

# Huron, New London Capture Lakeland Wins

Huron rapped Midview, 20-0, Vermilion lost to Amherst by the same coki and Oberlin sewed up a share of the Lakeland Conference by bouncing Wellington from the ranks of the unbeaten, 28-0, Friday night.

In the other league encounter, New London's Rick Evans scored three touchdowns as the Wildcats clawed Clearview, 34-28, in an offensive battle on the Clippers' turf.

Oberlin is now 8-0 for the season, and 7-0 in league play, needing only a victory to clinch the crown. Wellington dropped into second play with a 5-1 league mark and a 7-1 overall mark.

**HURON BLANKED** winless Midview with Tiger quarterback John Snyder scoring twice and passing for another as Frank Fiore's crew won its third game against four losses and a tie. Huron scored in the second

# Perkins Last-Gasp Loser

Perkins' scrappy Pirates came within scant seconds of upsetting favored Lorain St. Mary's Friday night, but couldn't stop the Fighting Irish from scoring in the waning moments and lost 22-20 before a sparse Parent's Night crowd at cold S. Campbell Street Stadium.

It was the Pirates' best effort of the season and they came within a cold breath of winning it, but St. Mary's quarterback Ken Dobosy scored on a quarterback sneak from the 1-yard-line with only 0:20 remaining to snatch the victory away from Perkins.

**THE FINE** showing came mainly as a result of Coach Ted Schwanger's shuffling of his backfield, inserting former end Pete Ralston into a set back spot with Bruce Dahm.

Ralston, an American Field Service student from Australia responded with some quick, slashing running and ended up as game's top ball

carrier, gaining 85 yards in 18 carries.

Ralston also scored a touchdown and contributed some fine defensive play.

**THE PIRATES** scored first on the initial play after a blocked punt, but fell behind when Dobosy scored twice in the first half.

Perkins came back on top

on a spectacular pass play with just over a minute remaining, but saw its efforts go for nothing when Dobosy plunged over.

Guard Randy Weaver blocked a Lorain punt with about 5 minutes remaining in the initial quarter. The Pirate lineman scooped up the bounding pigskin and raced to the 11 before being pulled down from behind.

However, Dahm, 142-pound junior, went over right guard for the distance on the next play, and added the conversion on a sweep around right end.

**LORAIN STRUCK** quickly to knot the score, with Dobosy's 19-yard jaunt around right end capping a three-play drive.

Lorain drove 70 yards following a Perkins punt in 14 plays to go ahead with Dobosy going clear to the left sideline before retreating back too score from the 10-yard-line, driving into the right corner of the end zone. Halfback Mike Coughlin raced around right end for the conversion.

Neither team scored in the third quarter, however, Perkins controlled the pigskin. Twice the Pirates fell on Lorain fumbles on the first down of a series.

Ralston tallied on the fourth play of fourth quarter, crashing into the end zone on a sweep around right end from the 6-yard-line. Rich Gangwisch was stopped on the extra point try, and Perkins trailed, 14-12.

**DAHM SET UP** the final score, intercepting a Dobosy pass at the 15 and running it back 44 yards to the Lorain 41 before stumbling with only one man ahead of him.

Ralston bucked twice for two yards. Penalties were called on the next two plays, but the ball only moved 5 yards to 32.

On the next play, Harris faded and spotted end Jim Randal sprinting down the right sideline. Harris laid it in his hands and Randal sprinted into paydirt with only 1:24 remaining.

Perkins was penalized 5 yards for delay of game and Dahm was stopped on the two-point try.

Dobosy led the way, passing to end Bill Burke for 8, circling right end for 18, passing to Mike Gallagher for 1, hitting Burke for another 8 and twice sneaking before scoring the deciding TD.

The Pirates are now 1-7, and Lorain is 6-2 and winners of its last five.

## Blocked Punt Gives Findlay Tie With King

Mike Stratman blocked a Lorain Admiral King punt and ran 56 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to give Findlay an 18-18 tie with the invading Admirals.

Findlay scored first on a 12-yard run by fullback Tom Lahey, but King's John Milam bolted over from the 1 to tie the score at halftime, 6-6.

**JOE (JAGUAR) PAYNE** sandwiched touchdown runs of 2 and 1 yards around a 2-yard scoring run by Steve Lanning to give King an 18-12 lead.
