Hillsdale, **Ashland Win**

ASHLAND - The host teams for the eighth annual Ashland Relays weren't acting very hospitable here yesterday, as both Ashland and Hillsdale came away with class championships at Ashland high school.

Ashland's Arrows took the Class "AAA" title with 53 points, while the Falcons of Hillsdale captured Class "A-AA" laurels with 56 points.

The Arrows started off right by trimming 18.1 seconds off the four - mile relay record set by Mount Vernon in 1967. All in all, five records tumbled in the "AAA" meet, with Ashland owning a hand in three of the new standards.

The Madison Rams accumulated 47 points to take second place honors in Class "AAA". Ram victories came in the 440-yard relay, the discus, the medley relay and the 880-yard relay.

The medley relay involves runners going distances of 440, 330, 220 and 110 vards.

LARGE MARGIN

Hillsdale simply ran away from its opposition in the "A-AA" feature, outscoring Plymouth, its closest competitor, by 20 points. The Falcons finished out of the scoring in only one event, while amassing five first places. In addition, Hillsdale broke two of the four Relays records that fell in the A-AA meet.

The victory was Ashland's third in succession in the Relays, while Hillsdale produced its second consecutive championship.

Sixteen teams were entered in the Relays, eight in each class.




