STEVE TACKETT and **MARY LOU BRINER** have their hands full at being the most athletic.

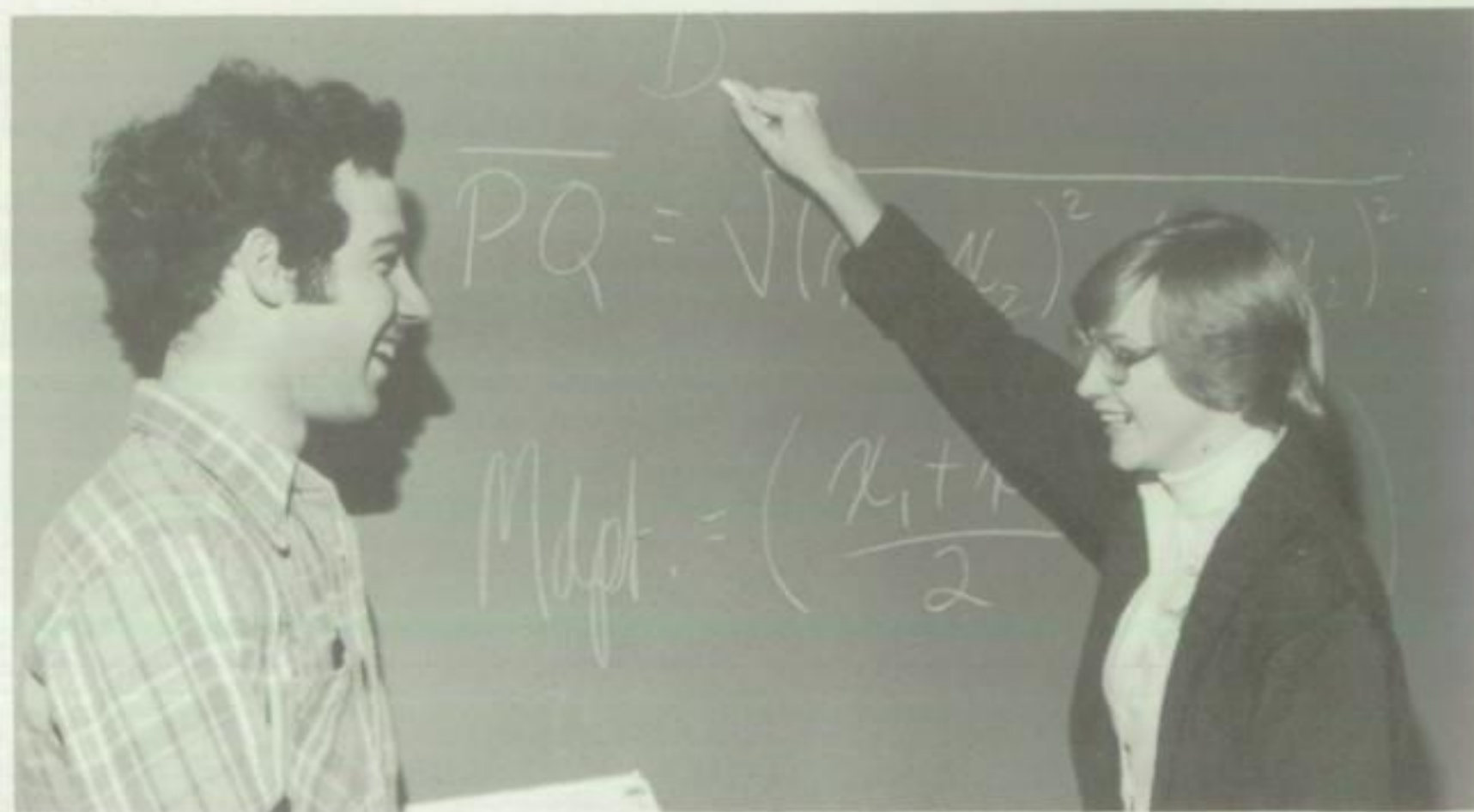

Mr. and Mrs. Keith Mowery brought the stereo and records and put on the music for the dance. Much thanks goes to them for helping to make the evening a success.

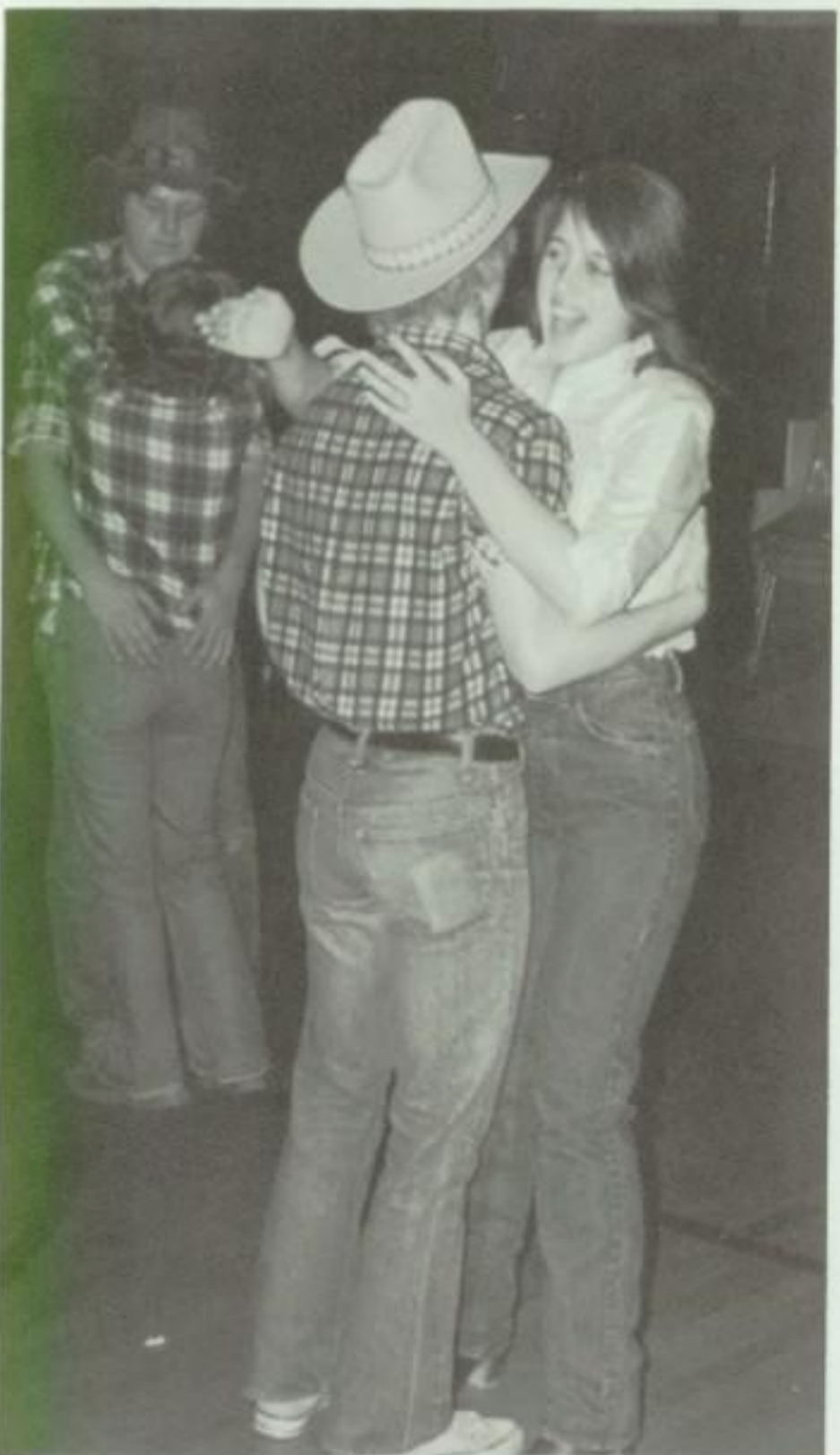
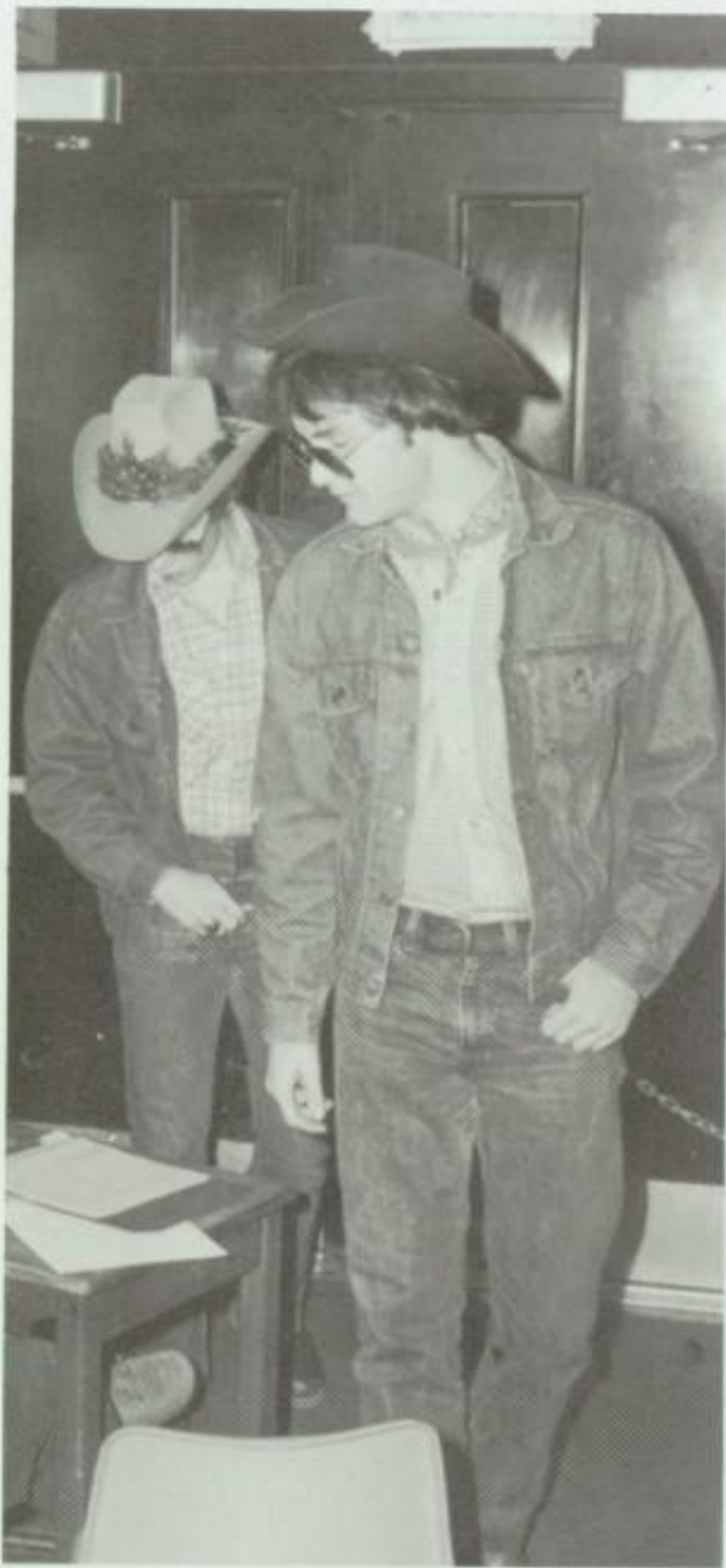

