## Joe Adcock 'Sets' Starting Lineup

NEW ORLEANS, La. (AP) — One-third of the Cleveland Indians' batting order against the Athletics in the season opener at Kansas City Tuesday night depends on whether the A's starting pitcher is a right-hander or a left-hander.

In announcing the lineup for the opener, Manager Joe Adcock said if a right-hander pitches for Kansas City Vic Davalillo (cf) will lead off and Max Alvis (3b) will bat second. Against a southpaw starter, Alvis will bat first and Davalillo second.

## Maloney's Sharp In Short Stint

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — There's nothing wrong with Jim Maloney's hand but there is some doubt about the future of two other Cincinnati Reds pitchers.

The Cleveland Indians came from behind and whipped the Reds 11-4 Thursday in exhibition play. All the Cleveland runs were charged to relief pitchers Ernie Broglio and Aurelio Monteagudo.

Maloney, scheduled to pitch on Opening Day, left in the third inning after trying to field a hot smash by Vic Davalillo with his bare hand. Manager Dave Bristol said his starter was not hurt.

### 'LITTLE EARLY'

"I hadn't planned to use Jim more than three innings anyway," he said. "So I decided to take him out a little early."

Maloney had given up one hit and one walk and left with a 2-0 lead. Broglio relieved and when he left after the sixth inning, the Reds trailed 5-2.

Monteagudo was treated even worse. The Indians scored four runs in the seventh and two in the eighth before Darrell Osteen came in to stop the onslaught.

John Edwards and Chico Ruiz hit solo home runs for the Reds.

Sammy Ellis and Gary Nolan were scheduled to pitch for the Reds today against Cleveland.

Pairings for the Mansfield Sectional Class AA baseball tournament were made last night.

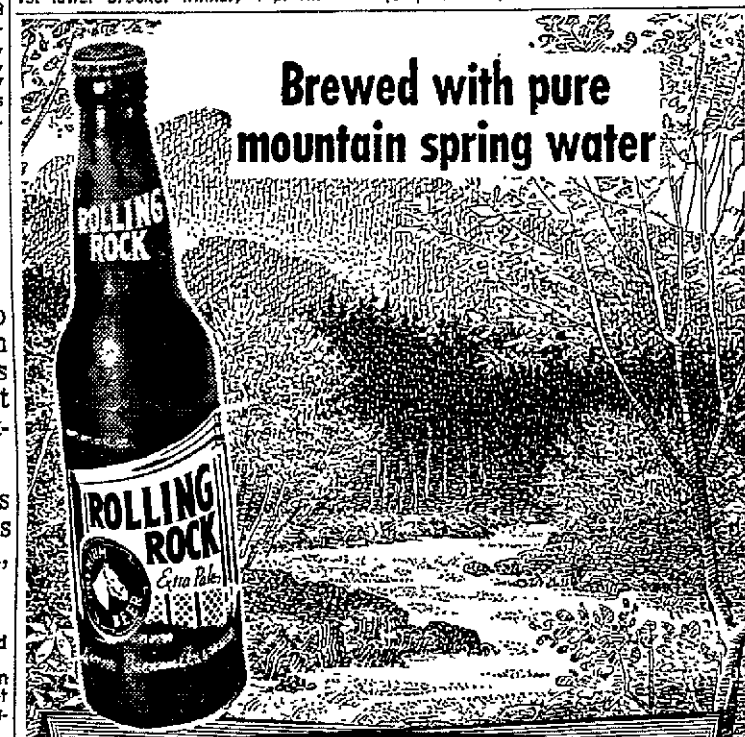
In the upper bracket, Malabar will play Ontario on April 20. Mansfield Senior plays the winner April 24.
