

Monroeville joined by 2 others at top of Firelands chase

Granted it's early in the season. Still, there's a crowd at the top of the Firelands Conference.

A trio of teams sport perfect records and they could be joined by another tonight when Western Reserve (2-0 overall and 0-0 in conference play) hosts South Central.

Sitting on top with 3-0 overall marks and 2-0 records in the Firelands are Monroeville, Plymouth and Mapleton.

Monroeville dusted off Norwalk St. Paul, 39-6, while Plymouth edged past previously-unbeaten Ashland Crestview, 14-7, and Mapleton slipped past New London, 21-13.

"We were really on tonight," said Monroeville head coach Steve Ringholz.

"This is one of the most complete games we've ever had. We only had to punt once and that was in the first half. This was a big step for us but we needed it to get mentally tough."

Senior quarterback Joe Lindenberger continued his pinpoint passing, completing 9 of 14 passes for 186 yards and three touchdowns.

His seven yard strike to junior Chris Geis got the Eagles on the board with 2:26 left in the first period. Eric Dickman tacked on the conversion for a 7-0 lead.

The Eagles followed with a pair of scores within the first 11/2 minutes of the second quarter.

Geis, who caught four passes for 112 yards, hauled in a 50-yard touchdown pass on the first play of the second quarter and the Eagles came right back on a Jerry Morrow four-yard scoring run at the 10:29 mark. Dickman converted after both scores as Monroeville suddenly was in command, 21-0.

The Eagles were able to score once more through the air as Lindenberger fired a seven-yard pass to Geis with just 55 seconds left before intermission. However, the PAT attempt was blocked but the Eagles led, 27-0.

Junior John Anderson, who grabbed three passes for 47 yards, scored on a 12-yard run with 3:41 left in the third period and the Eagles closed out their scoring with 6:16 left in the game when junior Chad Gumbert hauled in a 23-yard pass from sophomore Sean Smith for a 39-0 lead.

St. Paul, winless in three outings and 0-2 in the conference, avoided the shutout as Craig Coe scored on a four-yard run with 2:21 remaining in the game.

In addition to getting 215 yards through the air, the Eagles pounded out 184 yards on the ground with Rick Bryant and Jerry Morrow, both junior fullbacks, gaining 65 and 53 yards while Steve Farley chipped in with 25 on eight carries.

"Joe has been throwing the ball real well. He audibled on the first touchdown and really did a good job of reading the defense.

"The defense did a good job of swarming to the ball. We needed a game like this. But, I still say that St. Paul still has a good team," said Ringholz, watching his team win their 13th straight regular season game dating back to the 1986 finale.

Plymouth 14 Crestview 7

At Plymouth, it certainly looked bleak for the hosts in the early going as Ashland Crestview scored on its first possession of the game for an early 7-0 lead.

But, the Big Red rallied with a pair of scores in the second half including the game-winner in the final two minutes to secure a 14-7 victory.

Chuck Deskins, who rushed for 114 yards on 16 carries, scored the winning touchdown on a 32-yard scamper and Chuck Kosse passed to David Sparks for the two-point PAT and 14-7 lead.

Earlier, Deskins had got the Big Red on the board with a 17-yard run with 6:30 to play in the third period but the hosts failed to convert and was on the short end of a 7-6 score until the waning minutes of the game. Crestview, 2-1 overall and 1-1

in the Firelands, scored early when Kerry Hart broke loose on a 46-yard scamper to paydirt and Bobby Williams converted for a 7-0 lead with 8:05 left in the opening period.

The Cougars, who were outgained by a 202-120 margin, threatened to score again just before halftime when Plymouth fumbled a punt on its one-yard line. But, the Big Red refused to give in and kept Crestview from scoring a second time in the first half.

Mapleton 21 New London 13

At New London, Mapleton scored in every period but the third to take a 21-13 win over New London.

After Bruce Goodman scored on a three-yard run and Mike Abfall booted the conversion, New London trailed by a slim 15-13 score with 9:46 left in the game.

But, the Mounties put icing on the cake with just five seconds left in the game when Chris Hickey scored from four yards away to up the final margin of victory.

Bill Rutherford scored twice for the winners in the first half. He plunged in from one yard away with 5:08 to play in the first period and Keith Shonkwiler booted the conversion for a 7-0 lead.

With 7:02 left before halftime, Rutherford scooted in from 16 yards out and the Mounties converted on a two-point try as Craig Ritchey hauled in a pass from Jeremy Krause.

Sandwiched between was a seven-yard scoring pass from Abfall to Jason Blystone as the Wildcats scored with just 12 seconds left in the opening period.