Craig Poth served as ring bearer and Jennifer Ralph as flower girl.

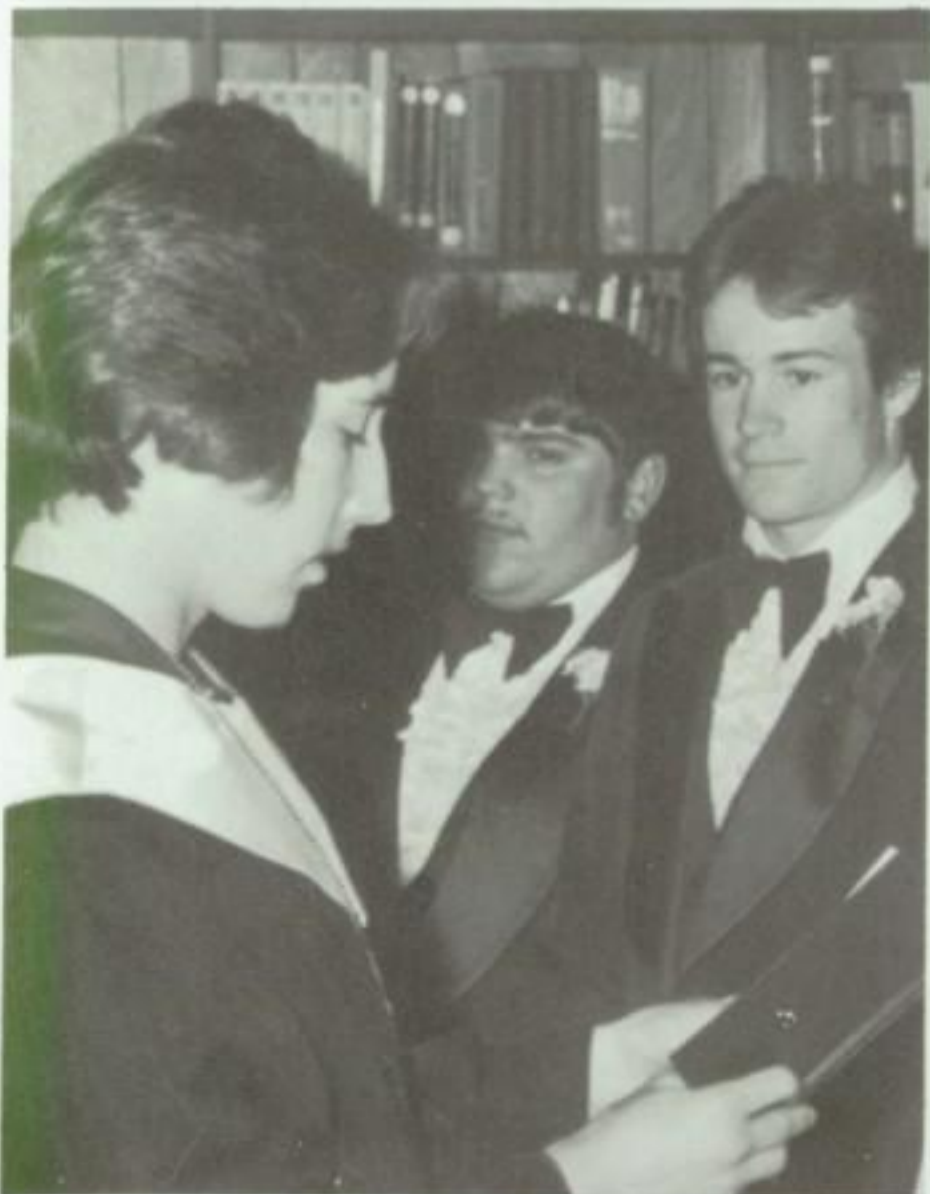
Jerry Miller posed as the photographer.

