

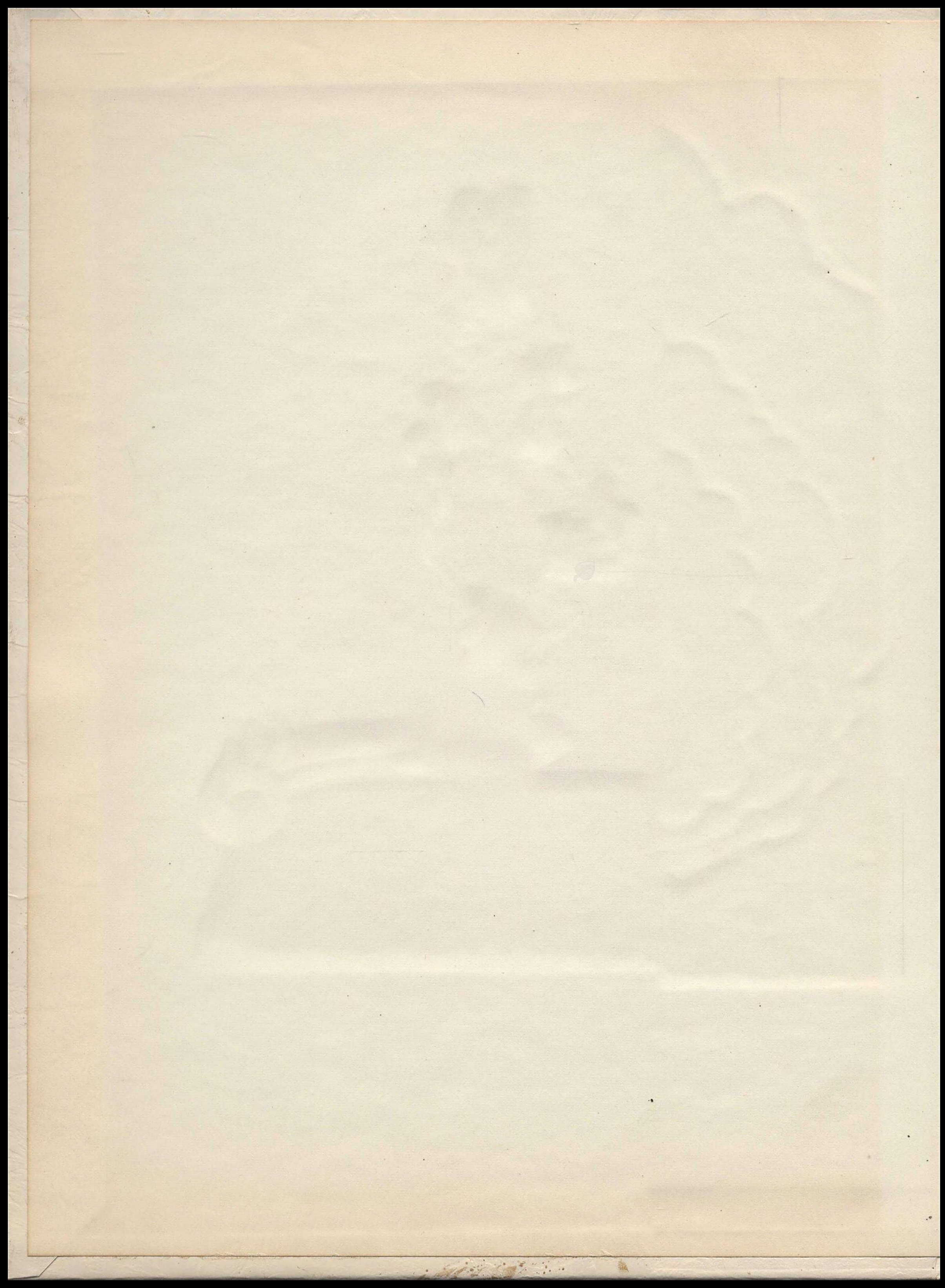

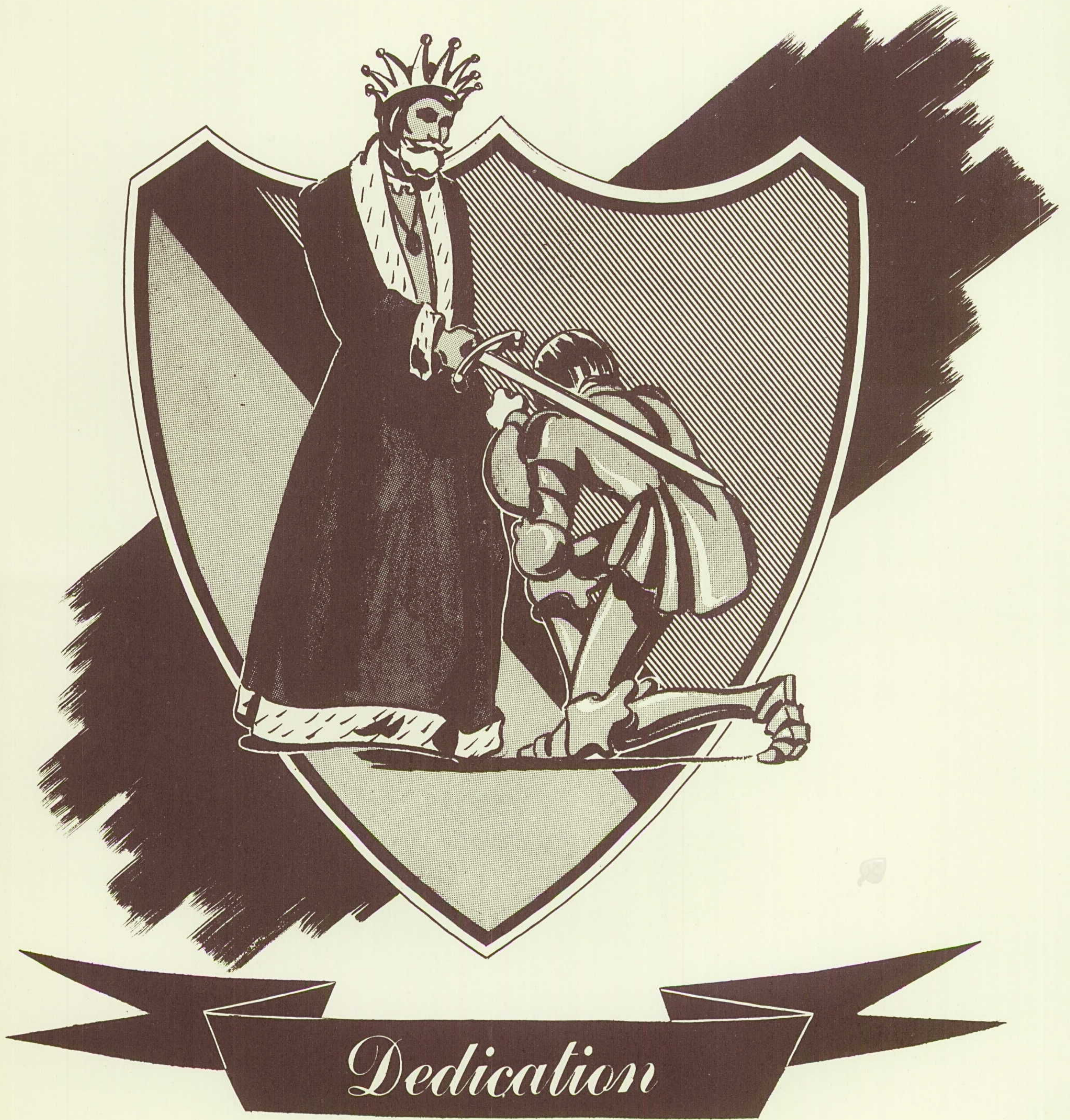

As a result of this outcome, \$144,000 will be spent for the betterment of our school. The improvements will include four additional classrooms, vocational agriculture classroom and shop, four new rest rooms, and new corridors. A new modern lighting system was installed throughout the building this year.

