Dodgers Finish Sweep Of Reds

LA Boosts Lead To 2 Full Games

CINCINNATI (AP) — It's far too early to try and predict what's going to happen in the pennant race," said Walt Alston, "but I'm well pleased with my team."

Alston's hustling Los Angeles Dodgers pushed Cincinnati out of the National League lead by completing a three-game sweep over the Reds with a 4-3 victory Thursday night.

DODGER WINGING
As a result, the Dodgers went winging back to the West Coast with a two-game lead, while the Reds moved into Pittsburgh for their first meeting with the Pirates tonight.

The Dodgers, who beat the Reds only four times last season, took a liking to Crosley Field fences and generally ignored the belief Cincinnati has the top pitching staff in the league. Los Angeles had hit only seven home runs before coming here, but pounded Cincinnati hurlers for six. Last year, Los Angeles got just five home runs off Cincinnati pitchers.

Derrell Griffith smashed his first homer of the year Thursday night in the fourth inning off Red starter and loser John Tsitouris. Ron Fairly followed in the fifth inning by tagging Joe Nuxhall for his fourth homer of the campaign.

10 STRANDED
Cincinnati left 10 runners stranded. Frank Robinson got his fifth home run in the second inning, but had to leave the game later because of trouble gripping the bat.

Robinson injured his hand while sliding in a game Sunday. Johnny Podres gained his second victory without a loss. Sammy Ellis, winner of four straight against no defeats, hurled for Cincinnati at Pittsburgh tonight and will face Bob Friend, 2-2.
