The team worked well together with pride and talent to prove what can be done when the desire and leadership is present.

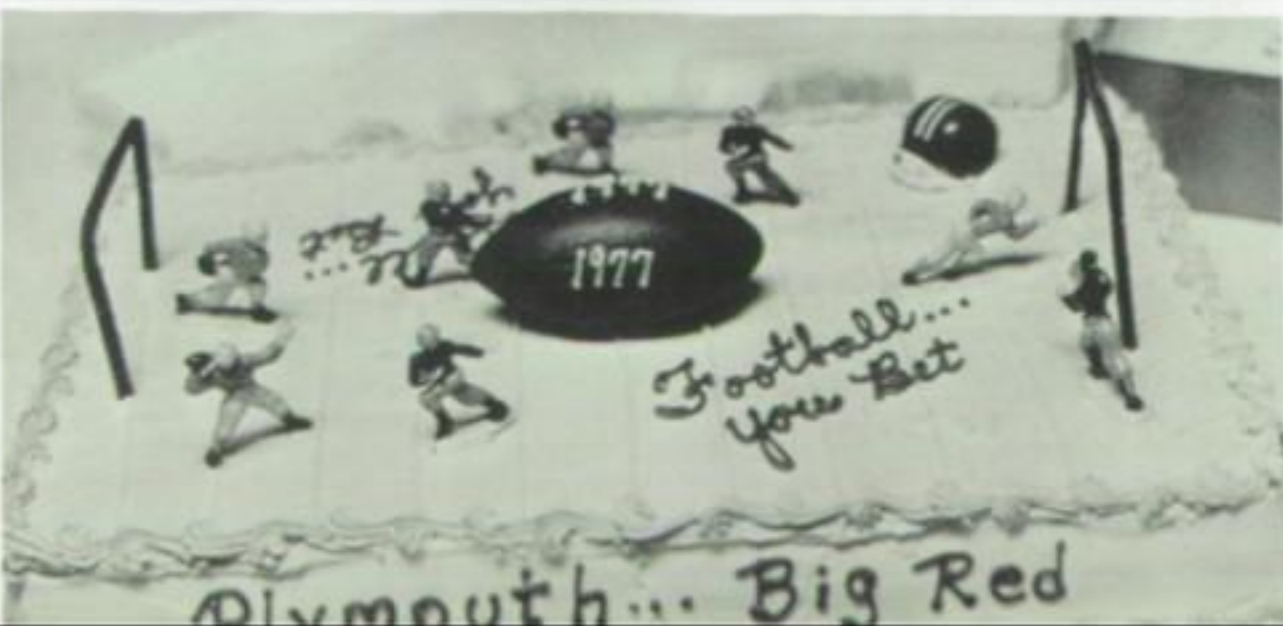
