Hillsdale High's track coach Bob Valentine was playing pretty coy before the Ashland Indoor Class A-AA Track Meet. He would rather talk about other athletes or other sports than his Falcons. It was apparent that Valentine was going to let his youthful cindermen do his talking.

A balanced attack led Hillsdale to a meet-long lead in the Indoor Classic at Ashland College's Conard Fieldhouse as the Falcons ran to 56½ points, good for the 1972 championship Monday.

Defending champ Plymouth suffered some disappointments in a couple key events and had to settle for second place with 39 counters. Crestview and Mapleton came on strong during the relay events to place third and fourth respectively with 37½ and 34 points.

Crestline, 19, South Central, 15, Black River, 12½, and Lucas, 10½, rounded out the eight team field scoring.

Hillsdale's versatile Ted Stake led the Falcons to their early lead with a second and a third in the 50 yard high and low hurdles and then added a first in the pole vault. Darrell Rowland's 46-3½ toss of the shot also was good enough for blue ribbon honors as the Falcons continued to lengthen their lead as the meet progressed.

Hillsdale mixed seconds, thirds and fourths together for the winning combination as Gary Kline took second in the 50 yard dash while Jerry Ervin tied for fifth. Lonnie Browne took third in the mile run while Stu Smith copped third in the two mile run.

Lon Browne's brother Ron was a big surprise for Coach Valentine and the Falcons. The sturdy built trackster took first in the long jump with a leap of 19-9½ inches to edge Black River's Jim Power by one-quarter inch. Ron also added a third in the high jump with a jump of 5-11 while teammate Jerry Hart took fourth place.

Mapleton and Crestview dom-

inated the relay events with the Mounties taking three and the Cougars tapping the other blue ribbons in the remaining baton events.

Mountie Junior Roger Crossen anchored two of the victorious Mapleton relays, 1600 yard and sprint relay, displaying blazing speed and unlimited potential. Only a freak accident prevented Crossen from qualifying for the state outdoor track meet last year in the 400 yard dash. Coach Jim Reynolds is quite excited about his Mountie's chances this year.

Mapleton won the 1600 yard relay (Ken Myers, Phil Biddinger, Phil Murtaugh, Crossen) in 3:25.9. The sprint relay team of Joe Collins, Ted Iceman, Ed Kemery, Stew Light claimed the blue ribbons with a time of 1:57.6. Myers, Biddinger, Light and Crossen then combined for a 2:38.3 time in the sprint medley to gain top honors.

South Central's record breaking high jumper Roger Ousley easily won the high jump with a leap of 6-0. The lanky 6-6 Trojan star, who placed in the state meet last year, was not pushed in only his second appearance in the pits this season.

Crestline's Demetrius Reeves was the only individual to win two events during Monday's action; first in the 50 yard high and low hurdles. Tim Nesbitt claimed the two mile crown with a clocking of 10:45.4 while Cougar Wayne White took the mile run in 4:49.01 with Lonnie Browne of Hillsdale third and Mark Handley of Black River fourth.

Crestview's distance relay squad of Del McArdle, Roger Fulk, Dave Dunn, Ken White swept to the finish line in 11:38.5 with Mapleton second and Hillsdale third.

The Cougs also triumphed in the two mile relay with Del McArdle, Curt McArdle, Ken and Wayne White splitting the legs for a time of 9:19.0.

Happy Valentine pointed out that Ron Browne and Ted Stake both had fine evenings, but was ready to add that it was a team effort that gained the trophy for

the Falcons.

"For the age of our kids, we did a great job. We'll take our lumps early in the year, but we'll make some noise by the end of the season," predicted Coach Reynolds of Mapleton. "Our relays did a good job and Roger Crossen did a nice job. Our mile relay team should really come along and eventually go to state."

Black River's first year head coach Tim Myers was a little disappointed with the Pirates seventh place finish, but stated that he really couldn't expect more. "This was our second week together and we really haven't had time to work yet. Jim Power had a good night and is our top individual right now. I'm a little disappointed with our showing in the distance events," he added.

Head football and track coach at South Central Ron Minard thought Roger Ousley did a splendid job for only his second night out. "I thought he'd get a new record tonight, but Roger is just getting back into the groove. He is just getting started and we look for an outstanding year by him."

