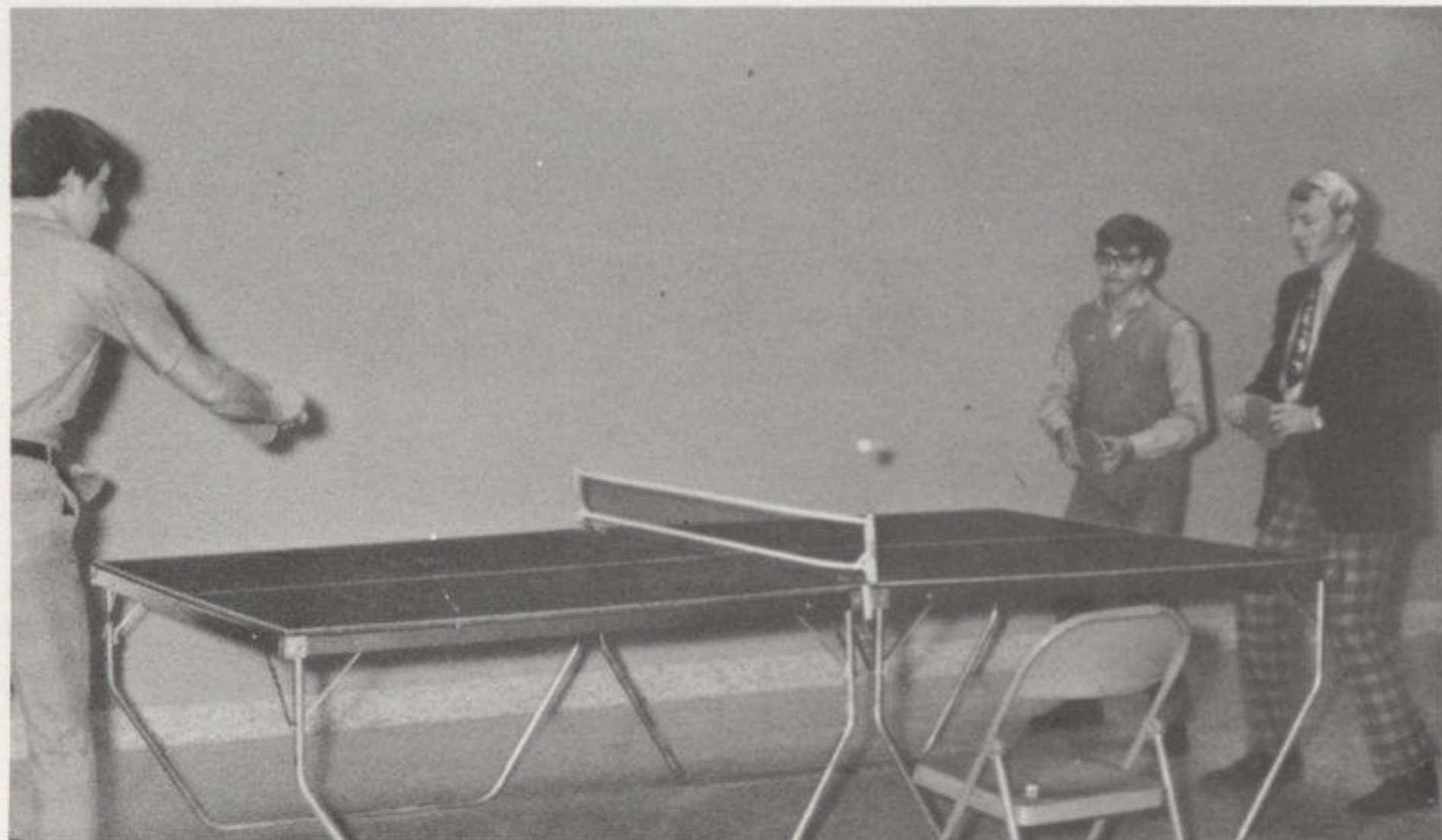

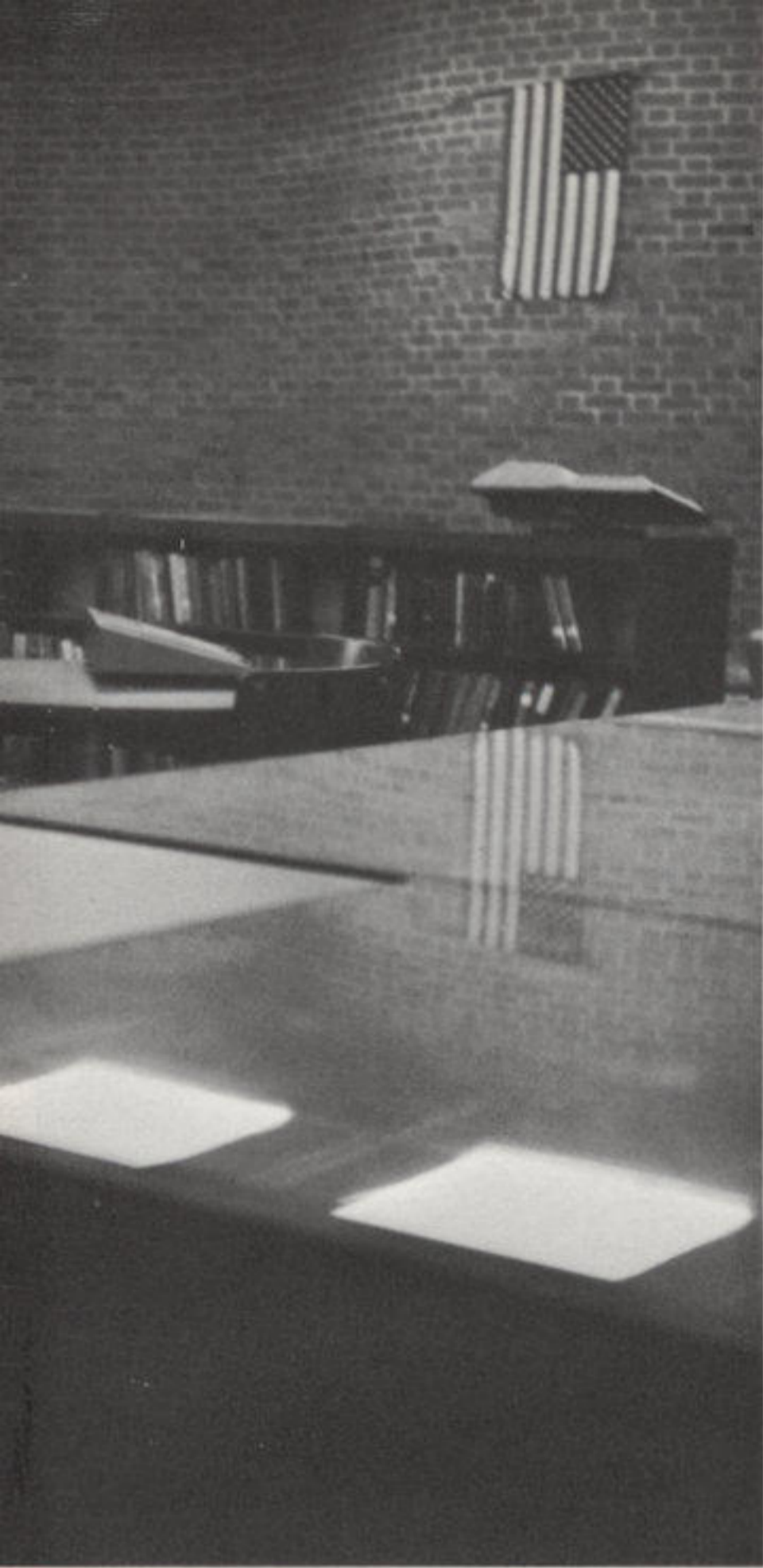

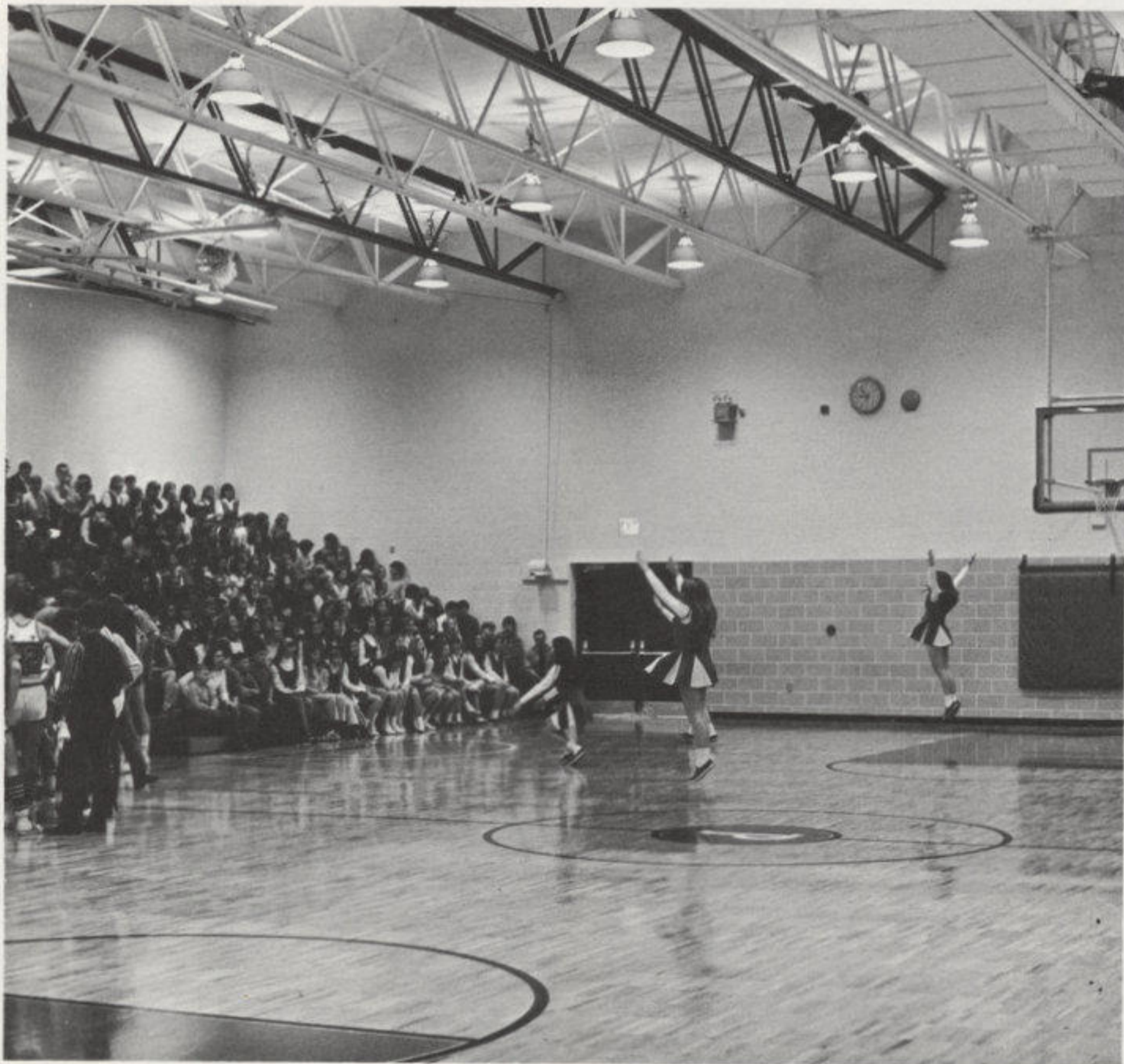

