We proudly dedicate this annual to Mr. Nixon.

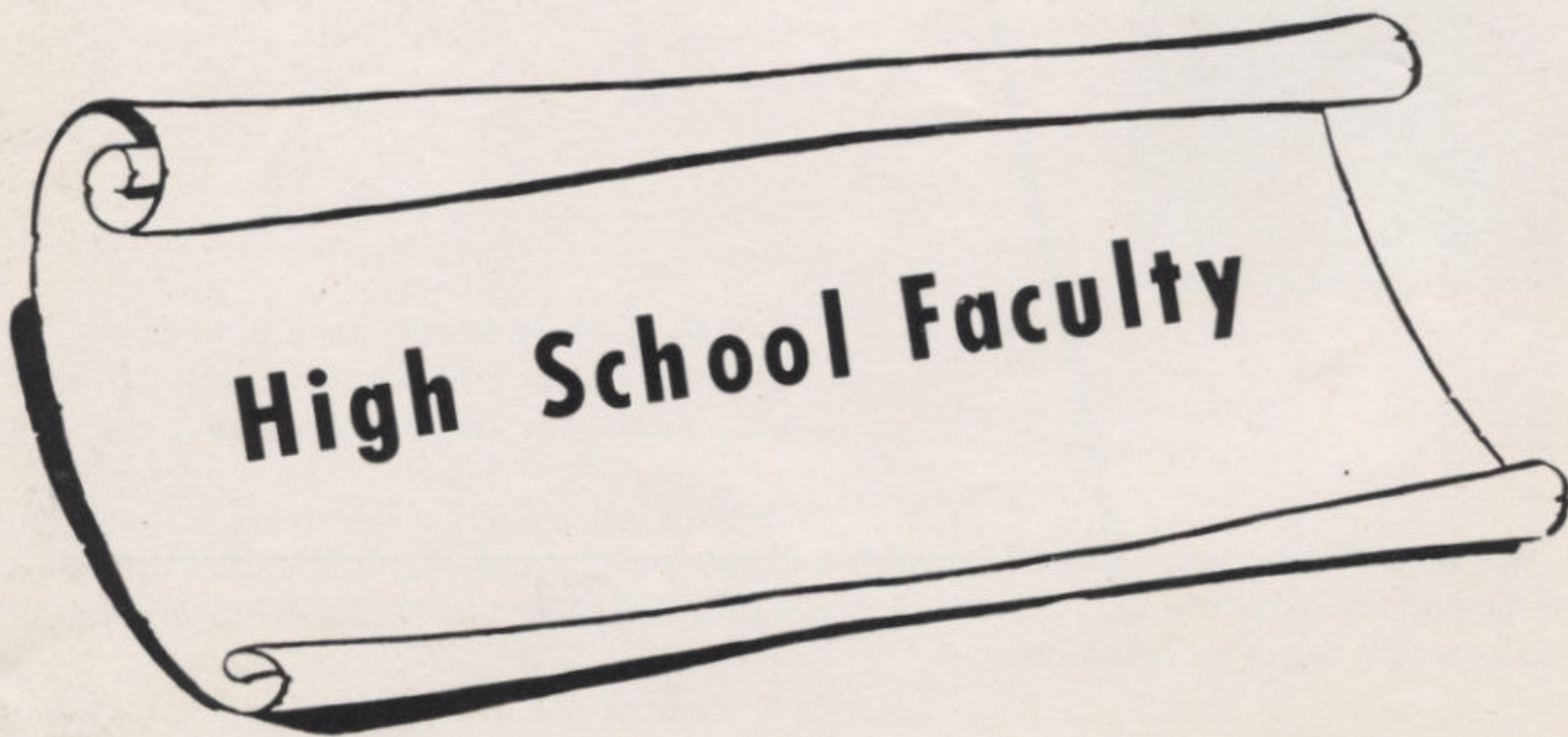
