Cardinals Get Score In Third

 Mentor's Cardinals, behind hard-charging halfback Ken Wagner, bulled their way to a 6-0 football decision over Mansfield Malabar before 5,000 fans at Arlin Field last night.
 The first athletic event in the history of the youthful Malabar High School was not a lopsided loss, however, as a pair of deep penetrators brought the crowd to its feet.
 Malabar kicked off to Wagner who returned the football a dozen yards to the 27-yard line. Fullback Bob Rhodes ran the first play from scrimmage then Wagner took over.
BUSY FELLOW
 The 5-8, 150-pound workhorse ran 11 of the first 16 plays that saw Mentor control the ball for eight and a half minutes and move into the Malabar 17-yard line before turning over the ball on downs.

Malabar's John Linta and Fullback Bill Williams spearheaded the Malabar drive following the turnover that moved the ball to the Mentor seven. Highlight of the drive was a 63-yard sprint by Linta who was caught on the Mentor 22-yard line. Williams crashed off tackle to the 11, moved on to the nine-yard line and blasted to the seven-yard line as the first quarter ended. Two pass attempts went for naught and Bob Oakes was caught for a four-yard loss to end the threat.

Starting on the Malabar 31 with 7:30 on the clock a key pass by Mike Durchik to Jerry Zak covered a dozen yards and placed the ball on the Malabar 18. Wagner cracked to the 16 and was then stopped by Oakes on the 10-yard line. Rhodes picked up a first down and goal on the six and then moved to the four. Wagner slanted off right tackle for four yards and the TD with 3:39 on the clock.

BATTLE BACK
 Malabar battled right back to its deepest drive. Nine short bursts moved to the Mentor 35. Hart hit Oakes for 15 yards through the air and a first down on the 20. Hart's pass to Linta on the goal line went incomplete facing the Falcons with a fourth down and seven situation. A fumble on the hand-off ended the drive on the six-yard stripe.
 Mentor ran 49 around plays with Wagner carrying for 26, Wagner and Rhodes combined to carry the ball on 42 of the 49 plays.

Malabar's next engagement is a Cardinal Conference tilt at Arlin Field next Saturday.
 Wagner carried 26 times for 96 yards and Rhodes 16 for 57. Linta paces the Cardinals with 77 yards in six carries, a 12.8 average.