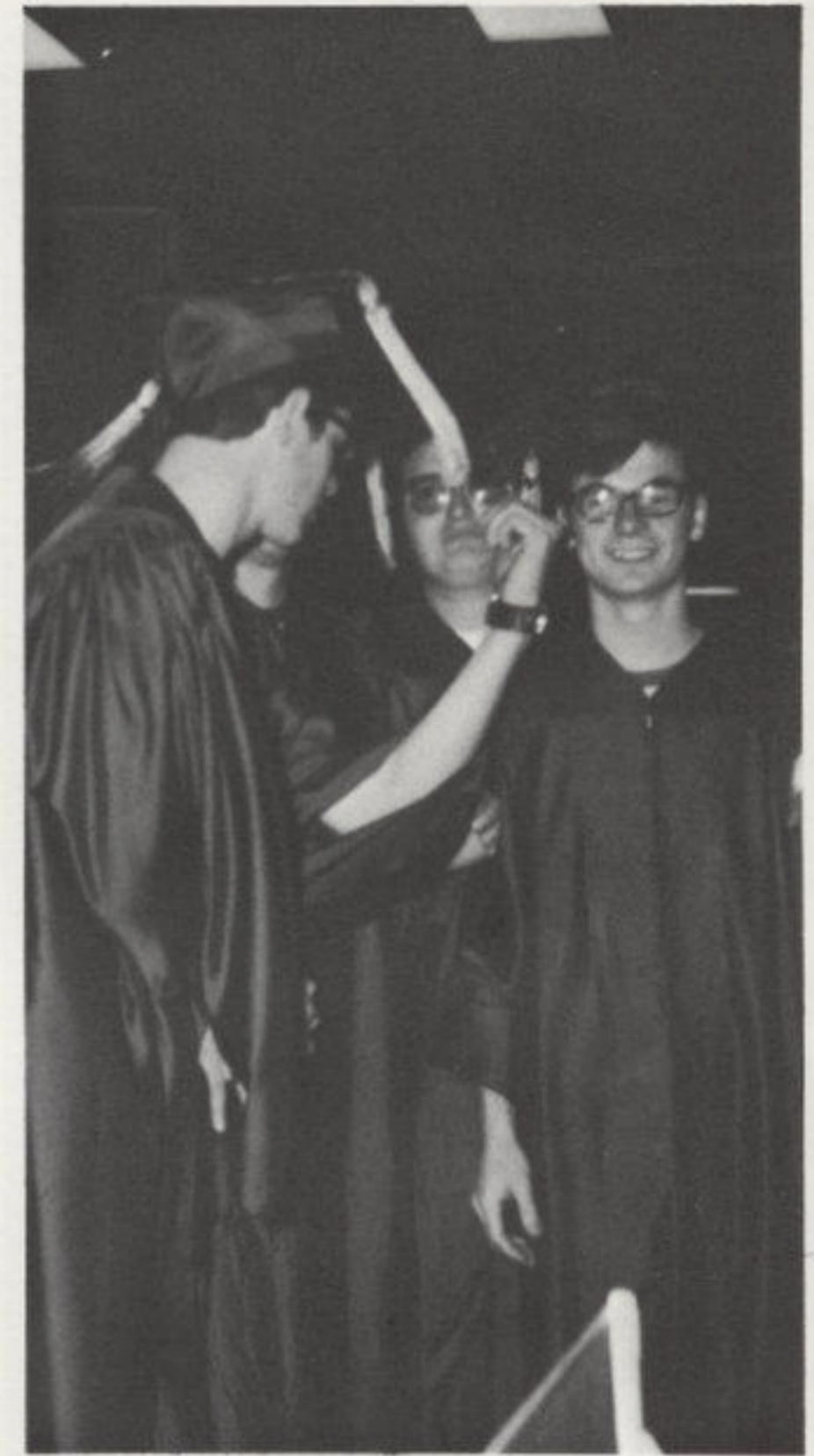

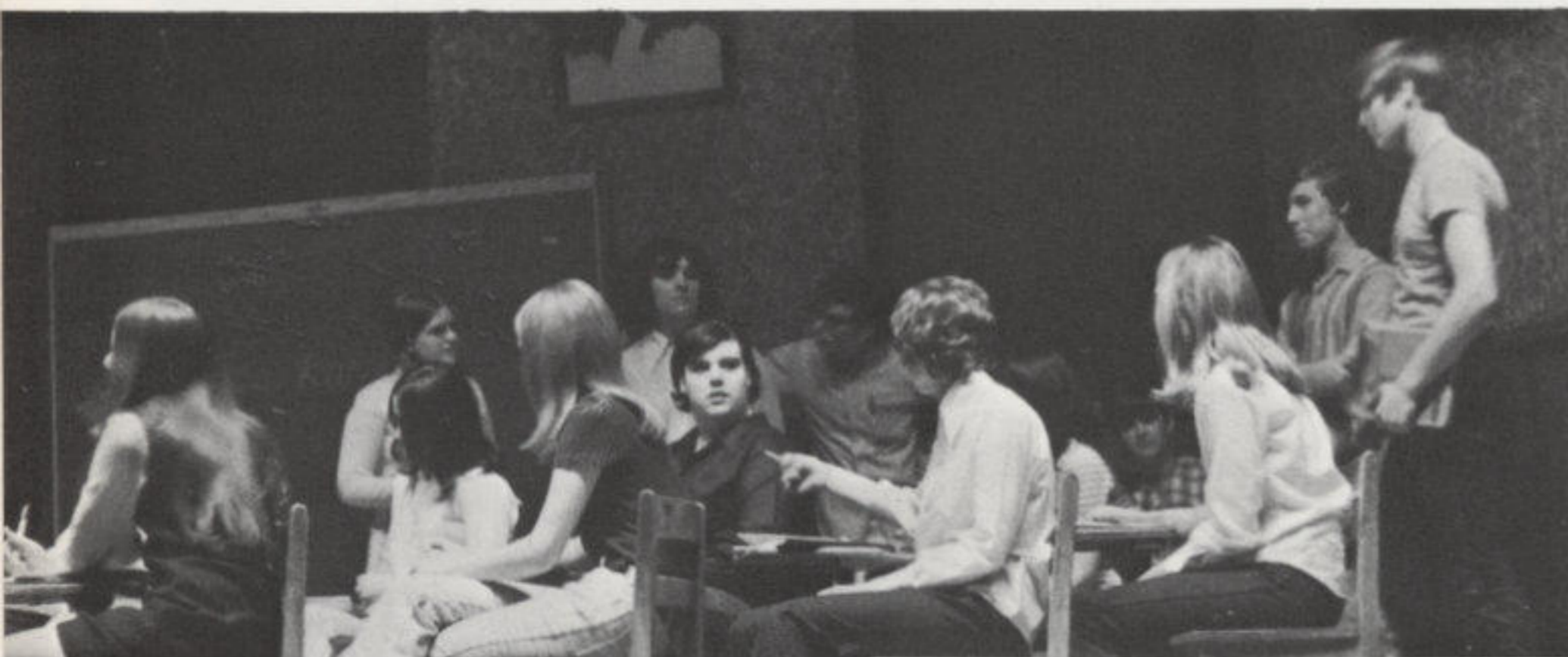

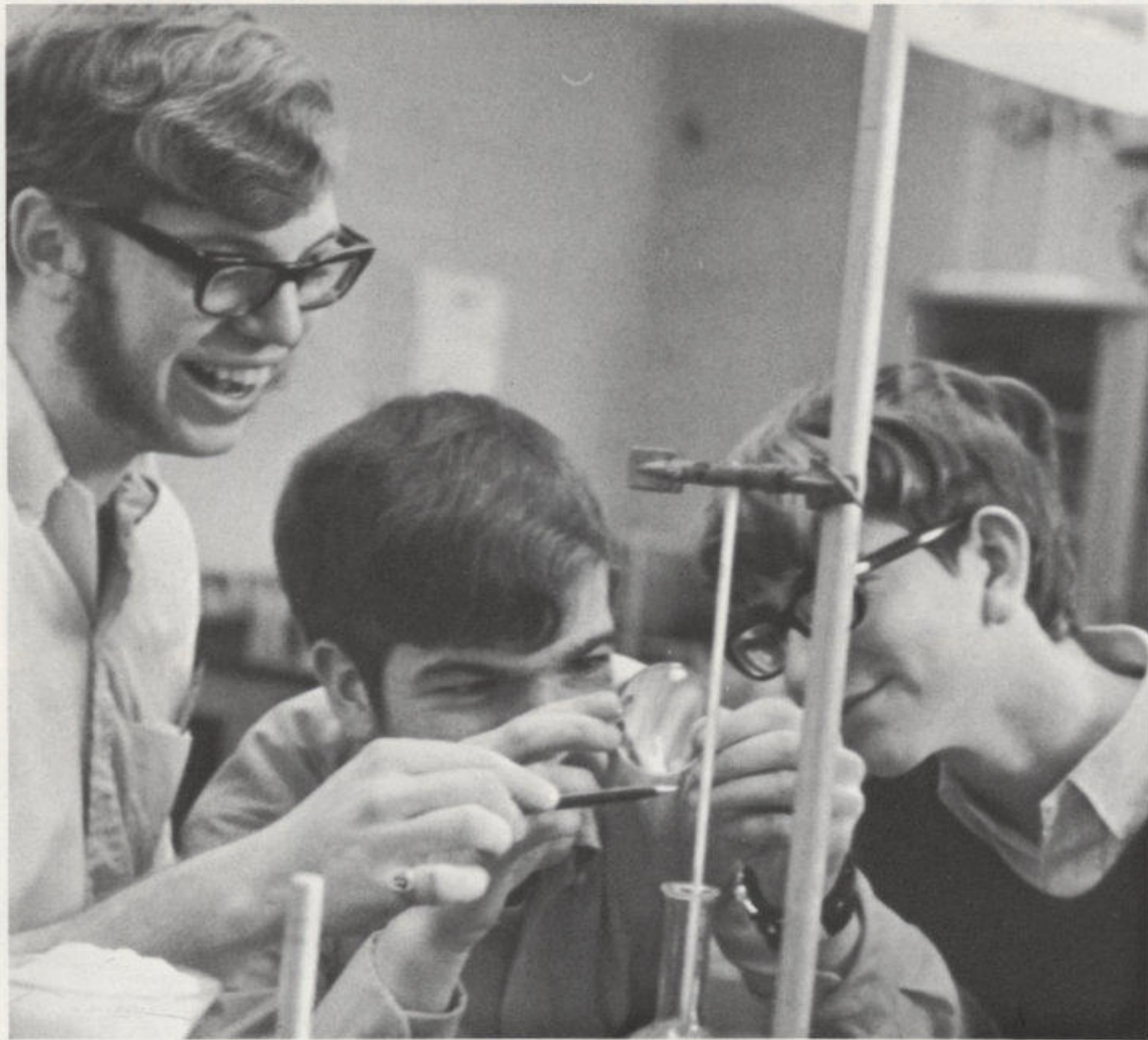

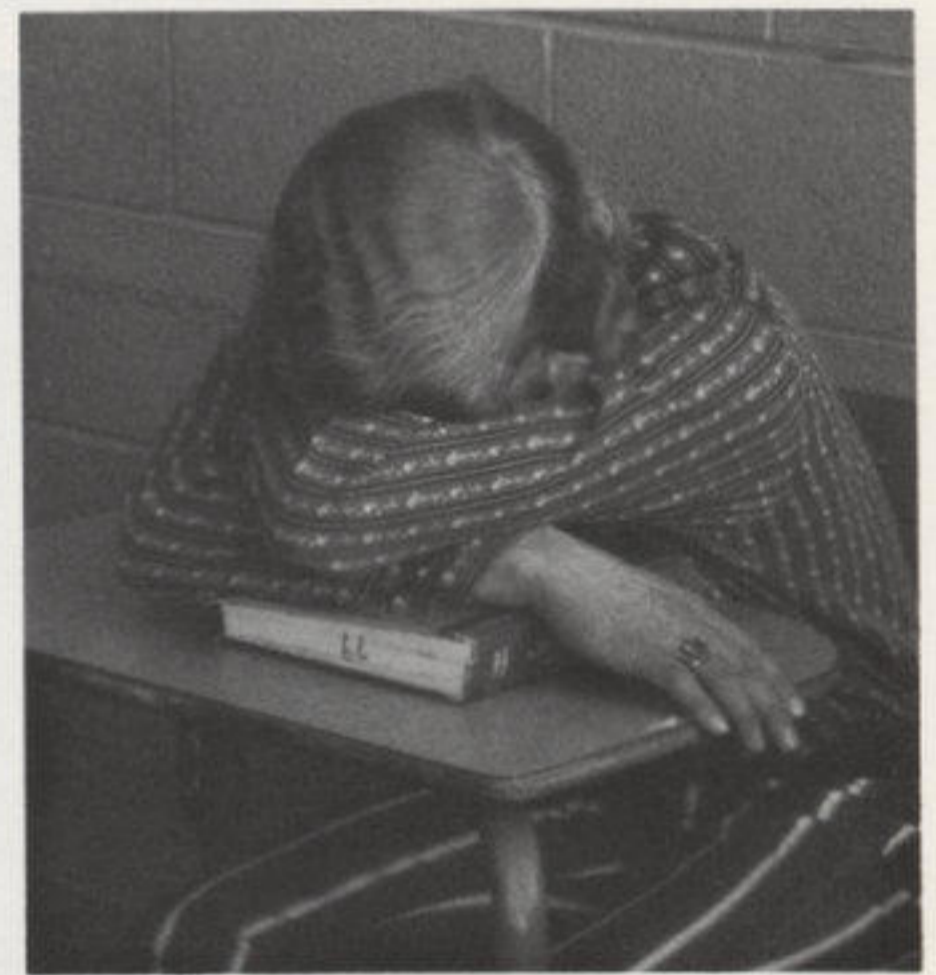

