The annual Sadie Hawkins dance was held on April 7, 1972. This dance proved to be a big sucess, due to the large turnout of students, who participated in it.

















Flag raising was held again on Friday, October 8. The Big Red then played the Homecoming game and won by a score of 28-6, downing Crestview.


A dance was held on October 9,

F.H.A. and F.F.A. Holds Annual Spring Banquet







Reserve letters were awarded by Mr. Haney to eleven basketball athletes.






