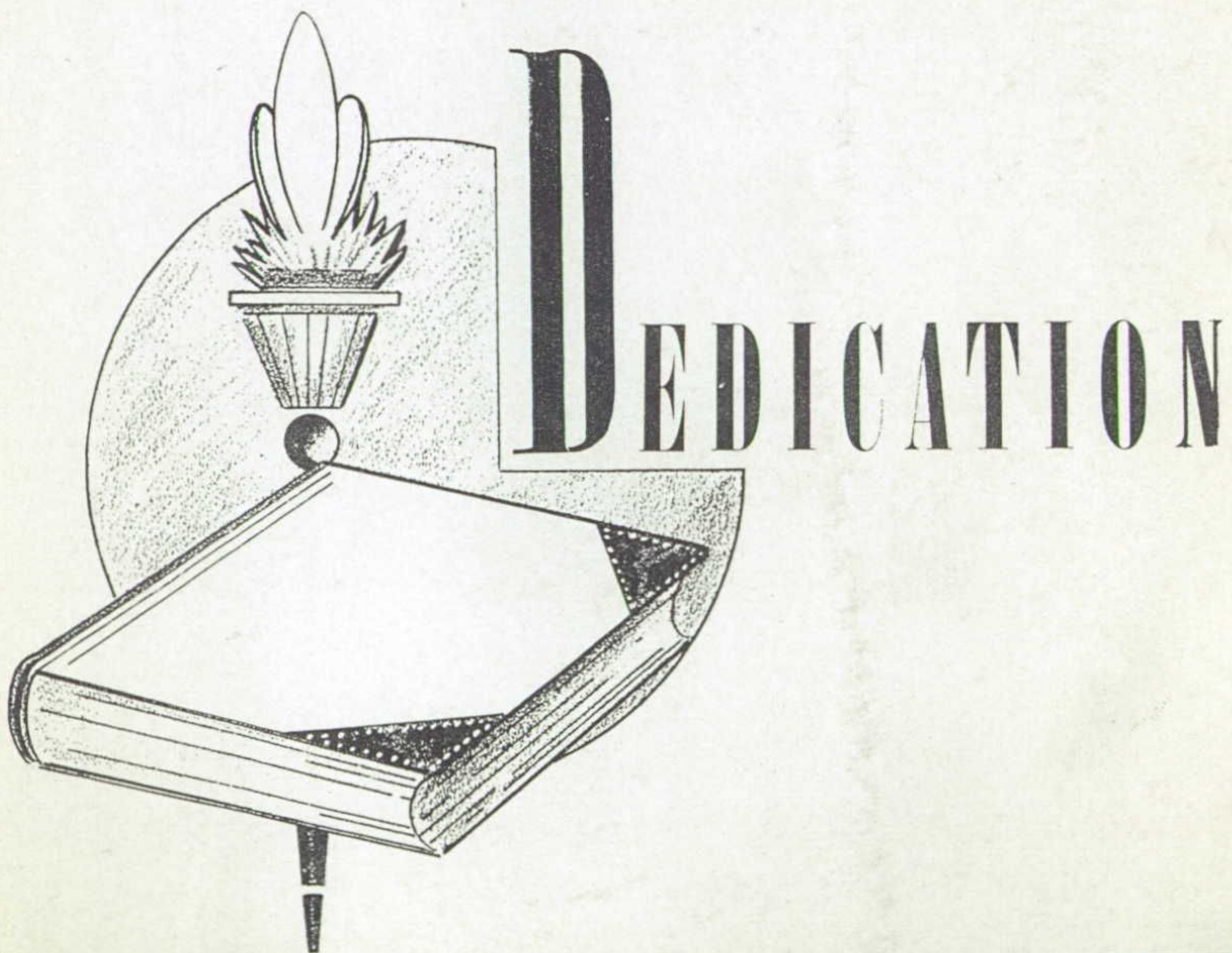

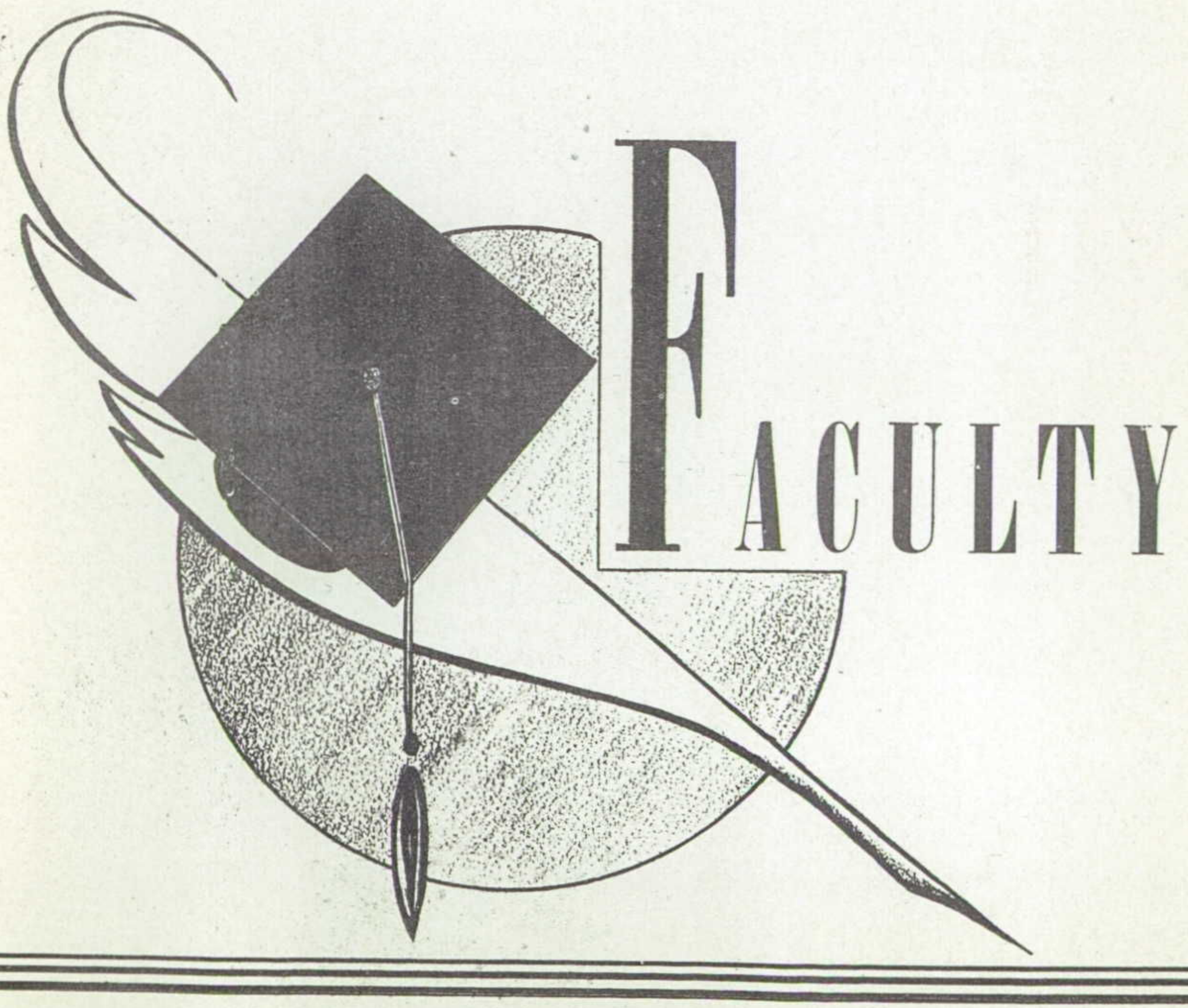

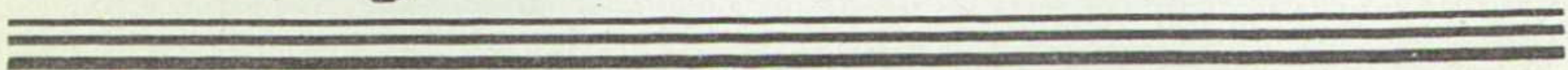

CLASS HISTORY

The class of 1942 must leave S.H.S. forever. We will go out into the world to make new friends and new history. Of course, we have made history in the past. Four grand years of it and how fast those years have passed.

On a bright September morning in 1938, a shiny new ship lay at anchor awaiting her crew. Twenty-four green but sturdy freshmen boarded that morning to begin a long four years' journey over many a rough water. Those freshmen were:

But during the year we lost two sailors, Betty and Russell Entler. We chose George Adams as our Captain, Mary Jean Homerick as First Mate, and Freda May Mills as Second Mate. We were a very green crew, but with the careful supervision of Miss Pettit, we glided safely into port to take a three months vacation.

Then on another bright September morning in 1939, twenty-three sailing Sophomores again boarded the ship. During this year, we chose Neal Garrett as Captain assisted by three mates, Eugene Russell, George Harrington, and Mary Jean Homerick. During our sail, we took on a new sailor her name being Doris Dellevar, but lost three others, namely Betty Shirey, Wanda Finely, and Gaylord Bennett. We chose Mr. Pittenger as our advisor and after our second year dropped anchor with twenty-one on board to enjoy another three months vacation.

On September 3, 1940, a jolly bunch of Juniors came aboard. They were a small lot compared with what sailed the other two years. We found that Freda May Mills, Virginia Murray, Avis Cline and Doris Dellevar did not come back to continue their journey with us, but in their place, we gained Cletus Cline, Ann Kopina, Thelma Carrick and Kenneth Sisinger. We chose Doris Reynolds as

