The slim, 24-year-old native of Lafayette, Ala., was tabbed at the beginning of spring training to succeed Hubbs, who died in a plane crash just before he was due to report to camp, but then lost the job.

Top Stars Join Cast For Relays

Two of Ohio's finest track-field athletes are included in the latest group of entries for the 33rd Mansfield Relays Friday and Saturday at Me-hock Field.

Six more schools entered today to build the field to 155 schools and 2,163 athletes from three states.

Top athletes coming into the fold today are Malabar's Johnny Linta and Cleveland St. Joseph's Ken Prince. Prince is the defending champion in the 440-yard dash here.

WELL KNOWN

Linta's pole vault deeds are well known to Mansfielders. He placed second in the 1963 Relays but tied for first in the state meet. Later in the summer he set an Ohio record of 14 feet, 1 1/2 inches. His first outdoor outing this week produced a 13-9 vault, highest early season vault in Ohio track history.

The Relays pole vault record of 13-6 was set last year by Marion Harding's Jim Showers, who tied Linta in the state meet.

The Big Red picked up five first places with the wins coming in the 440-yard dash, 180-yard low hurdles, mile relay, pole vault and high jump.

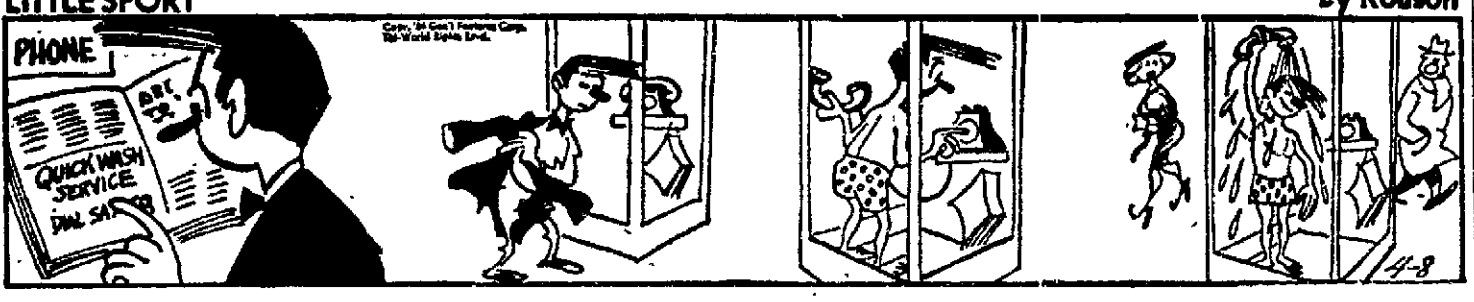
Norwalk's Knoll was the only double winner, with wins in the 880-yard run and mile run.

They are infielder-outfielder Deron Johnson, a one-time New York Yankee farmhand, and 19-year-old Billy McCool. Both showed well Tuesday as the Reds beat the Philadelphia Phillies, 6-4.

Johnson, playing at first base, had two hits, one of them a two-run homer, and McCool fanned two and walked two in the one hitless inning he pitched.

Manager Fred Hutchinson said Johnson "is going to play a lot of ball for us."
