

Plymouth boys, girls place second

The Plymouth boys and girls track teams each captured second place finishes at last Saturday's South Central Invitational.

Lucas won the boys portion of the meet with 102 points and nosed past Plymouth, which had 99. Host South

Central was third with 56 and was followed by Monroeville with 52½; Crestview, 51½; Norwalk St. Paul, 51 and Crestline, 44.

Todd Smart earned a pair of firsts for the Big Red by taking the 110-meter high hurdles in a time of 15.9

and later captured the 300-meter intermediate hurdles with a time of 46.7.

Plymouth also had a first in the 1600-meter relay with a time of 3:53.4.

Lynn Cole was second for the Big Red in the 800-meter run in a time of 2:19.1 and third in the 1600-meter run with 5:13.3.

Curtis Handshoe also took second in the long jump at 18-4 and was fourth in the 200-meter dash with a time of 26.3.

Steve Thornsberry placed third in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles with a time of 48.7. Duane Adams was third in the 800 at 2:26.8 and fourth in the discus with 103-11.

Plymouth's 3200-meter relay team was third with a time of 9:53.7 and the 400-meter relay squad was fourth at 52.5.

In the girls meet, Monroeville easily won the championship with 163 points, followed by Plymouth with 101; Crestview, 57; Crestline, 50; Norwalk St. Paul, 42; Lucas, 39 and South Central, 38.

The Plymouth girls had one first as the 1600-meter relay foursome broke the tape in 4:53.0.

Taking seconds for the Plymouth girls were Jenny Rony in the 300-meter low hurdles at 60.7; Susie Adams, shot put (31-8½); Lori Cole, 1600-meter run (6:55.2) and 3200-meter run (15:46.7); the 800-meter relay (2:06.2) and 3200-meter relay (12:16.0).

Adams was third in the discus with a throw of 78-8; Michelle Smart was third in the 200-meter dash (31.3) and the 400-meter relay team was third with a time of 61.6.

Taking fourths for Plymouth were Christy Wagers in the long jump (12-10) and Holli Barnthouse in the 400-meter dash (71.6).
