Be sure to be well supplied with toys.

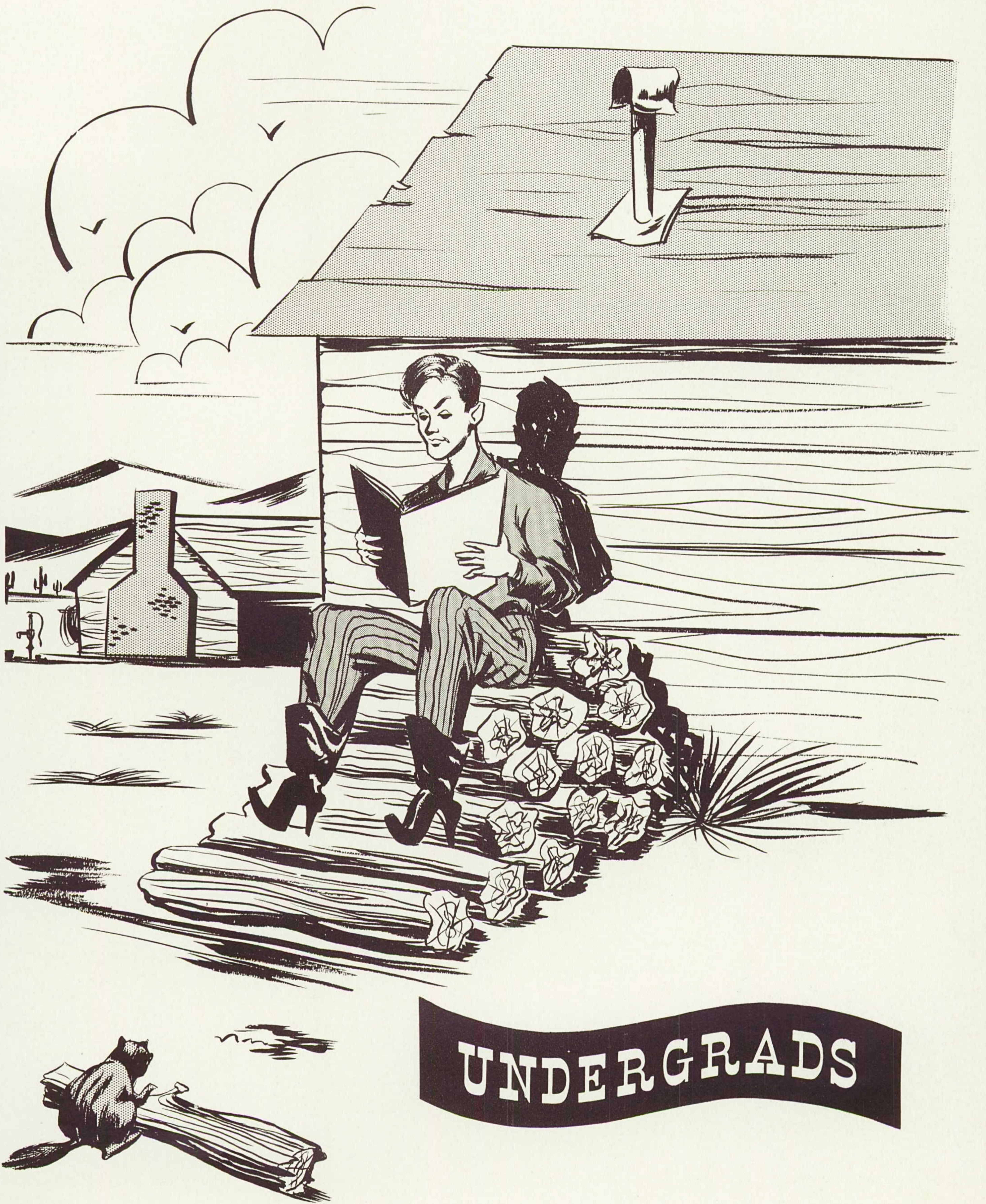
Eulalia Smith, a friendly girl to know,

We hope it won't be long before all the grades can be divided as the fourth and first grades are now.

