**FAIRVIEW** — Elyria Catholic finished second and Fire-

defending state champion during a five-team cross country meet over a Cleveland Metro Parks course here Thursday.

Kenston, third in the state Class AA meet last year, won the meet by two points over the Panthers, 43-45. Holy Name, second in the state last year in Class AA, had 75 points and defending state Class AA champion Firelands had 86. Fairview had 88 points.

But Firelands' junior Beetle, who was third in the individual race at state a year ago, stunned Kenston's Dan Franek to win the 3.1-mile race in a record 16:10. Franek, who won the state cross country race and the state track two-mile run last season, also broke the record with a time of 16:15.

A third runner — Elyria Catholic's Tim Mackert — smashed the mark of Rocky River's Bob Mau with a time of 16:30. Mau's record was 17:15.

Elyria Catholic's jayvees won their meet over Holy Name, Kenston and Fairview. Firelands did not compete.