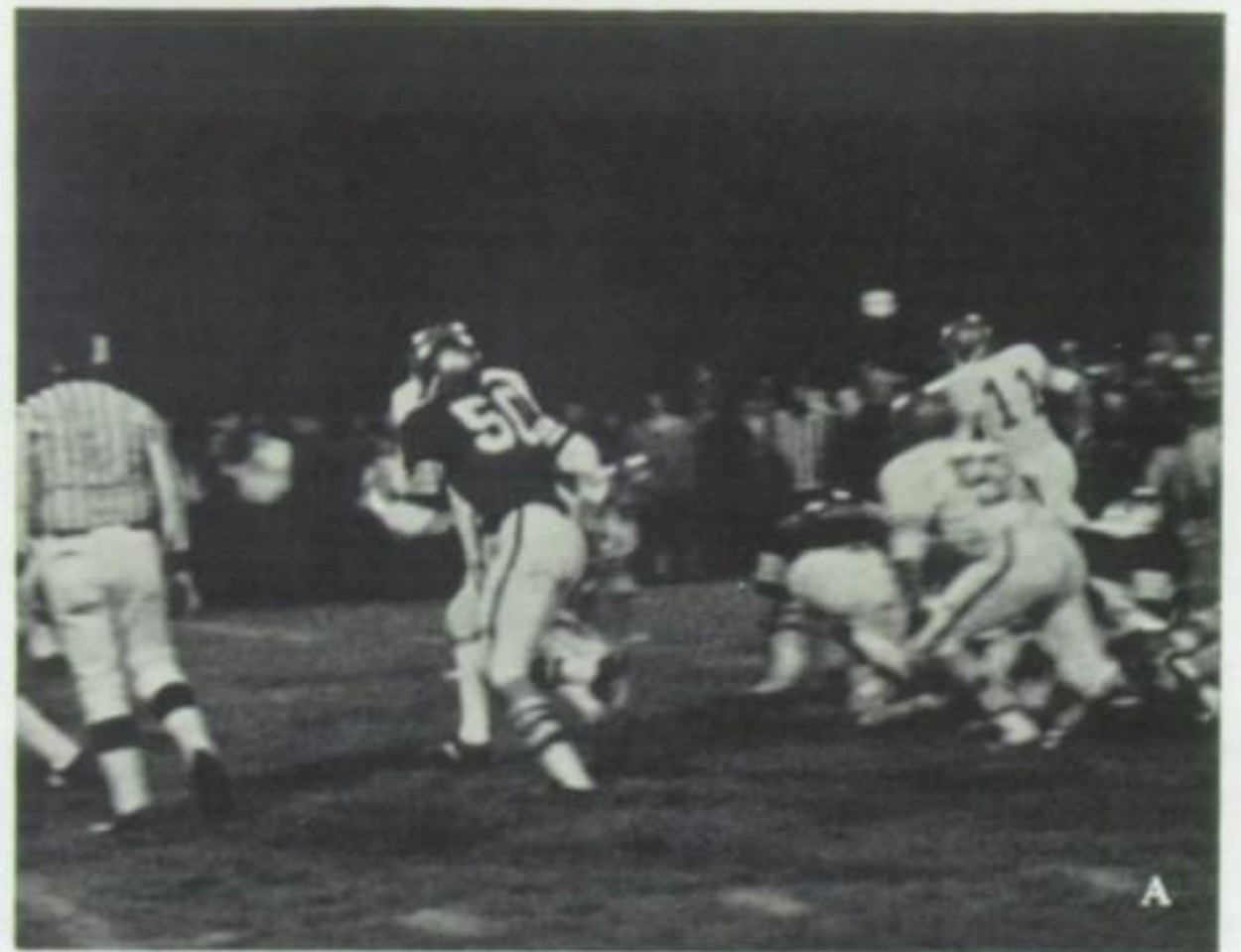

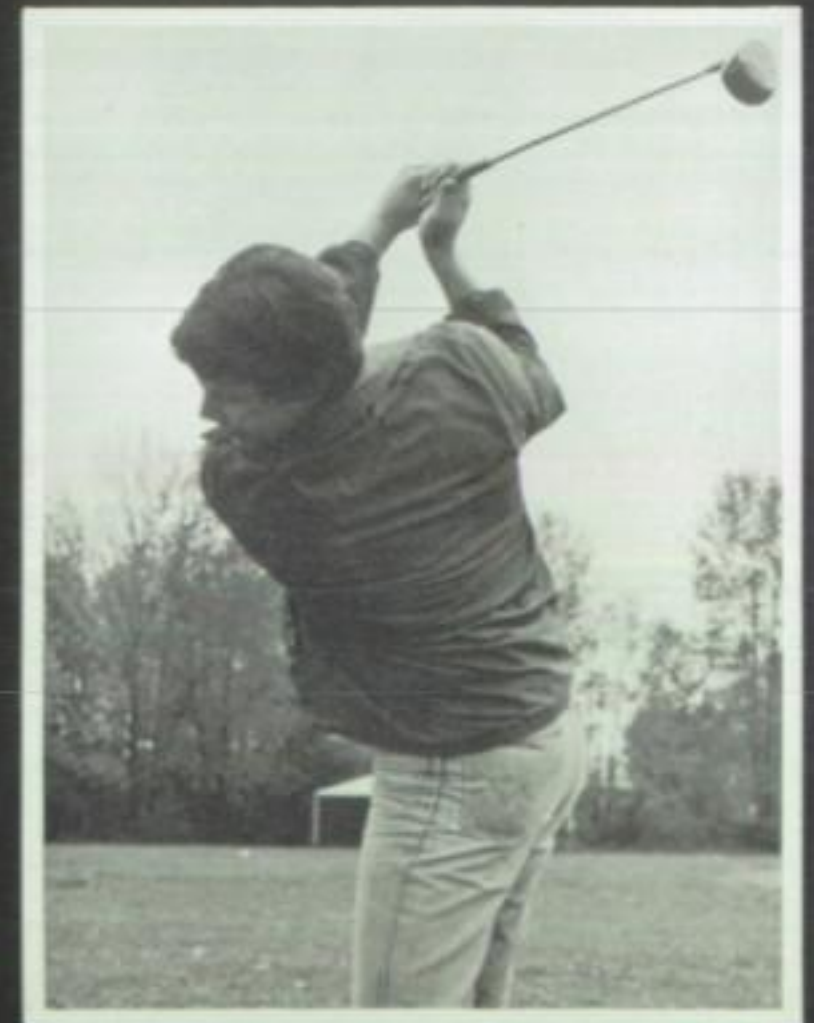