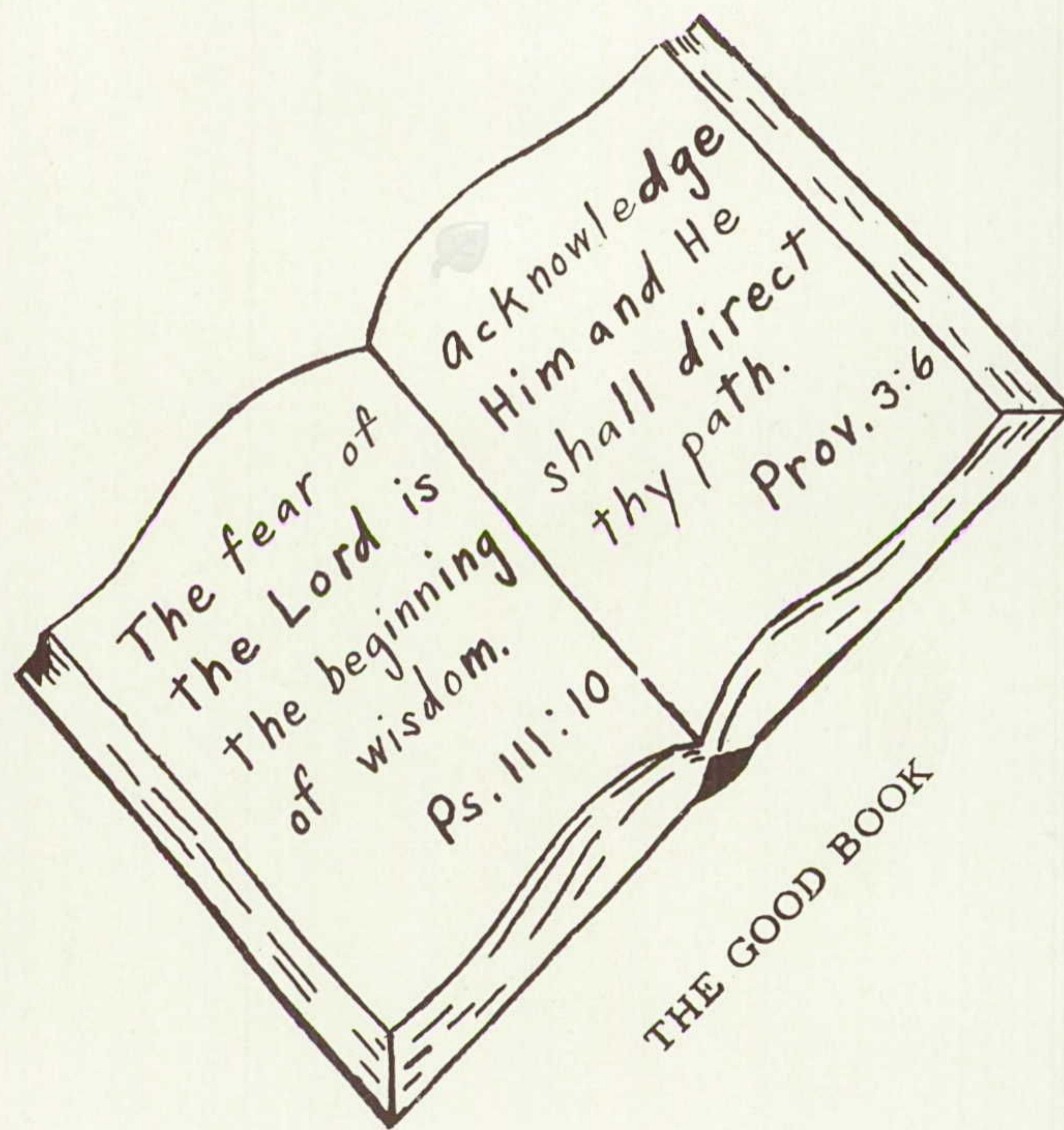

Shiloh started its baseball season of 1950-'51 off with a bang by defeating North Fairfield 11-3. The high light of the game was Garrett's home run over the left field.

