Norwalk St. Paul tops South Central by 21-7

NORWALK — After watching his team get shutout four straight times to open the season, Norwalk St. Paul coach Joe Widman said once the Flyers scored their first touchdown, the rest would follow.

And the first-year head coach has been proven right for the second straight week.

The Flyers spotted South Central a first quarter touchdown, then dominated the game with their ball control style of play on the way to a 21-7 Firelands Conference victory Friday.

The Trojans scored first on a John Vogel to Brian Fishbaugh 11-yard touchdown pass. The extra point was booted by Steve Hicks with 6:43 on the clock in the opening period.

The Flyers used a strong ground game and tied the score at the 8:55 mark of the second quarter as Gary Sprague busted in from the three. Scott Phillips added the PAT to tie the score, 7-7.

St. Paul scored again less than two minutes later with Sprague once again going the final two yards. Phillips' kick made it 14-7.

Jeff Nickoli scored the final touchdown of the game with just 1:58 on the clock in the fourth period, as he raced in from eight yards out. Phillips' kick made it 21-7.

Nickoli and Sprague were the main ball carries for the Flyers, picking up 147 yards between

them. In all, St. Paul collected 171 yards on the ground in 48 attempts. They added 2-of-5 in the air for 61 yards for a total of 232 yards.

Following its four straight scoreless games, St. Paul exploded for 35 points last week in a win over Mapleton, before adding three more touchdowns against South Central, who was coming off its first ever win over Edison.

South Central (2-4, 1-1) had 75 yards on the ground with 6-of-16 up above for 98 yards and 173 for the night.

St. Paul (2-4, 2-1) next travels to New London Friday while South Central will be at home against Black River.

Monroeville blanks Wildcats

MONROEVILLE — Monroeville recorded its fourth win of the season by blanking New London 32-0 in Firelands Conference action Friday.

The Eagles (4-2, 3-0) were led on the ground by Kevin Smith with 103 yards in five carries, and dominated the contest by picking up 219 yards on the ground and another 111 in the air for a total of 330 yards offense.

The Wildcats (0-6, 0-3) were held to just 63 yards on the ground and 61 yards in the air by a strong Monroeville defense.

Jeff Winslow got the Eagles on the board first when he hauled in a 23-yard touchdown pass from Kevin Smith at the 6:05 mark of the opening period. Chris Pfeiffer's kick made it 7-0.

On the final play of the quarter, Brian Colahan picked up a New London fumble and race 18 yards in to the endzone and when the kick failed it was 13-0 for the Eagles.

Midway through the second stanza Smith rambled 68 yards for the touchdown, giving the hosts a 19-0 lead at the intermission.

The Winslow-Smith combina-

tion hooked up again in the third quarter, and this time it covered nine yards for a Td.

Smith closed out the scoring at the 2:41 mark of the same period as he slanted in from three yards. The Pfeiffer kick made it 32-0.

Next week, the Eagles next will travel to Western Reserve Saturday, while New London will be at home against St. Paul.

twice.

But, the comeback began for the Cougars when Hershizer hauled in a three-yard scoring toss from Matt Bernhard with just under eight minutes left before halftime.
