# Marion Shades Tyger Baseballers, 2 To 1

## Senior High Ace Loses Four-Hitter

THE "GLAMOR" jobs have been pretty well filled but there are several plums, coaching gender, still available for the plucking in Mansfield schools. . . . Senior High (Tom Pierson), and Madison (James Cook) have decided on their head football coaches while St. Peter's High has tabbed Robert Frye as its first basketball mentor. . . . One top position is still available at Madison. . . . That is the basketball coach to follow Don Sutter, who resigned. . . . Forty men have applied for this post and the final five interviews are scheduled Saturday. . . . This vacancy might be filled then. . . . Madison also needs an assistant football coach, a reserve basketball coach and a freshman basketball coach. . . . St. Peter's is looking for an assistant coach mentor. . . . Senior High, however, has the biggest replacement problem. . . . Tyger officials are looking for four assistant football tutors as Pierson hopes to use three assistants to teach the varsity and a pair to handle a separate reserve squad. . . . One of these four will assist in basketball. . . . And from their ranks must come an assistant track mentor plus golf and wrestling coaches. . . . Senior High will truly have a new look in coaching next school year.

Marion Harding spoiled Mansfield Senior High School's night baseball debut, 2-1, last night at Liberty Park. The Prexies managed only four hits off Jerry Wharton while St. Peter's High third and seventh innings for single runs. One of the tallies was unearned. Wharton now permitted Marion only nine hits in two games but has been the loser both times.

**LOTS OF WHIFFS**  
Last night, the junior right hander, struck out 11 and walked only two. Marion put together singles by Babich and Perry and an error for the run in the third. Then in the top of the seventh, Ishida doubled and with two out Babich drove in the winning run with another single. Prichard, who struck out 13, scattered five Mansfield hits. Only in the second inning did Mansfield threaten. With two out, Vic Pfizenmayer singled and rode home on a double by Ron Heilman. Wharton drew a walk but Barry Hawkins whiffed. Mansfield, with three wins and four losses, swings back into action Friday at Shelby. The Tygers meet Shelby again in the Galion sectional Class AA meet Saturday afternoon. Two Mansfield games were rained out this week.