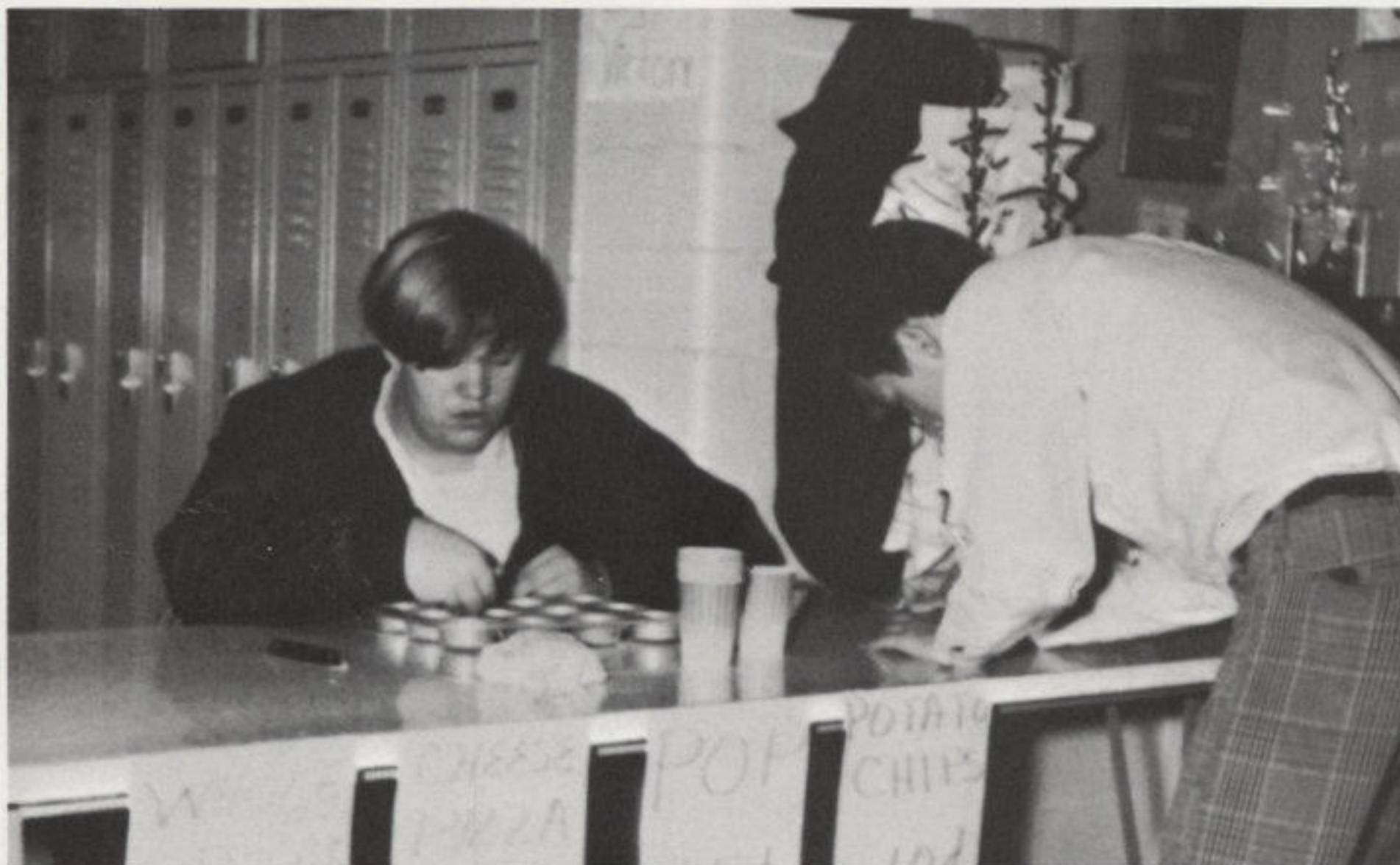

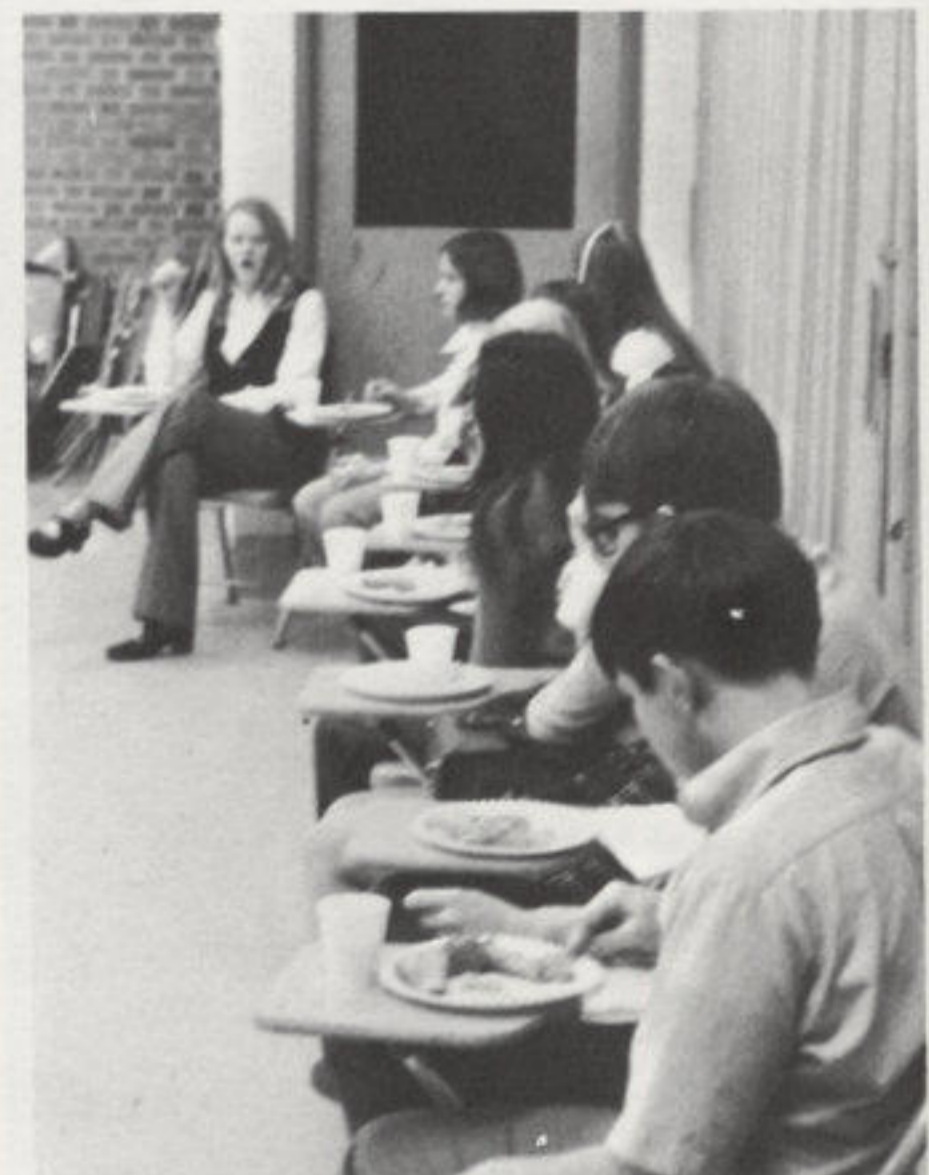

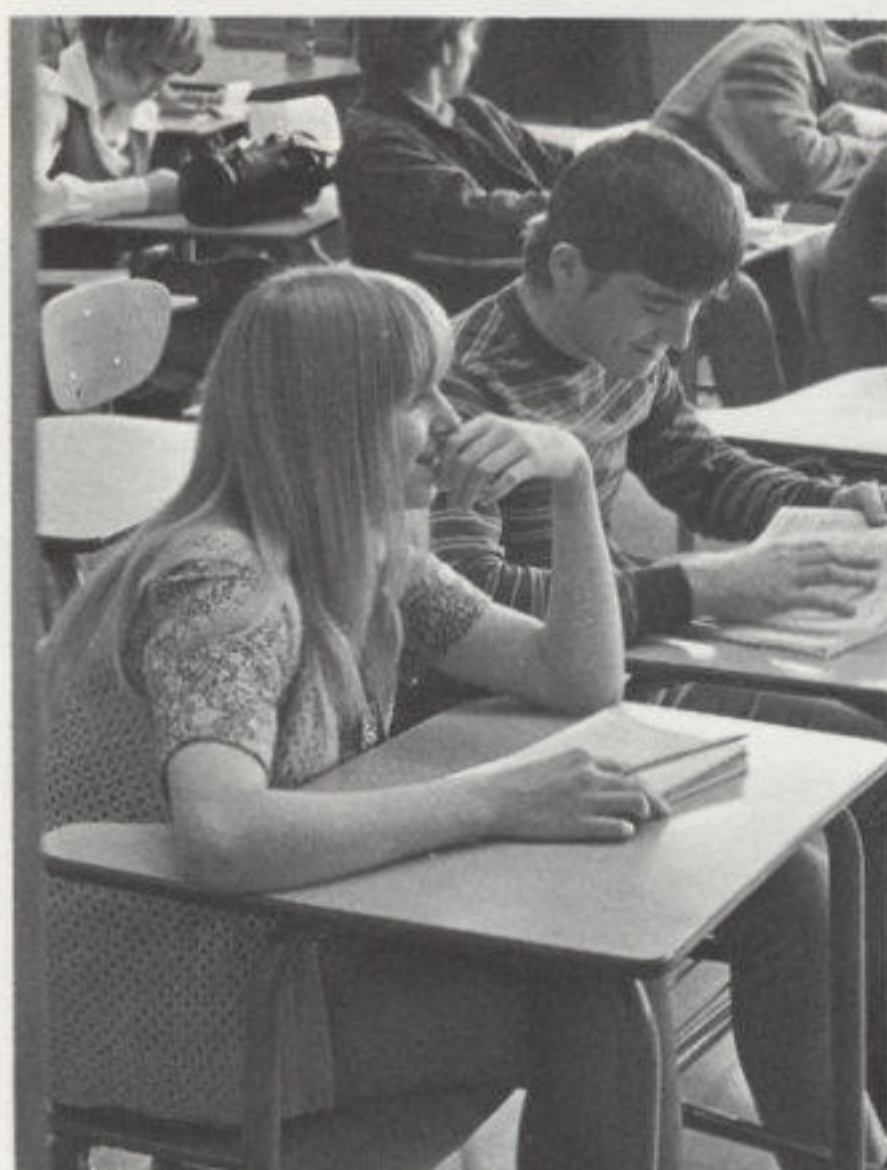

