

The Viking Lore Staff originated many new ideas this year. Mr. Heyl was the advisor and Betty Hunter the editor.

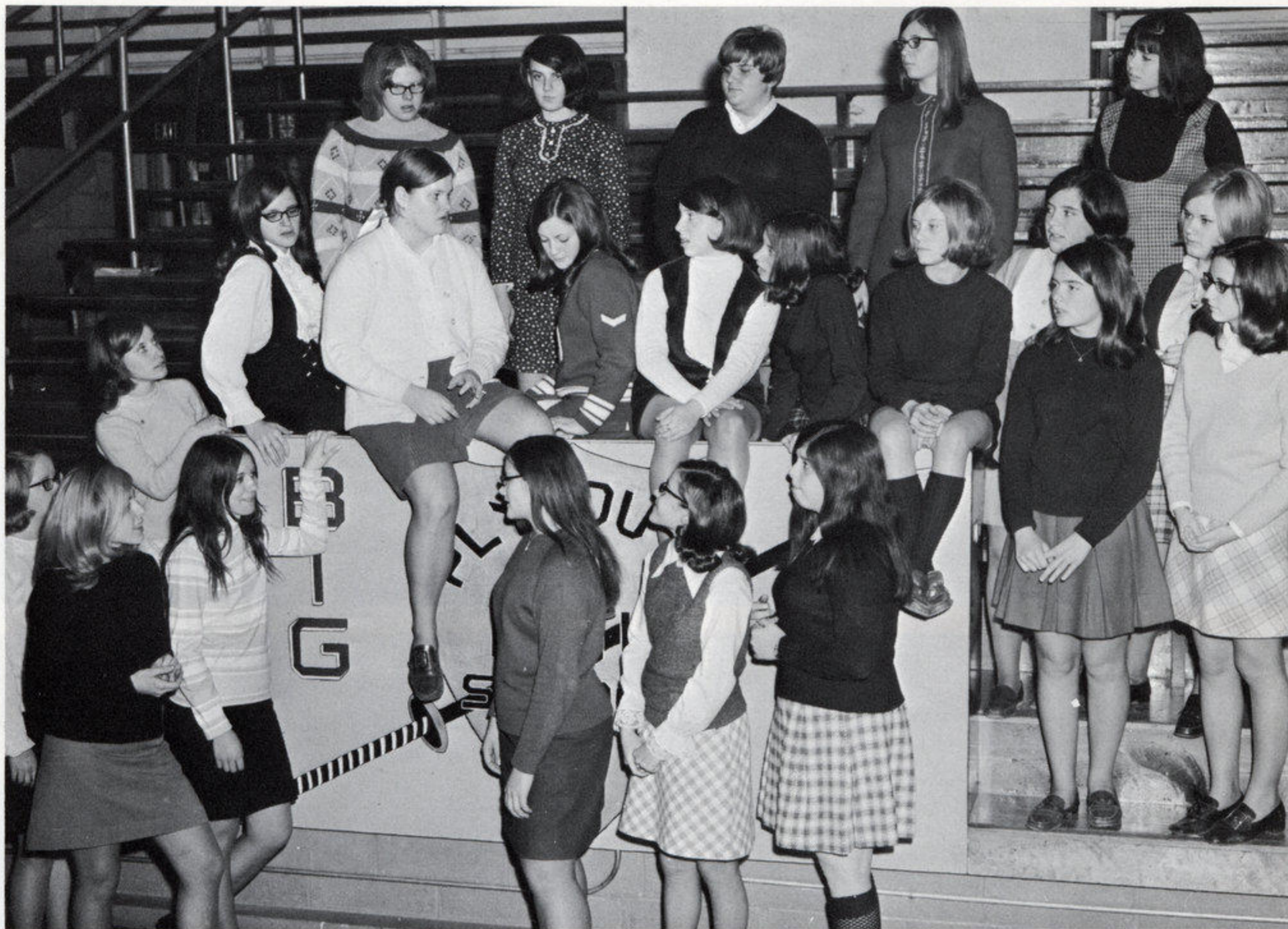

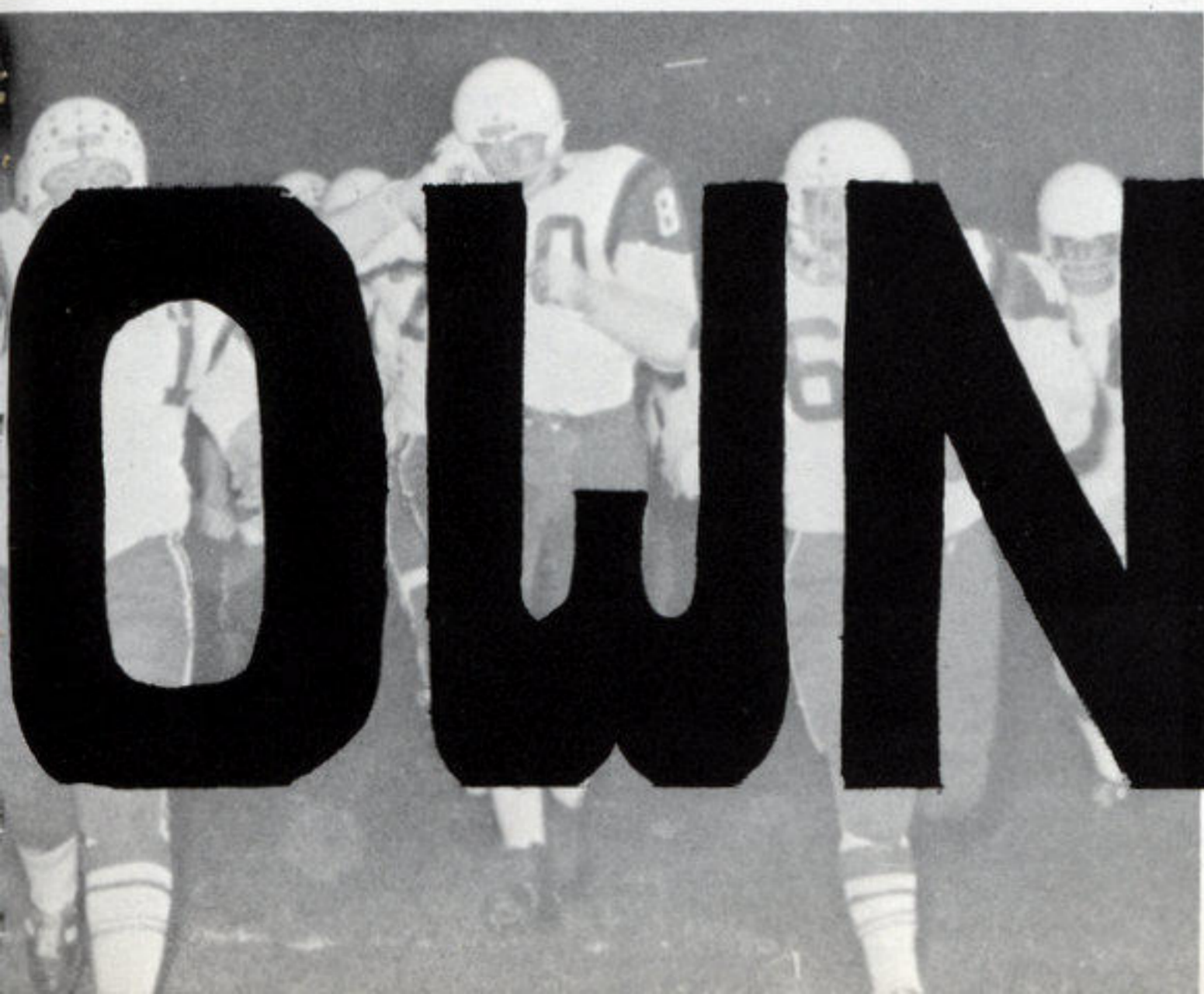


It was a winning season with a 6-4 record!

