Plymouth In State Cross-Country; SHS's Sparks Joins 4 From Area

Plymouth is the only area cross-country squad to qualify for the state championships in Columbus Saturday, but five area runners will be competing for individual honors.

The 1971 state champions in Class A, Plymouth will be back to defend its crown after placing second in the district meet at Ottawa Saturday morning.

SOPHOMORE KEN LUCAS captured first spot with a sizzling time of 9:59 on the Kildaire Country Club course as the Big Red finished second with 76 points. Liberty Center won the title with 62, and New Bremen also claimed a berth in the state by winding up third with 108 points.

Mike Adams of Plymouth was eighth in 10:21 followed by Brad Buzard 10:40, Ralph Noble 10:49, Steve Adams 11:03, Mike Courtwright 11:08 and Barry Hamilton 11:19.

Sandusky finished seventh in the Class AAA district at Ottawa Park in Toledo with 130 points, but sophomore Frank Sparks earned a spot in the state.

Sparks ranked 10th overall with a time of 10:19. Ernie Ferguson was next for the Streaks in 25th spot at 10:42, while Steve Lasnoski posted a time of 10:47 for 28th place. Ed Organ ranked 31st in 10:57 and Jeff Baker added 11:09 for 40th spot.

In Class AA, Norwalk will be sending two individuals to Columbus, and Vermilion one.

The Truckers finished seventh in the 12-school field as a team with 150 points, and Willard ranked 11th at 216.

Norwalk's Ron Knoll was 10th in 10:30, while Bob Chappell added 10:38 to get into the state. Dave Carter of Vermilion also qualified with a 10:35 listing in the "AA" district meet at Upper Sandusky.

Ashland Crestview won the team crown with Perrysburg second and Colonel Crawford third. Crestview had 59 points and Perrysburg 118.

Tom Fries of Seneca East finished fourth overall in the "A" meet and will represent the Tigers in the state.

"I FELT THE KIDS did a fine job overall. All but one bettered the times they had in the sectional on the same course, and the weather was much better last week," Coach Wes Hartsook explained.

"Ed Organ was sick most of the week and I'm disappointed he doesn't get to go to Columbus. He had 10:16 on this course in the sectional and ran a conservative race. It would have been nice to have him get to Columbus since he is a senior," Hartsook added.
