Area athletes excel in collegiate ranks

Jessica Faflik is a member of the Westminster (Pa.) College women's volleyball team this season.

Faflik, a graduate of Huron High School and sophomore with the Titans, has played a key role in their success this year.

She recently had eight kills at the net in a win over Geneva (Pa.). Westminster won the match, 4-15, 15-10, 15-13, 2-15, 15-11.

College matches are best-of-five instead of the best-of-three format used in high school.

Against Penn State-Behrend, Faflik led the way with 10 kills as the Titans won again, 15-7, 15-4, 15-7.

In another five-game match with Grove City (Pa.), Faflik was one of three players to record 12 kills. The Titans outlasted Grove City, 10-15, 15-3, 4-15, 15-0, 15-13.

Faflik came up with a team-high 14 kills in a recent loss to Point Park and she also had 16 kills in a five-game loss to Carlow. The Titans also downed Roberts Wesleyan in five games with Faflik leading the way with 11 kills and a pair of service aces. She added 10 kills in a loss to Seton Hall and came up with a team-high 16 kills in a loss to Houghten.

Following the three wins Westminster is now 23-11 overall and 8-5 in the Keystone-Empire Conference.

Jessica LaFene is expected to lead the way for the Bowling Green State University women's cross country team when they compete in the Mid-American Conference cross country championships at Muncie, Ind., today. The event is hosted by Ball State University.

The men's race begins at 11 a.m. with the women to run at noon. BGSU is the defending champion in both men's and women's meets.

The Falcon men finished with 57 points last year to clip Ohio University by eight points. The women tied the conference record with 21 points last year and set a new conference record for margin of victory with OU second with 92 points, 71 points behind the Falcons.

The Falcons lost the top three men from last year's team through graduation but one of the returnees is junior Craig Nieset, a graduate of Fremont St. Joe. He was 13th last year with the time of 27 minutes over the eight kilometers.

BGSU lost Tracey Losi and Kristin Gaddis from the women's team and they were second and third last year.

But the Falcons have gained LaFene who is in her first season on the team after transferring from North Carolina. LaFene, a graduate of Perkins High School, has been BGSU's top finisher in five of six meets this season.

LaFene came up with her best clocking of the season with 17:28 for five kilometers at the Notre Dame Invite. She was 13th overall in the meet.

She also gained all-Ohio recognition for finishing eighth at the All-Ohio Meet in Delaware, Ohio, in 17:59.4. Most recently she clicked off an 18:23 for 15th place at the Wolverine Invite hosted by the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor.

LeAndre Moore and Ryan Carter are seeing action with the Ball State University football team this season.

Moore, a sophomore eligibility-wise and junior academically, is second on the team in rushing with 378 yards on 91 carries. He trails only senior Michael Blair (96 for 443) who now ranks second on the all-time rushing list at Ball State trailing only Bernie Parmalee who is now with the Miami Dolphins.

The 5-7, 193-pound Moore, a graduate of Sandusky High School, has ripped off a 40-yarder for his longest run from scrimmage.

Also, he has caught eight passes for 77 yards including his longest reception of 24 yards. He has scored one touchdown and also has one tackle to his credit.

Moore ranks third on the team in total offense with 378 yards and is also third in all-purpose yards with 503.

Carter, who was redshirted last year, is backing up junior/sophomore Joe Schmitt (6-3, 267) at offensive right tackle.

The 6-5, 271-pound Carter, a graduate of Clyde High School, is being counted on for the future at Ball State which is 5-3 overall and 4-1 in the Mid-American Conference heading into today's 3:30 p.m. game against Eastern Michigan University (2-7, 2-4) at Rynearson Stadium in Ypsilanti, Mich.

Today's game will be televised on the MAC Television Network. Moore dons jersey No. 41 while Carter is No. 68.

Perkins graduate Joe Magee was slated to be a member of the Ball State team this season as a fifth-year player on the offensive line. However he was diagnosed with high blood pressure during preseason camp and was advised not to play.

Mark Van Meter continues as one of the leading tacklers for the University of Pennsylvania football team.

Van Meter, a 6-2, 225-pound junior linebacker, who prepped at Huron High School, has recorded 44 tackles for the Quakers who are 2-4 overall and 0-3 in the Ivy League.

Only Tim Foster (47) and John Bishop (46) are ahead of Van Meter, who also has two tackles for loss of yards, one quarterback sack for a three-yard loss, one fumble return and one pass interception and 13-yard return.

Kirk Brindley has moved into a backup role on the offensive line for Kent State University's football team.

Brindley, who spent the early part of the season with the scout team, is backing up senior Doug Morgan (6-4, 286) at right offensive tackle.

The 6-5, 292-pound Brindley, a graduate of Margaretta High School, is in his sophomore year eligibility-wise.

The Golden Flashes, 2-6 overall and 1-4 in the Mid-American Conference, host Central Michigan University (4-5, 3-3), at 1 p.m., today, at Dix Stadium, in Kent, Ohio.

Two senior captains were instrumental.

Gowdy bolted for 13 to the Vermilion 13, then Williams powered his way for 11 more and another first down. Gowdy ripped off a 24-yard burst to the nine to set up a first and goal.