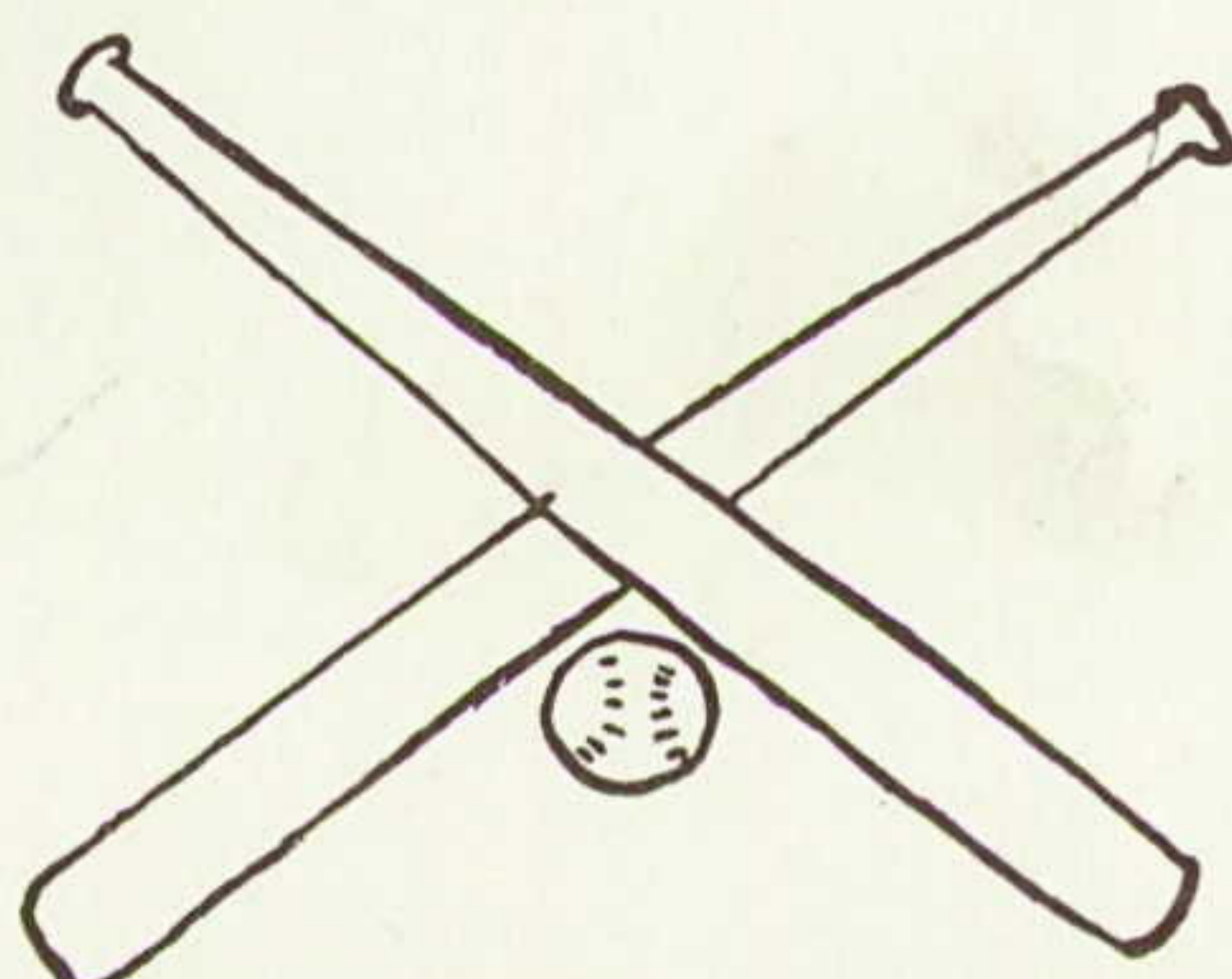