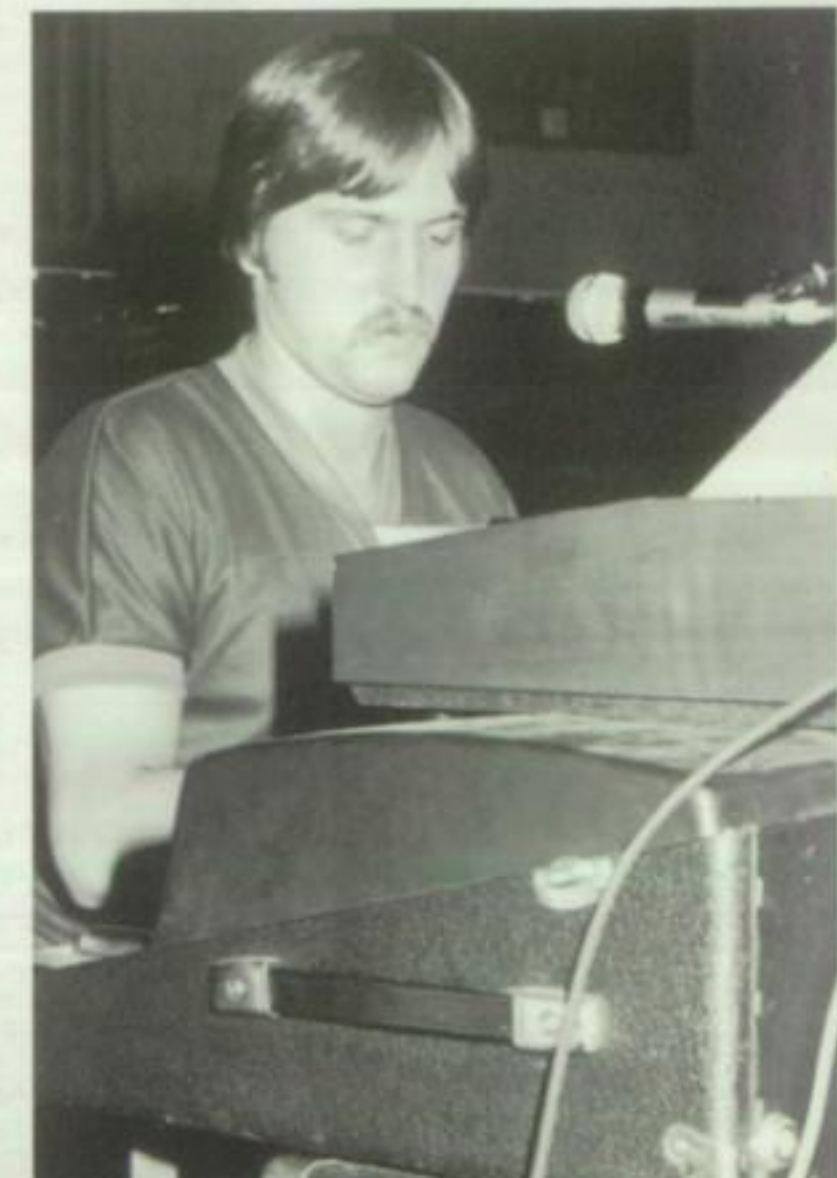
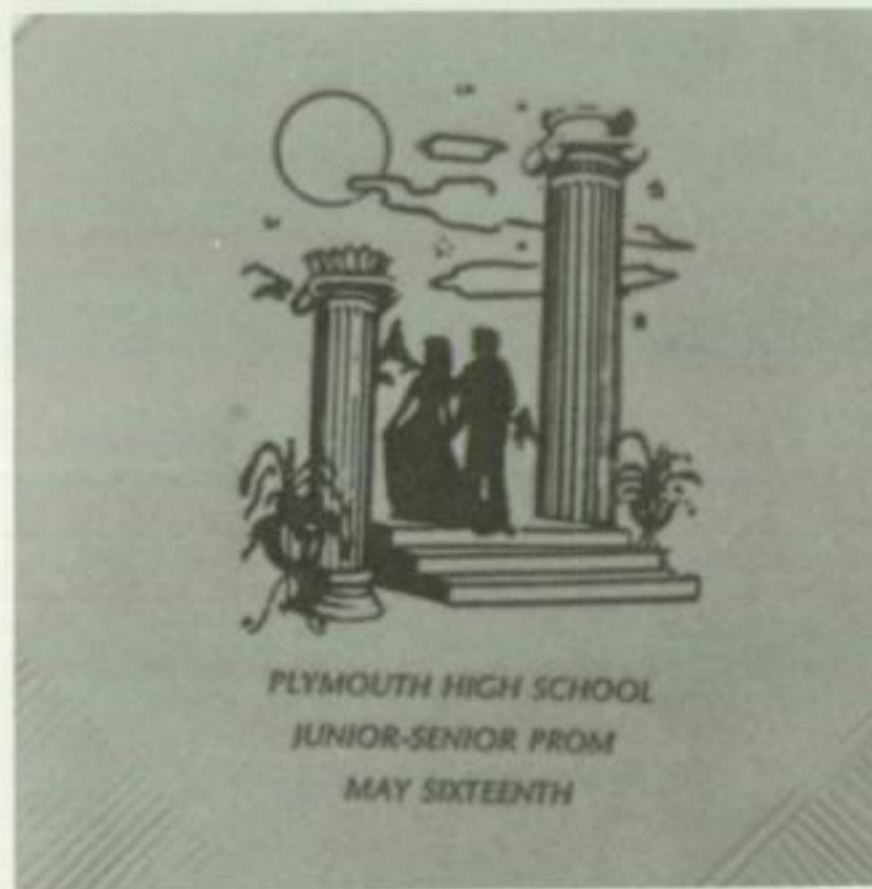

All in all, it was a huge success.



