

Davis Keys Flyers' Win

Detroit Basketball Coach Dick Vitale says Dayton Guard Johnny Davis, who almost single-handedly demolished the Titans Monday night, definitely is All-American material.

"Davis was the key to everything they did," Vitale said after the Flyers beat Detroit 90-76 behind the sophomore guard's 34-point performance. "You have to stop him to stop Dayton."

The whole Dayton (3-1) offense goes down the court head-hunting to get Davis free," Vitale observed.

The 6-foot-2 Davis seemed to dribble right through the Titan press and hit the basket from all angles. He netted 14 points in a five-minute stretch en route to 22 second-half points and had a perfect 12-2 night from the free throw line.

The Flyers held a narrow advantage for most of the first half and had a 47-31 margin at intermission. They then got hot in the second period, hitting 67 percent of their shots from the field, while Detroit managed only 30 percent.

Ali 'Seeking' New York Fight

NEW YORK (AP) — Muhammad Ali is the newest recipient of the Bronze Medalion, New York's highest civilian honor, and the heavyweight champion says the city will be the recipient of his first title defense.

"The city has been good to me" Ali said Monday after touring three of New York's five boroughs — Brooklyn, Manhattan and the Bronx — on Muhammad Ali Day.

"I'll fight in four months. My next fight has to be in the Garden."

Boxing insiders feel that Ali, who regained the title a decade after he first won it by knocking out George Foreman in Zaire, will defend against Ron Lyle of Denver in Madison Square Garden next March. A date being mentioned is March 3.

But Lyle wasn't mentioned by Ali, neither during his citywide tour nor in an informal meeting with reporters afterward.

Instead he regaled his audiences — at Rikers Island prison, in schools, at City Hall and at a midtown hotel — with tales of how he was ready to fight Foreman and Joe Frazier in one night or take on Frazier in a fight to the finish with just one bell — to start the fight.

The pronouncements were, as always, greeted with cheers.

Winning Plymouth Coach Steps Down

PLYMOUTH — Cross Country Coach Robert W. James last night had his resignation accepted by the Plymouth Board of Education after holding the post for five years.

In his letter of resignation to Supt. John Fazzini and the school board, Coach James said he would like to resign as cross country coach, but would like to continue his teaching post for another year.

James is a business education instructor at the high school.

Board Member Ivan Hawk abstained from voting on accepting the resignation.

Over his five seasons as cross country coach, James' Big Red have won two Class A state cross country championships including 1971 and this year.

Walton Speaks Out on Rumors

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — "Some people said some things in my name that they didn't have any right to say, and that's wrong," said Rookie Bill Walton of the Portland Trail Blazers, ending his silence on last week's rumors that he might retire from professional basketball.

"I didn't say anything, and I don't feel obliged to dispute what other people have said," the highly publicized former UCLA star said Monday.

Walton, who has missed the Blazers' last seven games because of a painful bone spur on his left ankle, said in an interview Monday: "I've got some things to be worked out, but I'd rather not say what they are."

Walton believes in privacy and there was nothing but silence from last Thursday night, when it was first rumored he might retire from pro basketball. Early Sunday the Blazers announced the 6-foot-11 center never had any intention of quitting.