Quiet, but efficient Forest Pruner of Crestview served as meet director and felt that the officials did a fine job running the meet. "I was satisfied without showing as a team and pretty happy overall. It is pretty early to tell what for a showing a team is going to make this early in the season."

Stake of Hillsdale tied the pole vault record of Scott Lamar of Black River with a 12 foot vault. It was the only record even severely challenged as the times and distances were subpar most of the evening due to the early date of the meet.

Plymouth 3rd At Ashland Relays

Big Red Set 4 School Relays Marks, 1 Individual Record

Plymouth's thinclads fared well in Saturday's Ashland Relays, as the Big Red finished third in the eight-team Class A-AA segment of the event. Plymouth set four school relay records in the event and one individual school mark.

Coach Doug Dickson's squad totaled 31 points, to rank behind Hillsdale, which won the event with 51 points, and Mapleton with 44.

Crestview ranked fourth with 30 points, and Edison placed fifth with 26 markers, followed by Loudenville with 21, Norwalk St. Paul with 16 and Black River with four.

THE BIG RED CAPTURED three firsts in the competition. The four-mile squad of Ken Lucas, Mike Adams, Tim Nesbitt and Jim Sutter headed up the field in 20:06.7, which was just seven-tenths of a second off the Ashland Relays record, and which broke the old school mark of 22:39 set last year.

The speed-medley quartet of Dave Howard, Brad Buzard, Dean Cline and John Conley paced the field with a 2:16.4 clocking, breaking the old school mark of 2:26 established last season.

The other Plymouth first came in the two-mile relay, where Big Red cindermen completed the course in 8:51.7. Lucas, Ralph Noble, Nesbitt and Sutter competed for the winning unit, which broke the old school standard of 9:40.6, also set last year.

The Big Red 880-relay quartet finished second, while the school placed third in the shot put, fourth in the long jump and fifth in the discus. The shot putters totaled 114-7½ feet, to eclipse last year's showing of 109-7.

IN ADDITION, CONLEY established an individual mark in the pole vault, as he soared 12-10, breaking his old mark of 12-6.

"I was real pleased," commented Dickson. "Our distance boys are pretty outstanding. I'm very happy to get third in the meet, because we really don't have the depth. We only have 21 boys on the team, and that includes the freshmen."

Edison ranked first in just one event, the discus, but placed in nine events altogether. The discus trio of Al Burris, Ed Knallay and John Bostater won the event with fine combined efforts of 348-5.

THE CHARGERS WERE second in the shot put with 120-4, third in the 880-relay, 440-relay, shuttle-hurdle and pole vault, fourth in the distance medley and the mile, and fifth in the long jump.

St. Paul also captured a first place in the spring medley. The Flyer foursome of Jeff Fields, Val Holz, Mike Pusateri and Steve Furey led the field with a 1:45.3 clocking.

The Flyers also placed third in the sprint-medley and long jump relays, fourth in the 440 and fifth in the mile and shot-put.

The Big Red of Plymouth regained their John B. Firestone Invitational title Saturday evening at Black River, but not without some strong competition from surprising New London.

Plymouth snared four firsts in the meet and registered 53 total team points. John McGowan's Wildcats also claimed four premier finishes but finished a place behind with 51 points.

Pre-meet favorite Mapleton came in with 39 points in a distant third place. Mapleton's mile relay team won as expected, but the 880 relay unit fell victim to an upset as New London's Kevin Randleman, Greg Mullins, Ferber, and Mark Mullins crossed the

line in 1:40.7. The Mounties finished second with foreigner McDonald placing third.

Ken Myers, Phil Biddinger, Bill Fagert, and Roger Crossen composed the mile relay squad that clocked a 3:43.4 in a winning cause for the Mounties. They traded places with New London in this event, as the Wildcats came in second followed by Plymouth.

Crossen picked up the only other first for Mapleton with his 55.1 in the 440 yard dash, nipping teammate Myers.

New London didn't waste any time in making their presence known, as Kevin Randleman went right out and

copped the 120 yard high hurdles in the first track event. The Wildcat crossed the line in 18.35 just ahead of fellow New Londoner Ulrich. Mapleton's Ed Kemery, who entered with the fastest time in the preliminaries, finished fourth.

Randy Bacon gathered two of South Central's three places for coach Ron Minard. Bacon finished a close second in the 200 yard dash behind Plymouth's Conley. Greg Mullins placed third for New London in that event. Bacon came back with a third place attempt in the long jump, finishing behind Milt Harris of New London who leaped 20 feet.

