Richards, Doster Spark Victory

Bellevue Closes 24-6 Victor

Bellevue struck for two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to whip Northern Ohio League foe Upper Sandusky, 24-6, in a season-ending tilt Friday night on the loser's gridiron.

The Redmen of Lowell Shafer closed their 1965 campaign with a fine 6-3 season mark and 5-2 league log. However, they didn't win the loop

title — a common occurrence for Bellevue teams in the recent past — which went to undefeated Shelby.

AGAIN IT WAS the hard running of workhorse Jeff Richards and the sharp passing of quarterback Dave Doster that sparked the victory. Richards, a 160-pound jun-

ior, set up the first Bellevue TD, carrying nine straight times to put the pigskin at the Upper 1. Richards gained 84 yards in the drive, but fullback Carl Pambianco blasted over from the 1 for the score.

Disaster hit John Degler with an aerial for the extra points. UPPER TOOK the follow-

ing kickoff, with Jerry King tossing 38 yards to Dick Ulrich for the score on the second play of the second quarter. A run for the points was stopped and Bellevue led, 8-6.

The score held until the fourth period when Doster hit Doug Reineke on a 10-yard scoring pass. Doster connected with end Les Sherman

for the conversion. RICHARDS SPRINTED 11 yards late in the final period and Doster hit Sherman again to end the scoring. Richards carried the ball 34 times and gained 165 yards. Bellevue rolled up 17 first downs to only five for the losers, who are 1-8 overall and 1-6 in loop play.

Routing Willard 42-8

Shelby Clinches NOL Title

Shelby wrapped up its first undisputed Northern Ohio League championship since 1960 Friday night when the Whippets bombed Willard, 42-8.

Willard didn't score until Shelby had notched all its points. The Whippets finished league play with a perfect 7-0 mark and are now 9-0 on the season.

And the winners weren't too particular about the way they scored. Larry Baldrige scored on a 1-yard run, Denny Alfrey broke loose for a 46-yard scamper and Baldrige hit end Lynn Guerin on a 12-yard pass score in the first half.

HUGH PITTENGER booted a 40-yard field goal in the second quarter to give

Shelby a 27-0 halftime edge. Lanny Hopkins tallied on a 15-yard run, and Tim Ensmann ran a blocked Willard punt into the end zone for second half scores.

Jerry Jarrett, Willard fullback, plunged into the end zone from 2 yards out with 0:28 remaining in the game to keep the Crimson Flashes from being shut out. Jarrett also added the conversion.

Nosed Out 15-14

Plymouth Almost Upsets Freddie's

Plymouth came within minutes of pulling off the upset of the year in the Johnny Applesed Conference Friday night, but tough Fredricktown eked out a close 15-14 loop win over the invaders.

Billy Goth scored twice, on a 1-yard plunge in the second quarter and a 24-yard pass from quarterback Jack Hoffman in the same period.

A pass after the first TD fell incomplete, but Hoffman hit end Norm Howard following the second and Plymouth led at halftime, 14-3.

JIM CARPENTER, who scored on a 7-yard run in the first quarter, added the six-pointer that tied the contest, blasting over from 3-yards out.

Spencer Hoeflich booted the placement that provided the winning point with only 1:30 remaining in the game. Plymouth is now 3-6 on the season and 3-4 in the conference, while Fredricktown sports a 7-2 season mark and 6-1 league log.

IT WAS TOWNE'S turn, and Chuggin' Charlie took the ensuing, kickoff 79 yards for a score and threw to Jim McCourt for the PAT.

Not to be outdone, Marvelous Merv went one up on Towne. One yard that is, the senior signal caller running back the following kickoff 80 yards. He tossed to Larry Perry for the two-point conversion.

Amherst's next score came when John Temple blocked a Nugent punt out of the end zone for a two-point safety and the Comets led, 26-22.

BUT NUGENT wasn't through yet and bulled into the end zone from 3-yards out. A pass for the extra points failed, but New London led 28-26.

But Towne put the finishing touches on the Wildcats, hitting Jim McCourt with a 35-yard scoring aerial with just four minutes remaining.