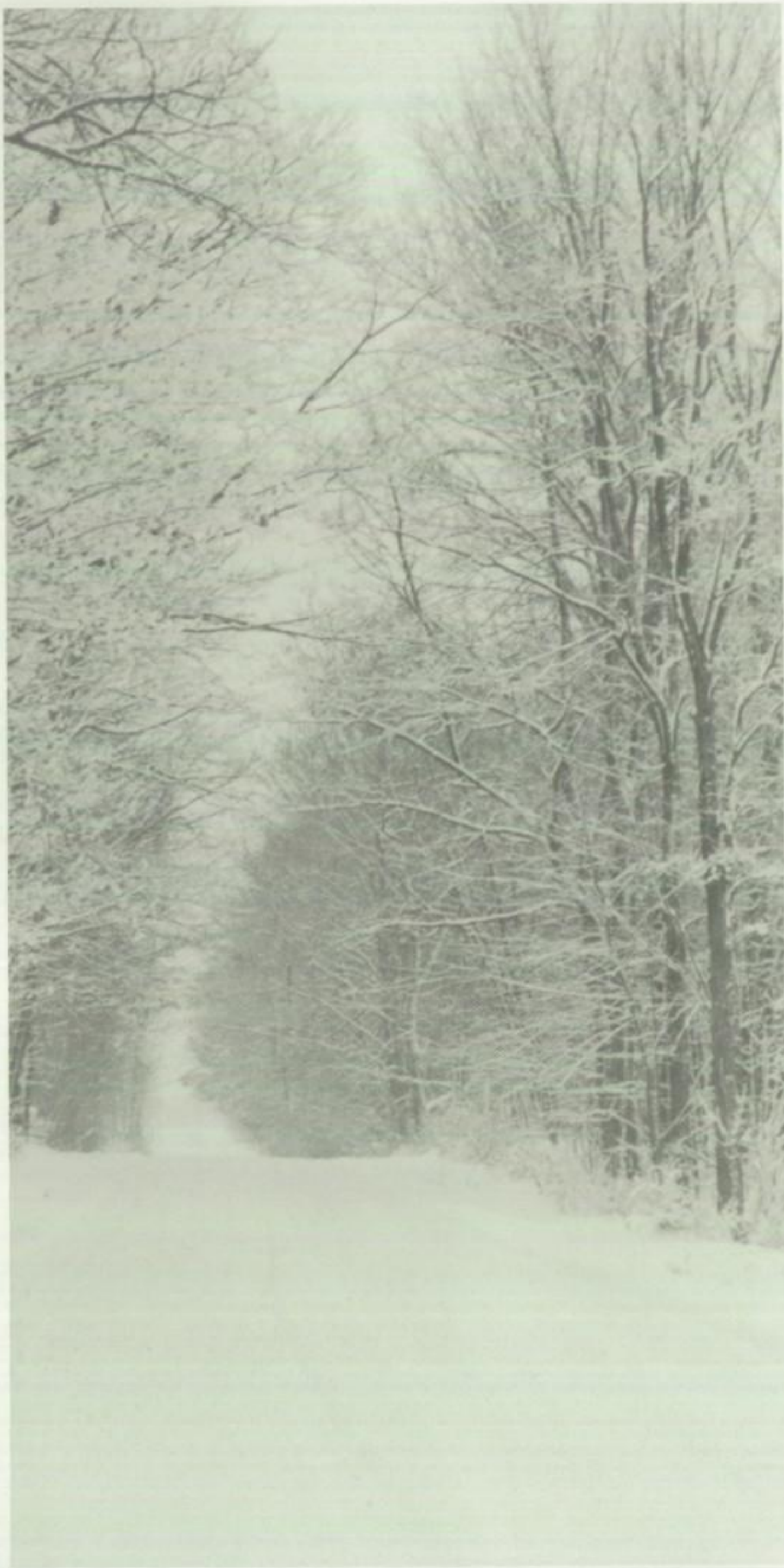


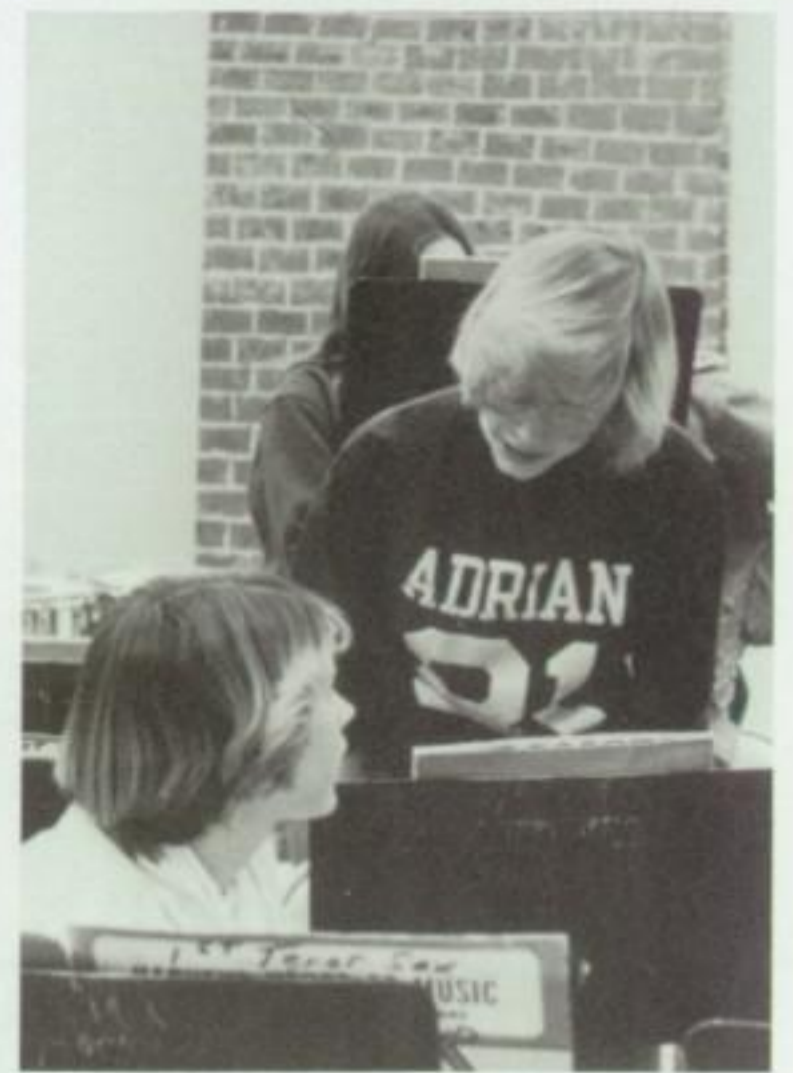

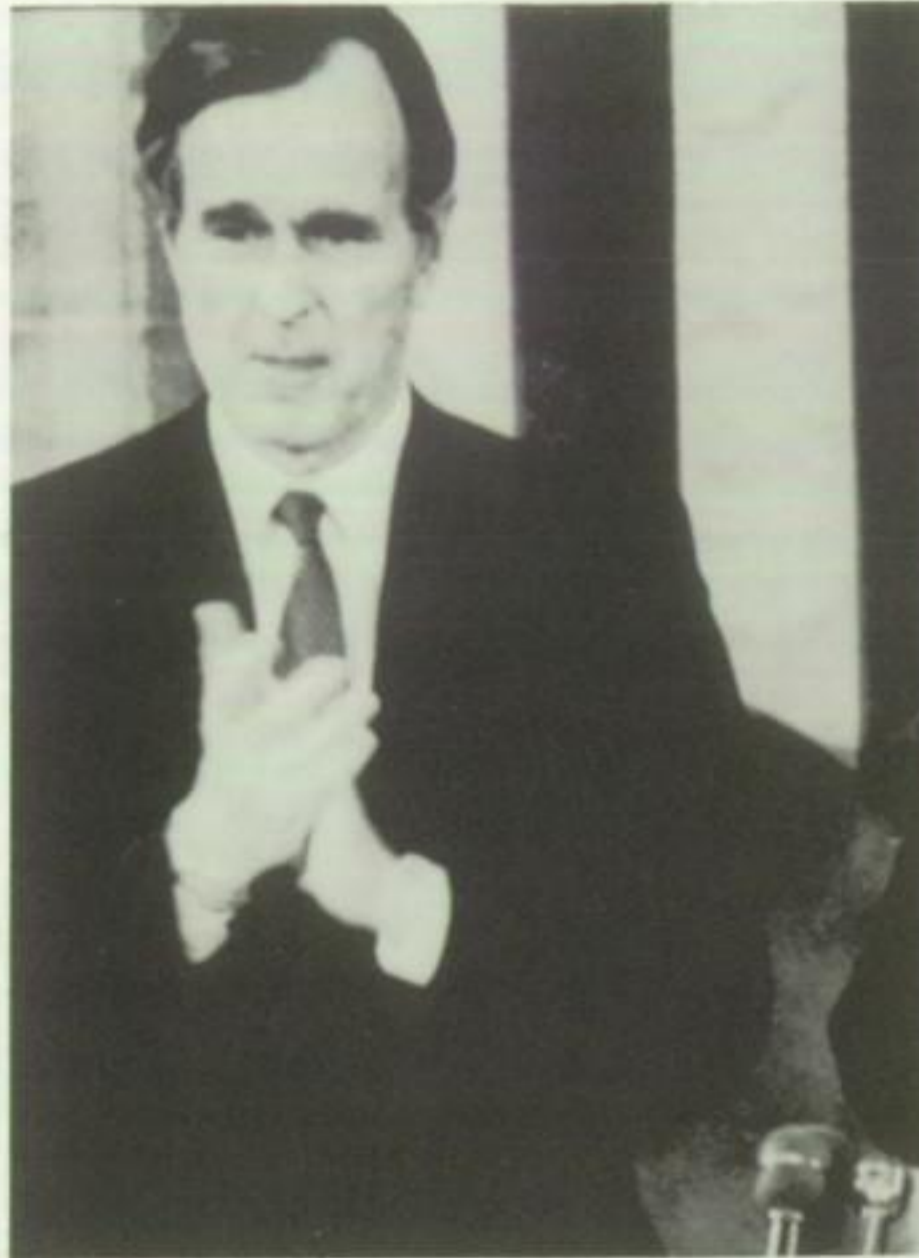

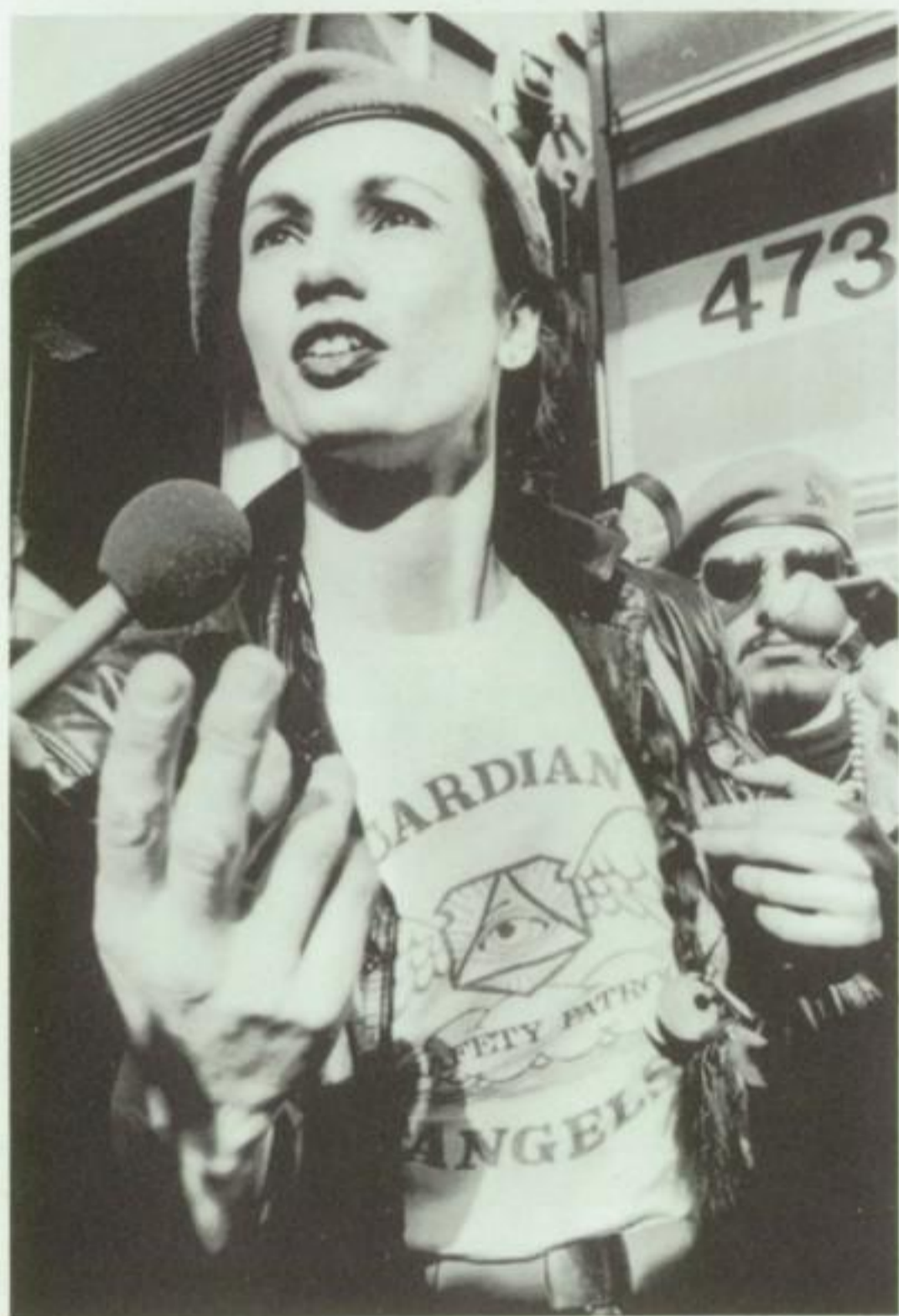

Pope John Paul II was shot while riding in his open car in St. Peter's Square on May 13, 1981. The shots were fired by Mehmet Ali Agca at 5:19 their time. The Pope fought infection for several weeks but was expected to recover fully.

