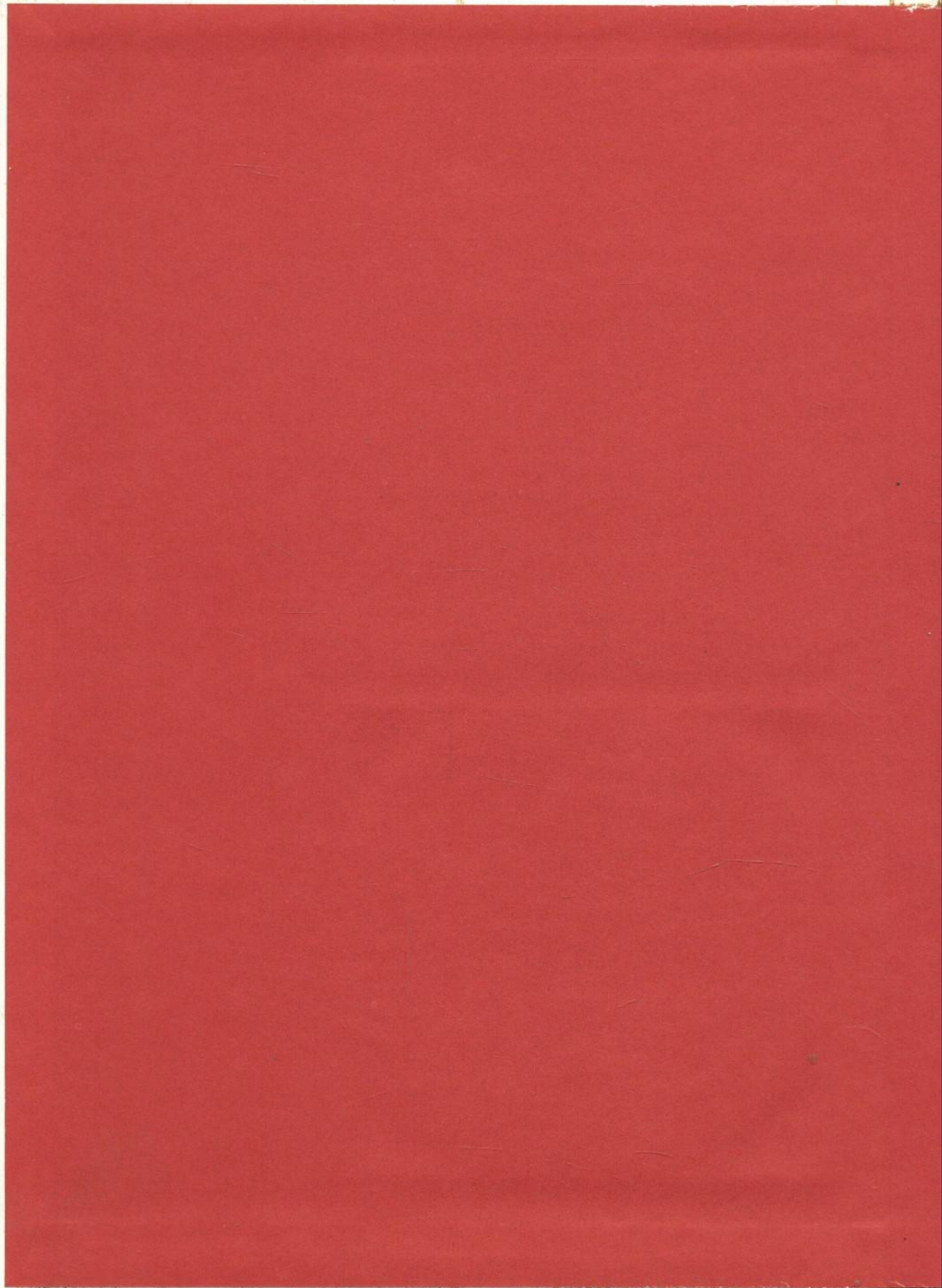

The meaning of the Havamal is the "Song of the High." It is the Norse code on the conduct of life in a long narrative saga in poetic form which illustrates the Viking rules of life. Expressed in the Havamal are many subjects encountered in everyday life; such as man's happiness, the value of science, and the duty of cheerfulness and bravery. Other ideas warn that wealth is the most unstable of friends; that no man is without his faults; and cautions man not to neglect his friends.

