

# Malabar Rally Pays Off In First Victory 28 To 24

## Early Elyria Scores Tumble Tygers, 15-8

### Falcons Overcome 24-8 Grid Deficit

COSHOCOTON — The Mansfield Malabar Falcons made good use of their opportunities here last night to down Coshocton 28-24 in a Cardinal Conference football game.

The Malabar victory was its first in six outings (1-3 in CC) and ruined the Coshocton homecoming besides dropping the Redskins to a 0-5-1 overall slate and 0-3 conference mark.

The Falcons had to come from far behind. Trailing 24-8 midway in the second quarter, they scored their second touchdown with 30 seconds left in the half and went to the locker room at a 24-14 deficit.

In the second half, the Falcons defensive team turned in a fine performance, keeping them outside their own 38-yard line.

#### GOOD CATCH

In the fourth quarter, Malabar halfback Jim Brown produced a fine pass reception as he had to back-track to catch an aerial thrown by quarterback Gene Hart. Brown then regained his balance and with good blocking, completed a 69-yard pass - play to paydirt. The down series began on the Mansfield 13 and covered the 87 yards in three plays.

Then came the second "key" play when Falcon fullback Rick Rollins recovered a Coshocton fumble on its own 47. Ten plays later, the Falcons took the game winning margin as Jim Caldwell snagged a Hart aerial covering 17 yards.

Brown had given Mansfield its first score in the opening quarter. Hart ran 10 yards on the fifth play of a 71-yard drive and fumbled when hit at the goal line. Brown recovered in the end zone for a touchdown.

#### LINTA SCORES

The Falcons second score was authored by John Linta from the first-yard line. It was the tenth play of a 59-yard march.

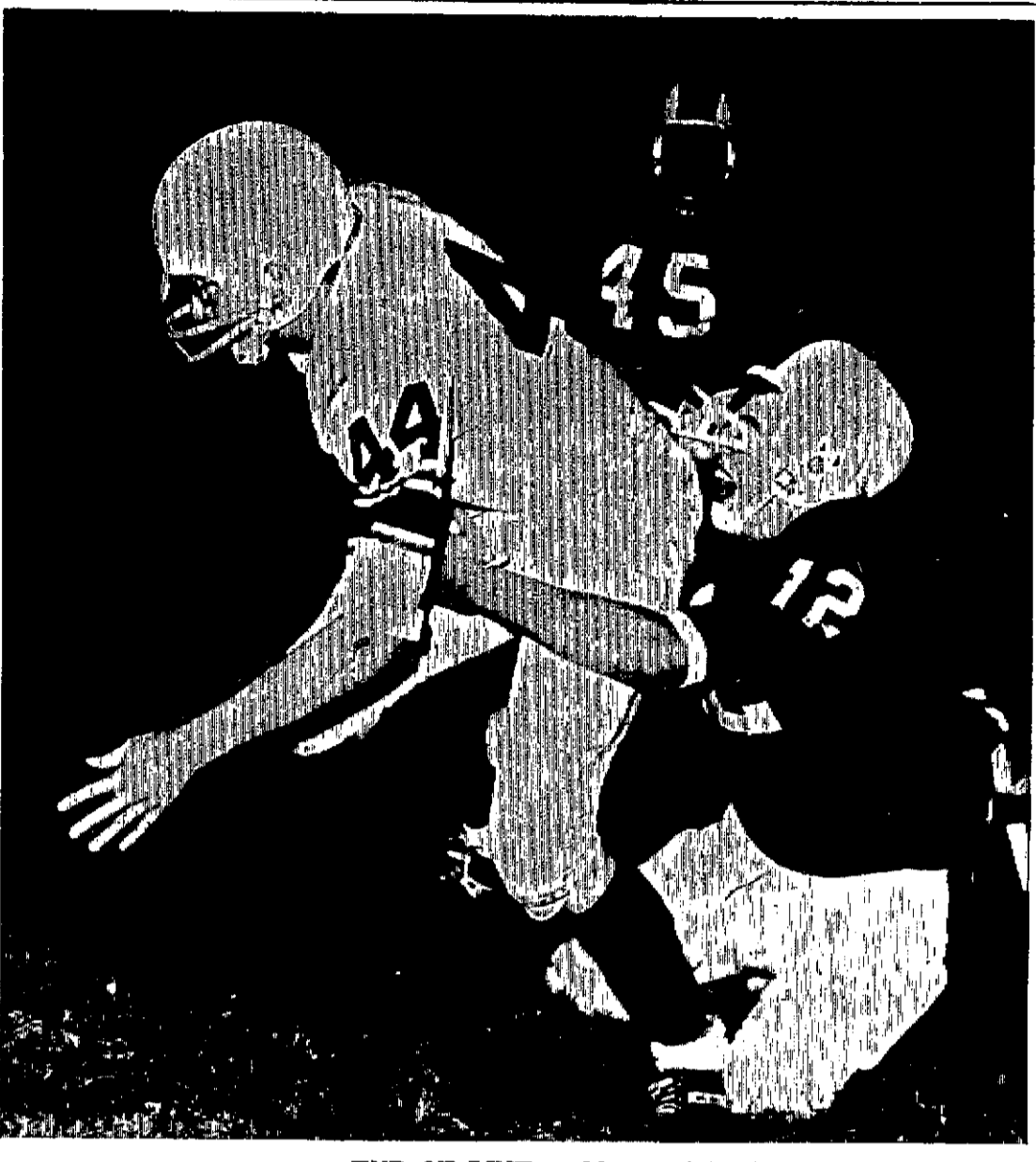

### Hutchins Runs 89 For Mansfield TD

Once-beaten Elyria scored twice in the first 16 minutes to tumble Mansfield Senior High School to a 15-8 defeat in a Buckeye Conference football game which was enlivened by a pair of fights on the field.

The first disturbance broke out in the third quarter after a Jim Dougherty-to-Dave Hutchins Tiger pass had gained 18 yards. Nearly the entire Tiger squad tried to get into the fist-swinging brawl which was quickly brought under control by coaches, officials and police.

The second "fight" died almost before it started at the end of the game as only a few punches were thrown.

Elyria (5-1) remained undefeated in three Buckeye starts by scoring on long marches, one of 82 yards and another of 64 yards before 6,000 fans.

Mansfield (2-4 and 1-2) got its lone score on a well-executed kickoff return with Sprinter Dave Hutchins going 89 yards, more than half of it well in front of a pack of out-distanced Pioneers. He fielded the ball on the 11 and broke up the middle behind some fine blocking.

#### FINDS DAYLIGHT

The 161-pound junior found daylight toward the south sidelines and turned on a burst of speed to cut an Elyria lead to 15-6. A pass from Dougherty to Tony Schruener added two extra points and the scoring was over.

Elyria's classy quarterback Roger Stevenson turned loose a fleet of quick and hard - running backs who shredded the Tiger line from beginning to end. The Pioneers rolled up 231 net yards on the ground as Stevenson a sleight of hand artist who must have studied under Houdini, sent his backs roaring 'through the interior forward wall.

The Pioneers threw more 11's than a Las Vegas gambler as the Tygers on their first touchdown march which moved 82 yards in 12 plays after the opening kickoff. Four straight plays gained 11 yards each with Stevenson, Houston Love, Bill Alley and Greg Young doing the honors.
