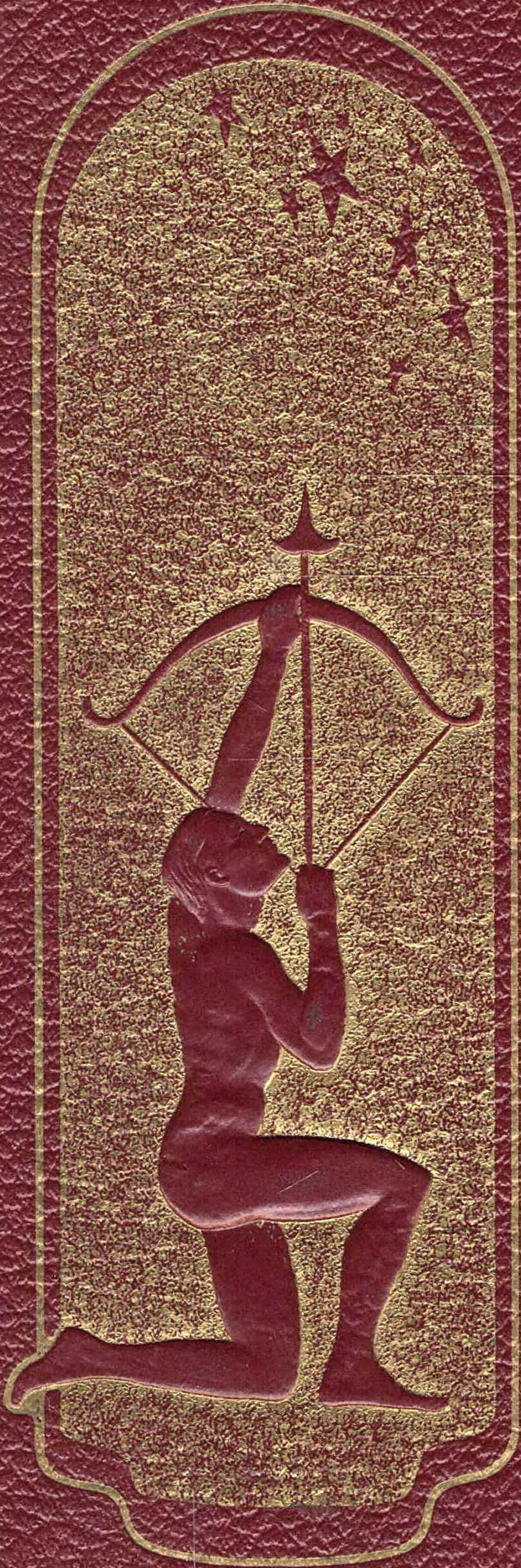

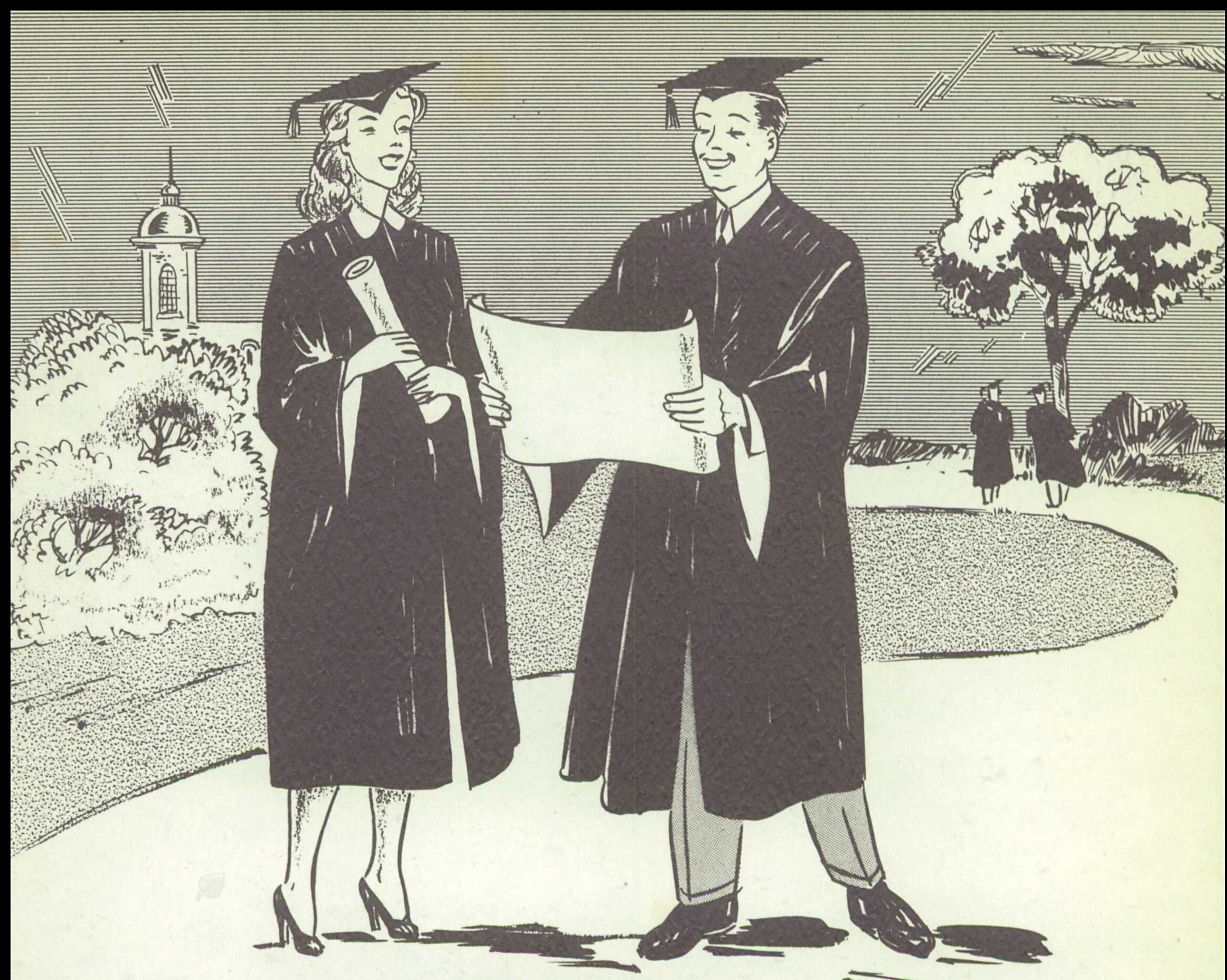

### "Class History of 48"

In the fall of 1944, a class of smiling faces started out on a long period of four years to get to Seniorville. We called our ship "Freshmen at Sea." In starting on our journey we chose as our captain Ruth Lykins; keeper of all records, John Young; as cashier, Jeanette Forquer; and our co-pilot, Mrs. Arnold. On our voyage we were fortunate enough to receive three more members to our class. These were Lawrence Wallan, Joan McKee, and Bill Adams. While drifting along in a very bad snow storm, we threw overboard the following: Dean England, who moved to Johnsville, Lawrence Wallan and Donna Carpender, who moved to Shelby, Naomi Reed, who moved to Plymouth, Dick Jones, who joined the Navy to work for Uncle Sam, and Maxine Ramey, who also moved to Shelby.

We than docked for a rest of three months. Soon our rest was over and at the sound of the bell, we gathered back on board to pull out for Sophomore Port. We chose as our captain, John Young; keeper of all records, Bill Adams; cashier, Jeanette Forquer. We lost three of our crew this year. Joan McKee, who married Frank Burkepile. Bill Adams joined up with Uncle Sam and Lester Baker moved.

Our ship was in need of repairs so we docked for another three months. At the end of our rest we found our boat ready to go, so we gathered back on board to start for Junior Port. We chose as our captain, Don Campbell; keeper of all records, Dorothy Brook; cashier, Alice Seaman; and our co-pilot, Mrs. McCauslin. This stretch of our voyage, we had more to look forward to. We gained one member, who was Agnes Tackett and lost two members who were Don Hudson, who moved to New York and Ruth Lykins, who married Lawrence Wallen. Troubles and tribulations gained on us but we succeeded nevertheless.

We then were quarantined for three months with sea fever. After quarantine was removed, we sailed on to Seniorville, with a little relief.

After we had sailed for a few weeks, we picked up one of our old classmates, Don Hudson, who came back from New York to finish his school days with his old classmates. Sailing along further we picked up another of our fellow members, Dean England, who came back from Johnsville.

