

# Four Mile Relay Quartets Tops

Mile relay teams streaked into The News Journal weekly Honor Roll in boys high school track and field.

In all three classes, a Mansfield area school won a sectional mile relay. In Class AAA, Malabar won in a time of 3:23.4. Shelby's mile quartet turned in a 3:25.8 at the Class AA sectional at Mehoek Field and Northmor was clocked in 3:30.7 Saturday in a Class A sectional at Delaware Hayes.

Notoriously weak in field events this season, area athletes did manage at least one superb effort in each class.

Tops was a 63-foot shot put by Class A Loudonville's Rusty Reynolds Saturday at a sectional meet at Cuyahoga Heights.

Sophomore Jim Titlow of Clear Fork increased his Class AA lead in the discus with a fling of 164 feet, four inches at Mehoek Field Saturday and Galion's Mike Stall pole vaulted 13 feet, six inches in Class AAA.

In triple-A distance runners were dominant. Malabar's Rob Pritchard set a school record in the mile run with his 4:26.7 and teammate Jim Loesch stopped the clock at 1:58.5 in the 880-yard run. Ashland's Ed Goard, only a sophomore, was the first Class AAA runner to go under 10 minutes in the two-mile run with a 9:59.3 Saturday at the Class AAA sectional in Sandusky.

Leading in nine of 15 events, Shelby athletes practically own the double-A Honor Roll. The leaders didn't change but two Whippets lowered their times appreciably. Tim Tarvin ran the mile in

4:26.9 and Dennis Arnold flew around the quartermile in 50.7 Saturday at Mehoek Field.

In Class A, Loudonville ran a strong 1:34.8 in the 880-yard relay Saturday and still came in second Northmor's Don Carter lowered his 440 time to 50.4 and Mapleton's Bill Gribben dropped his time in the high hurdles to 14.8

## Ford Leads Class AAA

Bernard Ford of Mansfield Senior High will lead a contingent of 21 area individuals and five relay teams into the Class AAA district track and field meet at Lucas County Recreation Center in Toledo. Only two will survive from each event.

Ford was the area's only Class AAA sectional double winner taking the 120-yard high hurdles in 14.8 and the 180-yard lows in 20.3. His top competition will likely be Malabar's Darrick Beauford (14.9), Ashland's Mike Casey (15.0), Toledo Scott's Ralph Warren, who won Lucas County Sectional in 15.0 and Placide of Lima Shawnee (14.6) in the lows, he will have to beat back Placide and Warren, winners at 20.2. Warren has gone 19.6

Other sectional champions from Mansfield are Bill Keefe, Rob Pritchard, Curtis Hall and Jim Loesch of Malabar and the Falcons' mile relay team.

However, Keefe pulled a leg muscle Tuesday at the Cardinal Conference meet so it will be up to Hall to lead the dash men. Hall won the quartermile in 50.4. Other dash qualifiers from the Mansfield area are Mike Reynolds (50.5) of Madison and Ron Tucker (50.6) of Malabar. Keefe had qualified by winning the 220 (22.5) and running a 10.2 100-yard dash.

Some of the dash men coming in will be Mike Worlds (10.1) in the 100, 22.4 in the 220 of Toledo Macomber. Tom Spooner (22.3) of Toledo Whitmer, Charles Ray (22.1) of Toledo Scott and Carl Bembry (19.4) in the 440 of Macomber

Malabar's Pritchard and Loesch will lead area distance men. Pritchard won the mile in 4:26.9 and Loesch grabbed top honors in the 880-yard run in 1:58.5. Loesch's top competition will likely be Madison's Don Gregg (1:59.6) and Pritchard's top foe will probably be Jackson (1:26.5) of Lima Shawnee. There are many sub-two-minute two-milers entered in the district meet, led by Windnagle (9:36.5) of Defiance.

