

# Browns Pick Over Denver

NEW YORK (AP) — The Washington Redskins, the only unbeaten team in the National Football League, will get their toughest test of the season Sunday — and they will pass it with a victory over the Kansas City Chiefs.

In the other big game of the weekend, the Minnesota Vikings will eke out a victory over the Baltimore Colts.

That's how it looks to this picker who was 10-3 last week for a three-week total of 26-12-1.

Picking 'em:

Cleveland 34, Denver 10 — Cleveland has the passing of Bill Nelson and the running of Leroy Kelly and Bo Scott and the Browns are healthy. Denver is not.

Washington 24, Kansas City 23 — With Larry Brown and Charley Harraway, Washington has the running that will allow Bill Klimer to pass against and make the Chiefs the Redskins' sixth straight victim. Kansas City has the home field and that old standby — momentum — after a season-opening loss.

Minnesota 20, Baltimore 17 — Minnesota's defense against Baltimore's running game, with the Vikings' coming out on top in this meeting two unbeaten powers on Monday night.

San Diego 31, Buffalo 21 — The only thing different here for winners Buffalo is that this game is on a Saturday night.

Detroit 31, Chicago 6 — Detroit will eventually wear down a good Chicago defense which should get little chance to rest. Because of injuries Chicago will go with third-string quarterback Bobby Douglas.

# Scots Host Kenyon in Loop Game

**WOOSTER** — The College of Wooster, fresh from a 16-14 upset win over Denison, entertains the Kenyon Lords Saturday in another Ohio Conference contest.

The clash will mark Wooster's 53rd Homecoming game. The Scots, who evened their season's record at 2-2 after Saturday's win, 1-2 in the conference, are 24-24-4 in Homecoming action.

Kenyon enters the game with a 1-4 mark, 0-3 against league foes. The Lords were routed 47-0 at Baldwin-Wallace last weekend.

"The key to the game will be containing quarterback Dan Handle (Youngstown)," stated Wooster coach Pat O'Brien, the former Mansfield Tyger assistant. "Kenyon has long been known as a passing team. Handle, a great runner, likes to carry the ball himself. He leads the conference in total offense."

**FINE JOB**  
The Scots did an excellent job of containing Denison's rushing attack. The Big Red, averaging 271 yards rushing prior to the game, was limited to 93 yards on the ground.

Wooster tailback Jeff Wise (Fremont) enjoyed his best game ever. He carried the ball 25 times for 109 yards. Fullback Jim DeRose (Akron) complemented him with 92 yards in 28 carries. Each tallied a touchdown.

Defensive back Rick Quayle (Bay Village) provided the Scots with their victory margin when he blocked a punt out of the end zone.

Wise leads Wooster with 317 rushing yards and a 4.3 average while DeRose has 208 yards and a 3.0 average. Joe Grunda has completed 20 of 57 passes for 228 yards and one touchdown. Bill Steiner has caught ten passes for 111 yards.

# Miami Defense Faces Powerful Falcons

Miami's national defensive leaders put a prized 28-year-old personal record on the line Saturday against Bowling Green's whirlwind attack built around Sophomore Paul Miles.

Miles has rushed for more than 100 yards in each game for Bowling Green, 4-1. And Miami, also 4-1, has permitted only one runner, Don Nottingham of Kent State, to gain more than 100 in one contest since 1943.

The battle of Mid-American Conference challengers at Bowling Green will boil down to a test of Miami's defense, yielding 143 yards per game, against Bowling Green's offense, No. 10 nationally with 408 yards a contest.

The survivor becomes Toledo's main challenger for the conference title. Bowling Green can finish its Mid-American season with

a victory and a 4-1 mark. Miami dropped its only league start to Ohio University.

Meanwhile, 3-0 Mid-American pacesetter Toledo risks the nation's longest victory streak of 29 games against visiting Dayton in an independent night game.

In other major tests on the 20-game Ohio college schedule Saturday, Wisconsin is at Ohio State, Ohio University at Virginia Tech and Kent State at Xavier. Cincinnati is idle.

## Young Mansfielder Scores Imperial Ace

Sixteen-year-old Mansfielder Bill Dormaier scored his first career hole-in-one at Imperial Golf Course.

Dormaier, playing in a twosome with his grandfather Alan Corey, aced the 141-yard 14th hole with a seven iron. Dormaier has been golfing for three years.

Unbeaten Akron entertains Southern Illinois Saturday night in the top college division game in the country this week. The Zips (5-0) are ranked fourth in The Associated Press college poll while the visiting Salukis (4-1) are No. 8.

The Ohio Conference matches two of its four unbeaten leaders, Baldwin-Wallace at Wittenberg, both 2-0. Marietta, 3-0 along with

Ohio Wesleyan, visits Otterbein (1-2).

Ohio Wesleyan plays outside the conference at Wabash. In other OC tests, defending champion Capital (0-3) travels to Muskingum (0-3) and Kenyon (0-3) to Wooster (1-2).