We were unfortunate in losing two of our classmates, Jean and Jeanette Forquer. Jean married Frank Cline and moved to Plymouth. Jeanette married Charles Young and moved to Mansfield. Our final year of school, we chose as our captain, Don Campbell; keeper of all records, Dorothy Brook; cashier, Alice Seaman; and our co-pilot, Mrs. Glasscock.

Dorothy Brook leaves her smallness to anyone who wouldn't mind being five feet two.

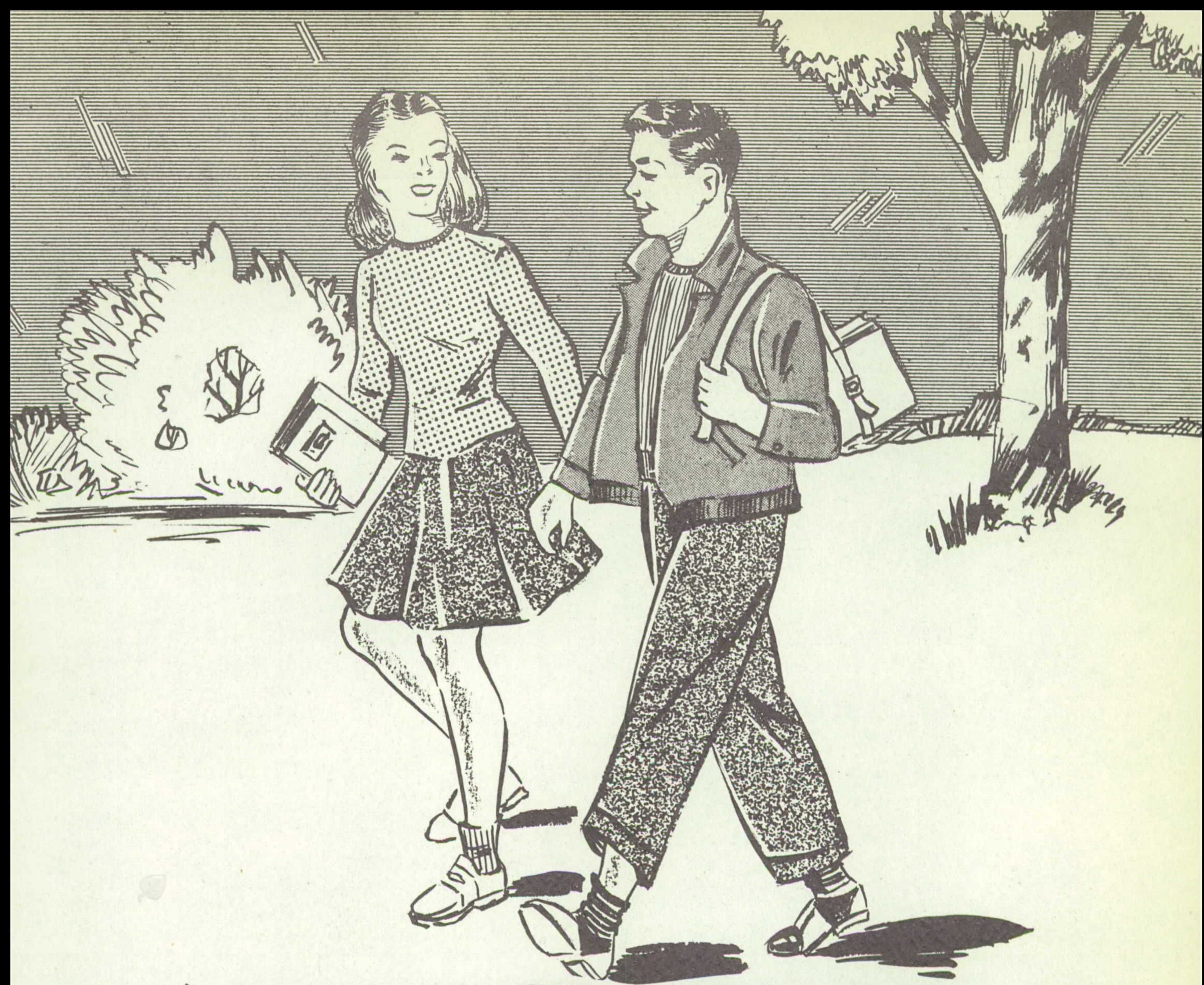