In 1963, Havamal was chosen as the theme for the yearbook and has remained the title because of its historical significance and its application to modern day living.

A viking also adorns a schroll in the center of the display where school championships can be added later.

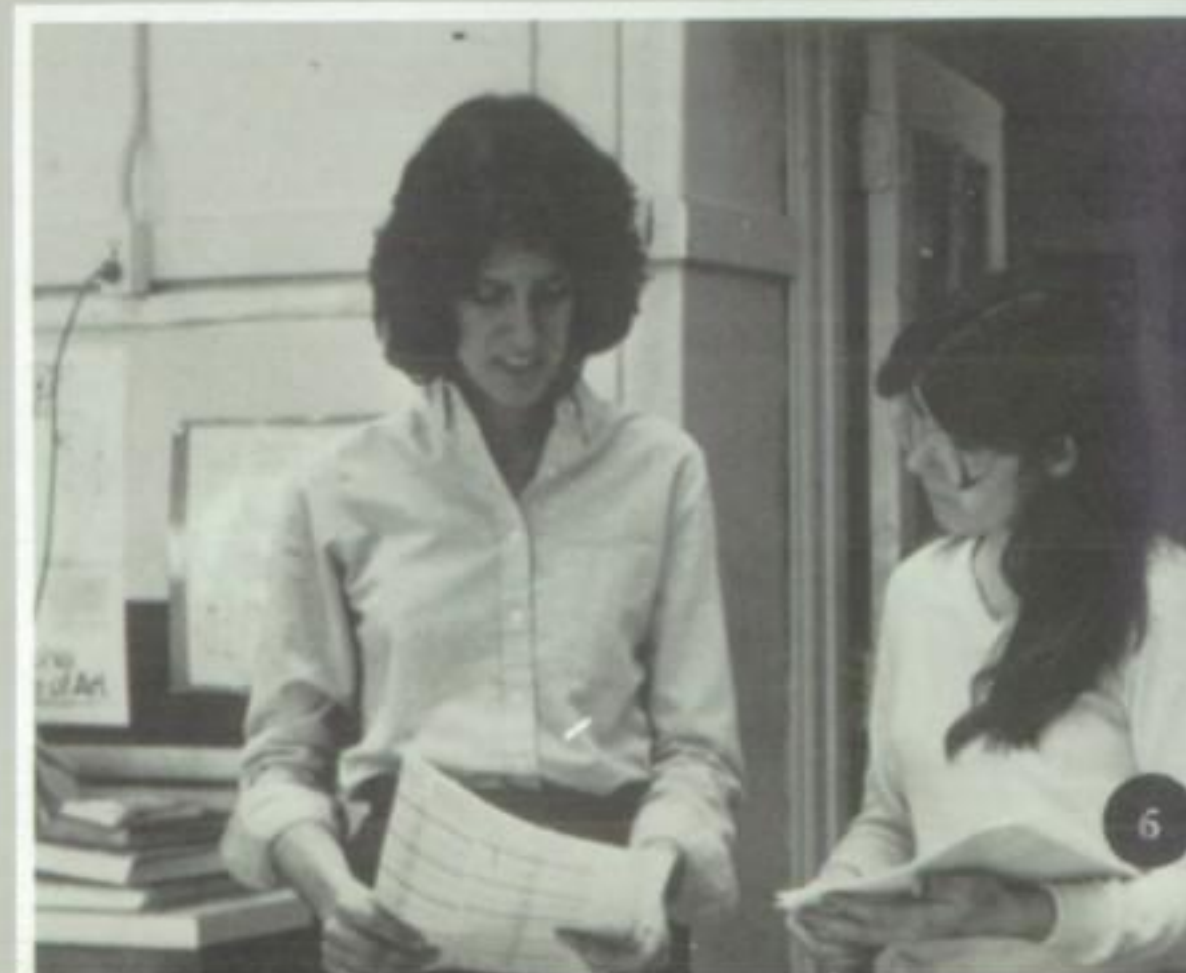