Mapleton's Pete Murtaugh was the only area runner to place in the mile run, claiming fourth place behind winner Tom Krupko of McDonald. Plymouth's Sutter picked up valuable points with his second place hold.

Plymouth's Conley picked up his second win of the evening with his 22.5 in the 180 yard low hurdles. New London's Berg and Iceman of Mapleton were area runners that placed with a fourth and fifth respectively.

Seneca East won their only event of the day with Kessler's 2:11.85 performance in the 880 yard run. Bob Chandler picked up runner-up points for the Wildcats while Black River's Handley also placed.

Tim Nesbitt of Plymouth turned in the only great time of the meet with his 10:28.9 in the two mile run. Roger Gordon of Mapleton was the only area runner to place, crossing the tape fifth.

The Mullins brothers of New London teamed up for a one-two finish in the 220 yard dash. Mark won it in 25.1 with Greg right behind. Stu Light copped a third for Mapleton while Brian Smith of BR came in fifth.

New London picked up more challenging points with Roy Clark's second place finish in the shot put. Blankenship of the Big Red won it with a heave of over 42 feet.

McDonald's Porter came back with a win in the discus with his throw of over 125 feet. Dave Jones and Kemery of Mapleton finished four-five.

Mapleton's Iceman was the only area athlete to place in the high jump as Bailey of McDonald won it all with a

5-8 effort. Dave Findley of Western Reserve wound up activities with his 12 foot six inch vault in the pole vault competition. Joe Collins of Mapleton finished fourth.

No meet records were broken, as the track was very slow due to a new layer of cinders.

Mountie coach Jim Reynolds was pleased with the overall performance of his team, but was surprised with New London. "I knew that both the Mullins were fast and could move, but I expected Light to do better aganst them."

"Outside of the track conditions, the meet was well run and enjoyable," concluded the veteran mentor.

Plymouth, New London Lead 'A' Spikers

Eight area schools will be represented in the Class A district track meet at Ada Saturday morning.

The top six finishers from the four sectional meets earned tickets to the district with the top five at Ada advancing to Columbus for the state meet May 26-27.

PLYMOUTH WAS runner-up in the Bellevue sectional event with 74 points, and the Big Red will have seven individuals competing in seven different events Saturday.

Bill Van Wagner, John Conley and Jim

Sutter collared firsts for Coach Doug Dickson. VanWagner established a Bellevue Athletic Field record with a toss of 151-4 in the discus, and Conley skipped over the 180-yard low hurdles in 21.8. Sutter registered a time of 2:04.7 in the 880.

Plymouth was well behind champion Buckeye Central which also had three firsts, and cemented the title by running away from the field in the mile relay . . . the last event of the day.

PLYMOUTH ALSO had three seconds. Conley cleared 12-0 in the pole vault,

while Tim Nesbitt posted a mark of 10:26.0 in the two-mile and Ken Lucas was runnerup in the mile in 4:47.2.

The Big Red will also be represented by Dean Cline and Mike Adams. Adams was third in the two-mile in 10:28.6, and Cline ranked fourth in the low hurdles in 22.6 and fourth in the highs in 17.6.

A strong wind played havoc with the runners and times were considerably lower than those posted in other sectional meets at Ada, Ayersville and Findlay College.

NEW LONDON, FOURTH in the 15-school field with 43 ½ points, will have six individuals and two relays competing in a total of seven events at Ada.

Danbury accumulated 25 points with Bob Chapman posting 16 himself. The husky senior field event specialist won the shotput with a throw of 46-0¼, and added a third in the discus at 130-5. John Dress was third in the high hurdles for the Lakers at 17.6, and Charles Hallier added a pair of sixth-place finishes in the 100 and 220.

MONROEVILLE WILL have five individuals and its 880 relay team in the district, while Norwalk St. Paul has four individuals and the 880 relay competing in the same number of events...five.

For the Eagles the best finish was fourth, by Jed Myers in the 100 in 11.1, and Dan Miller 4:50.0 in the mile. Adding fifth-place finishes were Jim Limbird in the discus, Bob Ackerman in the high hurdles, Gary Jones in the 100 and the mile relay team.

