

# Butler, Plymouth Both Lose Again

Both Butler and Plymouth, Richland County elevens playing non-area foes last night, came out on the short end in their grid encounters.

Butler dropped its third in four starts by a 14-6 margin to Norwalk St. Paul. Plymouth remained winless in four tilts by losing its third North Central Conference tilt, 38-0, to Lodi, 1-3 in league play.

**PLYMOUTH** — Bob Packard ran and passed Lodi to its 38-0 romp over Plymouth's Warriors here last night, scoring twice, garnering four extra points, and passing for two six-pointers in a spectacular performance.

After a scoreless first quarter, Packard hit Don Phillips with a 27-yard scoring toss and followed it up with a 20-yarder to Tom Indwood, giving Lodi a 14-0 halftime lead.

Packard scored from the nine in the third, Nickles ran over from the five in the fourth, and Packard put the icing on the cake with a one-yard dive in the final minutes.

Plymouth Coach Lew Pettit said after the game that the Lodi club was much stronger than had been anticipated and admitted his club did not play as well as was expected.

"Packard was terrific," Pettit said, "and we just seemed to sit back and watch. He did a real fine job."

## Haney Plans 'No Change'

**NEW YORK (AP)** — Fred Haney's season-long theory was to play 'em as they came, one by one. And now that he's holding the upper hand in the World Series, the stubby Braves' manager sees no reason to change.

**BUTLER** — "Our boys played their best game this season," said Butler Coach Bob Carroll, "but Norwalk St. Paul got the breaks and capitalized on them. That was the story of our 14-6 loss last night."

In addition to the added notch in the loss column, Tom Sargent, a standout tackle for the Bulldogs, will be out indefinitely with a wrist injury, Carroll announced today.

Norwalk St. Paul got the jump early when a punt kissed off Dutch Cochran's fingertips and rolled into the end zone where the Butler end was smothered by the Irish.

Butler's Ken Farst tossed an aerial to Bon Bowman with one minute left in the half and the fleet scatback went all the way unmolested. The play covered 60 yards and was described by Carroll as "our best pass play this year."

A 15-yard penalty gave the Irish the pigskin at Butler's doorstep in the third stanza and George Potts bulled over from the two.

In the final quarter, Potts tallied again from the 16 after a Bulldog bobble at that point.
