Also in September they received their class rings. They were the first class to have the school symbol, the Viking Head, put on their rings.



Mr. Flora, Mr. Rahall, and Mr. Bishop served as Junior class advisors.


Jane Fenner was the hard working President and served the class of '66 well.


SOPHOMORES

"His every gesture was right, his manner of speech was entirely suitable -- he was the perfect British foe.


