## Tribe Belts Detroit In 10-4 Breeze

CLEVELAND (AP) — The Cleveland Indians open an 11-game home stand tonight, meeting the Chicago White Sox in the first of a four-game series.

The Tribe has played only the Kansas City Athletics and the Detroit Tigers so far but will meet all American League eastern clubs in addition to the White Sox in their current home stand.

**SCORE TO PITCH**  
Herb Score, who lost to the Athletics here Sunday, pitches tonight against Dick Donovan, Cal McLish will be the Indians pitcher Saturday afternoon and Gary Bell and Don Ferrarese pitch the Tribe's first doubleheader of the season Sunday.

The Indians won their ninth game in 10 starts Thursday by defeating the Detroit Tigers, 10-4, at Detroit and now lead the league by three games.

Relief Pitcher Dick Brodowski earned the victory and now has a 2-0 record. He believed Rookie Jim Perry in the fifth inning and blanked the Tigers on three hits the rest of the way.

The loss went to Ray Narleski.

A three-run homer by Billy Martin in the third put the game on ice for the Tribe.

**LASTS UNTIL FIFTH**  
Perry, making his first appearance in a major league game, held the Tigers scoreless in the first three innings, but gave up a run in the fourth and was lifted after being nicked for three hits in the fifth.

The young right-hander drove in the Indians' first two runs with a bases-loaded single in the second.

The victory was the fifth straight for the Indians over the Tigers.

## Yankees Trailing Jordan's In First Defense

Is this the year the American League has a pennant race? Could be. Two weeks have passed and the New York Yankees haven't been in first place yet. Fact is, they're tied for second and trail Cleveland's hatchet-swinging Indians by three games.

What's more, Bob Turley, the Yankees' right-handed ace, has won but once in three decisions, and the world champions' pitching staff has produced just three complete games (two by Whitey Ford) in nine starts.

This is hardly enough to suggest that the AL is going to have a new champ for the first time since 1954, when another band of Indians out-ran the Yankees. But it is enough to have Manager Casey Stengel grumbling to his Yanks that he told 'em so.

At the moment, it looks as though it might be downright tough. The Indians, easily the most improved club in the league, made it nine out of 10 by once more thumping Detroit's timid Tigers, 10-4 Thursday. The Yankees, meanwhile, were defeated 3-2 at Washington as the Senators beat Turley for the first time in four years. Chicago's idle White Sox gained a share of second with New York, while Baltimore took fourth place by turning back Boston 8-7.

**ERROR DOES IT**  
Turley, who had won 12 in a row from the Nats since May 30, 1955, was handed his second loss by Bobby Richardson's error in a three-run Washington seventh.

Russ Kemmerer won his second for the Nats, although giving up eight hits including Mickey Mantle's second homer, and needing Tex Clevenger's two hitless innings of relief.

Willie Tasby, a favorite for rookie-of-the-year honors in the AL, homered and drove in four runs for the Orioles.

## Jordan's In First Defense

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Don Jordan, a young champion of the way up, pits his speed and skill against Virgil "Honky" Akins, a veteran slugger who may be past his peak, in a twice-postponed welterweight championship fight tonight.

The oddsmakers call the fight even. This might be because half of them saw Akin destroy Vince Martinez for the title a year ago, and the other half watched him badly outclassed by Jordan in Los Angeles Dec. 5.

The fight will start at 10 p. m., EST, and will be nationally televised from Kie Auditorium.

**HAUNTING FACT**  
The 31-year-old Akins and his handlers must be haunted by the fact the St. Louis fighter has looked back in all three of his fights since he blasted Martinez for the crown.

Jordan's manager, Don Neseth said Jordan likely will meet Art Aragon in Los Angeles if he defeats Akins.

Akins could gain a match with ex-champ Carmen Basilio if he wins and looks good doing it.

Jordan, a 24-year-old part Apache Indian who was one of 19 children, has come fast only a year ago he was regarded as merely a big light weight.

The fight was reset after a tornado ripped the St. Louis Arena, then reset again after Jordan's wife became ill.
