The Wildcats rebounded early in the fourth quarter and Cooke pushed across for the TD, wound up and pushed across again for the PAT, making the score 24 to 16.


On the next series of plays, Vermilion fumbled and Jim Kinnel, a 200 pound, senior guard pounced on the ball. Four

"Tonight, Shelby was the toughest team we have played in the conference so far," said Tony Zuppe after his Truckers had just been beaten 29-8 by the Whippets.

Shelby, probably the most underrated team in the NOL, did not play like a team in sixth place in the conference. Running from a single wing formation, the Whippets countered, reversed, double reversed, and swept around the ends leaving the Trucker defense bewildered.

With only 4 minutes of the game gone, the scoreboard already registered 8 points for Shelby. The score came on a 48 yard pass completion from Carl Henkel to Ken Bogan. Denny Alfrey added the PAT. Shelby tallied again in the

first quarter after Norwalk fumbled on their own 30. Larry Baldrige scored the TD by sweeping right end. Jack Foreman added the PAT.

In the second quarter the Whippets started a drive from their 40 and scored with Jack Foreman going over from the one yard line. Hugh Pittenger kicked the PAT to make the score 23-0 at half time. In the second half, Norwalk outscored Shelby 8-6. The Truckers defense controlled Shelby's ground game and their offense clicked for four straight first downs and a TD.

The one score came after a 75 yard march and the last 28 yards was covered by a pass from Dave Ross to Ed Snyder. Snyder made beautiful catch as he was

tightly covered by Shelby's defensive halfback. Taylor Hart scored the PAT.

Shelby scored in the third quarter on a pass from Baldrige to Bogan making the score 29-8.

The loss last night makes it 20 years since Norwalk last beat Shelby.