Toledo Macomber and Malabar were the two best mile relay squads. Macomber ran a 3:22.6 last week while the Falcons were going 3:23.4 and Madison was clocking a 3:24.1. Toledo Scott looks like the class of the 880 relay, winning easily in 1:31.9. Scott has gone 1:29.5

Malabar's Clint Williams went 21-3/4 for a third Saturday. Beating him at Sandusky were Rayfus Campbell (22-1) of Sandusky Perkins and Ed Holmes (21-4 1/4) of Fremont Ross. The man to beat is Worlds (23-8 1/4)

Other area men in the field are Madison's Brad Gutshall in the high jump and Jeff Gordon in the shot put, Lexington's Frank Wuchich in the shot put and Galion's Mike Stall in the pole vault. Some of the top competitors in the field will be discus tossers Scott Fisher (182-0) of Sandusky, Mark Raesen (163-0) of Tiffin Columbian and Tim Dillon (157-4) of Findlay and high jumper Brad Bosse (6-8) of Findlay

## 67 Qualify In Class A

Led by Crestview's Tony Nabors and Wynford's Faron Volkmer, the Mansfield area has qualified 67 athletes and 15 relay teams into Class A district competition in three different sites Friday and Saturday

Crestview, Buckeye Central, New London, Wynford, South Central and Plymouth all have representatives at the Findlay College District. The top five in each event Saturday will advance to the state meet in Columbus.

Mapleton, Hillsdale, Loudonville and Black River will all be represented Friday and Saturday at the Kent Roosevelt High District where three in each event will travel to Columbus.

Northmor, Highland, Fredericktown and Cardington Lincoln each have athletes at the two-day Bexley High District, beginning Friday. Only the top two will survive to make the trip across town to Ohio State University.

Crestview advanced 12 individuals and its mile relay team to the district. The mile squad goes as champion (3:30.9).

Other sectional champions from Crestview include Tony Nabors, Tony Crank and Ken Lemieux. Nabors, who qualified in four events, won the long jump (20-6 1/2) and the 180-yard low hurdles (20.6). Crank won the sectional pole vault competition (12-10) and Lemieux took top honors in the halfmile (2:01.2). Besides Nabors, the only other Cougar competing in more than one event is Keith Napier in both hurdles.

Buckeye Central will send two sectional champions into battle. Jim Gray tossed the shot 50 feet, 2 1/2 inches and the Bucks' 880-yard relay team won in 1:35.1

Though Volkmer will be competing in four events, Wynford's only sectional champion was Chris Dunlap in the two-mile (10:17.7)

Brian Granneman of New London matched Nabors' performance of winning two sectional titles and the Wildcat youngster will be competing in three events. He won the high jump (6-0) and the high hurdles (15.4). New London's other section champion is Herb Gregory in the mile (4:32.2)

At Kent, Mansfield's area four schools will be represented by six sectional champions

Bill Gribben, who will also compete in the lows, won the high hurdles in 14.9. Teammate Steve Light won the 440 in 51.1 and will be competing in the 220. Mountic Steve Shepherd won the 880 in 2:01.1

Hillsdale's Marty Myers won the high jump with a leap of 6-foot-5. Loudonville's Rusty Reynolds won the shot put event with the state's top Class A effort of 63 feet and Black River's Steve Rook took two-mile laurels in 10:03.2

Don Purcell of Loudonville, competing in both weights events, will join Gribben and Light as the area's only men to compete in more than one event

## Shelby High Invades Track-Field District

A run-down on area Class AA athletes going to the boys high school track and field districts would read like a who's who on the Shelby track squad.

Eleven men will be competing in 13 events, plus both Whippet relay squads qualified.

Going to the Bowling Green State University District along with Shelby will be 11 other area athletes and two relay teams. The top three in each event will qualify for the state meet May 28-29 at the Ohio State University.

Mt. Gilead will be representing the area with three individuals Friday and Saturday at Bexley High. Only the top two will advance to state

Leading the Whippets into competition will be three sectional champions and a winning mile relay team. Tim Tarvin won the mile in 4:26.9 for Shelby and right on his heels was Colonel Crawford's Doug Shryock (4:28.7). Garcia (4:28.1) of Genoa will be another tough competitor at the district

Mark Mellum (9:31) of Eastwood will be the man to beat in the two-mile. Shelby's challenger will be sectional champion Mark Reed (9:48.4), while Bucyrus offers Tim Ley (9:59.1) and Perrysburg enters John Kazcor (9:51.5).

Shelby's other sectional champion is Dennis Arnold in the 440-yard dash (50.7). He will be joined by another sectional champion, Todd McFarland (50.5) of Van Wert.

Shelby's mile relay team has the best time from the three sectionals making up the district. The Whippets ran a 3:25.8 and Ontario ran a 3:29.7. Sandusky St. Mary's was clocked at 3:28.6.

Two Whippets will be competing in two events with Fred Oesch in the hurdles and Dwight Downs in the weights.