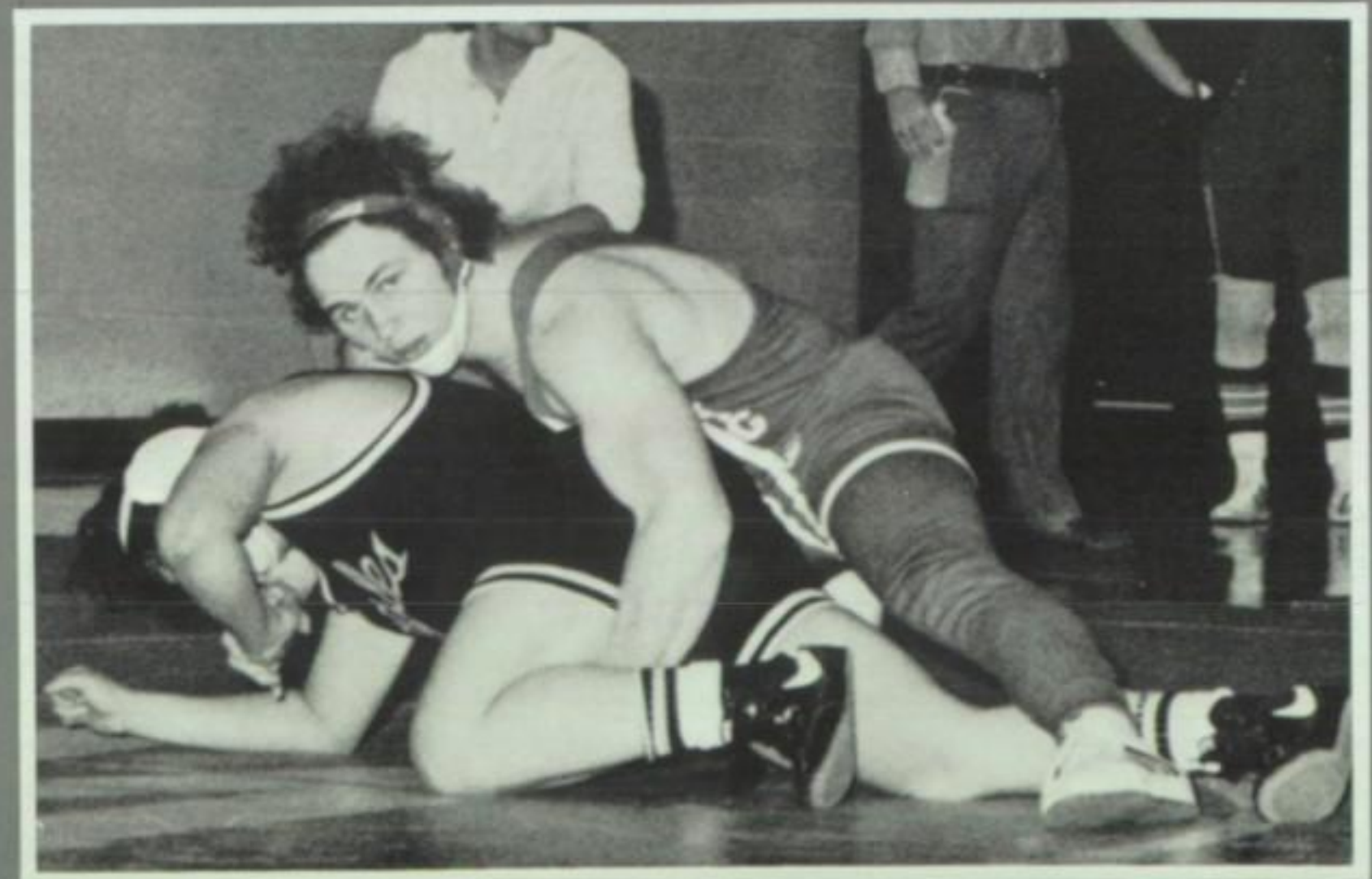

Mike holds many school records in both wrestling and