Lakers' GM

Q. Who is the general manager of the Los Angeles Lakers? D.W. Mansfield A. Pete Newell is the general manager of the Los Angeles Lakers in the National Basketball Assn.

He had a .657 winning percentage in 14 years of college coaching at the University of San Francisco, Michigan State and the University of California. At Cal, he led the team to an NCAA championship in 1959, beating West Virginia. West Virginia had Jerry West as its big star. West later played with the Lakers. West Virginia's coach was Fred Schaus, who Newell later replaced as GM at Los Angeles.

Newell also coached the 1960 U.S. Olympic team to a gold medal. He became general manager of the San Diego Rockets in 1968 and went to Los Angeles in 1972.

Tommy Gunner

Q. Did Tommy Heinsohn ever lead the Celtics in scoring? B.W. Shelby A. Tom Heinsohn, the current coach of the Boston Celtics in the National Basketball Assn., led the Celtics in scoring three consecutive years beginning in the 1959-60 season. He averaged 21.7, 21.3 and 22.1 points per game in those three seasons.

In the 1962-63 and 1963-64 seasons, he led Boston in free throw shooting with .835 and .827 percentages and he also led the team in most personal fouls five different years.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (UPI) — Janet Guthrie will become the first woman to compete in a major stock car race when the green flag drops in today's World 600, but she has no illusions about out-running David Pearson and Richard Petty, who will start on the front row.

But, for the 36-year-old New York native, who failed to make the field for the Indianapolis 500, getting a spot in the \$240,155 event was a major accomplishment.

"My major concern was getting up to competitive speed in one day," said Guthrie, who qualified for the 27th starting slot after two days of practice, only one in her car.

"I have never seen anyone—man or woman—adjust to driving a stock car race as quickly as Janet did," said crew chief Ralph Moody, a stock car veteran who prepared her car.

"The transition from any other type racer to a stock car is extremely difficult. She had done it in two days with little more than 40 total laps of practice."

Pearson, starting on the pole for the sixth consecutive race at the Charlotte Motor Speedway, will be going after his first victory since the Rebel 500 at Darlington April 11.

His qualifying speed of 159.132 miles per hour in the Wood Brothers Mercury was about six miles faster than Miss Guthrie's and earned him \$11,000.

Calie Yarborough will start in the third position in a Chevrolet and Bobby Allison, in a Mercury, will start fourth. Dave Marcis and Buddy Baker will start in the third row.

Baker's father, Buck, attempted to qualify for the race but mechanical problems prevented him from reaching competitive speeds during the three days of qualifying.

"Don't ask me about that woman driver," said the elder Baker, who had predicted Guthrie would fail to qualify. "She has already made a fool out of me with my prediction. She's in the field and I'm not. I'm ready to believe anything. Even that she can win the race."

Guthrie was quick to respond when reporters asked if she expected the other drivers in the race to treat her differently during the race because she is a woman.

"Hell no. We're all racing," she snapped. "Oh, my goodness. That didn't sound very ladylike did it."

Phoenix Seeks Better Shooting Accuracy

PHOENIX (UPI) — The Phoenix Suns with at least their backs to the wall if not one foot in the grave, were expressing cautious optimism Saturday that they are still contenders for the National Basketball Assn. championship but the emphasis was on caution.

"I really don't think we're out of it," said Suns Forward Curtis Perry as the Suns geared for the third game, and their first home appearance of the series, against the Boston Celtics Sunday afternoon.

"We'll have to play our best game of the season every game we play. We have to stop making mistakes."

So far, the Suns have made enough to last a season after their unlikely appearance in the championship series. The Suns, as one fan said, remain a team that is committed—or if not, perhaps should be.

But Perry discounts such comment. "They're always talking about how they can blow us out, how we can't play with them," he said. "Well, if we'd been shooting like we were all year, we'd be two games up on them."

But the Suns have not been shooting like that. In fact there were times in the second game at Boston when they probably shouldn't have been shooting at all, as they agree.

Boston comes into the third game with a 2-0 lead and a penchant for forcing the Suns into hurried shots they would rather have missed—and have. The Suns shot 48 per cent during the first 13 games of their journey into the playoffs, but only 39 per cent in the first two games against Boston.

The Suns have to get their thing going—and Boston Coach Tommy Heinsohn said they might do it.

"Their backs may be to the wall, but they'll be in front of that crowd," said the Boston coach. "Our thing's the banners and flags flying," referring to the 12 championship pennants flying in the Boston Garden's rafters. The Suns have