"Up the Down Staircase" Looks At Typical High School Life

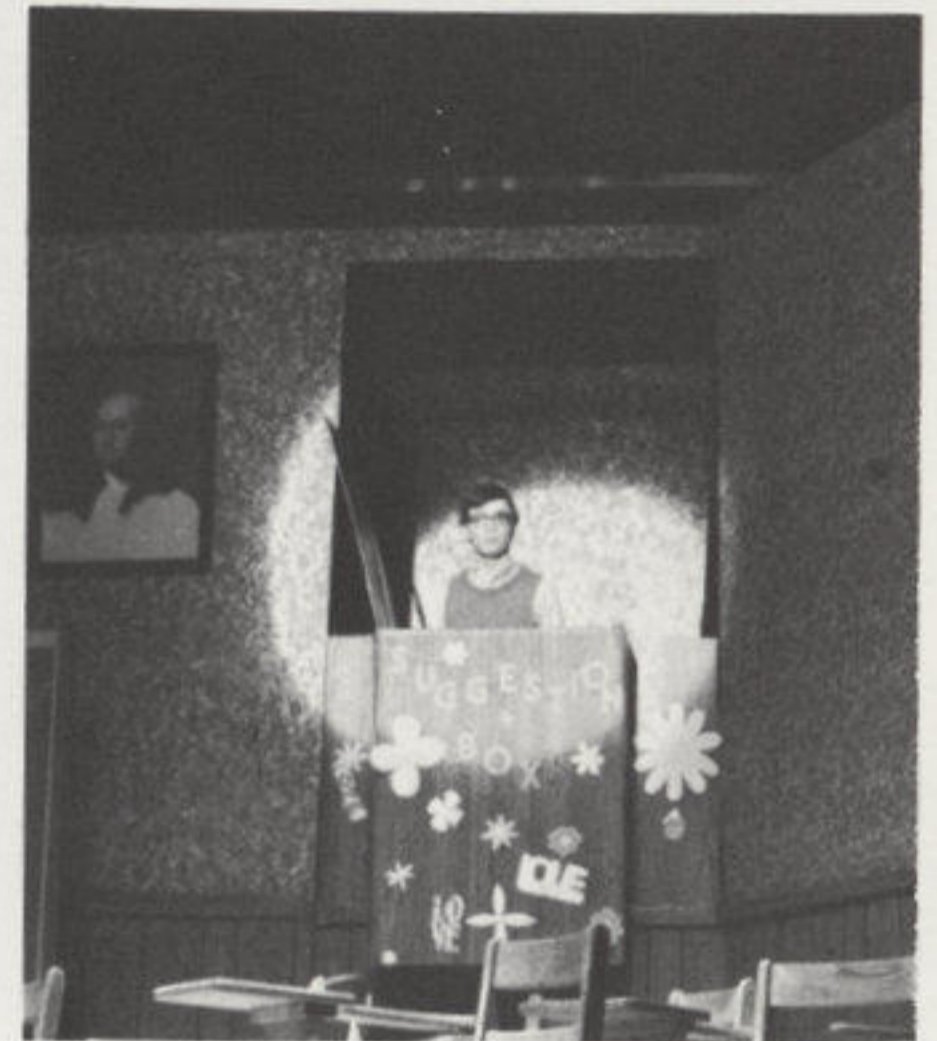

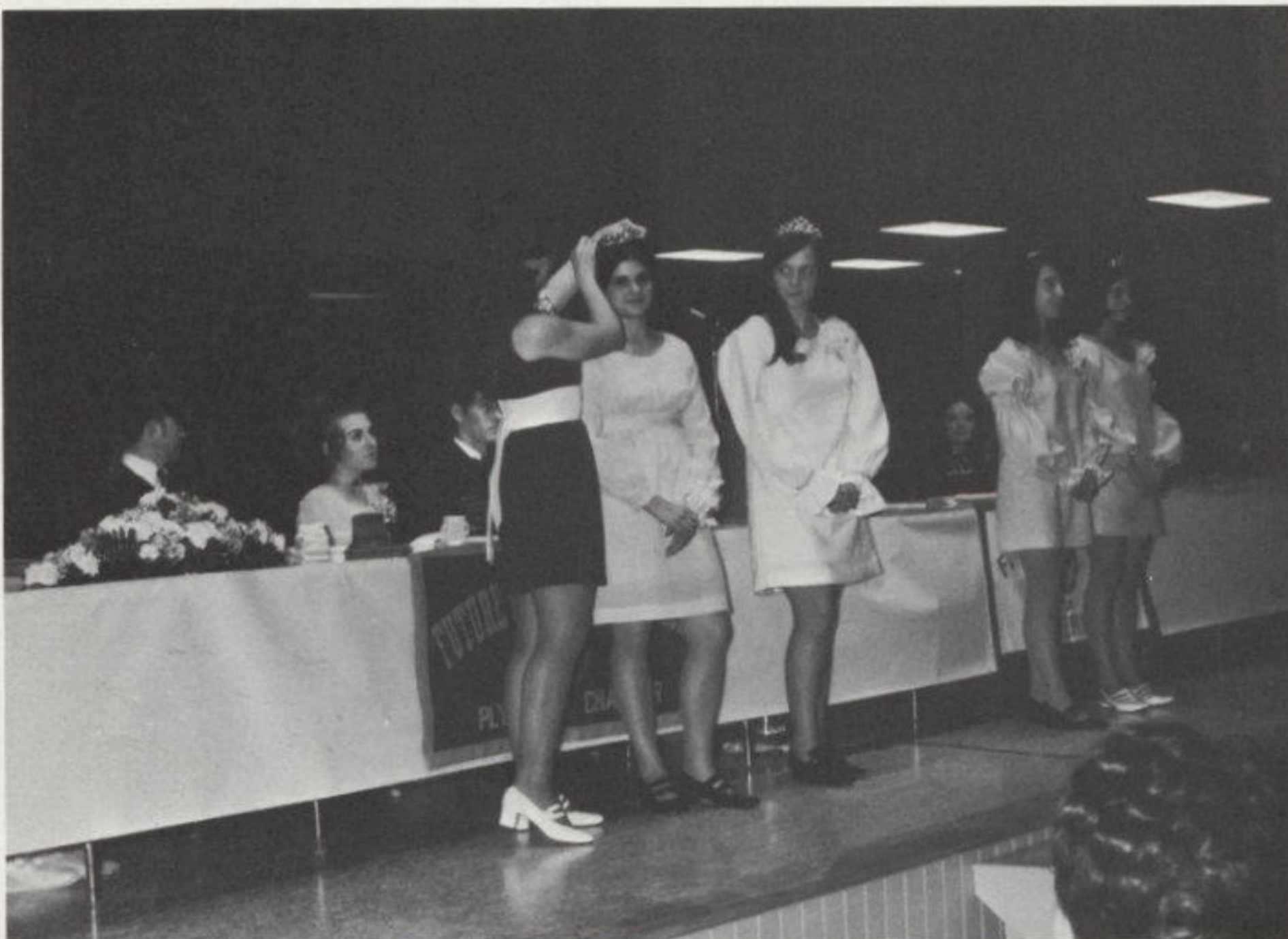