football, and is respected by area wrestlers, and is a strong favorite for the state title next year.

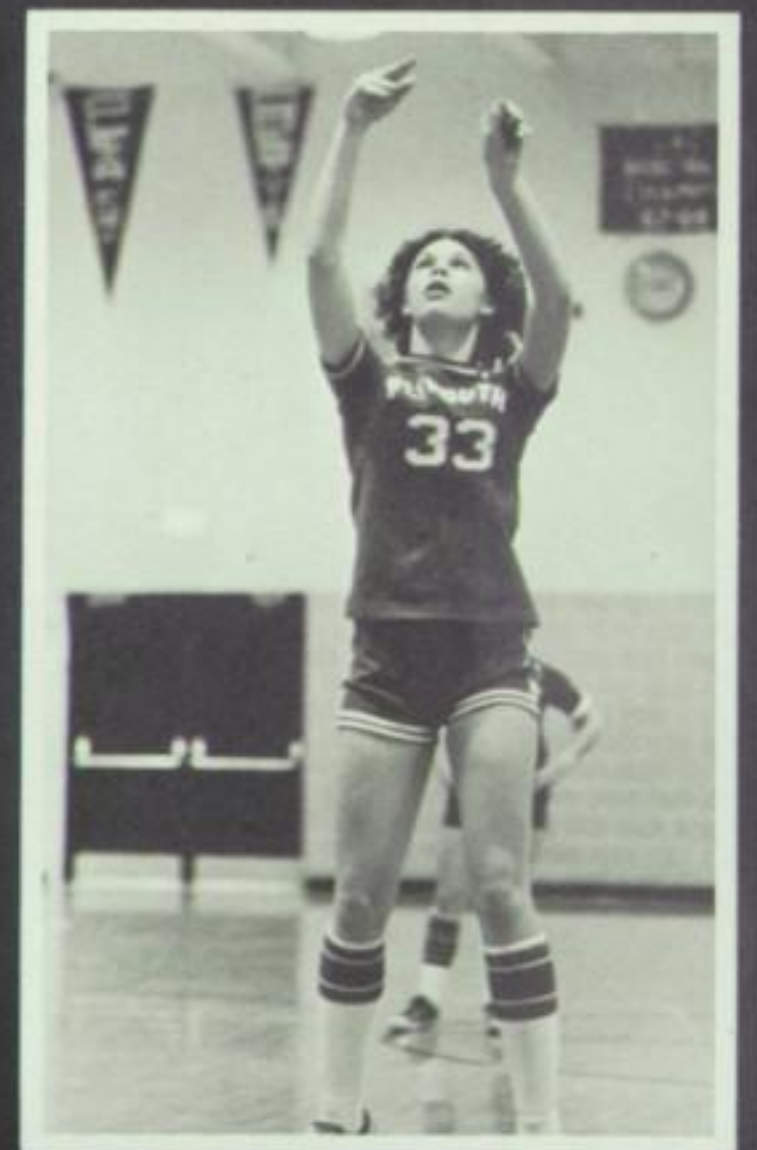

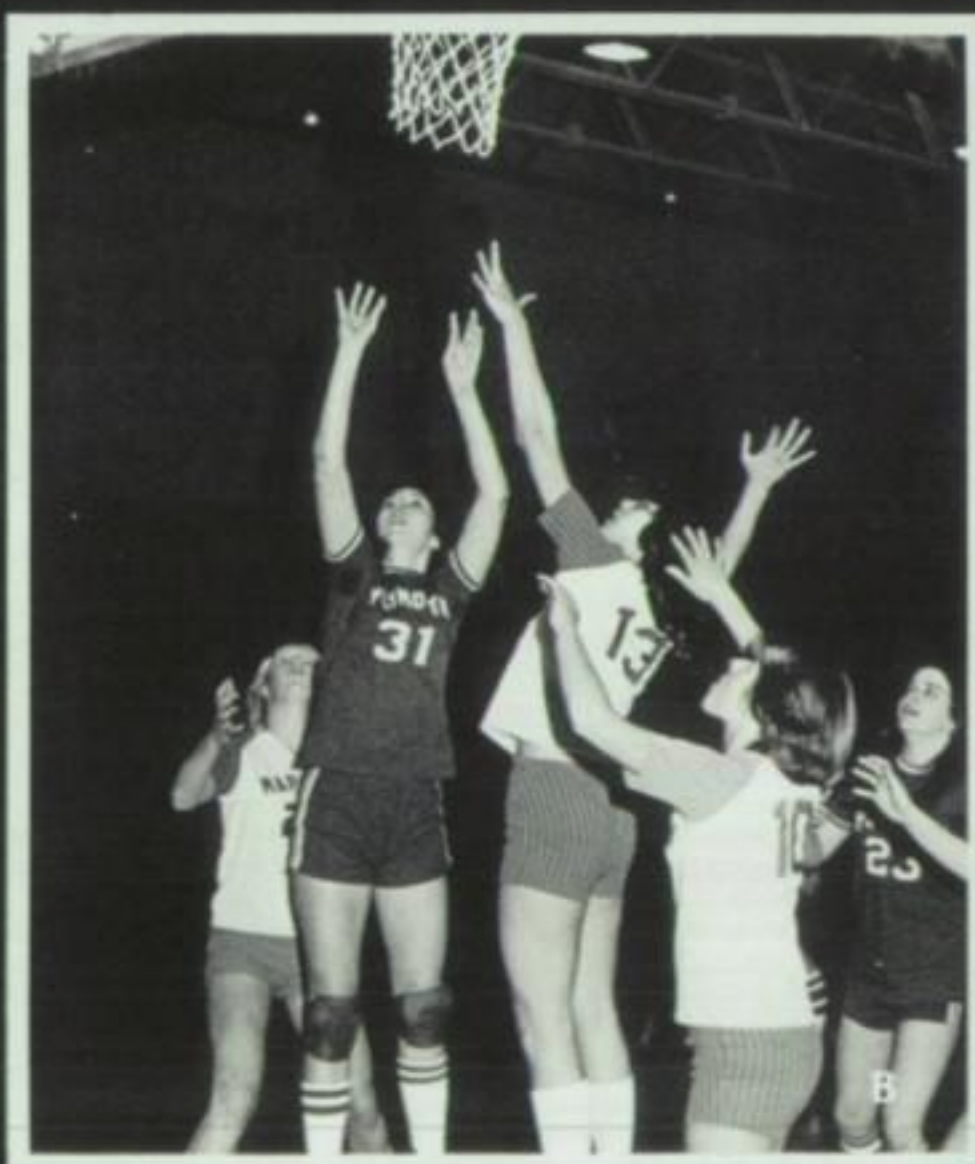