The Las Vegas Hilton Hotel was one of the many hotels that caught fire throughout the United States this year. The 30-story building caught fire on February 10, 1981, killing 8 people and injuring 300 others.

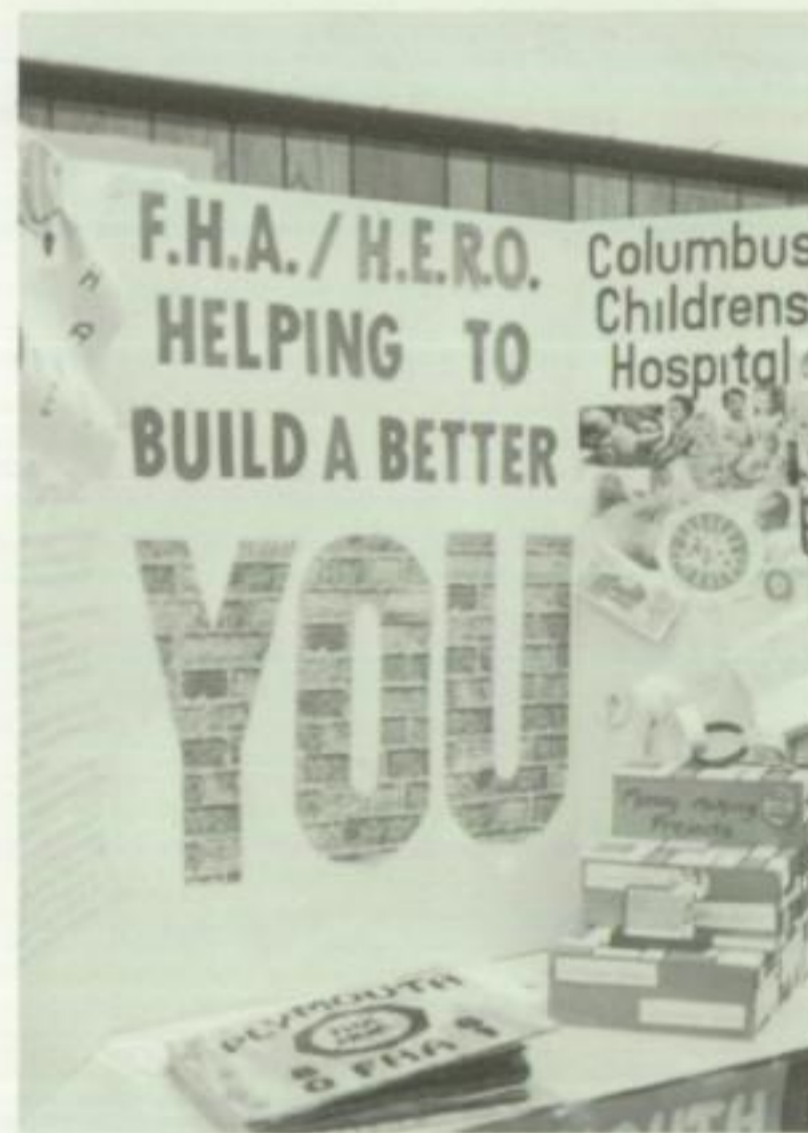
FHA On The Move

Student Council also held an in-school movie the last month of school. The movie, "Fast Break" was a huge success.