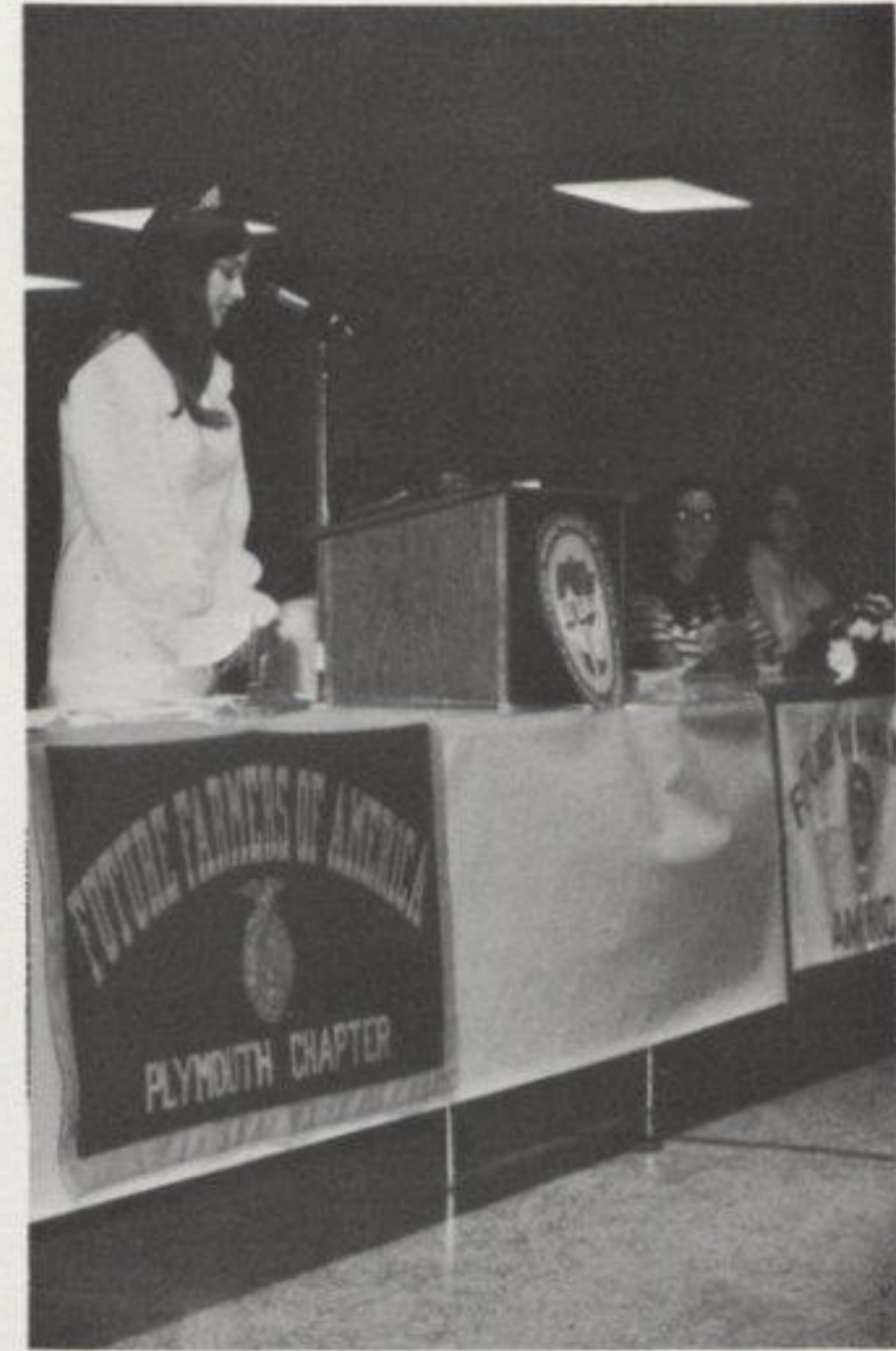

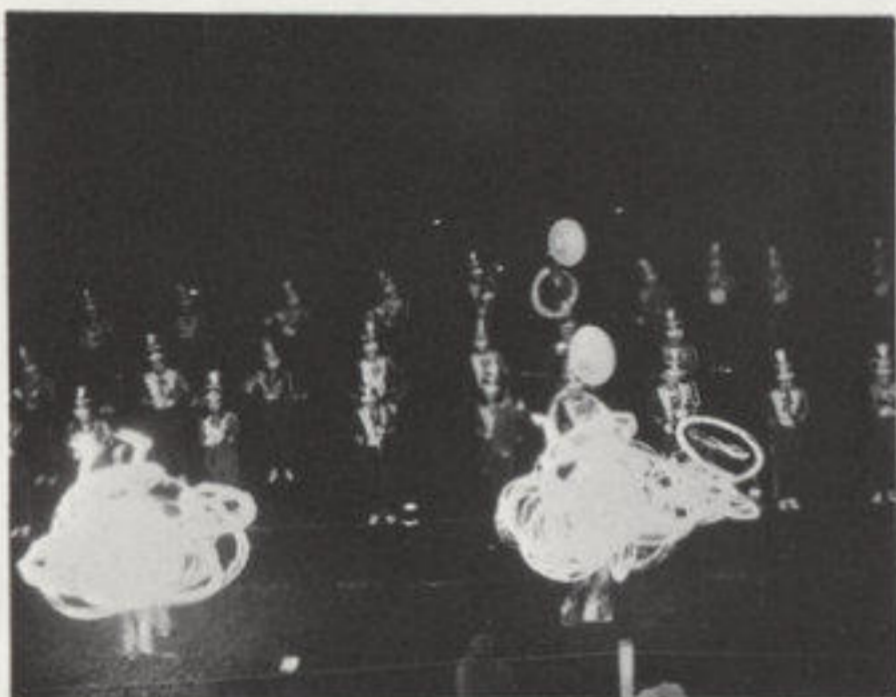

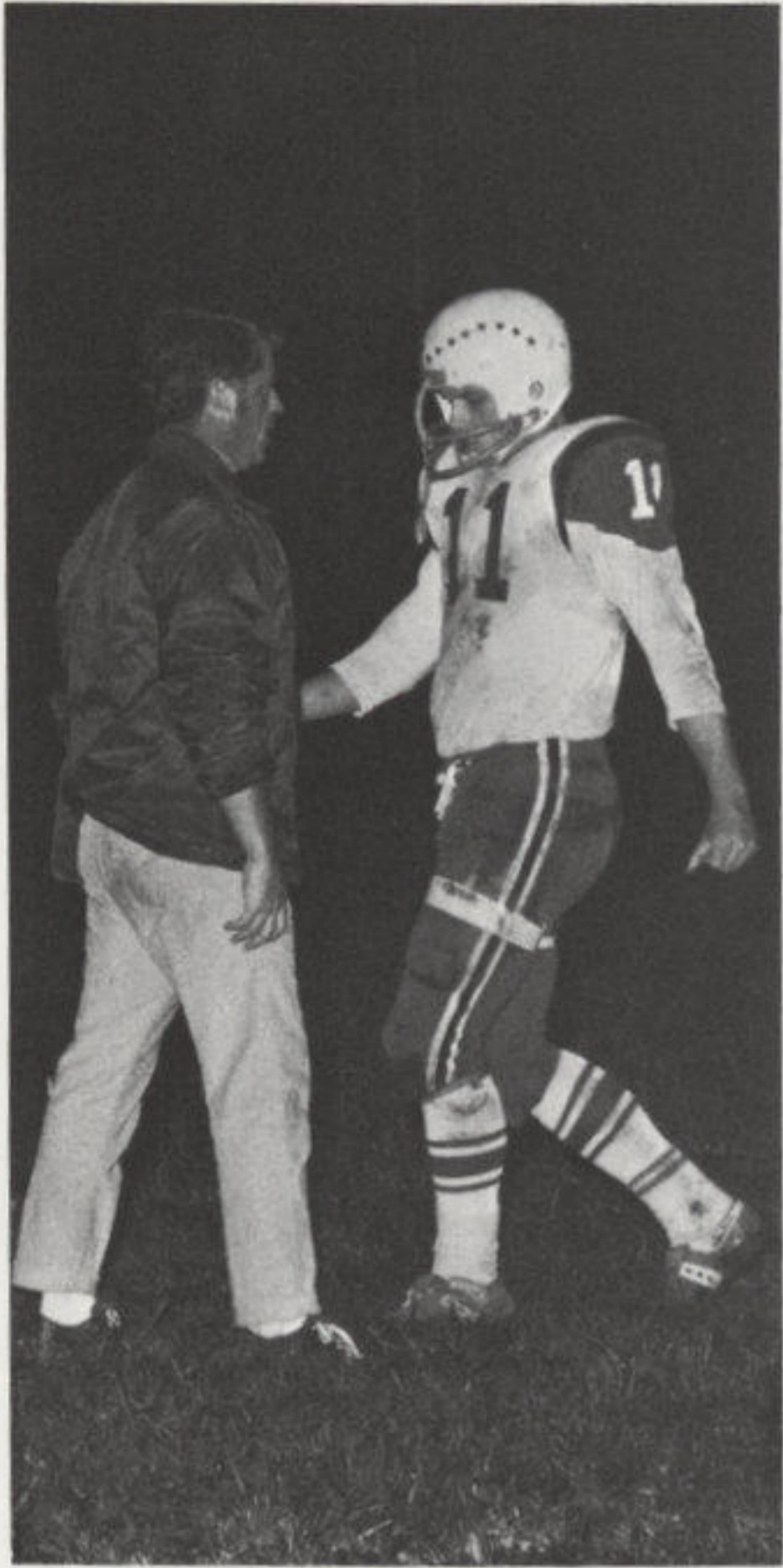


Defense on the down.