St. Paul's best effort was also a fourth by Brian Pusateri in the long jump at 19-1½. Steve Furey was fifth in the 440 in 54.9. Curt Smith held the same spot in the pole vault at 11-0, and Mike Weisenberger was sixth in the mile in 4:53.8. The 880 relay team was also sixth in 1:40.9 without Jeff Fields who missed the meet.

SOUTH CENTRAL'S only representative in the district will be Arnold Poth who was fifth in the two-mile in 10:46.4.

Buckeye Central's Mike Kempf set the only meet record with an excellent 10:09.2 effort in the two-mile. He also bettered the field mark. The champions also won the mile relay and Dick Kempf won the mile in 4:45.1.

Milt Harris captured first in the long jump at 20-5½, and the 880-yard relay team of Kevin Randleman, John Ferber, Greg Mullins and Mark Mullins posted a mark of 1:36.8 to win handily, Mark Mullins came back later in the day with a 23.8

listing to grab top honors in the 220 with his brother, Greg, fifth in 24.5.

Randleman was second in the high hurdles in 16.7, while Tom Funk soared 11-0 for fifth in the pole vault. Bob Chandler fell back to fifth in the 880 in 2:05.8, and the mile relay team was sixth in 3:45.1.

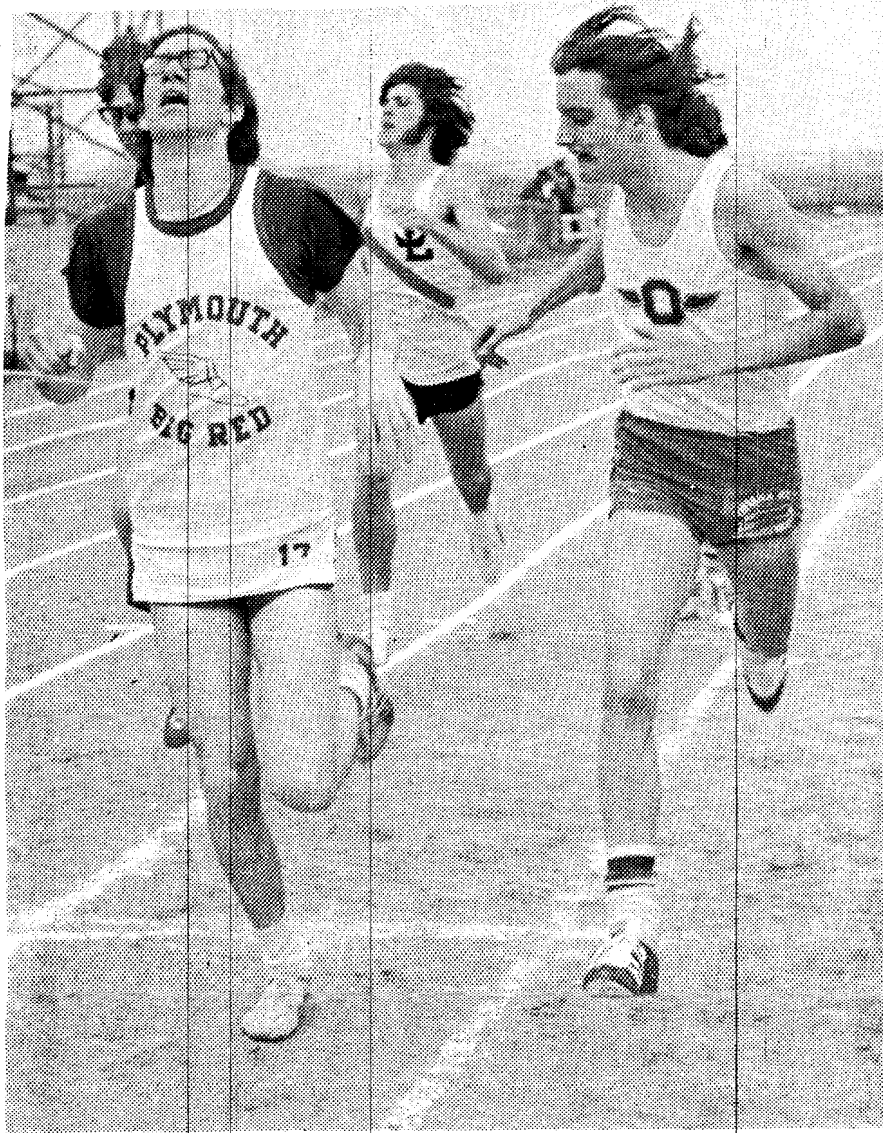
SENECA EAST WILL have entrants in eight events in the district, but only one performance was above average in the sectional. The 880-yard relay team was second in 1:38.0, and Gary Weaver

placed third in the long jump at 19-3½, and fourth in the 220 in 24.5. Teammate Ken Feasel was sixth in both the long jump and high hurdles, while Dave Kessler's 2:05.2 effort was good for third in the 880. Tom Fries ranked fourth in the two-mile at 10:37.7, and the mile relay entry wound up third in 3:40.8. Mike Utz was fifth in the low hurdles for the Tigers.

