faculty, administration, and non-certified staff.

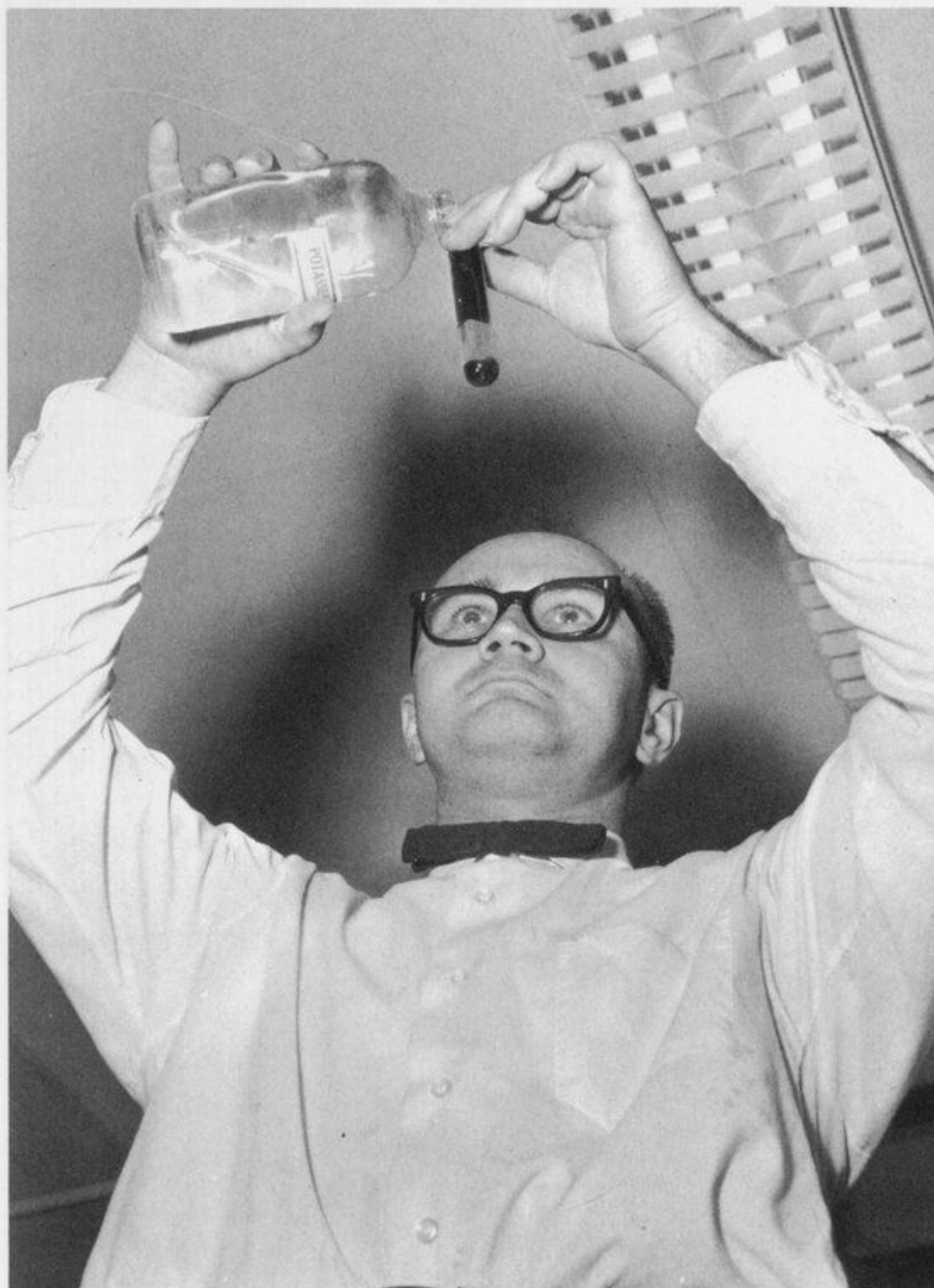

"His every gesture was right, his manner of speech was entirely suitable--he was the perfect British foe.

