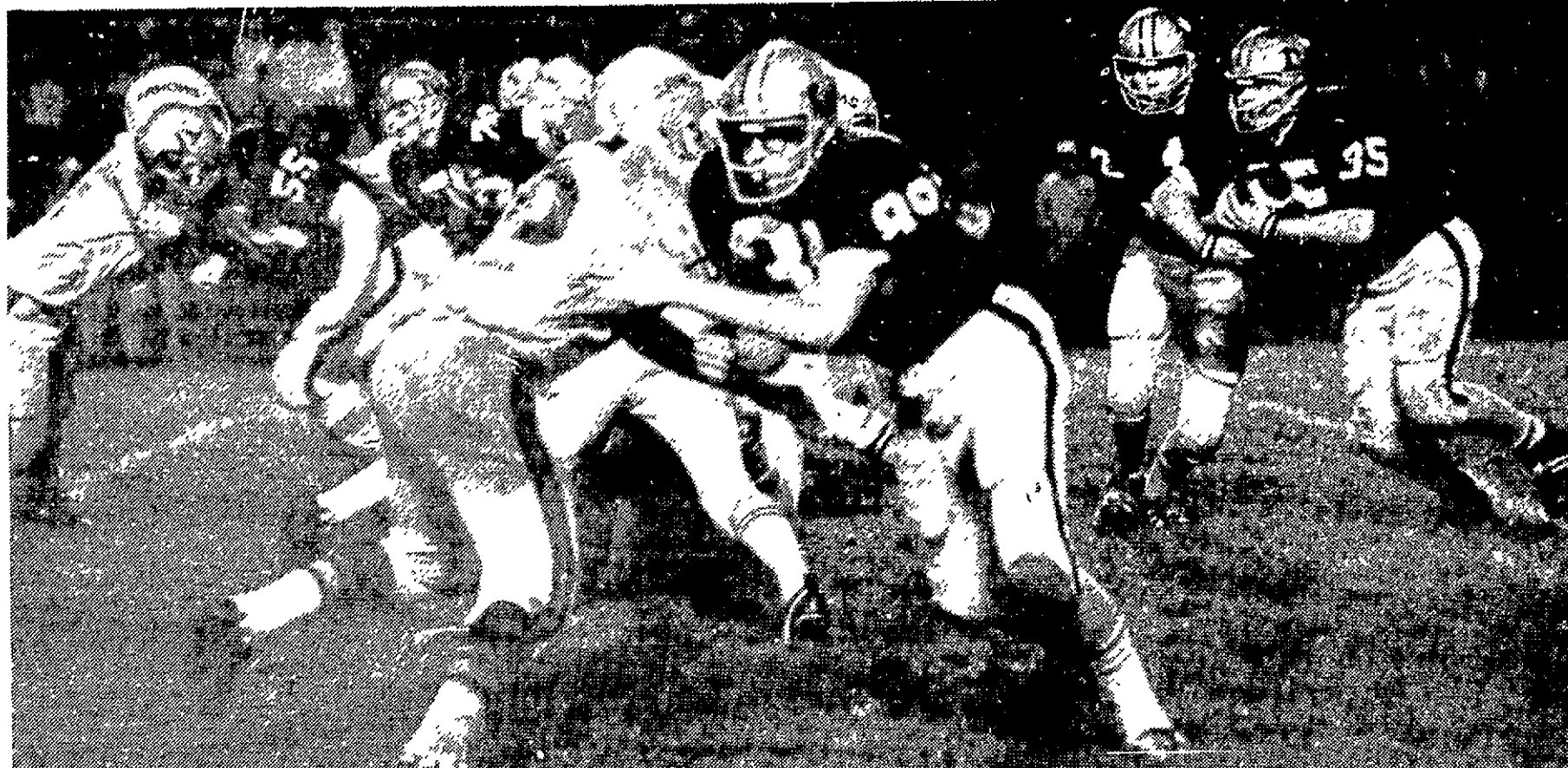

# Cards Sign Manager to 1973 Pact

ST. LOUIS (UPI) — Red Schoendienst, predicting the St. Louis Cardinals would be a solid contender next year, signed a one-year contract to manage the club for the 1973 season.

Schoendienst, 49, has led the Cardinals to two pennants and one world championship since he took over from the late Johnny Keane following the 1964 season.

He has managed the Cardinals for eight seasons, the longest tenure for a manager in the history of the club. He trails only Walter Alston among active managers in consecutive years of service guiding a major league baseball team.

Alston will start his 20th year with the Dodgers next season.

Looking to his ninth season, Schoendienst said the Cardinals would have a good shot at the top. "Pittsburgh can't win every year," he said. "Stargell and Clemente can't play forever."