Before starting basketball we had folk dancing.

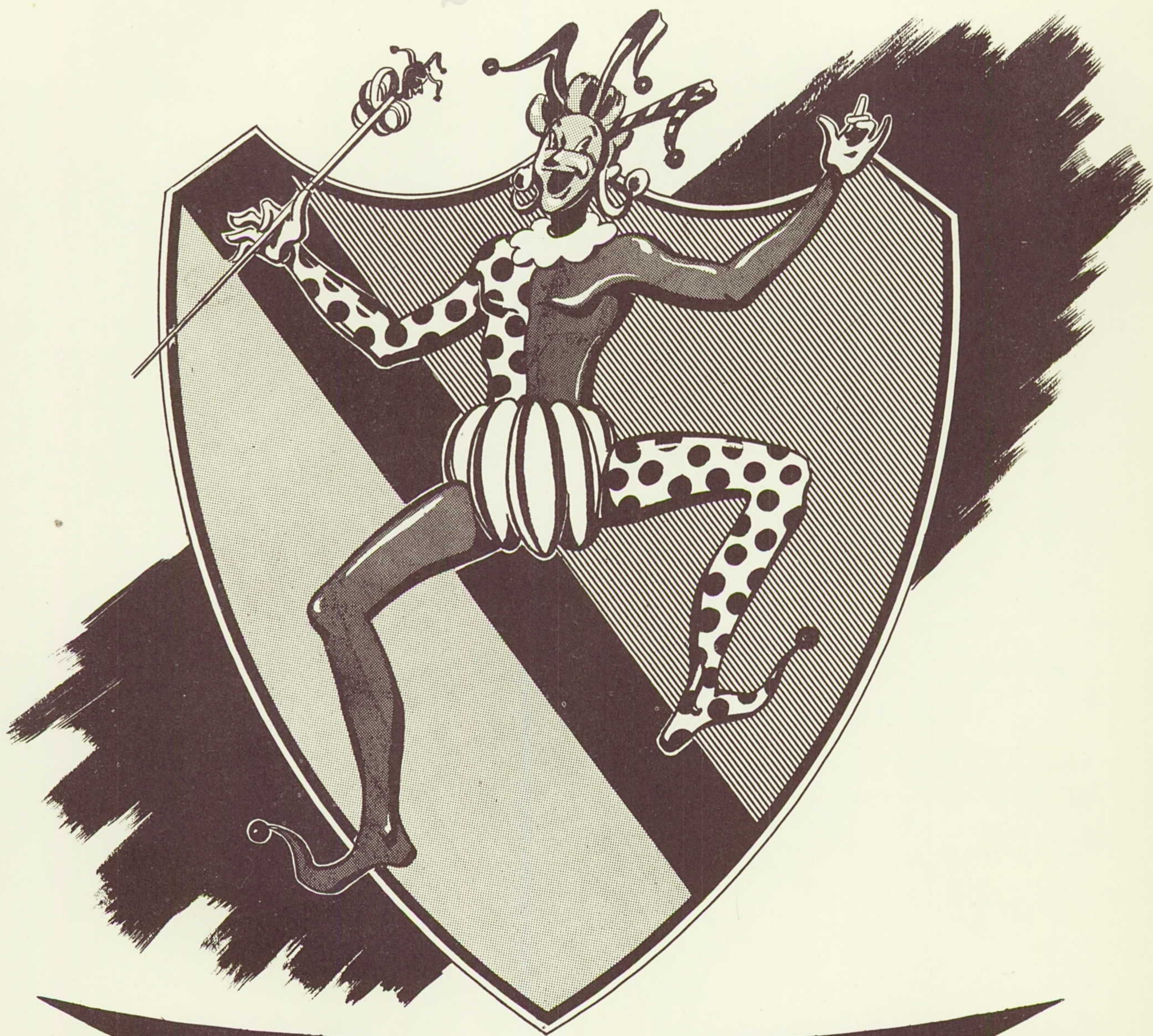
