

Twelve years have gone by for 105 seniors. Next years seniors are making plans for their final year at P.H.S. Underclassmen are preparing for the future.

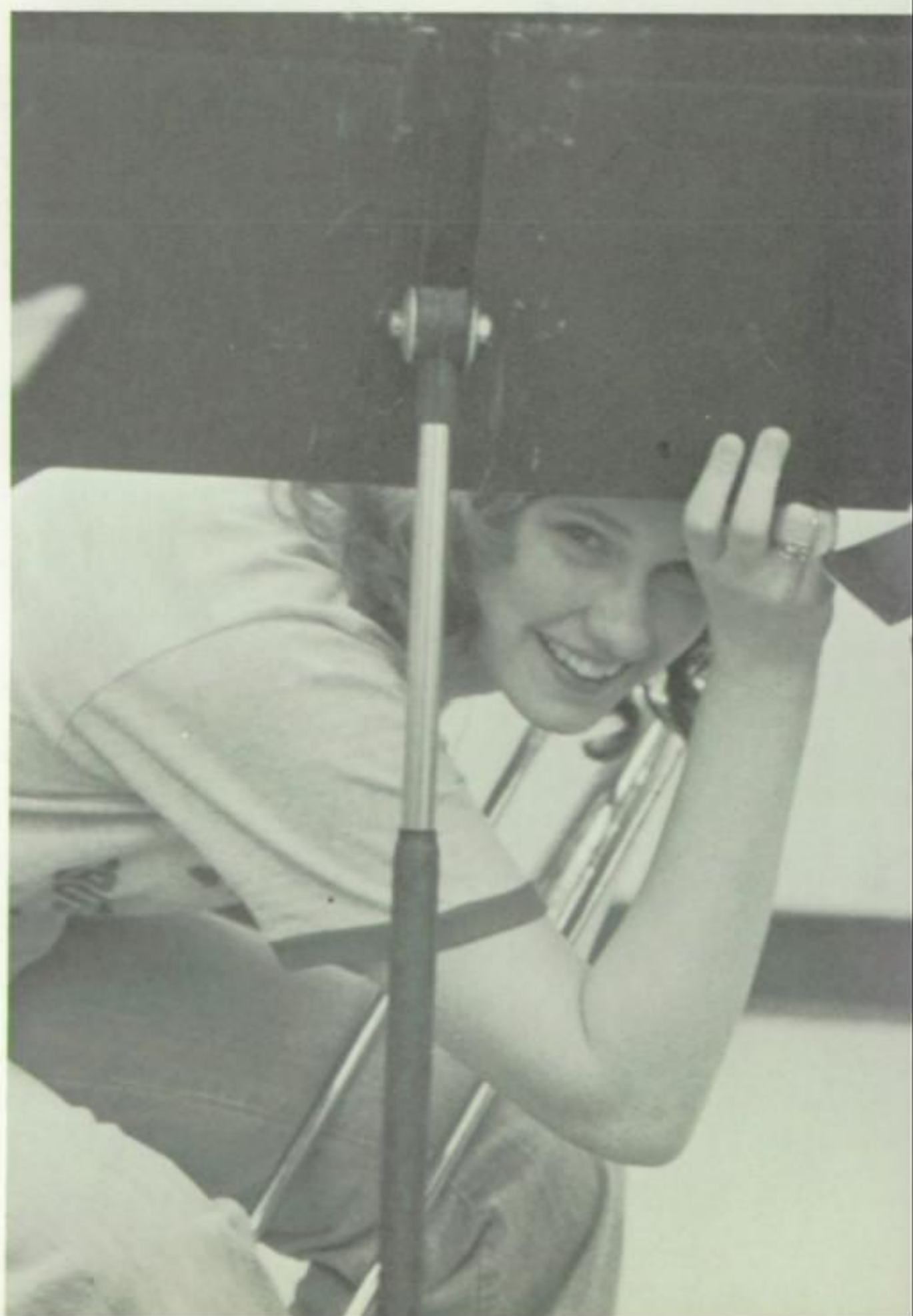
