Now's the time deer are trouble to autos

I've heard some lively stories about deer in the past few years. Like the man who was driving near Mansfield OSU, had a big buck loom up in his headlights, and the deer jumped on impact.

It came through the windshield and buried an antler tine in his forehead, though luckily he'd ducked just in time.

Then there was the deer that was killed in downtown Mansfield by a motorist who was sure he was safe from any car-deer collision in such a place. Or the woman who hit a deer on a rural road not far from Willard, totaled her car, and had to make a substantial walk down midnight roads to get help.

You've probably heard stories like these too, and you're going to hear more because that bad time of year is here.

A seven-year study shows that over half the deer-vehicle accidents occur during October, November, and December. The peak of the rut is in November, and that one month alone accounts for over a fourth of all accidents. It's a spooky time to be driving.

During these bad months over half the accidents are recorded between six p.m. and midnight when deer are moving and bucks are avidly tracking does.

The other bad time is from 6-7 a.m. when deer are moving back to bedding areas after a busy night of feeding and mating.

One thing that's certain is that if you hit a deer squarely and at a reasonable speed, you're going to total your car and might get hurt in the process.

Even a glancing hit could cost \$1,000 worth of damage.

A lot of things have been tried in hopes of cutting deer-car accidents—motorist warning signs, reflective devices, fencing—even whistles. None of them work very well, and this year your only real chance is to drive defensively.

When I'm running roads and highways during the bad hours, I drive at 40-45 mph usually, and keep my brights on when no traffic is approaching. I'm looking for deer and thinking deer, and while a fair number have appeared in the headlights I've yet to hit one. You should do the same.

The Division of Wildlife has adopted a "get tough" policy for gunners hunting on private property without written permission this fall. Ohio law requires WRITTEN permission of the landowner before entering

private property to hunt, and that law is definitely going to be enforced. But, for the moment, at least, it'll not be a case of every hunter being checked by game protectors each time he goes hunting for that slip of paper. An that's going to cheer up a lot of people who've been calling me to see what the situation is.

I talked to Bill King, Richland County's game protector, and he said that the crackdown is going to be primarily against that small segment of coon hunters who think they can hunt where they please without asking permission.

They're going to hit deer hunters hard too, at least those types who believe they can follow a deer anywhere without bothering to check with the landowner, or form lines of men and hunt for miles on the theory that "We'll only be on this guy's property a few minutes, anyway."

It'll cover bunny hunters also, who think they can hunt someone's back 40 and be gone before anyone knows.

But Bill was very careful to point out that "I have no intention of harassing the man who has a long standing relationship with a given farmer by checking him for written permission."

So, if you've hunted a farm for years, know the man well, and have long since received permission to hunt, no problem.

You need not hurry around to all those long-time friends and spend your time pulling them off a busy tractor to sign a permission slip.

But if you're hunting a new place, it'd be a good idea, and if you're a cooner, deer hunter, rabbit chaser or whatever who's not too concerned with property lines and getting permission, you could be in real trouble this year.

I'd best mention that I didn't check with all area game protectors, just Bill. Hopefully, the others feel as he does, but just in case, check when you next see one. He might have different thoughts altogether.

Faust denies rumors of him resigning

CINCINNATI (UPI)—Notre Dame coach Gerry Faust says he has no intentions of resigning if he has a losing season.

Faust denied reports that said he would resign if his team finished 5-6 this season, The Cincinnati Post reported.

"I will not quit," the Post quoted Faust as saying from Notre Dame's South Bend, Ind., campus. He was replying to an article in Friday's New York Times that said he may resign at the end of the season.

"I am trying to get in touch

with Gordon White (who wrote the Times article) to find out why he quoted me that way," Faust said. "What I told him was I don't know if I'd want to return if we finished 5-6. Who wants to be 5-6?"

Faust was quoted in the Times as saying, "If we were 5-6, I don't think I'll be around. If we win all seven left, if (the future) depends on how well we play."

Before taking the job at Notre Dame, Faust was head coach at Moeller High School in Cincinnati.
