Plymouth Determined To Win State Crown

Plymouth cross-country coach Bob James leaves no doubt what the major goal is for his veteran squad this year.

"Guess," he said when asked that question.

"We won the state in 1971, but finished fifth last year and I hope we can win the state again," the Mt. Union College graduate stated.

James has a wealth of talent on the 14-man squad, headed by two-year veteran Ken Lucas who is only a junior. Lucas holds the school record of 9:56, set in 1972, and has a best this season of 9:57.

However, he already has established course records in meets at Mansfield Madison, Ashland and Tuesday at Shelby.

Lucas was eighth in the Class A division his freshman year, but managed only a ninth last fall. "We didn't run well at all in the state as a team, but we have three kids on the team who could be in the state for the third year," James explained. Senior Brad Buzard and junior Steve Adams also competed in the 1971 and 1972 meets in Columbus.

"We have seven of our top eight runners back and we have steeled getting our kids as close together as possible. We had between 42 and 45 seconds between our first and fifth man last year, and it's down to 30 seconds now," James noted.

James expects Lucas to literally smash his own record in the near future. "Ken hasn't run into much competition thus far, but when he does I'm confident he will have an outstanding time."

James is also pleased with the fact that lettermen Ralph Noble and Buzard are chasing Lucas. Noble has a best of 10:03, and Buzard's top mark thus far this year is 10:04. Both are seniors.

Junior Mike Courtwright's best is 10:18, while freshman Tim Lewis has a 10:26 to his credit already this season. Steve Adams posted a 10:29 effort in his best performance.

Others contributing heavily to the success thus far are junior Steve Lewis and freshman Brett Kraft.

Plymouth collared its 11th consecutive win Tuesday, a 21-34 triumph over host Shelby as Lucas cracked still another record, this time on the Woody Ridge two-mile course.

Lucas shattered the old mark by eight seconds with a scorching 10:18 effort, and previous recordholder Mike Tarvin of Shelby submitted a time of 10:25.

Noble was third in the race at 10:41, followed by Courtwright in 10:46, and Tim Lewis ranked fifth overall at 10:50. Brad Buzard of Plymouth finished in 11:01 to rank eighth.

James is pointing for the Ontario Relays which the Big Red captured a year ago, and just as important to the fourth-year coach is the annual Johnny Appleseed Conference meet.

"We've never won the JAC, and we would like to add that to our list, but still the state is the most important goal of all," James quipped.

Plymouth has been the "A" sectional champion the last two years, and finished second in the district test in 1972.

"I feel the word dedication fits our squad. I don't have to tell them to run, they do it on their own. I feel they have faith in me and that helps quite a bit," James continued.






