St. Paul head coach John Livengood noted the difference in his team's play as the game went on was its' desire to win.


"We did not want the game the first four quarters, but give credit to Monroeville. They played with a lot of guts," said Livengood.

Clyde clips Upper in OT

UPPER SANDUSKY — Bob Bishop is wary when it comes time for the Clyde Country Fair.

Two years ago, the Fliers outlasted Edison in seven overtimes, 24-21.

Friday, Clyde was involved in overtime again and came out with a 14-13 win over Upper Sandusky.

"It seems like everytime the fair comes up, we're involved in an overtime," said Bishop, who has a 2-1 record in overtimes. Midway through the 1989 season, they lost to Margaretta, 11-8.

Both Clyde and Upper Sandusky scored in the second period and the 7-7 tie held up the rest of regulation.

The Rams, 1-2 overall, scored first on a four-yard run by Jason Spencer and Jake Parsell booted the conversion for a 7-0 lead with 5:19 showing on the clock.

Clyde, 2-1 overall, got the equalizer on a 25-yard pass from junior quarterback Eric Hutchins to junior wide receiver Josh Gregg. Sophomore Joe Sutton converted to knot the count at 7-7 with 1:17 left in the first half.

At the end of regulation, Upper Sandusky had the ball first in overtime and quickly scored on a 12-yard pass from Ryan Holman to Jason Ratliff. However, the point after attempt was no good as the Rams took a 13-7 lead.

"Their extra point kick was wide right and the kid just shanked it," added Bishop.

The Fliers came right back and scored on the second play of their overtime possession. Aaron Wil-

son hauled in an 18-yard pass from Hutchins. Sutton was again perfect on the conversion to give Clyde a 14-13 win.

"It (overtime touchdown) was a play action pass. We had been running a lot from power formations. Eric took off on a bootleg and their halfback was sucked in which left Wilson wide open. Aaron ran a nice pattern to get free.

"Sutton has been a very solid

kicker. Last week, he kicked a 35-yard extra point and his attempt was right through the uprights.

"A couple major penalties kept us from having a couple big plays. This was an emotional win and it looks like we better be ready to go next week in the SBC opener against Edison," said Bishop.

The Fliers were led on the ground by Craig Cheek with 92 yards on 23 carries.

Roughriders slip past South Central

COLLINS — Converting after a touchdown is so important.

With 5:01 to go in the game, Meagrow plunged in from one yard out. The Roughriders were also successful on the PAT as Curt Bly fired a pass to Sean Moore, giving the hosts a 14-6 lead.

But, it was shortlived as the Trojans struck on the very next play as Hunt rambled 85 yards with the kickoff return at the 4:44 mark. However, SC was off the mark on a PAT pass and the Roughriders held on for a 14-12 win in their conference opener.

NEW LONDON — The kicking game proved critical Friday night as New London rallied for a 9-8 win over Mapleton.

New London junior Jay Raphael split the uprights on a 27-yard field goal attempt with 6:36 left in the third quarter, helping the hosts overcome an 8-6 deficit.
