

Plymouth Runner-Up

Defending champion Plymouth was runner-up in the fifth annual Ashland College Indoor Track Relays for Class A-AA schools Monday night.

The Big Red compiled 39 points, well behind winner Hillsdale which had 56½ points in the eight-school field. Crestview was third at 37½, followed by Mapleton with 34, Crestline 19, South Central 15, Black River 12½ and Lucas with 10½ points.

LEE WILKINS AND TIM NESBITT were individual winners for Plymouth, while Roger Ousley of South Central successfully defended his title in the high jump.

Wilkins dashed to the finish line in the 50-yard dash in 5.9, and Nesbitt captured two-mile honors in 10:45.4. Ousley, who leaped 6-1 a year ago, claimed first place with an effort of an even 6-0.

John Conley was a busy performer for

Plymouth. He ranked second in the 50-yard low hurdles in 6.6, was also second in the pole vault at 11-6, and fourth in the long jump at 18-4¾. In addition, Conley joined Wilkins, Dean Cline and Brad Buzard on the sprint medley relay which was runner-up.

JIM SUTTER WAS runner-up in the mile in 4:50.9 for the Big Red, and Wilkins placed second in the high jump at 5-11. The two-mile relay entry of Ken Lucas, Mike Adams, Don Cunningham and Mike Courtright also wound up second.

In addition to Ousley's victory, Randy Bacon leaped 19-1 for third spot for the Trojans in the long jump. Arnie Poth was fourth in the two-mile.

Demetrius Reeves of Crestline was the long double winner, and Ted Stake of Hillsdale tied the meet record in the pole vault at 12-0.