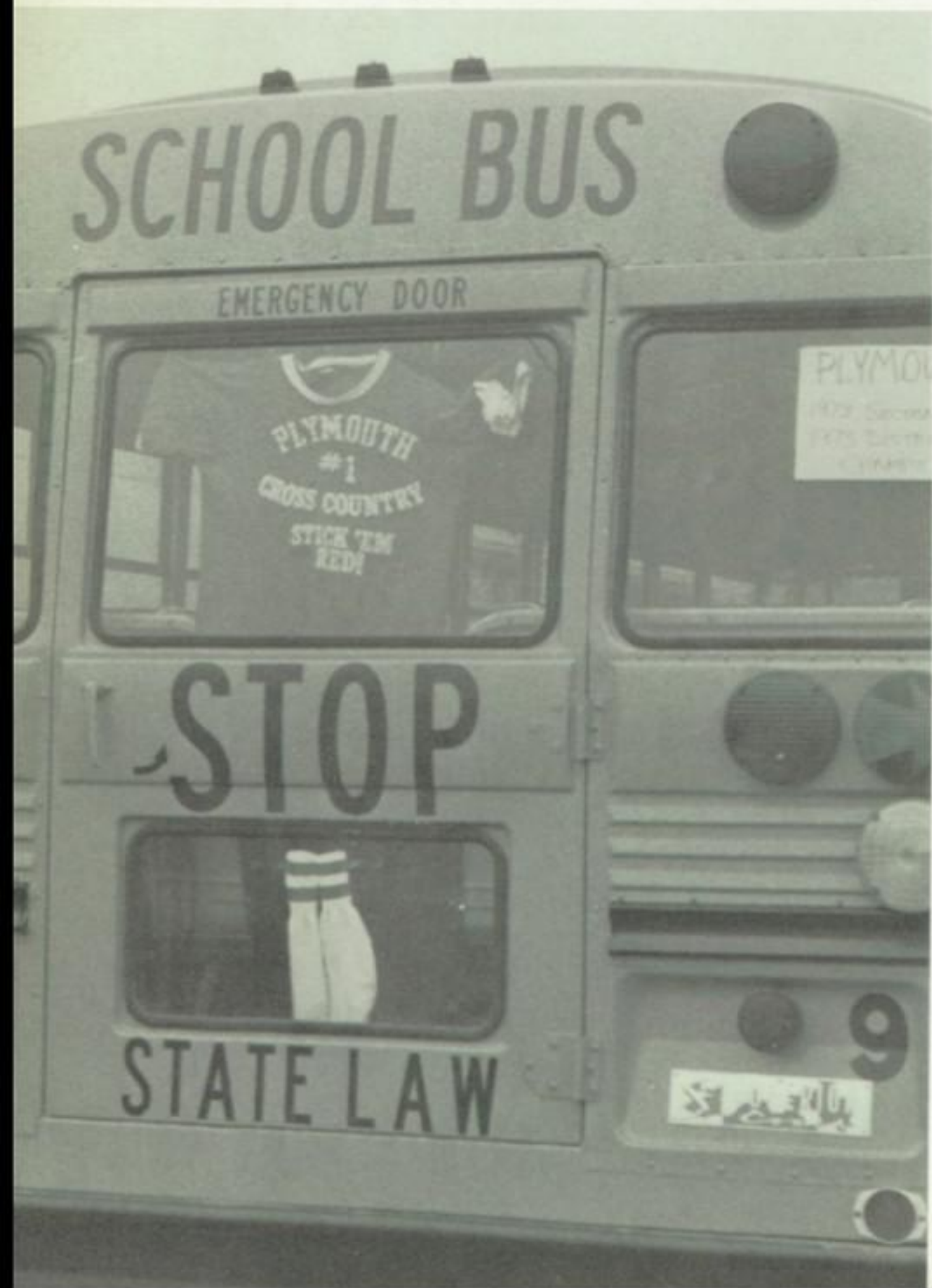
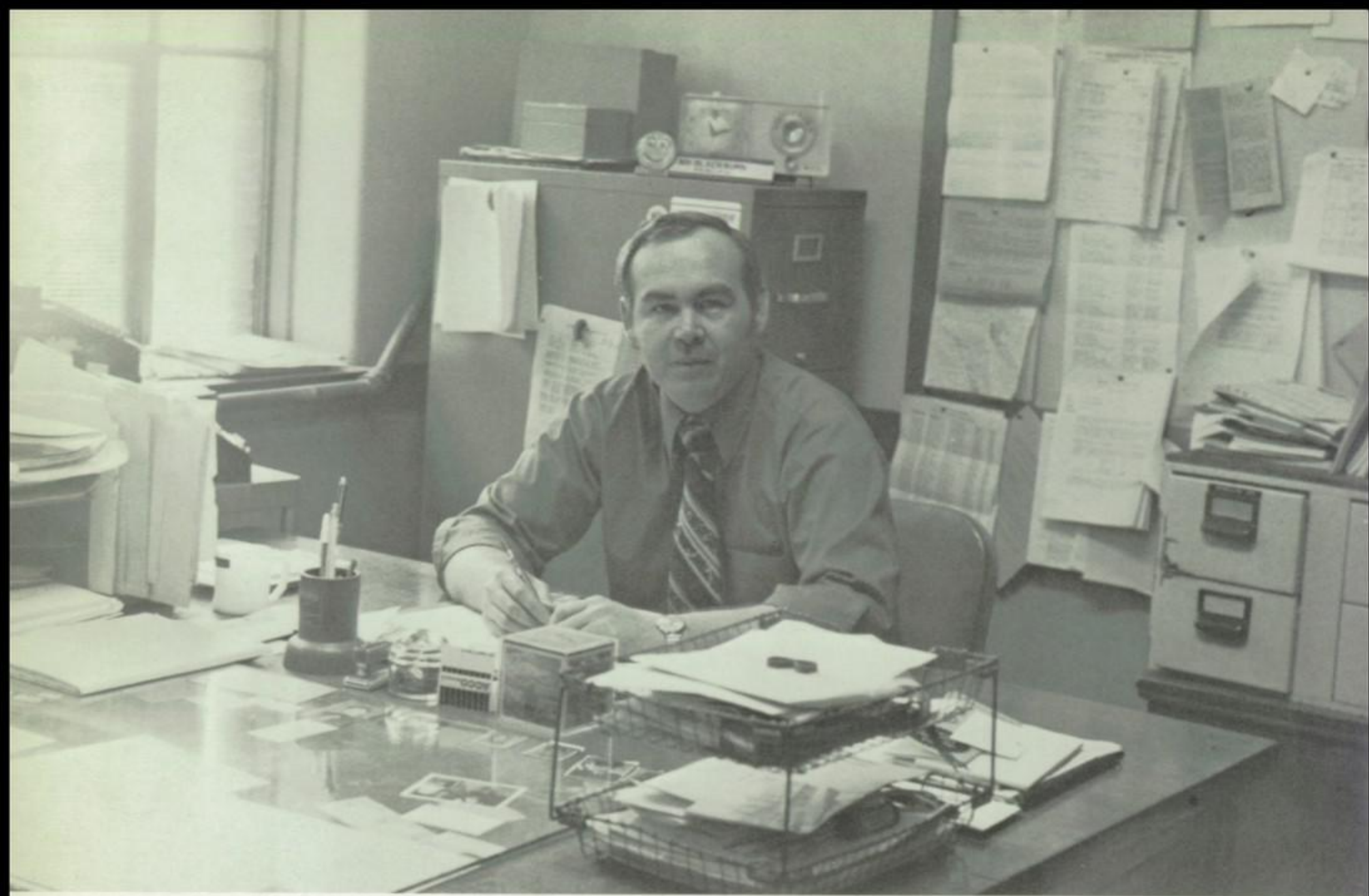