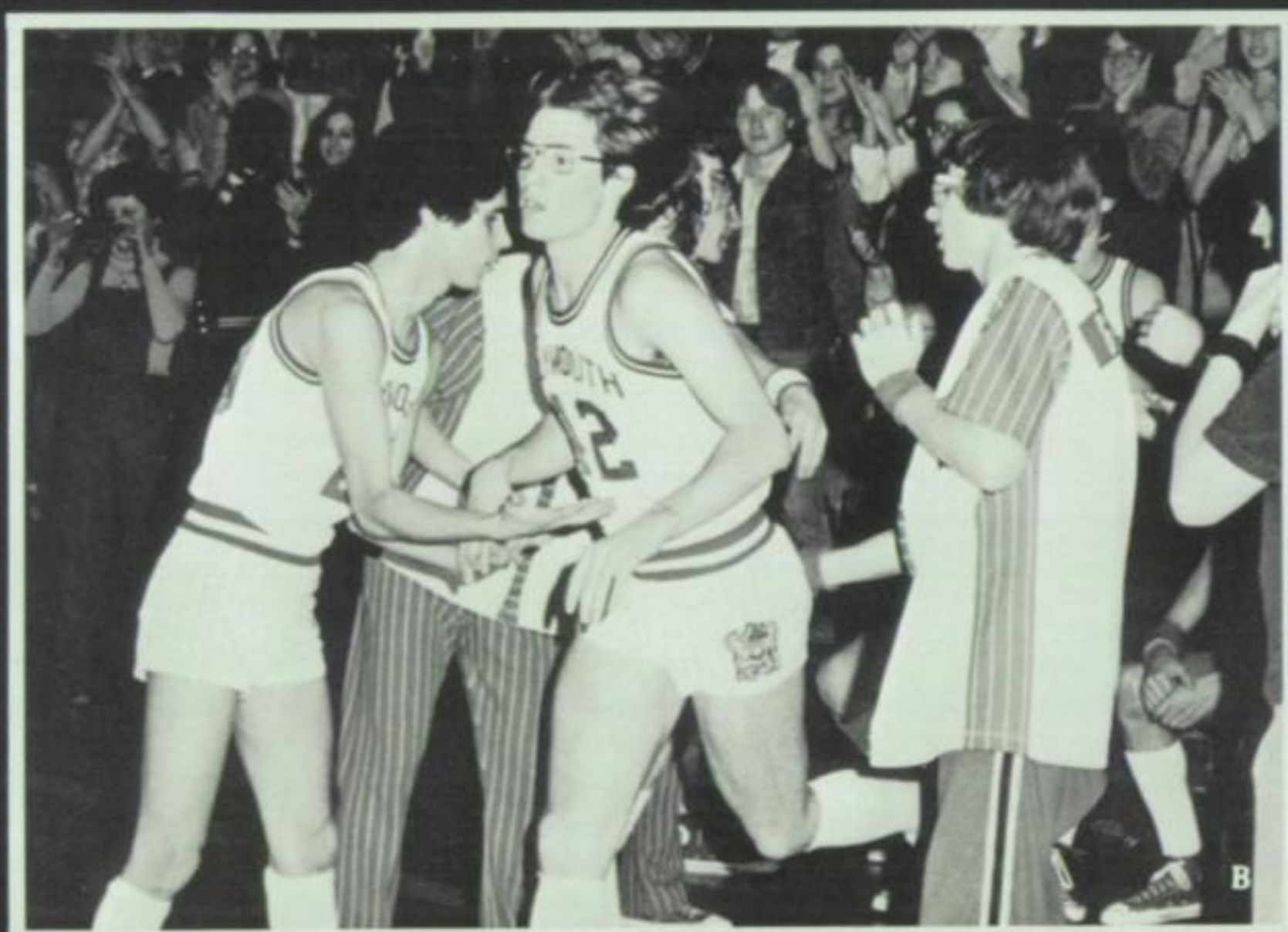

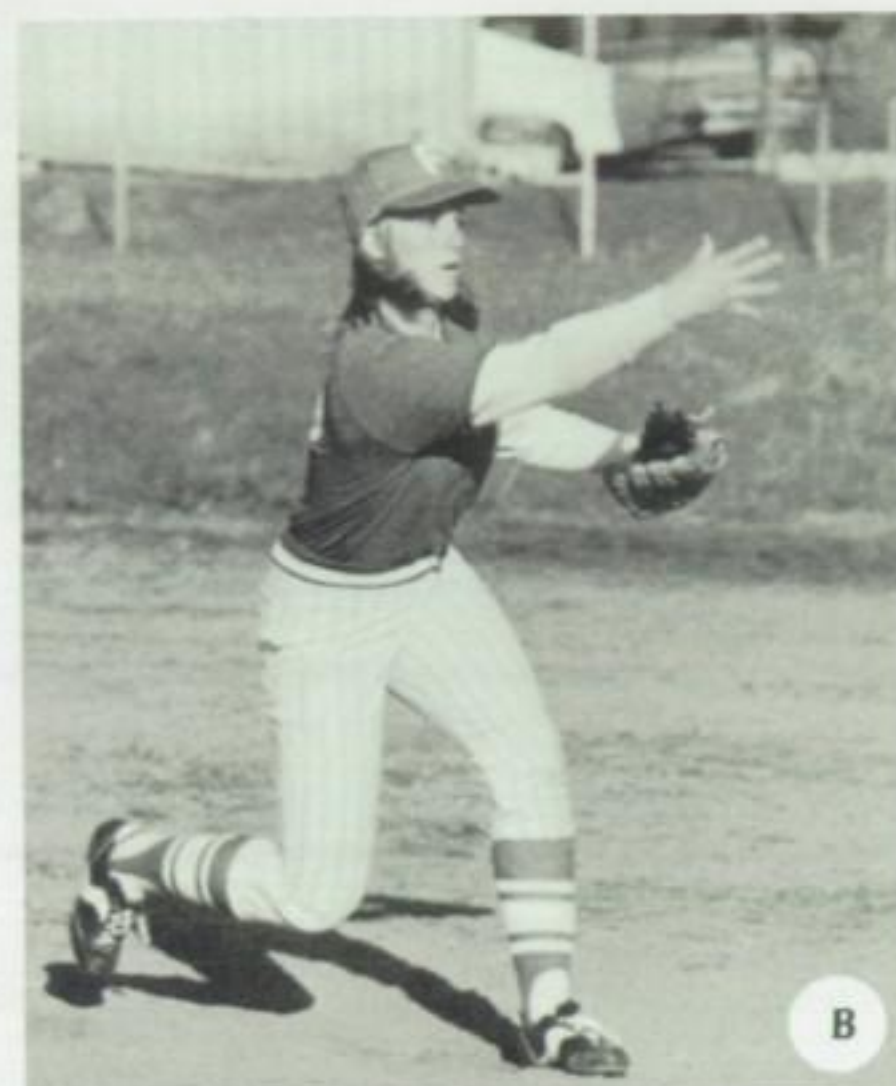

