# Packers Favored To Regain Stride

## Cleveland 7-Point Choice At Pittsburgh

Vince Lombardi, whose "run to daylight" gridiron technique has guided the Green Bay Packers to countless victories, may be running for cover if the Packers don't snap out of their current slump.

A veritable football genius, Lombardi inherited a squad that compiled a horrid 1-10-1 mark in 1958 and in five seasons has registered two league championships and five-year 50-15-1 mark.

However, this year the Packers have plummeted below .500 for the first time in Lombardi's tenure and dropped three of their last four contests, the most recent, 27-17, to the Rams. "We played a pretty bad football game," Lombardi said of the L. A. game. "We were drained emotionally from the Baltimore game (the previous week) and it left us pretty flat."

As a result the team has been drilled exceptionally hard this week for the upcoming Viking game.

**Packers Favored**  
Although Sunday's matchup is at Minnesota the oddsmakers have installed the Packers as four-point choices.

Elsewhere, Cleveland (5-1-1) is at Pittsburgh (3-4); San Francisco (2-5) is at Baltimore

(6-1); Los Angeles (4-2-1) travels to Detroit (4-2-1); St. Louis (4-2-1) visits New York (1-5-1); Philadelphia (4-8) hosts Washington (2-5); and Dallas (2-4-1) faces Chicago (2-5).

The Browns are seven-point choices to turn back the only team to have beaten them this season. In their earlier meeting which went to Pittsburgh, 23-7, the Steelers held the great Jimmy Brown to just 27 yards on the ground. He needs only 14 this Sunday to 'become the first man in history to reach the 10,000-yard career milestone.

Baltimore will try to extend its winning streak to seven games for the first time in team history. The Colts led the league in scoring with 237 points and fullback Lenny Moore is top individual scorer at 66. San Francisco leads the loop in passing yardage but is a 17-point underdog.

**Colts Benefit**  
Rams and Lions are deadlocked for second place in the West so the Colts must benefit for this one. Detroit is favored by three. In September they battled to a 17-17 stalemate.

The Cardinals trail Cleveland by one game in the East and

will play the rest of the season without star end Sonny Randle. The Giants have the poorest record in either division and are five-point underdogs.

Philadelphia is favored by three-and-a-half points to reverse an earlier decision with Washington. Veteran Ollie Matson has been a first rate replacement for the injured Tommy Brown.

The world champion Bears boast the league's two finest pass receivers in Johnny Morris and Mike Ditka but still share the Western Division cellar with the 49'ers. They are five-point choices to defeat defense-minded Dallas. However six Bears, including Morris, were stricken with an intestinal virus Friday and were doubtful starters.

# Browns Looking Back With Pain

CLEVELAND (UPI)—The Cleveland Browns in general, and Jim Brown and Frank Ryan in particular, will be out to prove some things when they face the hot-and-cold Pittsburgh Steelers in the Steel City Sunday.

The Browns will be out to show they're not as bad as they looked in their first contest against the Steelers. Pittsburgh rolled to an easy victory in the game which they dominated. And the Steelers were a pretty cocky club following the game.

Fullback Brown will be out to get at least 14 yards to become the first man in pro football history to gain 10,000 yards.

The blizzarding fullback should make it with ease but he can't help remembering the first contest when the Steelers held him to 28 yards.

Ryan will be seeking to convince the fans that he can still move the team. The Browns haven't shown much offense in their last two games but coach

Blanton Collier says it isn't Ryan's fault.

The Browns, who are on top in the Eastern Division with a record of 5-1-1, will fly to Pittsburgh later today.

The Steelers, who are 3-4, need a victory to remain in contention. And they better hold on to the ball.

League statistics show that the Browns have recovered the ball 16 times on 19 fumbles by their opponents.

That's nearly twice as many recoveries as any other team. The Browns themselves have fumbled the ball 10 times but recovered it six times.

**Steelers Try Again**  
Can the Steel City boys defeat the division leading Browns twice in a season?

That's the question Steeler fans will see answered Sunday when the old rivals clash at Pitt Stadium.

The Steelers surprised everyone by beating the Browns 23-7 Oct. 10 at Cleveland. Coach Buddy Parker set up a new defense for the Browns and turned John Henry Johnson and Clarence Peaks loose. Johnson gained 200 yards in 31 carries for a club record and Peaks picked up 96 yards.

Despite this, the Browns are favored again and the Steelers will need another miracle to emerge victorious.

End Jim Kelly and linebacker Bob Schmitz are not expected to see action for the Steelers because of injuries.

The Steelers announced Friday that linebacker Myron Pottios had been reactivated and guard Mike Sandusky was retired for the rest of the season. Sandusky was injured in the Minnesota game two weeks ago. Pottios suffered a fractured right arm before the season opened.

About 50,000 fans are expected to view the Sunday match.

## Ladd Handed

# Biggest AFL Fine So Far

NEW YORK (UPI) — Ernie Ladd, a mammoth tackle for the San Diego Chargers, today protested the \$500 fine assessed on him by American Football League Commissioner Joe Foss. "The fine was too heavy," Ladd said, according to a Charger spokesman. San Diego Coach Sid Gillman protested that "the fine is about 300 per cent out of line."

Ladd, who scales over 300 pounds, and veteran quarterback George Blanda of the Houston Oilers were fined Friday by Foss for "actions detrimental to the best interest" of the league.

The fine to Ladd was the biggest ever levied on a player in the AFL. It is believed Blanda was fined \$250. Both penalties resulted from last Sunday's game between the Chargers and Oilers at Houston, which was won by San Diego 20-17.

Ladd was charged with striking Houston defensive tackle Ed Husmann with his helmet and Blanda was fined for a post-game comment he made about the officiating.

"If a player, coach or club official has a legitimate complaint about game officiating, the place for him to file it is with the commissioner's office," Foss said.

Ladd, who was expelled from the Houston game after the incident, said later: "I try to avoid fights, but when one does start, to me fighting is life or death."
