CHICAGO — Ray Robinson, it says here, has bet \$2,000 that he will whip Gene Fullmer tonight and regain the middleweight championship of the world for the third time.

That's a crazy thing to do? Well, the man is in full possession of his faculties, with the possible exception of his hearing. Evidently he wasn't listening when Barney Ross visited his camp in Greenwood Lake, N. Y. a fortnight ago.

"How long before you retired," a man had asked Ross "did you realize that you were over the hill?"

"I found it out the night I retired," Barney said. "In my last fight with Henry Armstrong, I was in the seventh round, and he hit me a right hand, I had my left up here and I saw the punch coming, and he hit me. Right away he hit me again with the same punch and then he caught me with a hook. I knew then, I knew that if Armstrong could hit me that punch, then there was nothing left for me."

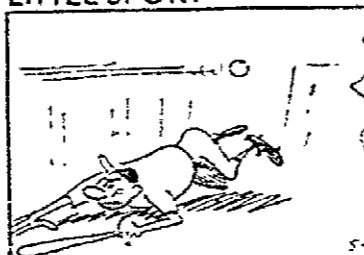


Illustration of a person in a dynamic pose, possibly a runner or athlete.

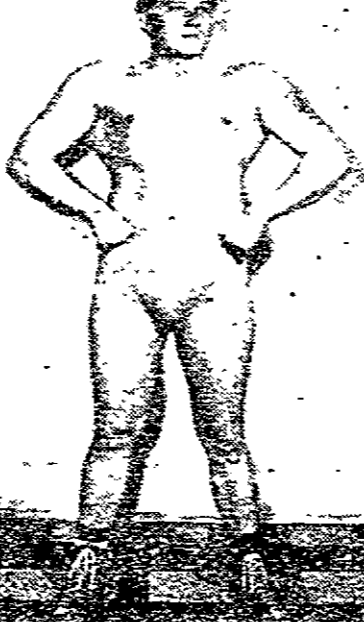

BUCYRUS — Host Bucyrus High completely overwhelmed Galion and Mansfield Madison in a triangular track and field meet at Lane St. Athletic Field here last night.

The strong Redmen won 10 events and finished one-two in four to stack up 76 3/5 points. Galion was second with 36 and Madison wound up with 29 2/5.

John Pirastilli, John Kiess and Ed Light paced the Bucyrus rout. Pirastilli snared the high hurdles and the 220 and 440-yard dashes and tied for third in the high jump. Madison's Fred Fischer and Tom Steel enabled Kiess to post the rapid \$80 clocking. The Ram twosome set the pace most of the way only to have Kiess come on strong at the finish.

Galion's Jim Blaine snagged the 100 in 10.3 and came back to head the broad jumpers.

Competition is expected to be particularly fierce in the 100 and 220 yard dash events with three top-flight performers pitted against each other. The trio is composed of Bellville's Larry Black, Mike Bash of Loudonville and Tom Money of Millersburg. Money has turned in a 10.2 clocking in the 100 this season while Black and Bash have been under 10.5.

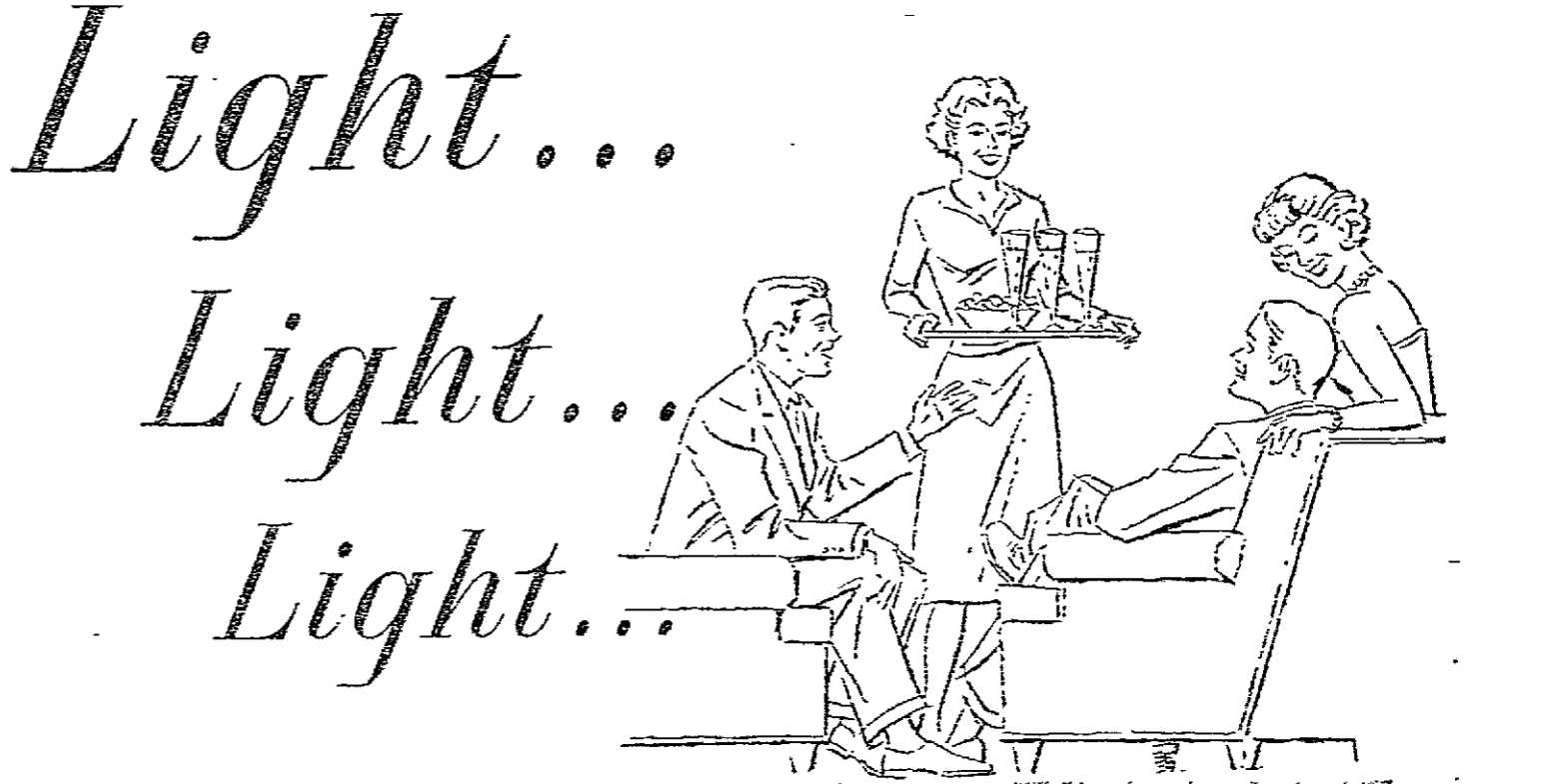