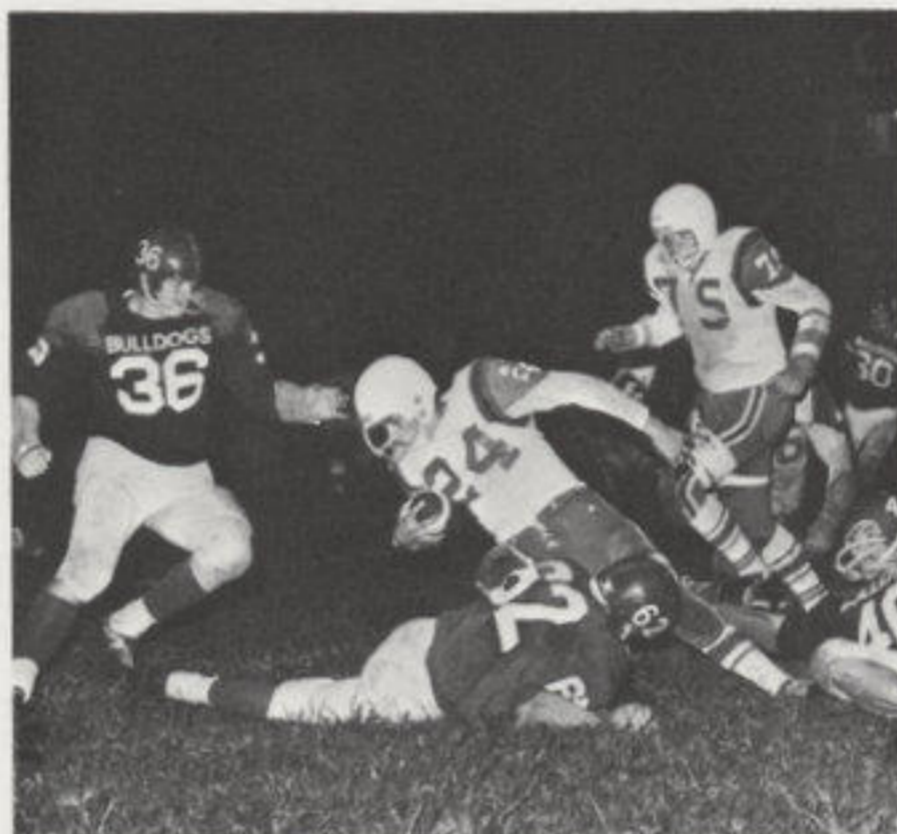

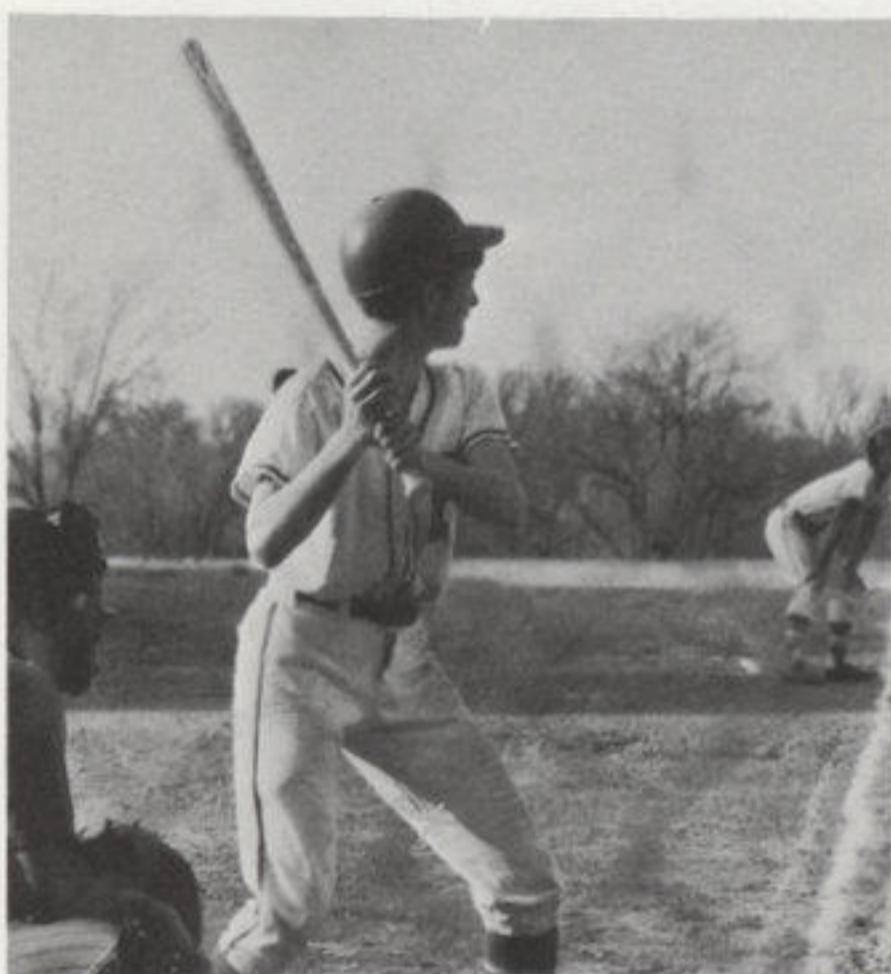

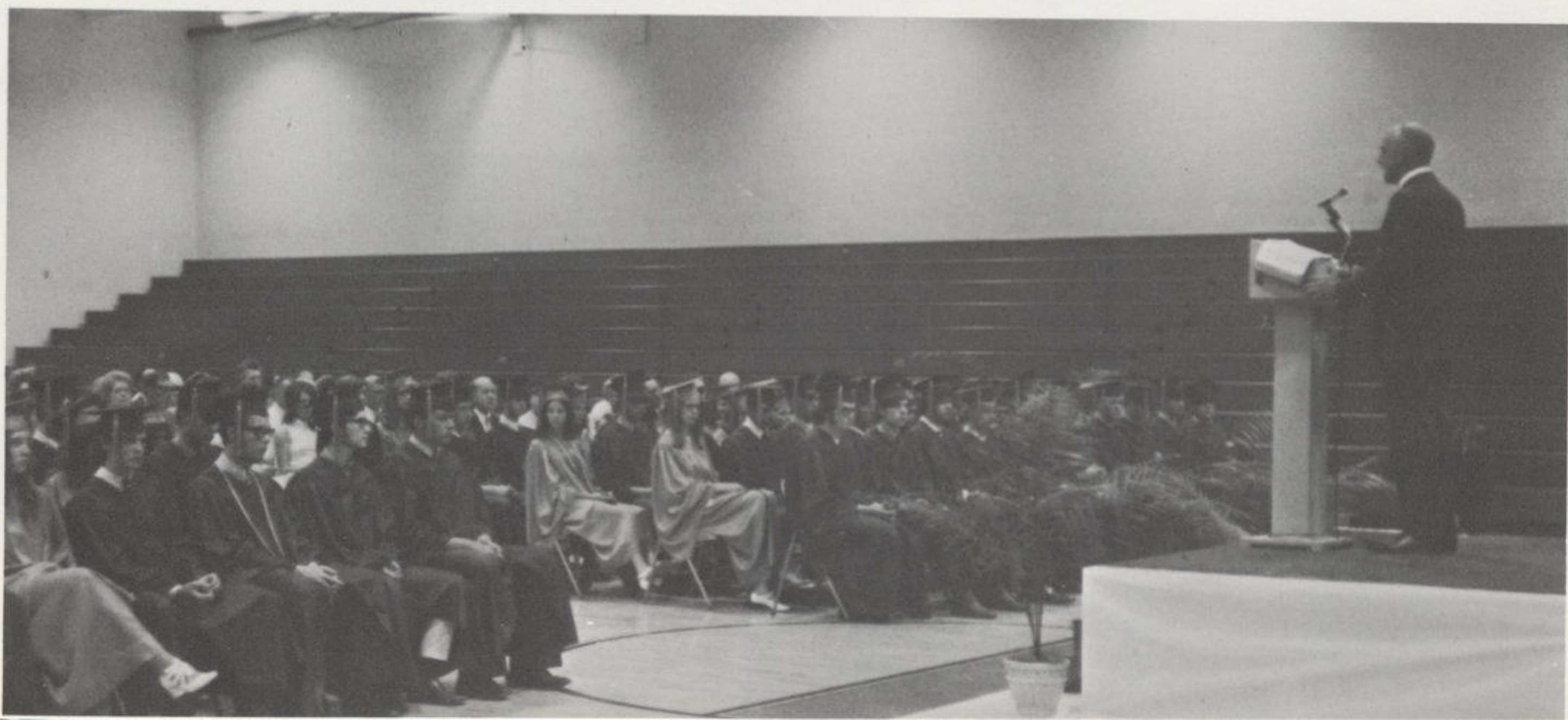
