



Western, South Central tie in boys' FC tri meet

SHILOH — The boys' competition was close Tuesday in Firelands Conference action between Western Reserve, South Central and Plymouth.

In fact, the Roughriders and Trojans tied for first with 57 points, while the Big Red tallied 51.

First for the Roughriders were attained by Greg Patrick in the shot put at 46-4 1/2; the 800 relay, 1:41.14; 400 relay, 47.8; Jake Dellisanti, 400-meter run, 55.38 and 1600 relay, 3:45.

Gaining the top spot for South Central were Derek Dittman in the discus at 129-0; Tyler Wilhelm, 5-8; Jordan Ray, 18-0, long jump and 25.06, 200 and Clint Hackney, 1600, 4:56.2.

The Whippets boys' team claimed a 101-28 win, while Shelby's girls' squad captured a 98-38 win.

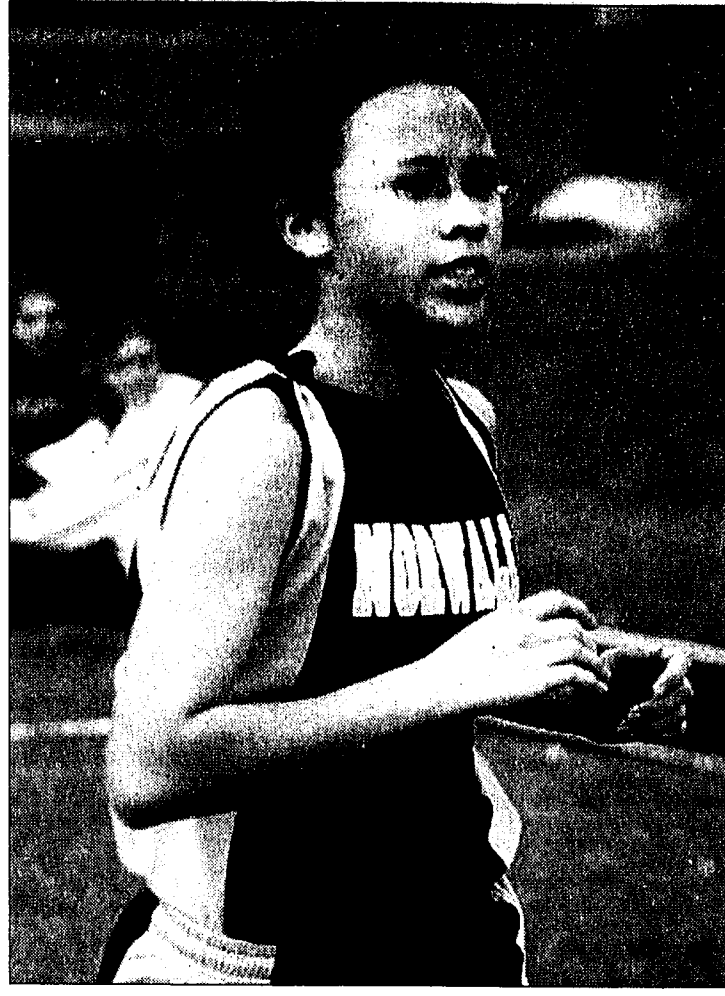

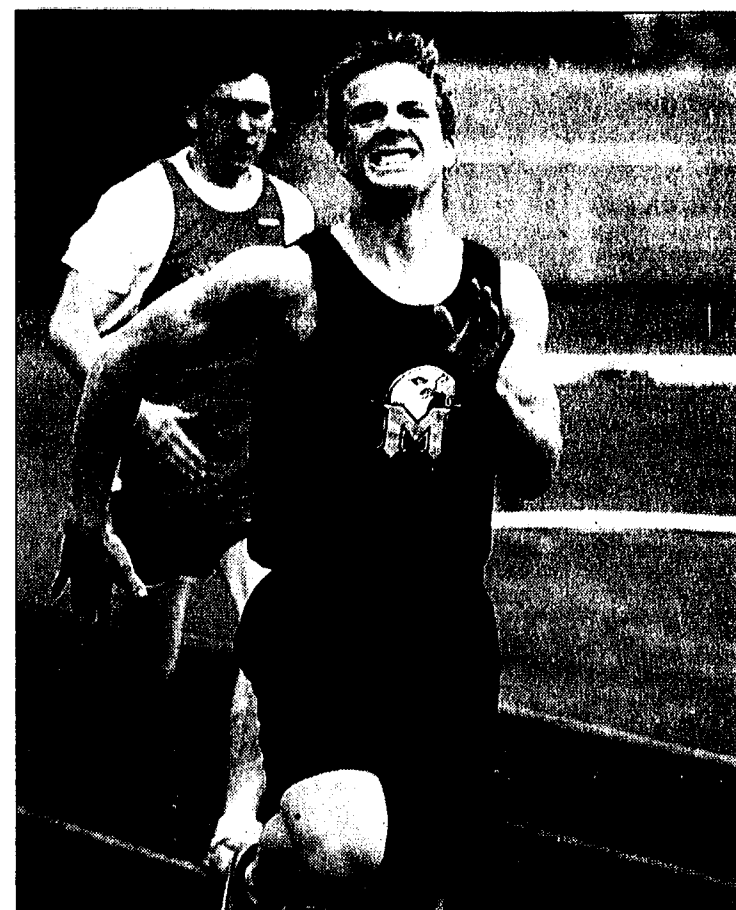

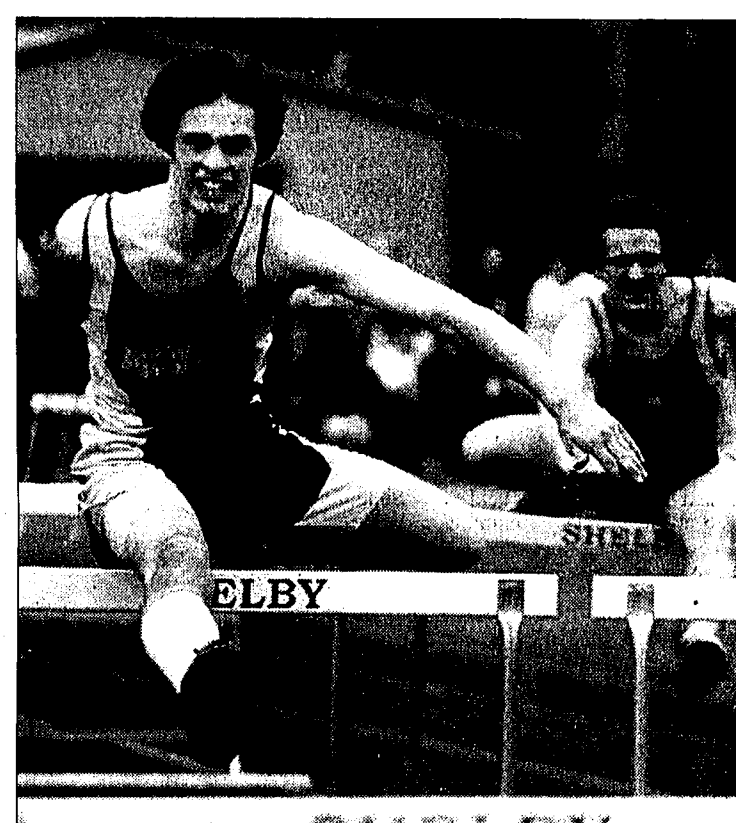

Chase Buurma and Brandon Oney both pitched for the Flashes with Buurma taking the loss.

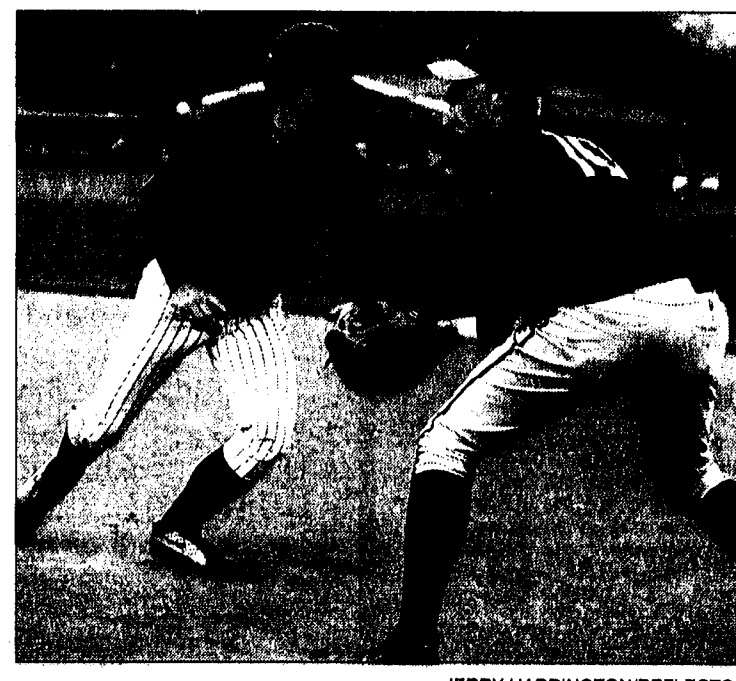