Western Reserve amassed 31 1/5 points, but only four in the running events. The Roughriders were leading

after the conclusion of the five field events.

DAN FINLEY CLEARED 12-6 in the pole vault for one victory, and younger brother Dave was third at 12-0. Coach John Speer will also have Keith Foster and Pat Conry in the district. Foster came through with a 54.6 mark for fourth in the 440, and Conry was sixth in the shot put and fourth in the discus. Western was without its top hurdler and long jump record-holder, Ron Strimpfel, who missed the event because of sickness.

Buckeye Central Wins Sectional

BELLEVUE — Buckeye Central copped the final two events of the day to secure the team title here in the day-long Class A Sectional Track and Field Championships.

Ahead by a scant eight points over fast-closing Plymouth High School, the Bucks garnered first places in the two-mile run and mile relay to breeze to the Sectional crown with a total of 92 points. The Big Red finished in the second spot with 74.

Mike Kempf, who captured the two-mile event for Buckeye Central, also set a Sectional record. His time of 10:09.2 erased the previous standard of 10:14.9 set by Tim Nesbitt of Plymouth in 1971. Nesbitt placed second this year with a clocking of 10:26. Buckeye Central's mile relay time was 3:37.5.

Fostoria St. Wendelin finished in the third position with 50 1-5 points, while New London was fourth with 43½.

TOP SPOTS

Other first places for Buckeye Central were in the 100-yard dash, where John Wechter turned in a 10.9 clocking; Dick Kempf's 4:45.1 in the mile run and Kevin Roush's 440-yard dash tour of 52.1.

Bill VanWagner's first-place finish in the discus, a throw of 151 feet, 4 inches, headed three Plymouth top spots. Jim Sutter posted a 2:04.7 in the 880-yard run and John Conley hit 21.8 in the 180-yard low hurdles.

Lucas' Gary Constance took high jump laurels with a leap of five feet, six inches.

The top six finishers in each category move on to the District meet May 20 at Ohio Northern University in Ada.

Ontario's Warriors Repeat In Johnny Appleseed Meet

LONDONVILLE — Ontario repeated as Johnny Appleseed Conference track and field champion here last evening, collecting 81 points in overshadowing seven league foes. Second-place Plymouth had 36 points.

The Warriors, winners of nine of the twelve encounters in JAC competition since 1961, ran up 20 points in field events and then piled up 61 points in track victories.

ONE IN FIELD

Chuck Leicy was the only Ontario member to take a victory in the afternoon field trials. Leicy's leap of 5 feet, 11 inches garnered first place in the high jump. Ontario's depth in the remaining four field contests zoomed the JAC defending champs ahead, entering the 7:30 p.m. finals.

The powerful Warriors won seven of the night contests while setting one record. In the 880-yard relays Ontario's Jeff Au, Paul Lucic, John Goetz and Bob Shafer entered the books with a 1:34.4 clocking. The victory chopped a tenth of a second off the 1971 mark established by Plymouth.

Only in the hurdle events did Ontario fail to break the tape. Crestline's Demetrius Reeves, won the 120-yard highs and John Conley, of Plymouth outdistanced the competition in the 180-yard low sticks with a 21.1 time. Clear Fork's Nick Kuelling snared the other event that the strong Warriors did not manage to win. Kuelling's 53.4 time in the 440-yard dash won the race.

Winners for Ontario were: Mike Stoffer with a 4:34.4 time in the mile run; Steve Burkholder, 2:01.9 in the 880-yard run; Paul Lucic, in the 220-yard dash with a 23.8 time; Ontario's mile re-

lay team with a 3:37.3 time and two mile champion Mike Mitchell, who broke the tape with 9:42.9. Mitchell's time barely missed a record of 9:42.8.