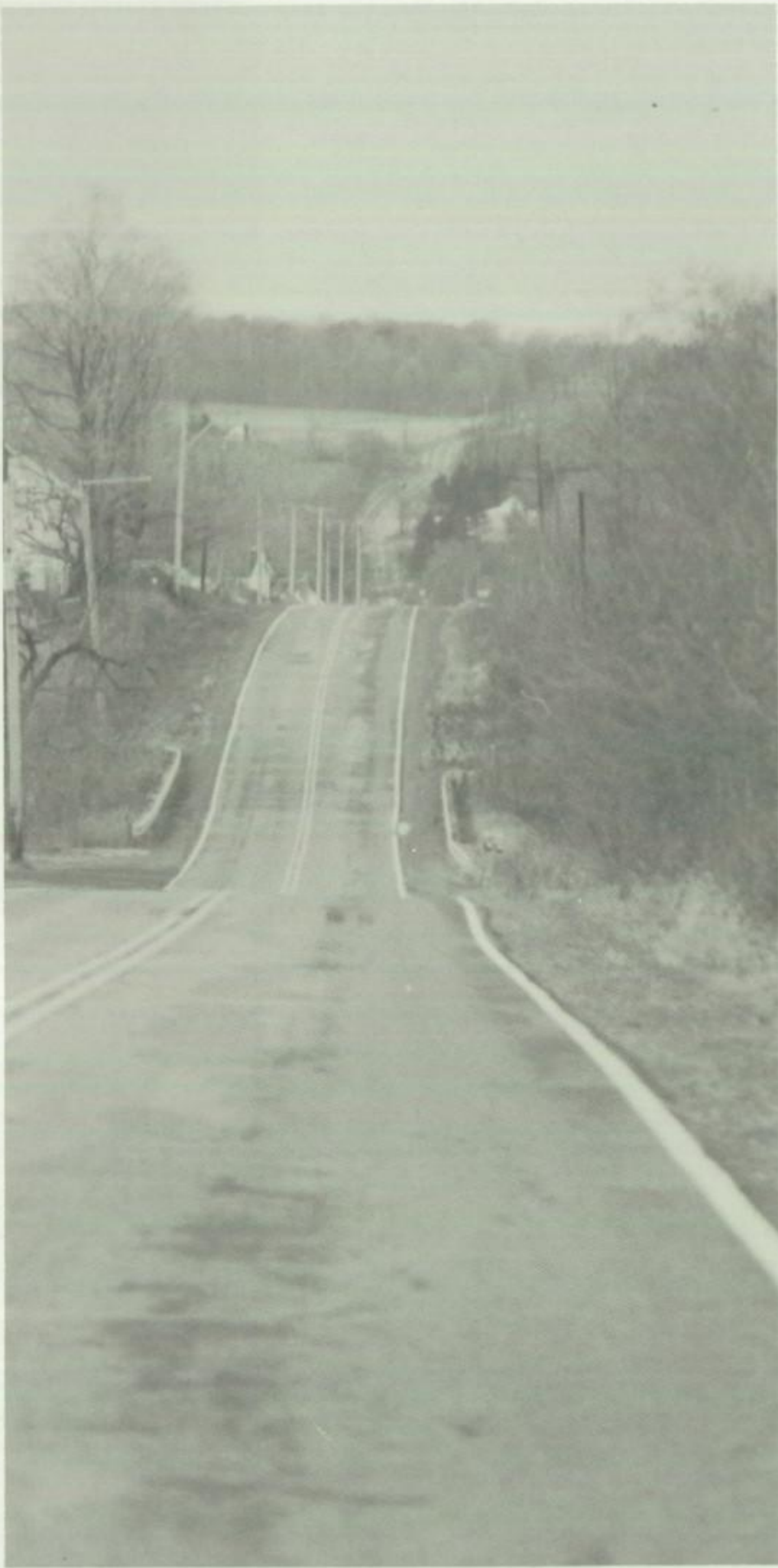

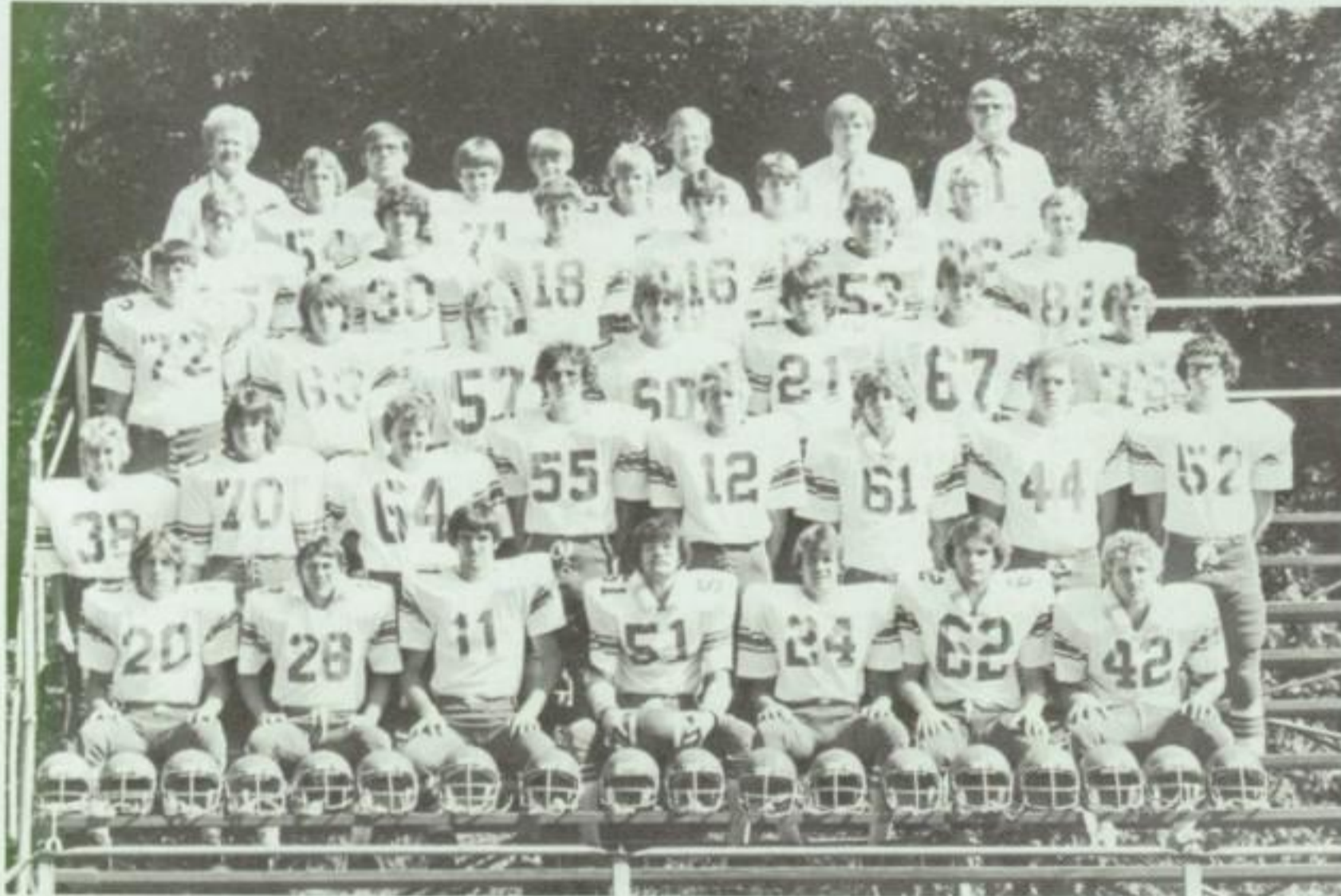
Gridiron Tough To Tackle

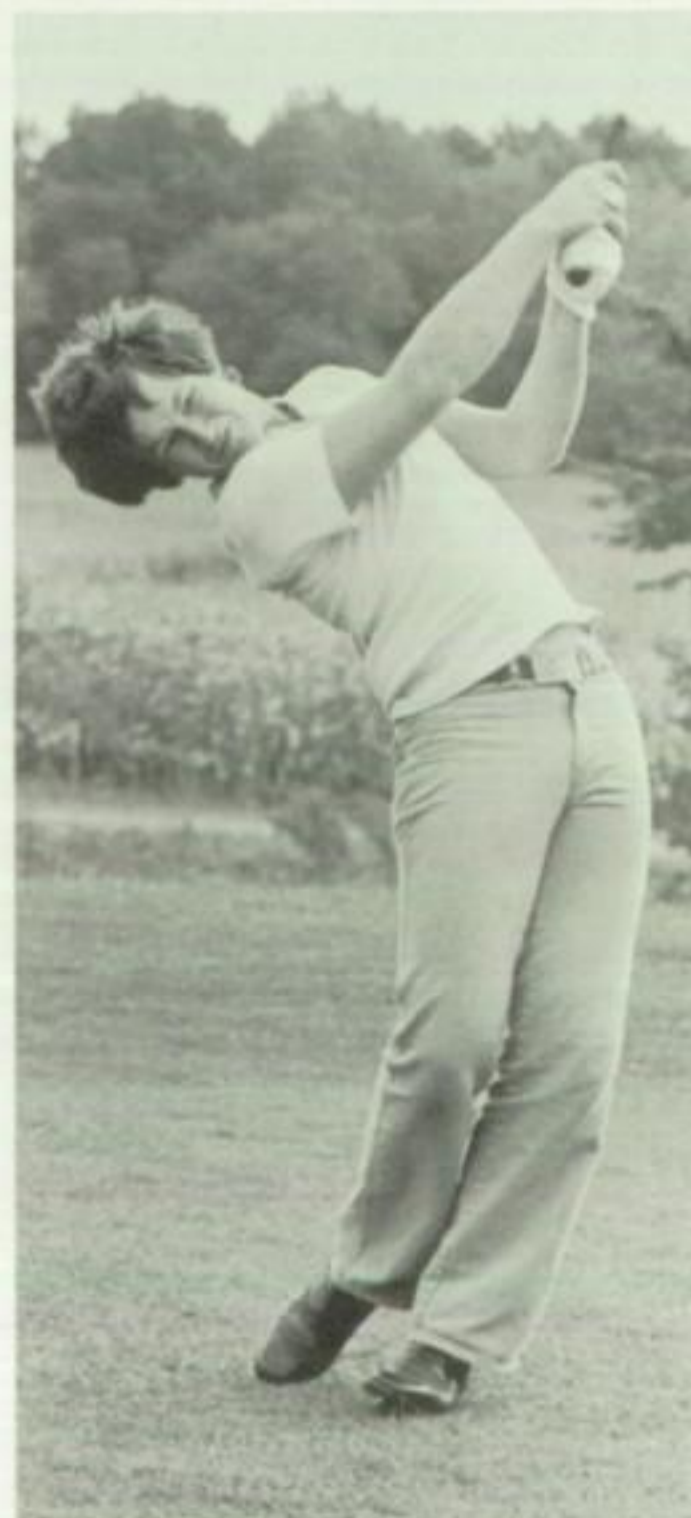
Putt, Putt, Putt Goes PHS Golf

healthful sports which demands lots of skill and intelligence. Endurance is also needed to make the wrestlers lose weight for their match.



