

Lucas, Plymouth split track meets

PLYMOUTH — Lucas and Plymouth split a pair of high school track meets here Tuesday afternoon, the Cubs winning the boys' meet 92-40, while the Vikings gained the girls' verdict, 74-36.

Curt Caldwell led the Lucas performance in the boys' meet, winning the 120-yard high hurdles in a time of 19 seconds flat, and following that with a 1:00.2 clocking, good for first place in the 440-yard dash. Caldwell also ran a leg on the Cubs victorious mile relay team.

Lisa Daron was Plymouth's pacesetter in the girls' competition. She won the 220-yard dash in 30 seconds flat and also ran on the Vikings 440 and 880-yard relay teams, both of which took first places.

Jamie Brooks of Plymouth was a double winner, winning the 100-meter low hurdles (18.5) and high jump (4-10).

Plymouth girls run past Lucas, 74-36

SHILOH — The Plymouth girls opened its 1982 season with an impressive 74-36 whipping of Lucas Tuesday night.

The win gives Plymouth a 1-0

slate while Lucas falls to 0-1.

Plymouth flexed its strength in the meet by dominating the field events and winning all of the relay events.

Plymouth swept the discus with freshman Becky Endicott propelling the Big Red with a throw of 87'7" while Fayette Hudson was second with a toss

of 71'1" and Glenda Will was third with a 63'2".

Endicott was one of two double winners as the freshman won the shot put competition with a heave of 33'4 1/4".

Plymouth's other double winner was Montelle Levering in the mile run with a time of 6:50.3 and the 880 yard run with a time of 3:05.2.

Other first places for Plymouth went to Becky Turson in the long jump, Annette Takos in the 440 yard dash, Lisa Daron in the 220 yard dash, and Jamie Brooks in the high jump.

Second places for Plymouth were by Turson in the high jump, Kim Daron in the 100 meter dash and Will in the 880 yard run.

Thirds for the Big Red went to Brooks in the long jump, Lori Fidler in the hurdles, Jan Wallace in the shot and Amy Adkins in the mile run.

The next meet for the squad will be April 6 when the Big Red travels to Buckeye Central for the 4 p.m. meet.

SHILOH — The Plymouth girls and boys track squad gained a split against Black River Tuesday afternoon at the Shiloh cinder track.

The girls got back on the winning track with a 56-54 win to boost their seasonal log to 3-1 overall while the boys squad was trampled by the Pirates, 95-47, and dropped to 0-4 on the year.

The Lady Vikings had two double winners as junior Lisa Daron blazed to firsts in the 100 yard dash with a time of 13.9 while winning the 220 yard dash with a 29.5.

The other double winner was freshman Becky Endicott in the shot put and discus with distances of 30-11 and 96-10, respectively.

Other first place finishers for the Plymouth girls were Jamie Brooks in the high jump and Becky Turson in the long jump.

The boys team had one double winner as James Jamerson was a first place finisher in the shot put with a toss of 41-3 and the discus with a throw of 113-4.

Other first place efforts for the Big Red boys meef were Mike Beck in the mile run time of 5:10 and Jim Will in the pole vault height of 11-0.

Plymouth girls run past H-L, 63-47

PLYMOUTH — The Plymouth Big Red girls track team posted another win Thursday after scoring a victory over Hopewell-Loudon by a 63-47 margin.

The Vikings took first places in eight of the events of the afternoon to push their seasonal log to 4-1.

Plymouth also had one double winner in the meet as Jamie Brooks was a winner in the high jump with a

leap of 4-9 and the 100 meter low hurdles with a time of 19.1.

Also collecting firsts for Plymouth was Becky Turson in the long jump, Becky Endicott in the shot put, Lisa Daron in the 220 yard dash and the 880 relay unit of Lisa Daron, Kim Daron, Brooks and Turson.

Turson won the long jump competition by three inches with a leap of 13-3 while Endicott, only a freshman, tossed the shot 30-2½.

Thirds for the Big Red went to Brooks in the long jump, Jan Wallace in the shot put and K. Daron in the 100 meter dash.