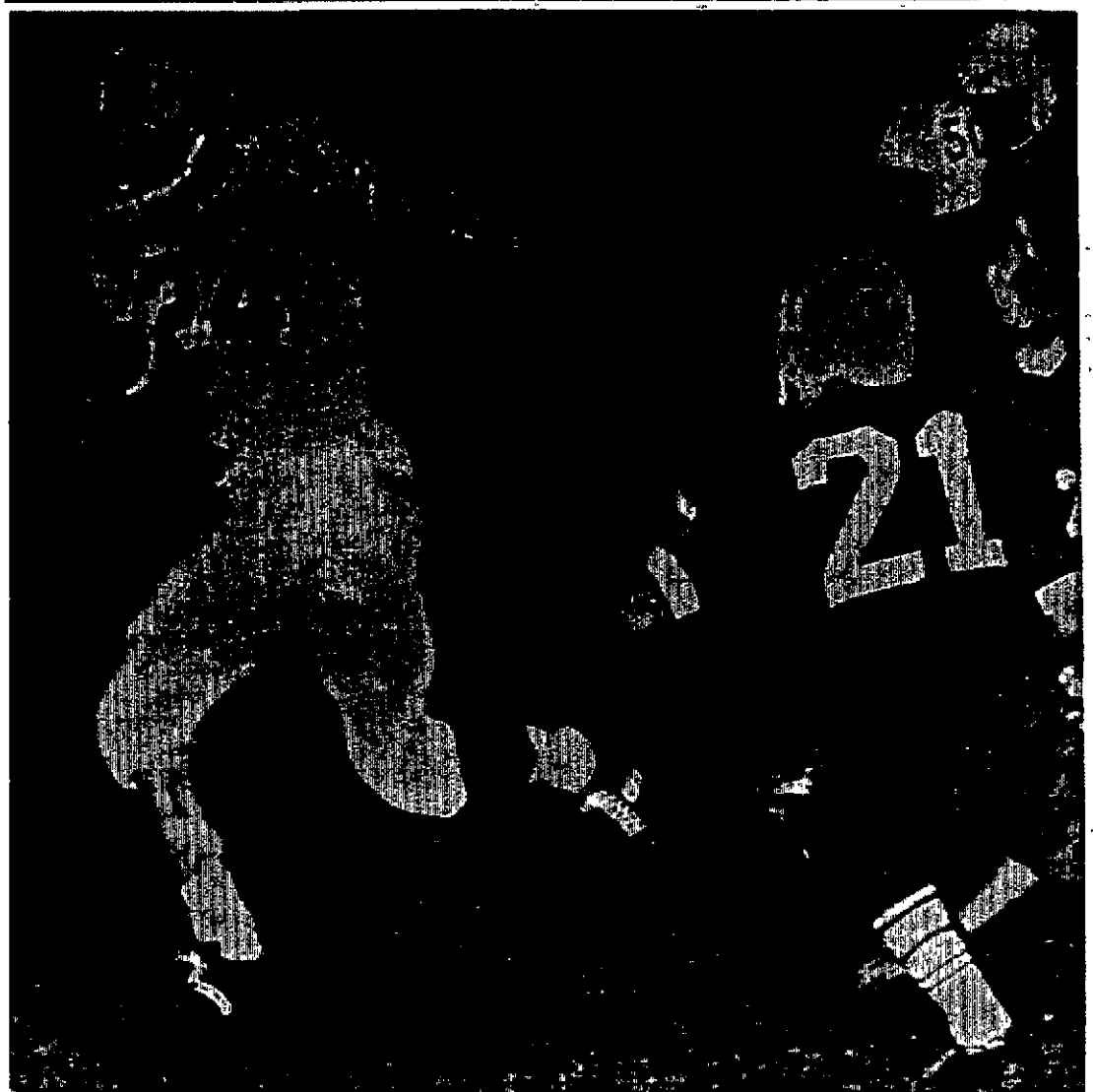

Mansfield Attack Sputters On Road

WARREN — The Mansfield Senior High Tygers last night went to Warren "loaded for bear".
 However, the Panthers of Warren Harding proved to be more adept at battling feline competitors and downed the Tygers, 14-0, in the opening game of the football season for both teams, before 10,000.
 Charles Grisham and Quarterback Bruce Brewster combined for a 22-yard pass-play touchdown late in the second quarter as Warren covered 45 yards in four plays.
 The second Warren score came with 1:21 left in the third period on an 18-yard scamper by Grisham. This time Warren covered 45 yards in seven plays.
 After the first three sets of downs and with less than two minutes remaining in the initial period, Warren committed what could have been a very costly mistake. The hometowners fumbled the ball on their own 35-yard line and Tyger tackle Charlie Williams pounced on it.

TYGER TRAPPED
 Dwight McCollum was trapped six yards behind the line of scrimmage on the first play after the fumble.
 At that point, Quarterback Willie Hawthorne, who had come in to replace Kerry Dean at the helm, reeled off a nine-yard gain around the right end. A pass went astray and Hawthorne took control again and unleashed a 20-yard sprint which, except for an alert Panther safety man, would have gone the distance.
 Three plays later, Mansfield was on the Warren 12-yard line, one yard behind the original line of scrimmage and Danny Coe came in to attempt a field goal which fell short.
 Mansfield threatened again in the closing seconds of the second quarter. On the kick-off following the TD, Dave Hutchins grabbed the ball on his own 20-yard line and raced 62 yards before being nailed on the Panther 18-yard stripe.