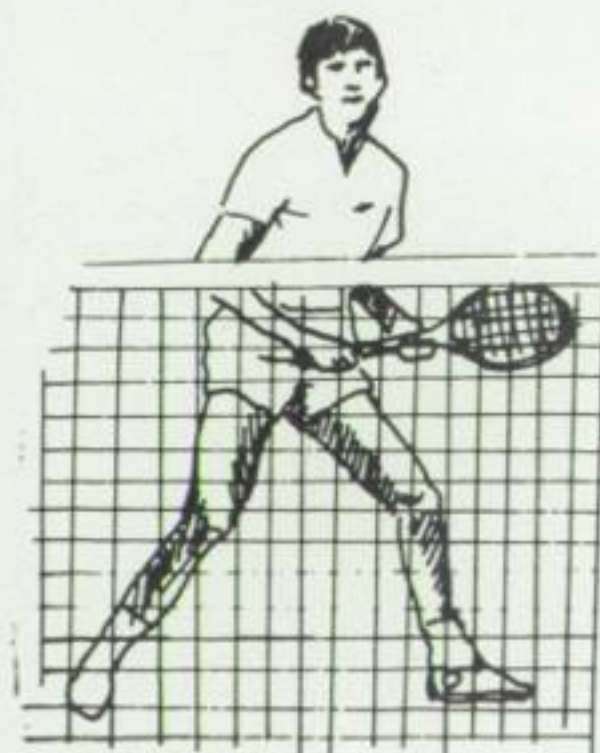
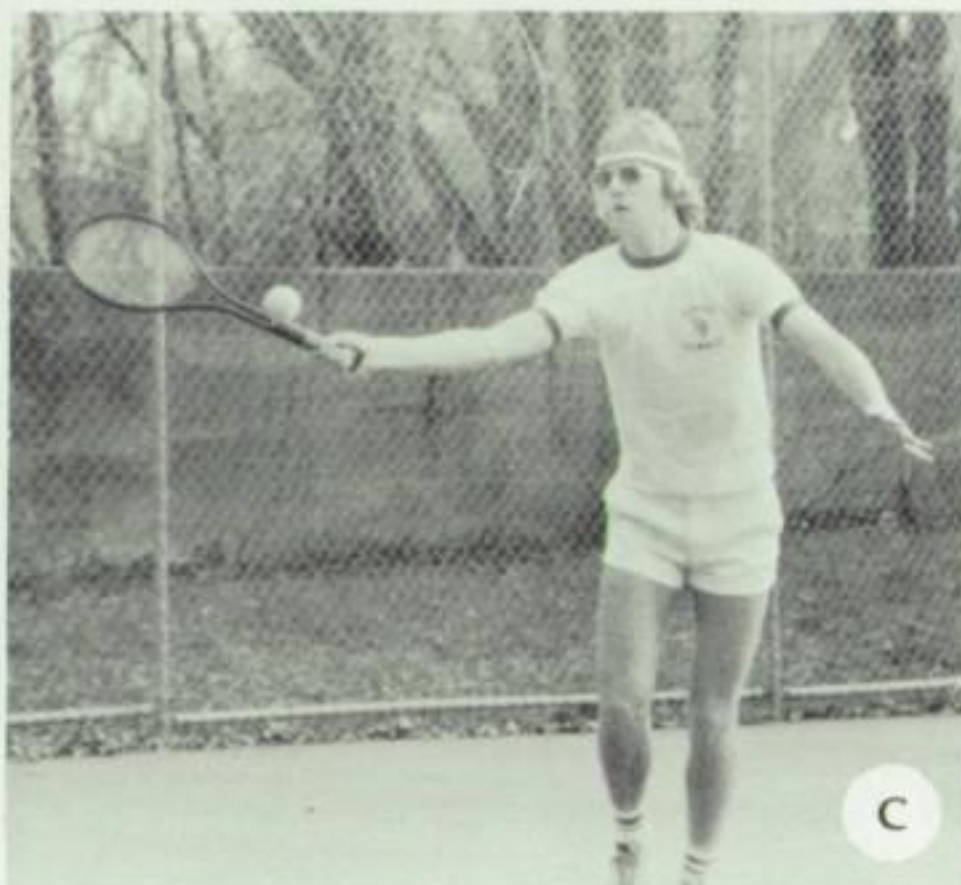