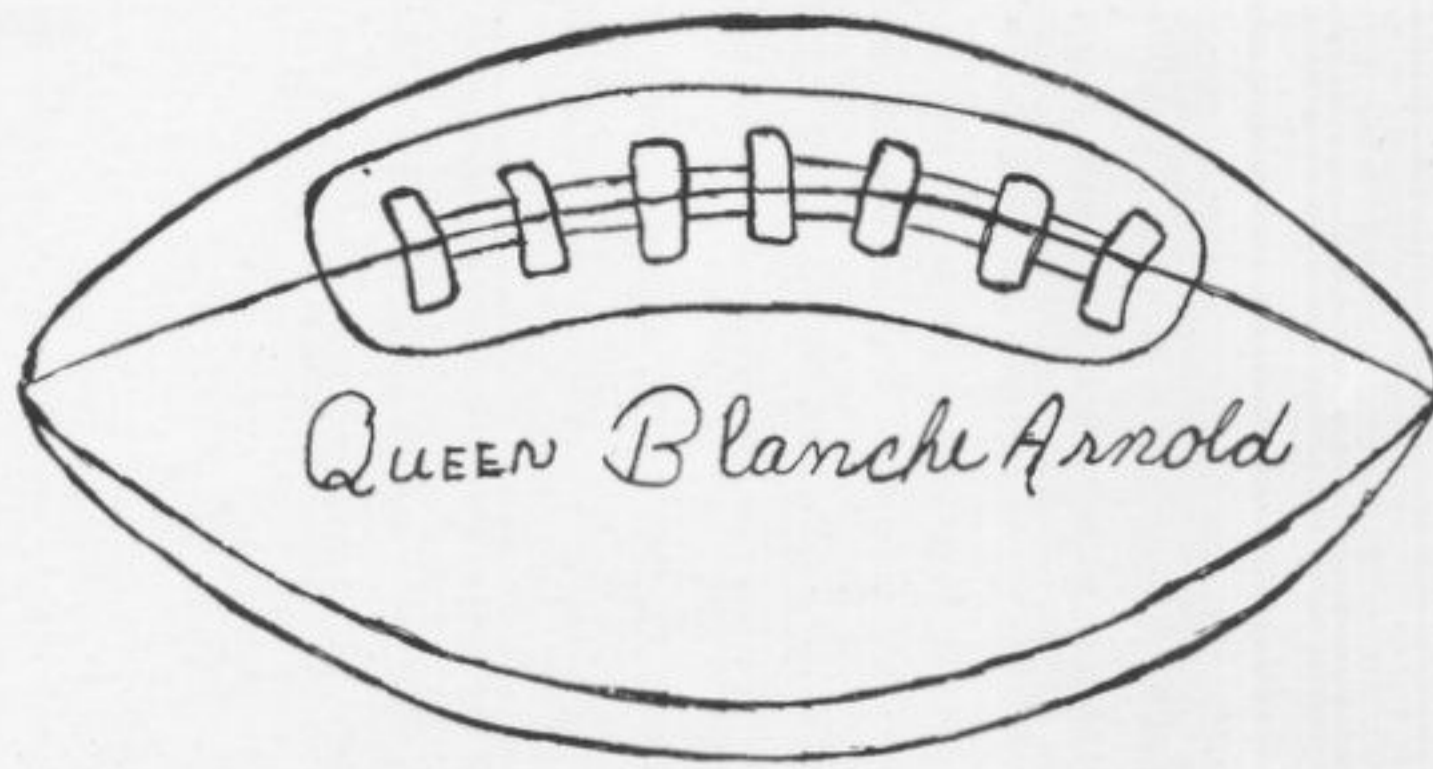