After two losses in a row pushed the Streaks back to the 16, Newell lofted a pass toward the end zone.

The 6-3 Williamson was

matched against the 5-3 Nemeth, and Williamson won the jump ball for the touchdown at the 9:14 mark. Poeschl kicked a 30-yard extra point for a 7-0 lead.

Sandusky drove 56 yards in six plays, then came right back after Vermilion went three plays and out, and drove 36 yards in six plays.

Gowdy ran four yards and Williams 10 on another burst up the middle to ignite the drive. Newell hit senior Chuck Willinger on an 11-yard pass play to get it to the 11. After a yard loss, Williams skirted the right side and used his speed, plus a great block by Willinger, to dash into the end zone from 12 yards out. Poeschl again kicked the PAT.

The final score came with 2:28 left in the game as Williams struck for his 15th touchdown of the season, this one from 10 yards out, to cap a drive of 57 yards in 7 plays. Gowdy's 18-yard jaunt and one of 15 by Williams preceded the touchdown run.

Elyria is co-champion

LORAIN — Elyria has earned a share of the Erie Shore Conference football championship. The Pioneers outscored Lorain Admiral King 25-0 in the middle quarters and rode the three-touchdown effort of Cameo Bright to pound the hosts, 39-14.

Elyria and North Ridgeville wound up as co-champions with identical 4-1 records in the final year of the conference which had eight schools at one time, but just six remained this season. Bright ran for 208 yards on 29 carries and scored on runs of 1, 3 and 9 yards. He averaged 7.2 yards per carry.

Quarterback Mike Groomes added a pair of touchdown runs for the Pioneers who closed with a rush for a 6-4 season. Admiral King dropped its fourth straight conference game after opening with a win over Sandusky.

Monroeville secures VI playoff berth

ASHLAND — Monroeville nailed down a Division VI, Region 22 playoff berth with a 22-12 win over Ashland Crestview Friday night.

The Eagles (8-2, 6-1) will most likely finish second to FC rival St. Paul in the computer ranking, and needs a Mapleton win over the undefeated Flyers tonight at Whitney Field to pick up a piece of the league title.

The Cougars (5-5, 4-3) jumped in front early on a 3 yard Jerry Poth run, but Clint Poths raced 40 yards and added the extra point kick to take a 7-6 lead.

David Brandon pushed Crestview back into the lead when he went in from 15 yards out with 8:19 left in the first half.

Jon Roeder put Monroeville in the lead to stay with a three yard run late in the third quarter with Andy Schwochow hitting Brad Smith on the conversion pass to make it a 15-12 lead.

Poth then added the insurance score by going in from four yards

out and booting the extra point kick with 1:06 left to play.

The Eagles piled up 321 yards total offense with 163 coming on the ground. The visitors also picked off a pair of Cougar passes and recovered a two fumbles.

South Central Plymouth 32 6

GREENWICH — Doug Dendinger ran for three touchdowns and passed for another leading South Central to a 32-6 win over Plymouth in the season finale for both teams Friday.

Both teams finished with over 300 yards total offense in the game, but the Trojans (4-4, 4-3) intercepted three Big Red passes and recovered a fumble.

Dendinger went in from six yards out to opening the scoring with Plymouth (1-9, 1-6) closing the gap to 7-6 on a 46-yard run from Fred Hawk.

But Dendinger answered by going over from the one before the first quarter ended to push the Trojan lead to 13-0.

The score stayed that way until Dendinger got his second 6-yard touchdown run of the night with 7:26 left in the third quarter and then hit Ty Stevenson for a 36-yard scoring pass five minutes later as South Central pulled out to a 25-6 advantage.

Stevenson hit Brandon Osborne with a 38-yard touchdown strike and Greg Ramsey hit his second extra point conversion of the night to end the scoring.

The Trojans piled up 375 yards total offense with 201 on the ground while the Big Red finished with 292 yards rushing.

New London W. Reserve 50 28

COLLINS — Anthony Daniels scored four times in leading New London to a 50-28 win over Western Reserve Friday night.

The Wildcats, finishing 5-5 overall and 3-4 in the Firelands Conference, broke the game open with 23 points in the third quarter.

Daniels scored on runs of 23 and four yards in the first half as the

Wildcats built a 21-14 lead. He scored two more times in the third quarter on runs of 48 and 82 yards to go with a 29-yard field goal by Brian Gault and an 18-yard scoring run by Ben Pack.

Together the teams piled up over 900 yards offense with New London having 484 yards including 451 on the ground while the Roughriders, who finished 0-10 overall and 0-7 in the conference, had 461 yards offense with 331 on the ground.

"There was a lot of offense on the field and Daniels had well over 200 yards rushing for them," said Western Reserve head coach Gary Lill.

"It was only 21-14 at the half and we were right in it but a lot of mistakes in the second half gave them good field position and they were able to take advantage of it."

"(Sonny) Bivins did a nice job running the option and (Dustin) Dow had over 100 yards rushing again and those were some positive things which I feel we can build on for next season," added Lill.
