
MRS. SOUTHARD

During these years our teachers were: Miss Hamilton, first grade; Miss Akers, second grade; Miss Fikes, third grade; Mrs. Farrar, fourth grade; Mrs. Ervin, fifth grade; Mrs. Davis, sixth grade. We gained three new members that graduate this year with us. They are: Glenn Yockey, second grade; Helen Fox, third grade; Christine Lucas, sixth grade; Doris Reber, third grade.

We then entered Junior High School. These two years proved to be very eventful. In the seventh grade the history class was very interesting, but definitely hard. In the eighth grade we had a new subject called Civics which was also very interesting. During these two years we also had our own basketball team and cheerleaders. We played other Junior High Schools, such as Shelby and Shiloh.

In 1948 the class of '52 entered high school as Freshmen. At the beginning of this year we were swamped with dozens of new activities. Initiation by the class of '51 was very thrilling. The class could now choose their own subjects and look forward to four happy years of high school life.

The Sophomore year proved much like the Freshman year although the students were a little more familiar to high school life.

The Junior year was a very happy and exciting year for the class. This was the year the class purchased their beautiful class rings. The rings arrived on November 5, 1950. This was also the year for the class play, "The Campbells Are Coming." The play was a great success. Another big occasion was the Junior-Senior Banquet, given by the Juniors for the Seniors. The theme of the banquet was "Moonlight and Roses." When school was out in May of 1951, the new Seniors could hardly wait to get back to school.

At last, came the Senior year, and it proved to be a busy one. At the beginning of the year, our morale dropped to a new low when one of our class members, Doris Reber, met with a serious accident which prevented her from completing her final year with us. During our Senior year we gained two new members, Eva Jean Ousley and Kay Breitrick, only to lose them again a little later in the year. There were also many exciting activities such as the class play, "Adam's Evening", the F.H.A. dance, the Junior-Senior Banquet, and many other occasional things like getting measured for our caps and gowns, which were green and white. Of course, there was graduation in May and the class trip on the 25th of May. All in all, it was a very eventful and happy twelve years of trials and tribulations.

## Class Prophecy

After working for three years with no relaxation, I finally decided to take a vacation. I called on *Leanna Shields*, head dress designer at the New York Fashion Shop, to see if she could arrange her vacation at the same time and join me. She said she could and would be glad to accompany me. While I was there I dropped in to see *Ruth Barnes*, one of their most popular models, modeling a beautiful ermine coat.

After we left Texas we went up to the Grand Canyon. The guide there sounded familiar, and it turned out to be *Marilyn Cheesman*. They're hiring women now that so many of their other guides have joined the Navy.

From there we went out to California to see the giant redwood forest. We went into

one of the gift shops that had been carved from the inside of a tree, and who did we find owned the shop but our old friend Alice Mathews.

After we had seen the redwood forest, we went to Los Angeles and checked in at the Hotel Hampton, owned of course by another old school pal, *Larry Hampton*.