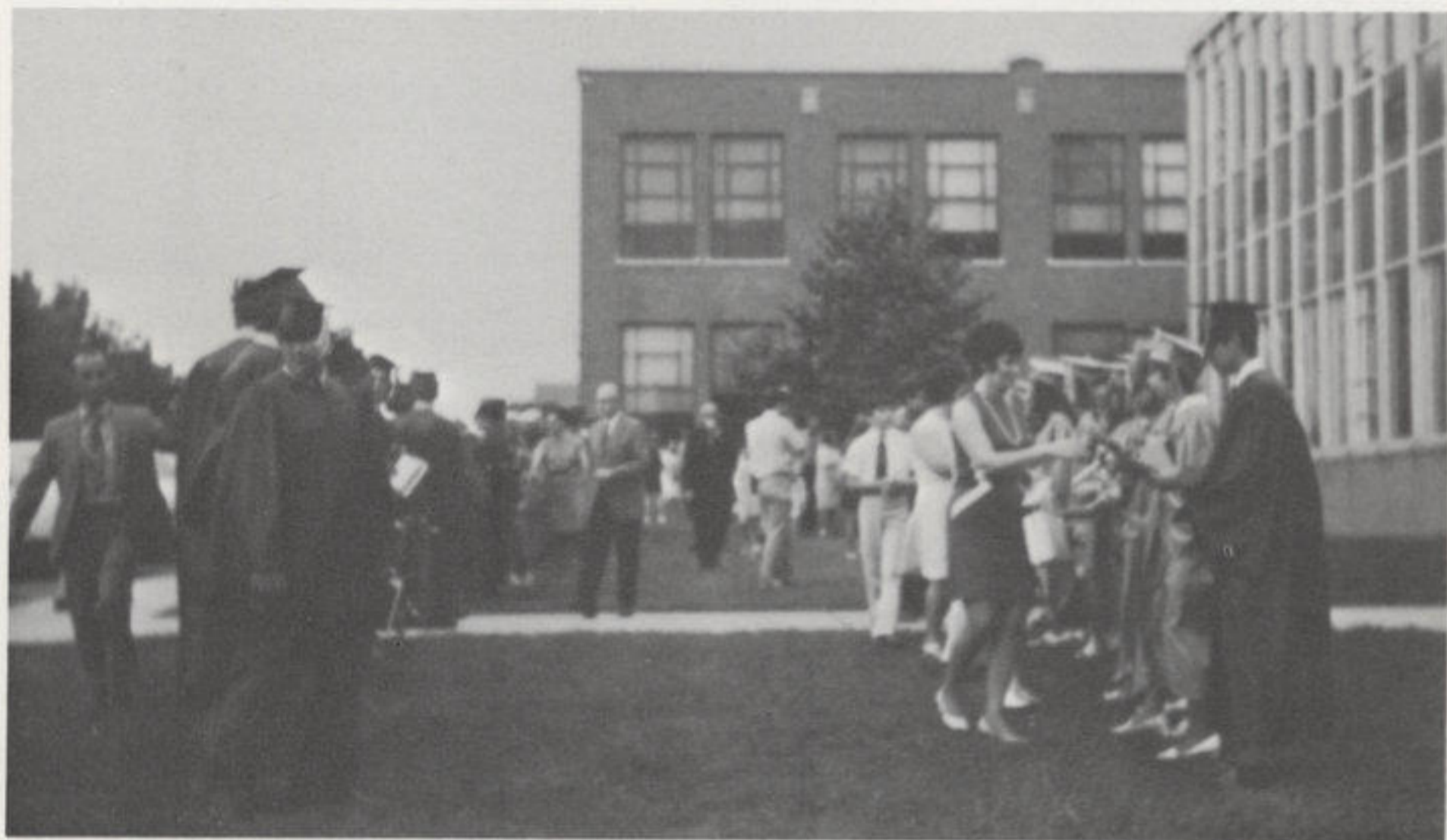
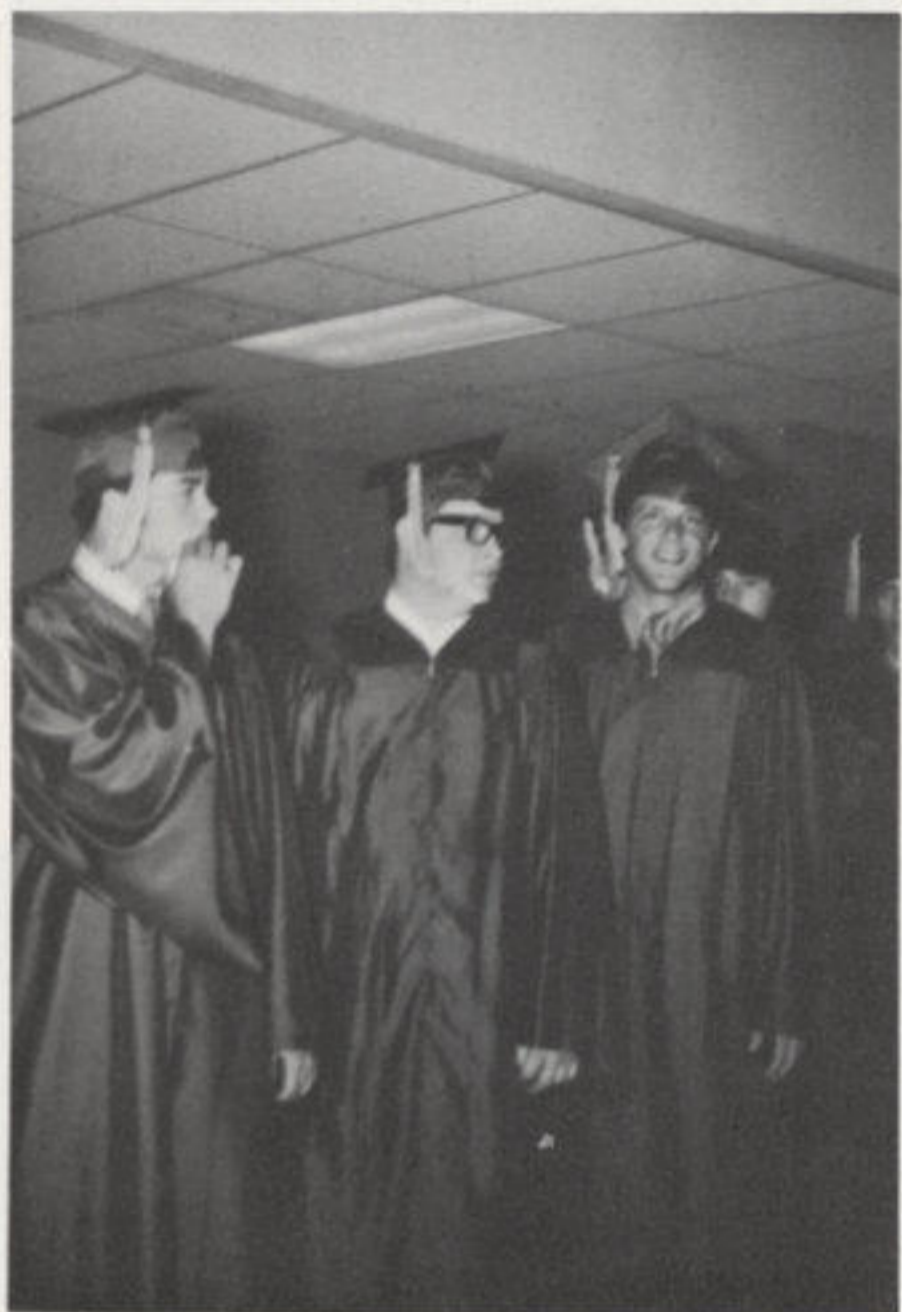
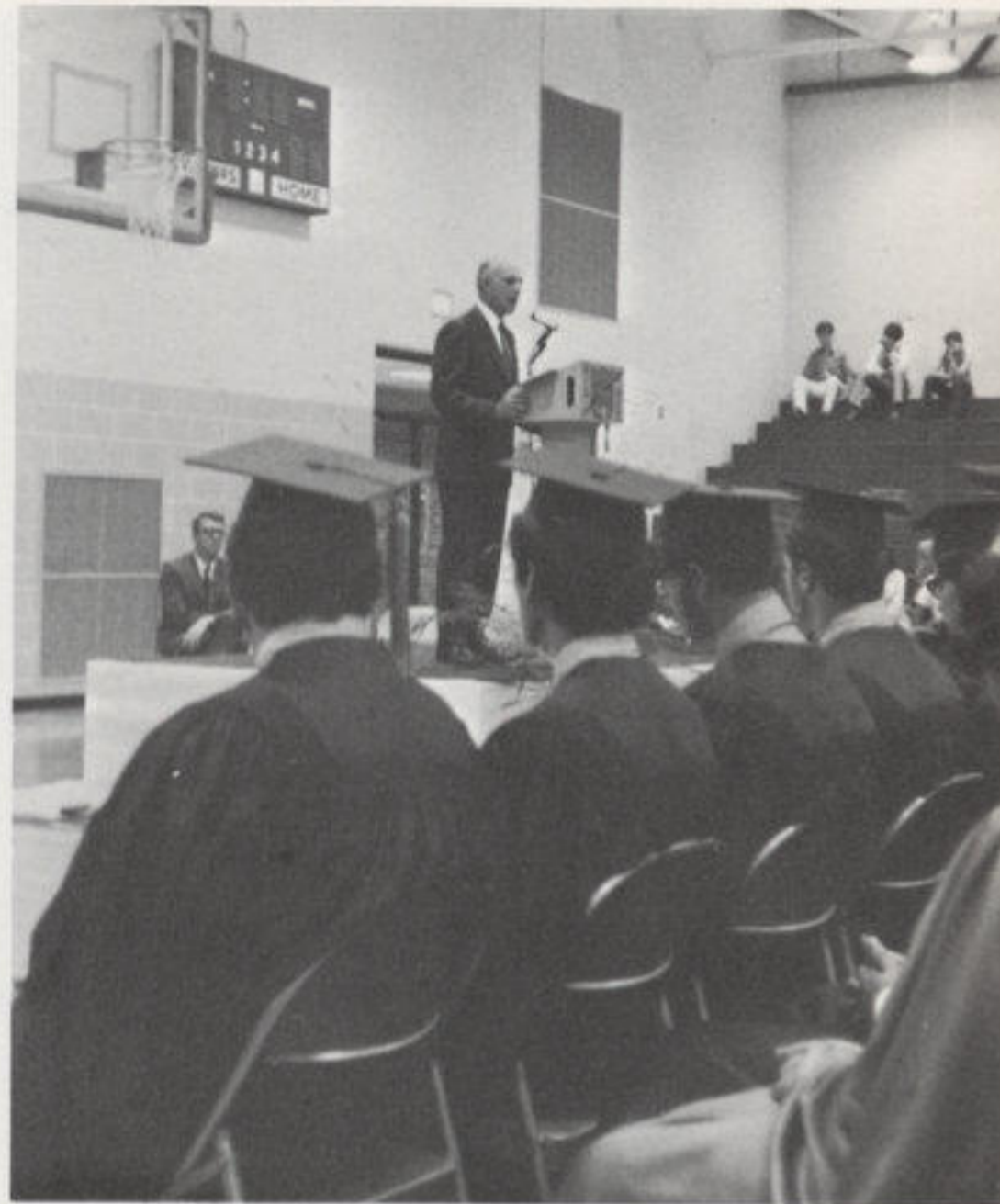