Captain and three mates to assist her. They were Merle Lutz, Mary Jean Homerick and Juanita Laser. We spent a few weeks of our time on the ship preparing and giving our Junior Class Play "Mother-in-Law Blues" under the direction of Miss West, whom we had chosen as our advisor. Later, we had the misfortune to lose one of our crew, Thelma Carrick, but Thelma Hutchinson and Elmer Montgomery soon came to fill her place. We also took time off to prepare and give a fine banquet for the Seniors which was held at the Mansfield-Leland Hotel. After a very pleasant trip, we dropped anchor on May 21 for a three months' vacation after which would come our fourth and last trip as Seniors on the good ship "Shiloh High School" with twenty-one on board.

At last the great day September 2, 1941 arrived. The mighty crew of eighteen Seniors boarded the ship to start their last journey. We were sorry to learn that Cletus Cline, Thelma Hutchinson and Kenneth Sisinger were not going to continue the trip with us. We chose Eugene Russell as Captain, and George Harrington, Ann Kopina, and Earl Stiving as his mates. We also chose Miss West again to supervise the trip as she saw us over many rough waters on our last journey. This trip has been a short one and one of the highlights was the time we took off to prepare our Senior Class Play, "Spooky Tavern" which was enjoyed by all. As our destination "Commencementville" is drawing near, we are looking ahead into the future and back over four of the grandest years of our lives. We are only eighteen in number and as a reminder they are:

Earl Stiving is on an experimental trip to the South American Countries. When his money gives out, he can always fall back on the Trucking Business.


Doris Moritz is one of the World's most successful Single Dress Designers. I know she would make something out of herself.