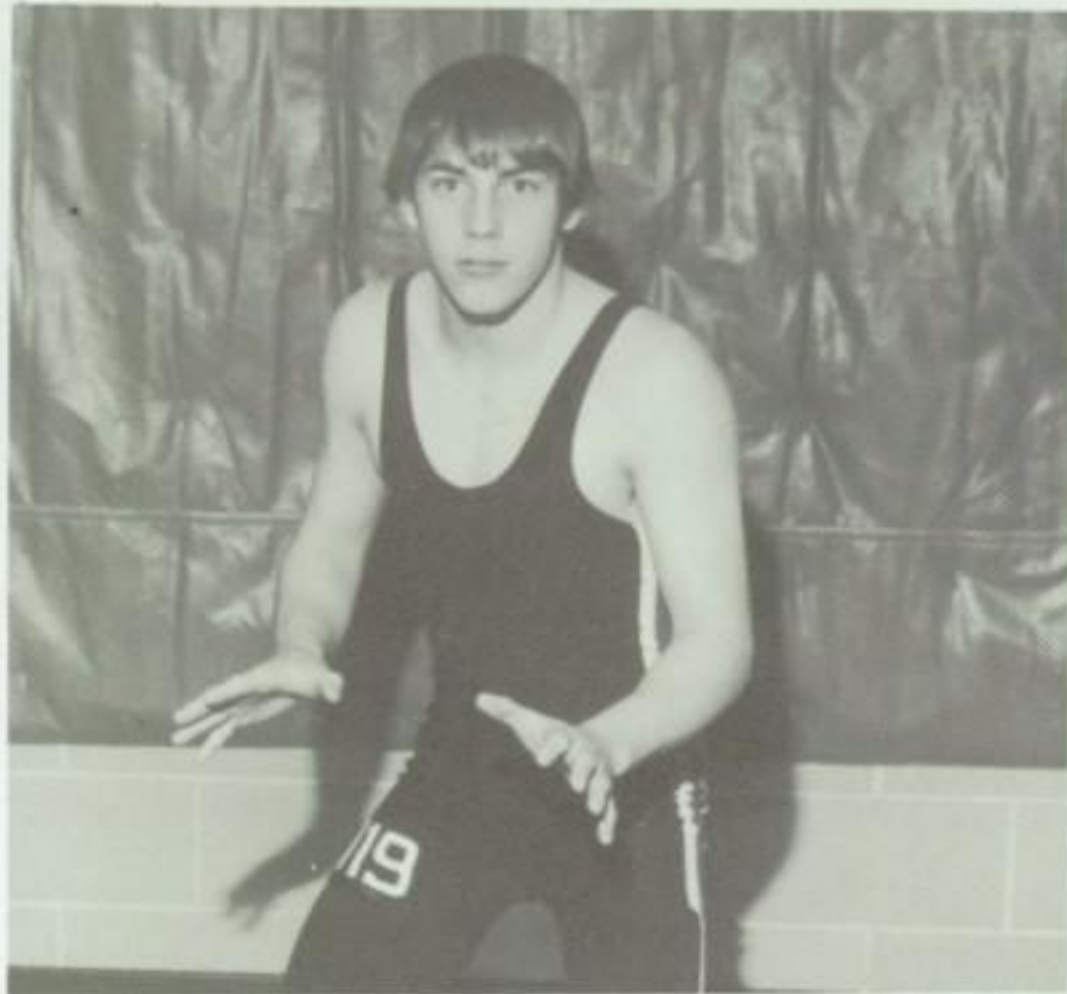

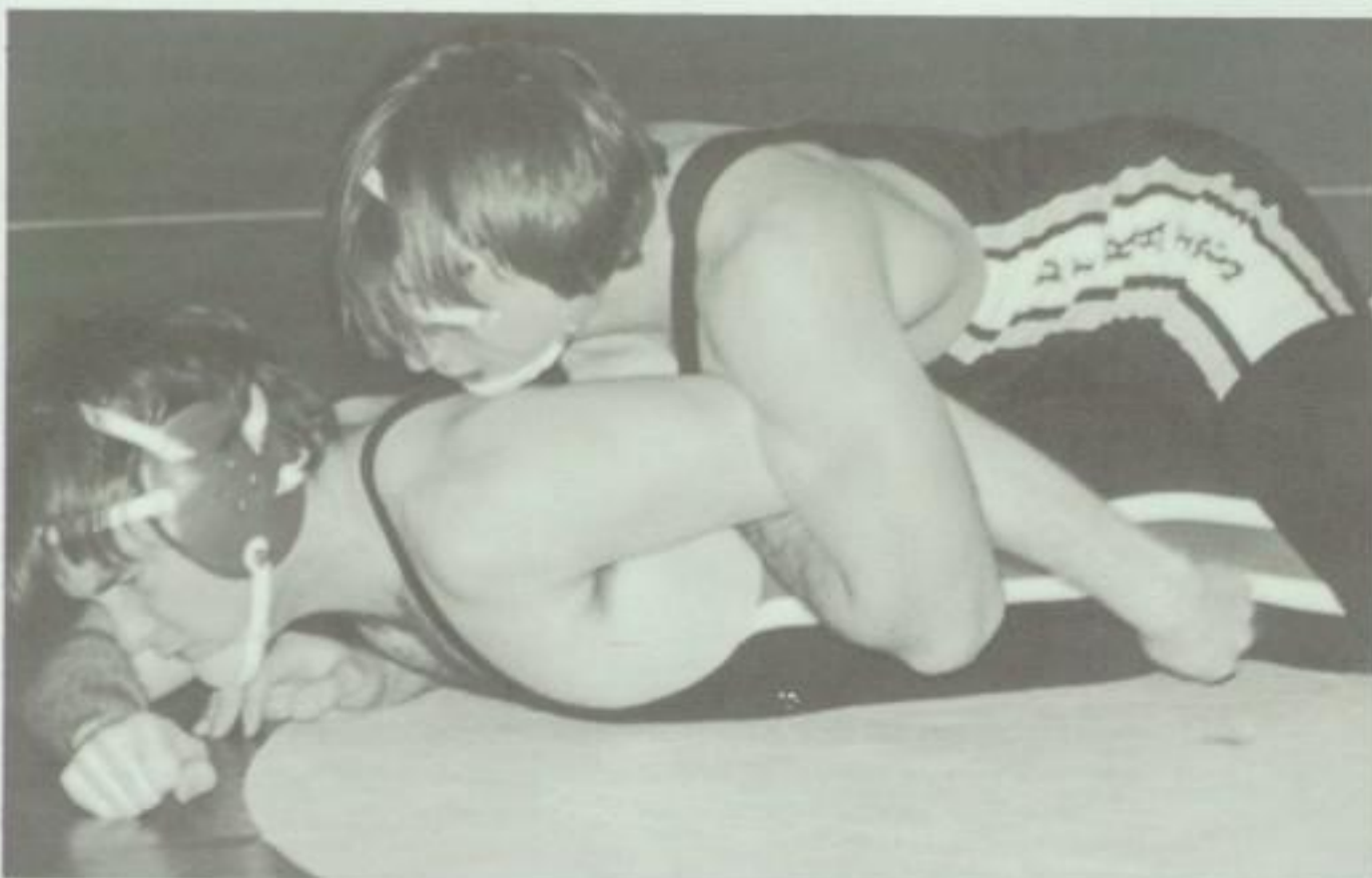

The tennis team continued gaining experience this year. With a new coach, Miss Sondra Herren, and only one senior, the 16-member team only won one match the entire season.

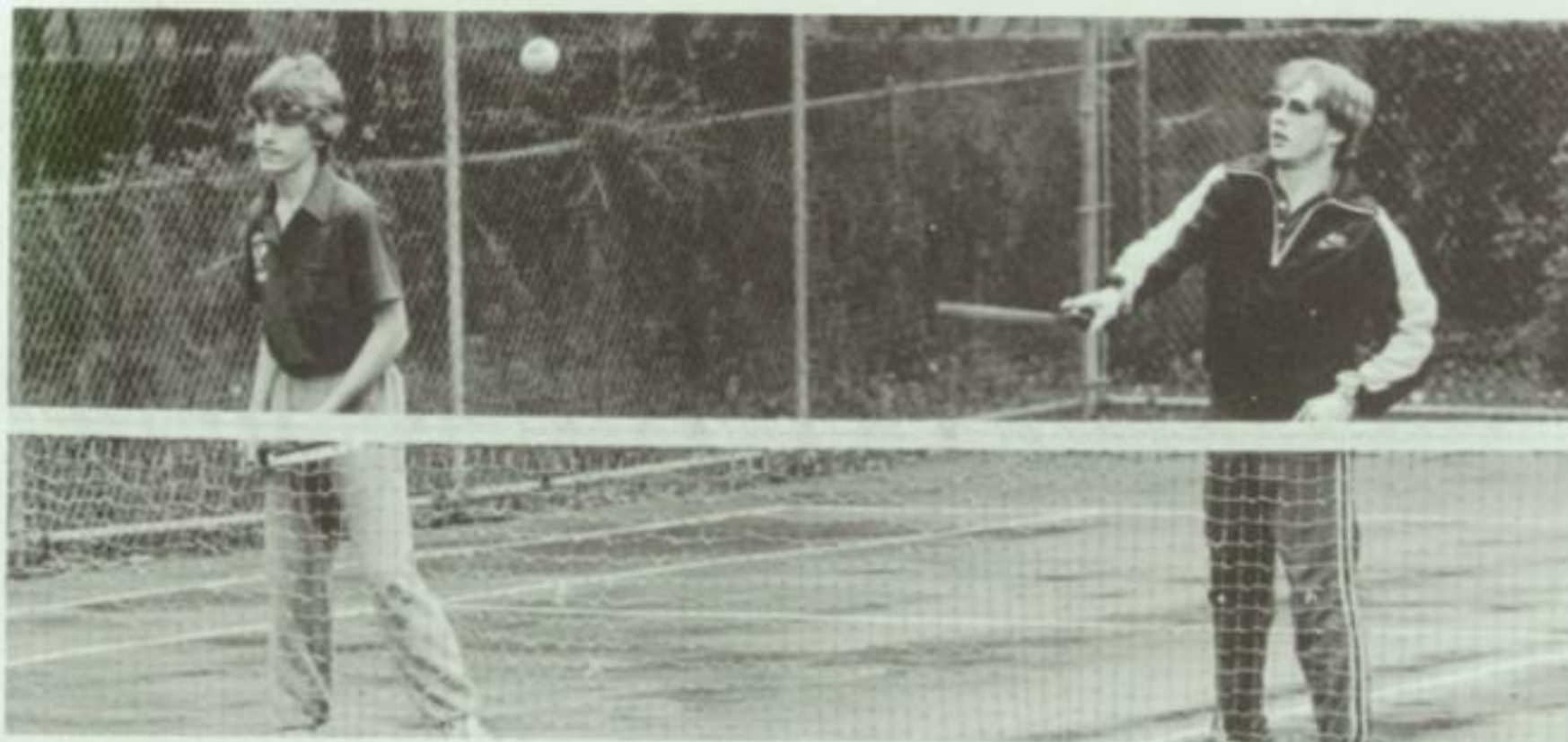