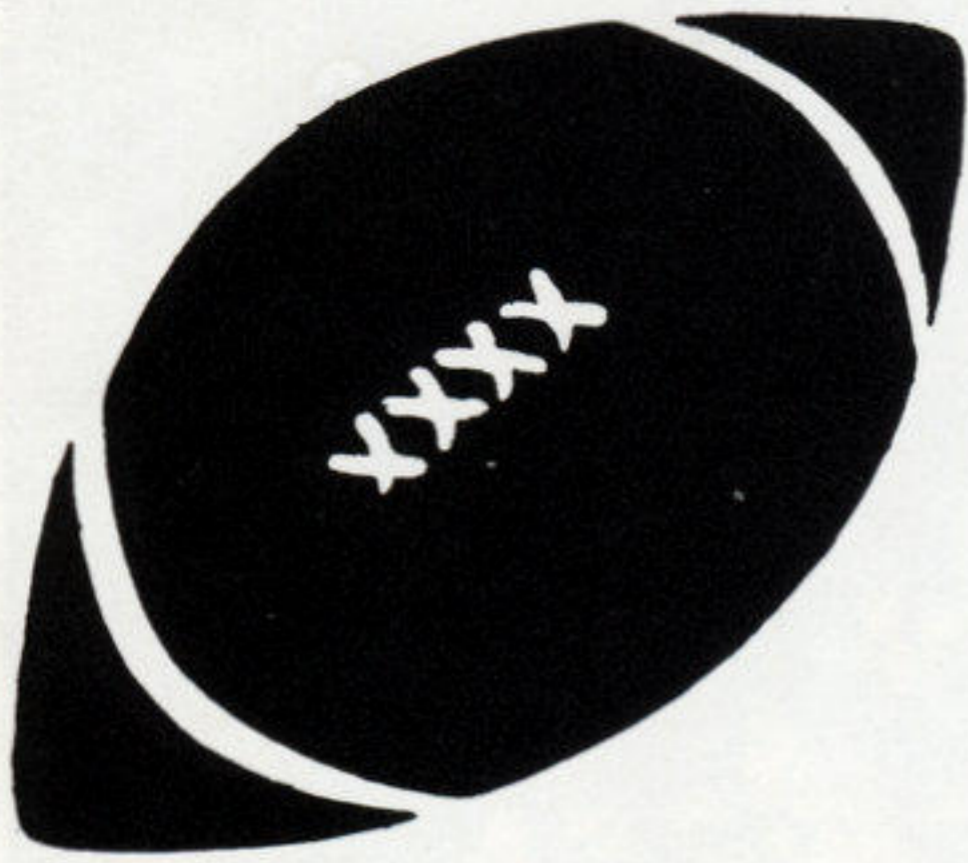

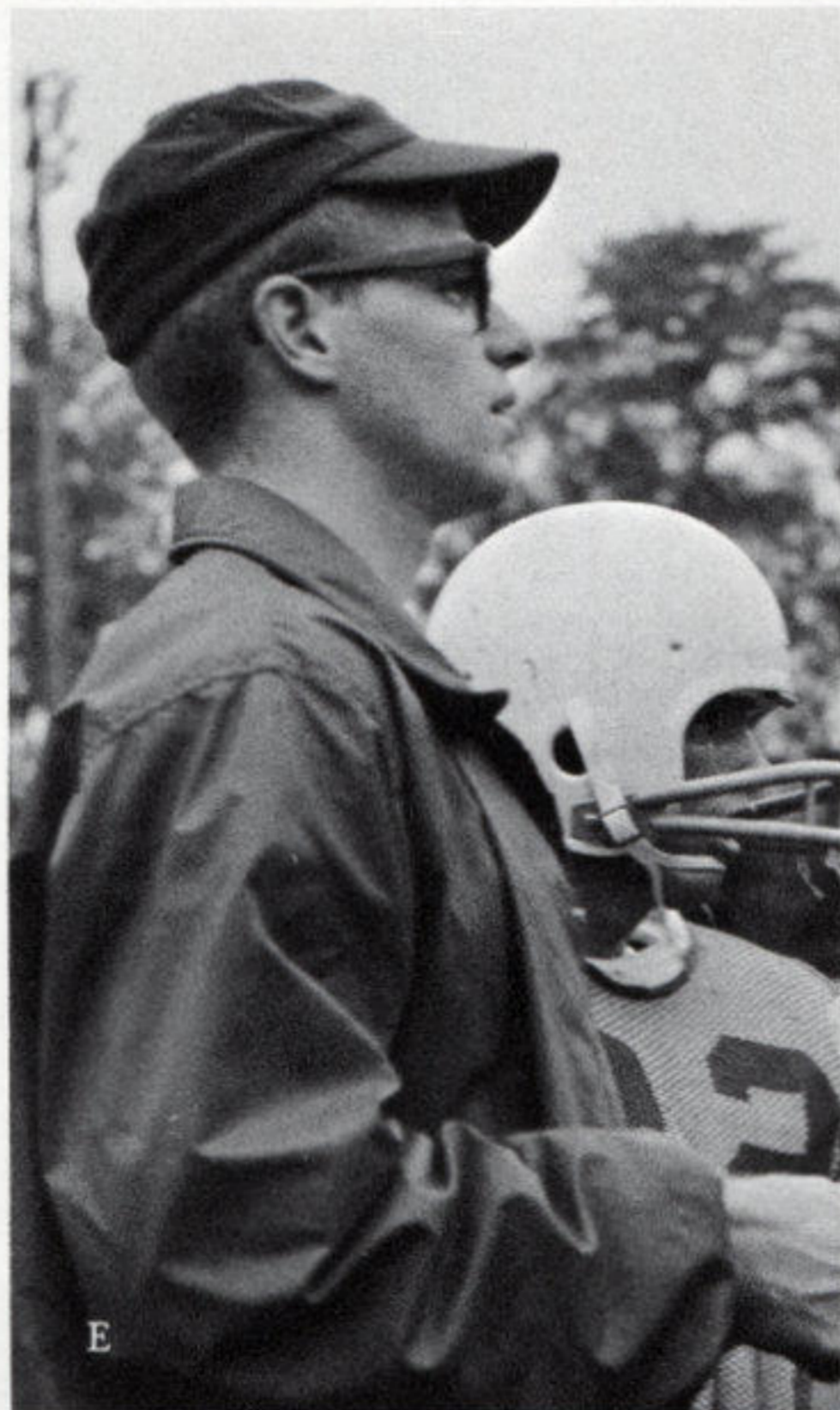

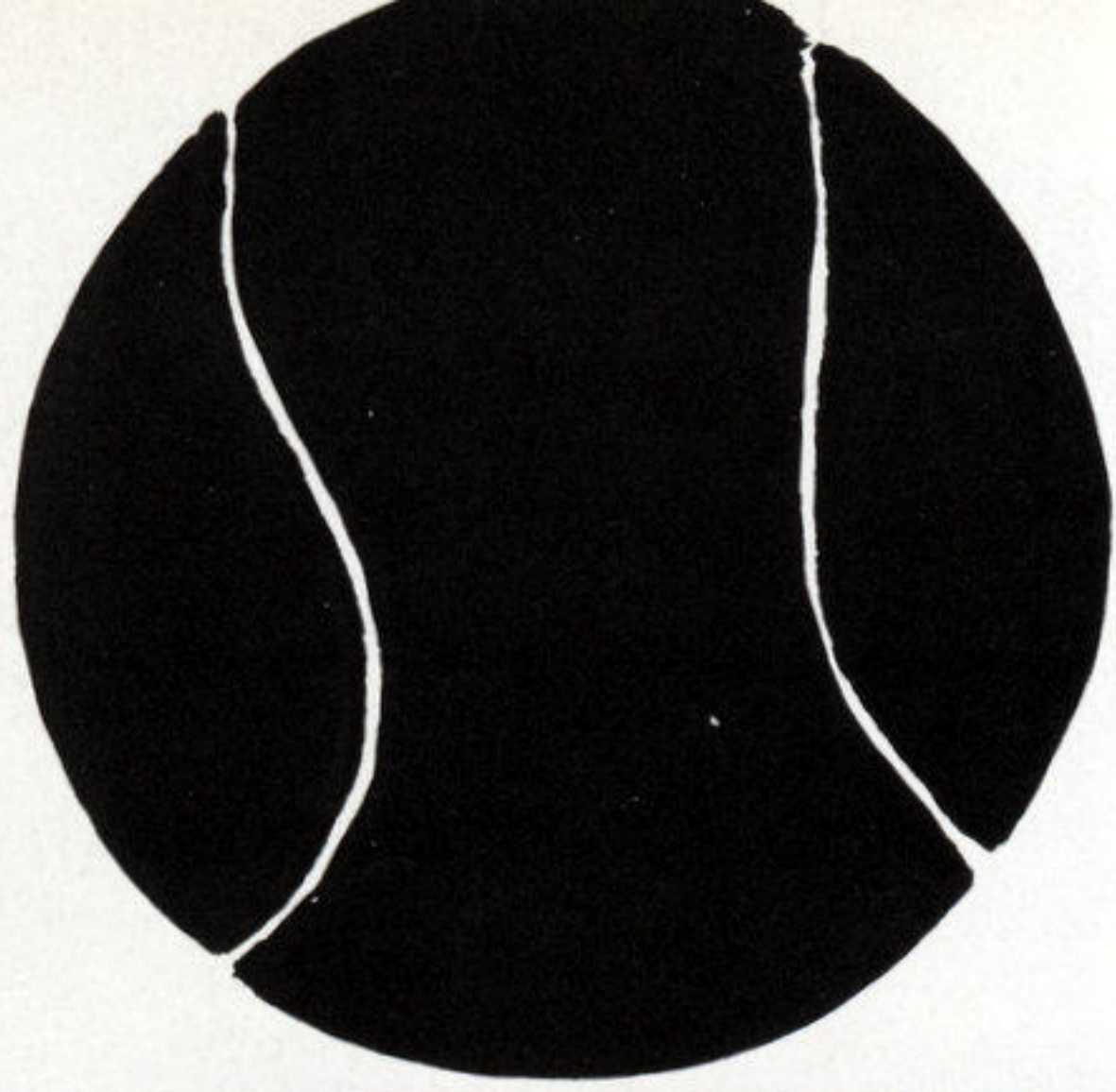
Under the direction of Coaches Ocepek and Dickson the 1969 reserve team played an aggressive season. Even though winless in six starts, they played with much effort and determination.

