

Firelands Conference meet is held

Places were far and few between for the Plymouth track team last Saturday, as the Firelands Conference held its annual meet.

The girls finished last in the team standings with nine points, while the boys were next-to-last with just 18 points.

St. Paul took the girls title with 115 points, followed by Crestview (108), New London (86), Mapleton (76), Western Reserve (45), Monroeville (32), South Central (25) and Plymouth (nine).

On the boys side, Crestview claimed the title with 105 points, while New London was a close second with 102 points. The Wildcats were followed in the team standings by Mapleton (84), St. Paul (78), Western Reserve (73), South Central (26), Plymouth (18) and Monroeville (seven).

The only individual to place for the boys was Kevin Click in the 800-meter run. The senior finished second with a time of 2:06.

The Big Red scored their only other points when the 3,200 relay team finished third with a time of 9:15 and the 400 relay team finished fourth in 47.1.

For the girls, Richelle Smart placed in a pair of events. She was fourth in the shot put with a throw of 31-feet, 5.5 inches and sixth in the 300

hurdles in 54.9.

Heather Roll was fifth in the 3,200 run in 13:48.1 and Kim Howard rounded out individual honors for the locals by placing sixth in the 100 hurdles in 17.5.

The 800 and 3,200 relay team both placed sixth with respective times of 2:02.8 and 11:46.9.

Prior to the league meet, the Big Red tuned up by running in the New London Invitational.

Howard was fourth in the 100 hurdles in 18.2, Roll was sixth in the 3,200 in just over 13 minutes, Smart was sixth in the shot put with a throw of 31-0 feet and Laura Roselius was sixth in the high jump with an effort of 4-2.

The 800 relay team of Roselius, Jenny Reber, Amber Kropf and Lindy Seel was fifth in 2:01.3 and the 400 quartet of Howard, Roselius, Reber and Seel was sixth in 57.0.

On the boys side, Ryan Click, James Akers, Jay Follett and Kevin Click teamed up for a third-place finish in the 3,200 relay in 8:58.9, Matt Anderson, Akers, Jerry Longden and Kevin Click teamed up for a fourth-place finish in the 400 relay in 48.6 and Ryan Click, Akers, Anderson and Kevin Click teamed up for a fifth-place finish in the 1,600 relay in 3:54.8.