The PHS tennis team is one of the few teams that is co-educational. Most of the schools they play are much larger and have separate girls' and boys' teams. This makes competition with other schools

Both Coaches took advantage of the talent and experience their team members had. Finishing out to a 10-

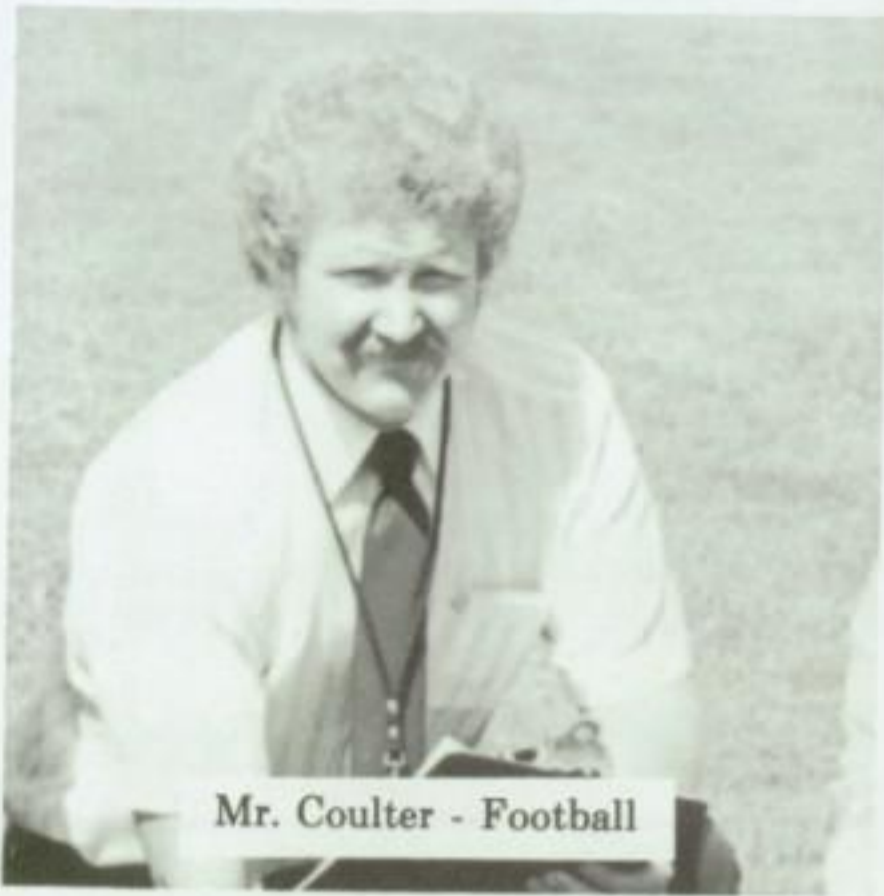