Many underclassmen gained adequate football knowledge and skill to produce the quality necessary to play Varsity football in 1970.

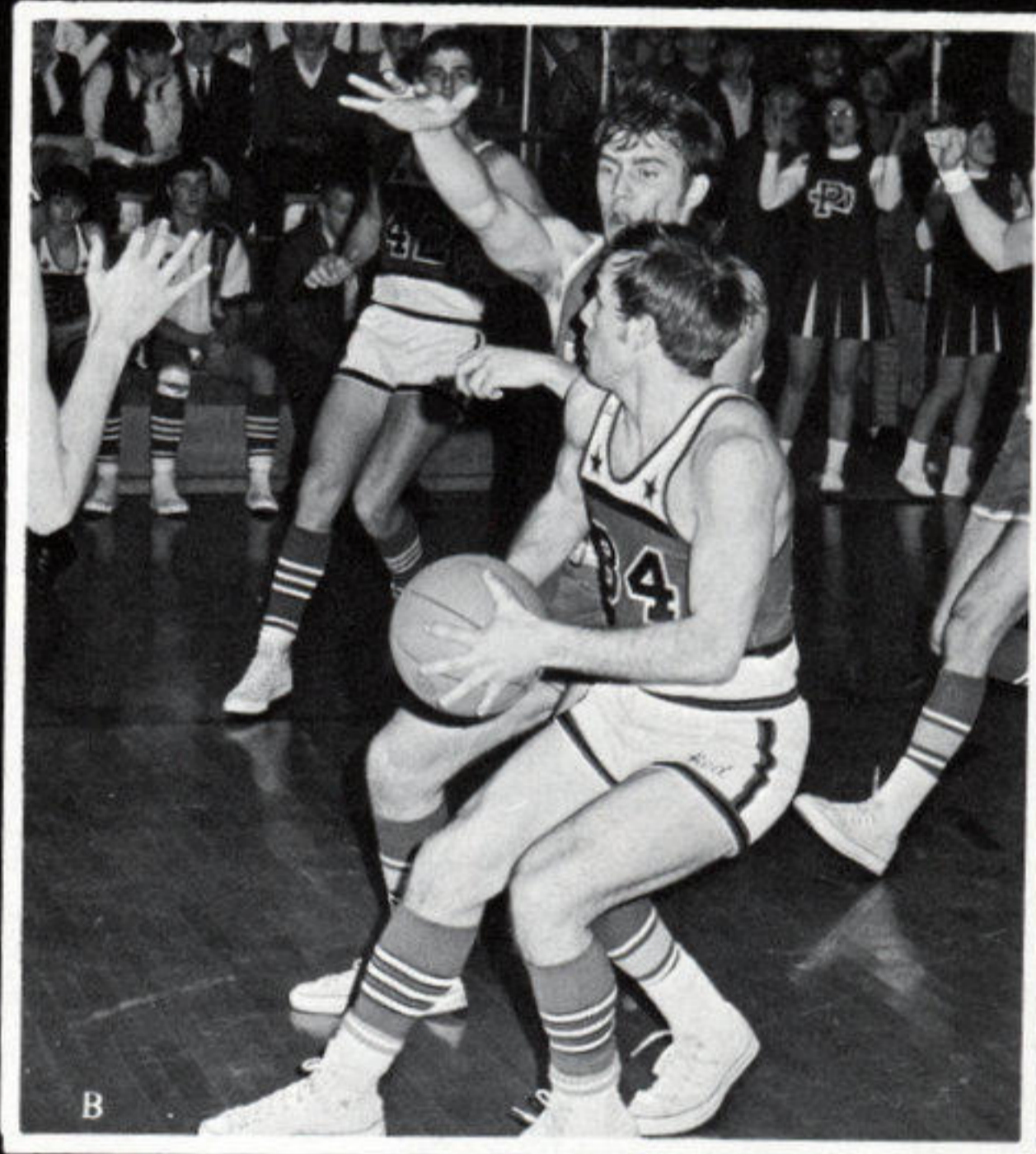

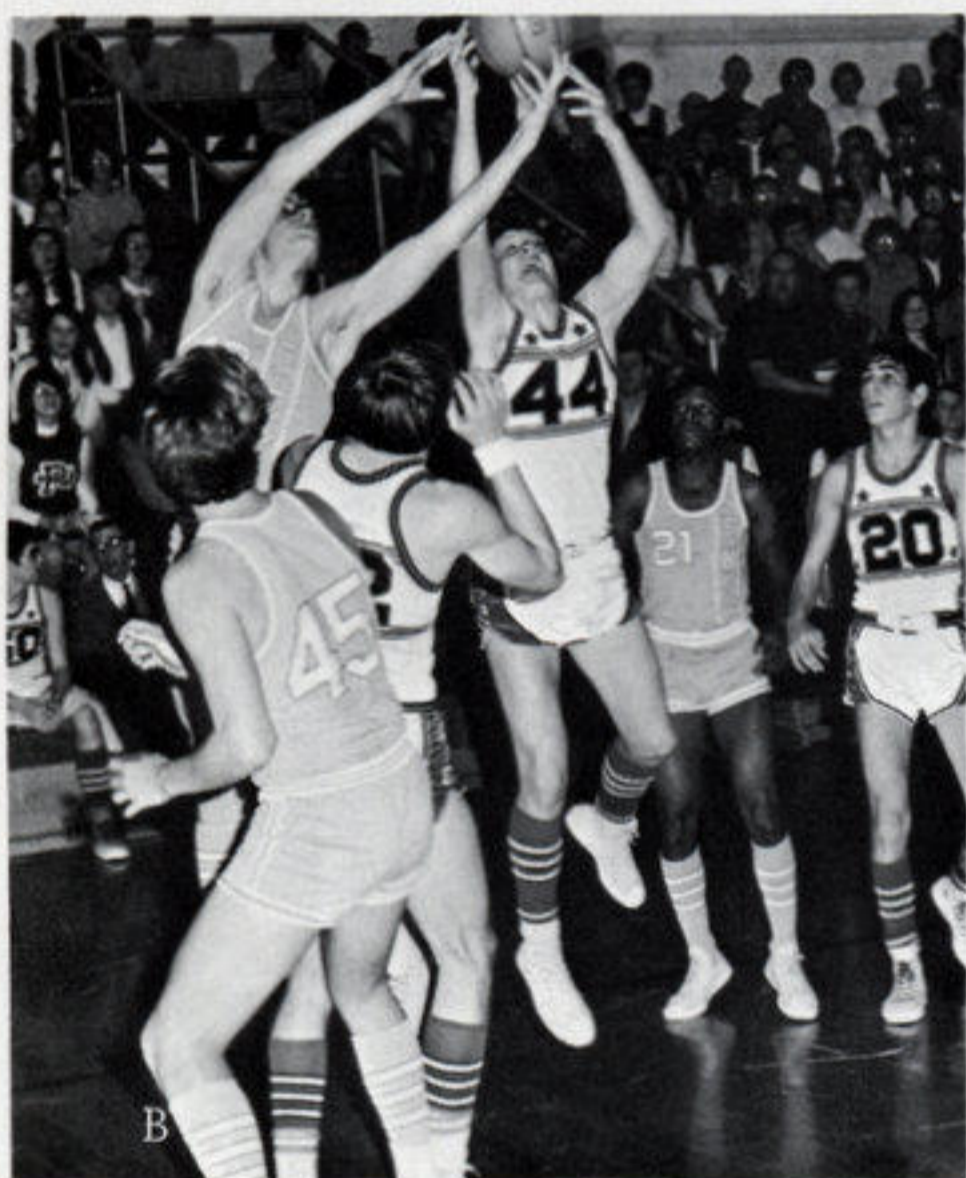

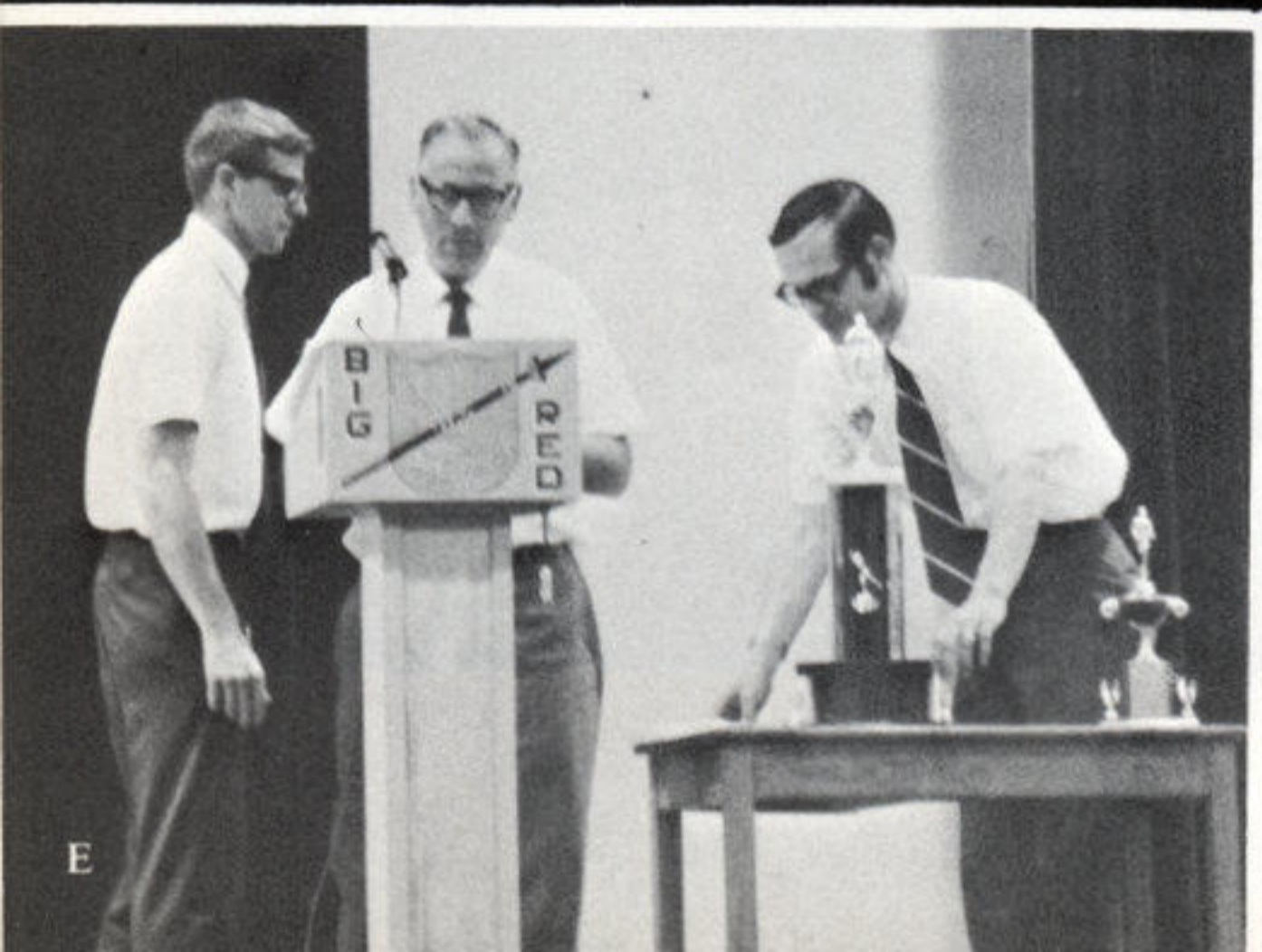
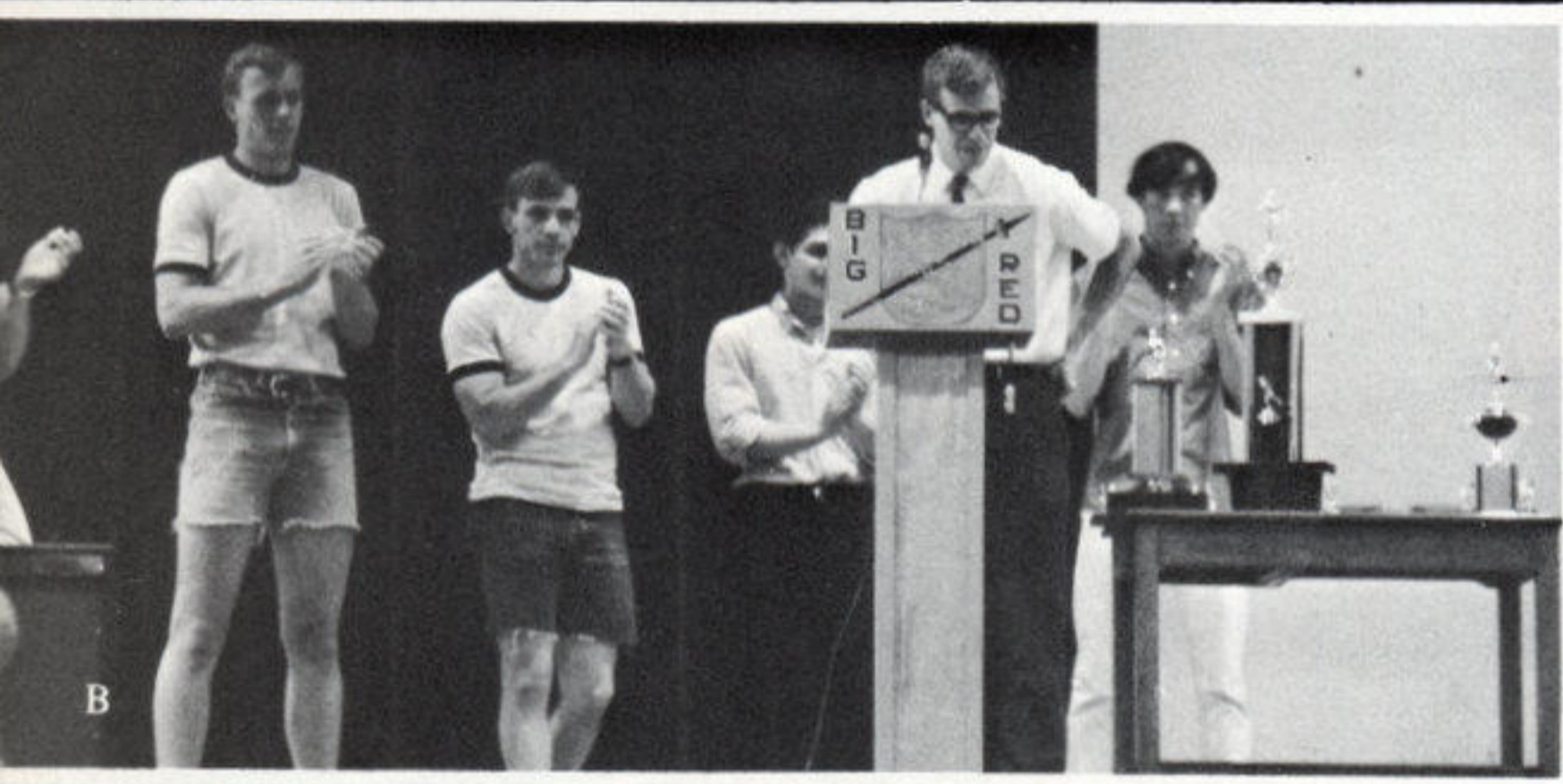
The track squad under the superb direction of coaches Doug Dickson and "Bud" Oceppek took top honors in the spring sports despite the absence of a track. They broke eight records, brought home three trophies, and the 880 relay team went to the State meet.

Dwayne Kok proceeded to break his own record in the shot put leaving it at 48' 1 3/4". John Conley pole vaulted at a height of 12'6" and ran the low hurdles in 21.0. The 220 was set at 22.5 by Jim Adams. He also set the 100 yard dash at 10.0. Bill Van Wagner threw the discus 139'5". The 880 yard relay team consisting of Jacque Daup, Lee Wilkens, Jim Collins, and Jim Adams set a new time of 1:33.4. Terry Buzard recorded a time of 2:04.4 at the regionals in

the 880 yard run.

The team placed third in the Ashland College Indoor Meet (of 8), second at the Ashland Outdoor Relays (of 7), sixth in the Ontario Relays (of 10), first in the Firestone Invitational (of 9), third in the JAC, and second at the district (of 17). Seven cinder-men advanced to regionals while the four relay men went on to place seventh in the State. The final track record was 48-22.