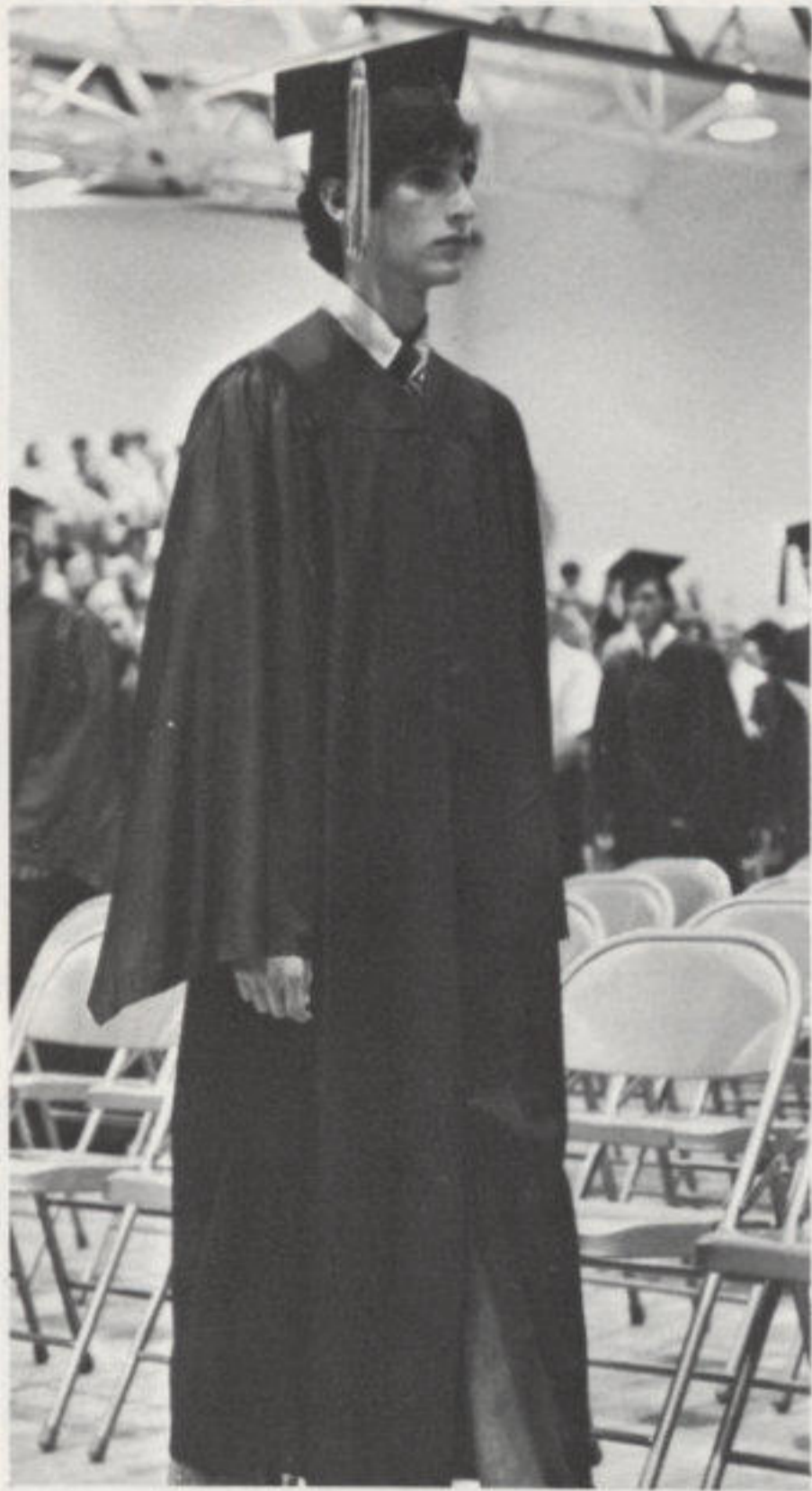
Graduation Is Not an End — It's a Beginning
