Penguins Cop Golf In Breeze

Tom Barto, Youngstown University senior, shot a four-under-par 68 to finish as medalist while leading his team to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics district golf tournament championship at Possum Run Tuesday.

The lanky Penguin number two man collected eight birdies, six pars, and four bogeys to finish five strokes ahead of Mansfield's Bob Scodova of Ashland College (37-36-73).

Scodova, who scored five strokes under his average, and the three top Penguins will represent District 22 in the NAIA national championship in Quincy, Ill., June 16-17-18-19.

Ashland finished 32 strokes behind the Penguins' 291. The six-man Youngstown contingent totaled 448 for an average of 74 with the high man hitting 79.

Only the low four tallies from each team counted. Youngstown's Ed Antonelli won a sudden death playoff for alternate in three strokes to Chuck Dayton's five after the Baldwin - Wallace senior tied him in regulation play at 75.
