








Music Department Heads



A first glance at Plymouth High School's gridiron scores is no evidence of the merited teamwork and excellent sportsmanship displayed by the team.



The team will lose fifteen members due to graduation but six Varsity underclassmen will be returning which gives next year's team a good beginning for a winning season.






Top right: Ken Wagers hauls in another Mike Beard pass. Above: Senior captains lead team to action packed second half.