The loss dropped New London's mark to 6-3 on the season, and 4-3 in the conference, while Amherst improved its mark to 7-2 overall, and 5-2 in the loop.

Monroeville Closes With 44-8 Splurge

Monroeville scored at will Friday night, walloping host Black River, 44-8, in a Firelands Conference contest. The Eagles closed their season with a fine 6-3 season mark.

New London Nipped 32-28

It was a battle of the quarterbacks, and New London's Merv Nugent and Charlie Towne of Amherst put on quite a show, including running back kickoffs back-to-back.

NUGENT OPENED the scoring on a 16-yard run. An extra point pass fell incomplete. Jim Studd sliced over from the 7 to tie the score, and Towne hit Greg Godfrey on the conversion pass to give Amherst an 8-6 lead.

Towne connected with Godfrey for a 29-yard passing score in the second quarter, and Marty Aschenbach added the PAT.

Beidelman Is Elyria Spark Against Ross

Elyria's fine junior halfback Jack Beidelman, scored three touchdowns to pace the host Pioneers to a 21-0 Buckeye Conference win over Fremont Ross Friday night, giving the Sandusky Blue Streaks an undisputed B C grid championship.

Fremont entered the game only one game out of first place, but the loss coupled with Sandusky's win put the BC title out of the Little Giants' reach.

BEIDELMAN, WHO scored four touchdowns last week against Marion Harding, went in on a 1-yard plunge in the first quarter.

The Pioneers held only a 6-0 halftime lead, but Beidelman took the second half kickoff and sprinted 88 yards into paydirt.

The swift junior added the final TD on a 9-yard buck in the fourth quarter to give Elyria its fifth win in nine outings and a 3-3 BC mark.

Massillon Only 18-0 Victor

Massillon's No. 1 ranked Tigers crunched Eastlake North by an 18-0 count Friday night to remain undefeated in nine outings.

Undeclared in eight outings after Friday night's 20-6 win over Lakota at Columbian Stadium in a loop clash, Calvert hosts Margaretta in the league finale next Friday.

Calvert was voted out of the conference Thursday by the member schools. Calvert's large enrollment which reaches close to the 800 mark was the cause for the

ouster, informed sources said. Margaretta bombed Gibsonburg, 44-20, last night to enter the game just a point behind Calvert in the standings. The Polars must win to take the title, with a tie or a loss giving the Senecas the crown.

Last-Minute Prexie Score Tops Steelers

Marion Harding's Roger Beery, who hit paydirt three times, slashed into the end zone with 40 seconds remaining to provide the winning points as the host Prexies dumped Lorain Senior, 24-22, in a Buckeye Conference thriller Friday at Marion.

Beery went over from the 2 for the winning touchdown, after scoring on runs of 13 and 7 earlier in the game.

LORAIN TALLIED on touchdowns by Terry King, Mark Kuncel and Darrell Emerick, all coming from inside the 10-yard line after long drives.

Dan Skirk skittered 53 yards with a pass interception in the third quarter for Marion's other TD.

The win boosted Marion's season mark to 3-6, and its BC log to 1-5, while Lorain is 2-7 and 0-6.

TIFFIN'S CHANCES took a dip when its fine halfback Joe Clark sustained a spine injury on the opening kickoff. Clark was rushed to Tiffin Hospital where X rays proved negative.

However, the junior halfback was kept at the hospital over night and will undergo more tests today to determine the seriousness of his injury.

Calvert struck first, when quarterback Joe Zirger slipped over from the 1-yard.

LAKOTA TALLIED in the third quarter on a 79-yard pass play to Ron Neisett from Scott Chancy to tie the score.

Roger Dariano, Calvert's fullback, blasted over from the 2, and Carl Werner snagged a Zirger pass for the extra points.

Sophomore Bill Stelmets scored the clincher, zipping over from 15 yards out.

Calvert is now 6-0-2, and 4-0-2 in the league, while Lakota is 2-7 overall, and 1-6 in loop play.