The 1982 Musical was *The Wizard of Oz*, under the direction of Joni L. Rinaldi. *The Wizard of Oz* was written by Lyman Frank Baum, a newspaperman, editor, dramatist, and writer for juveniles. 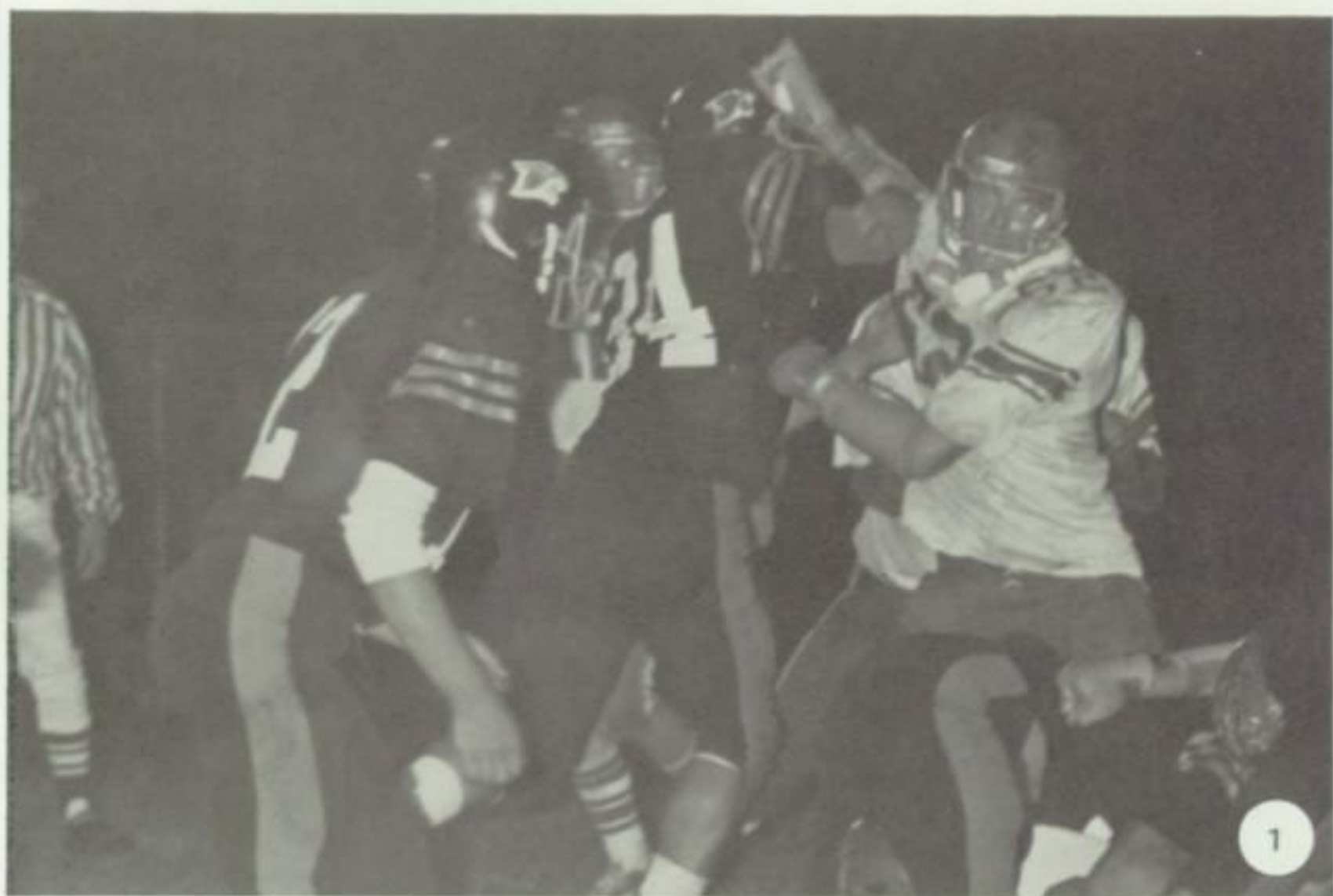

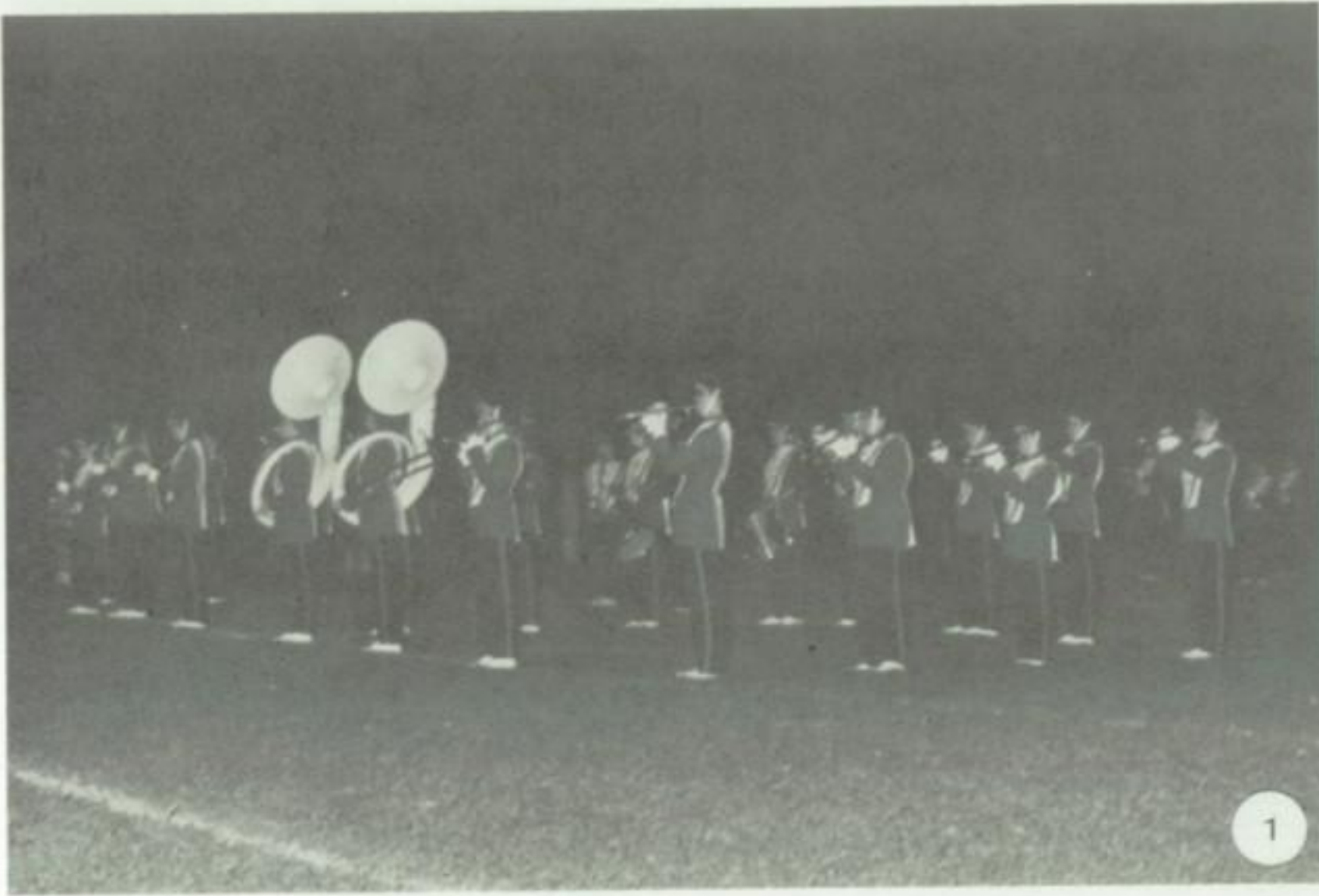
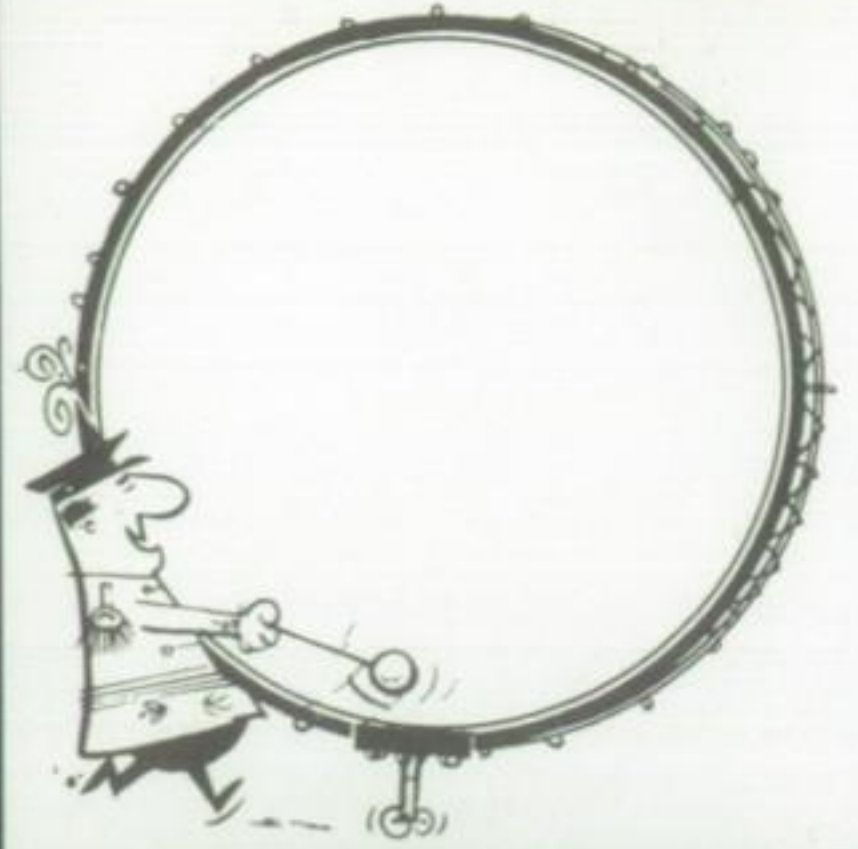

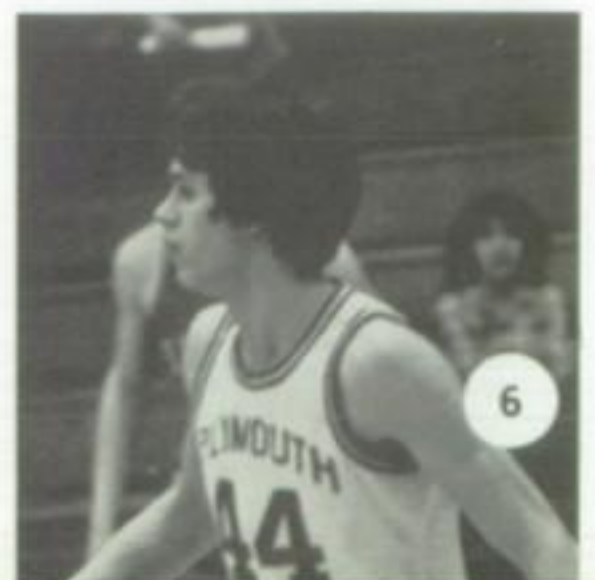
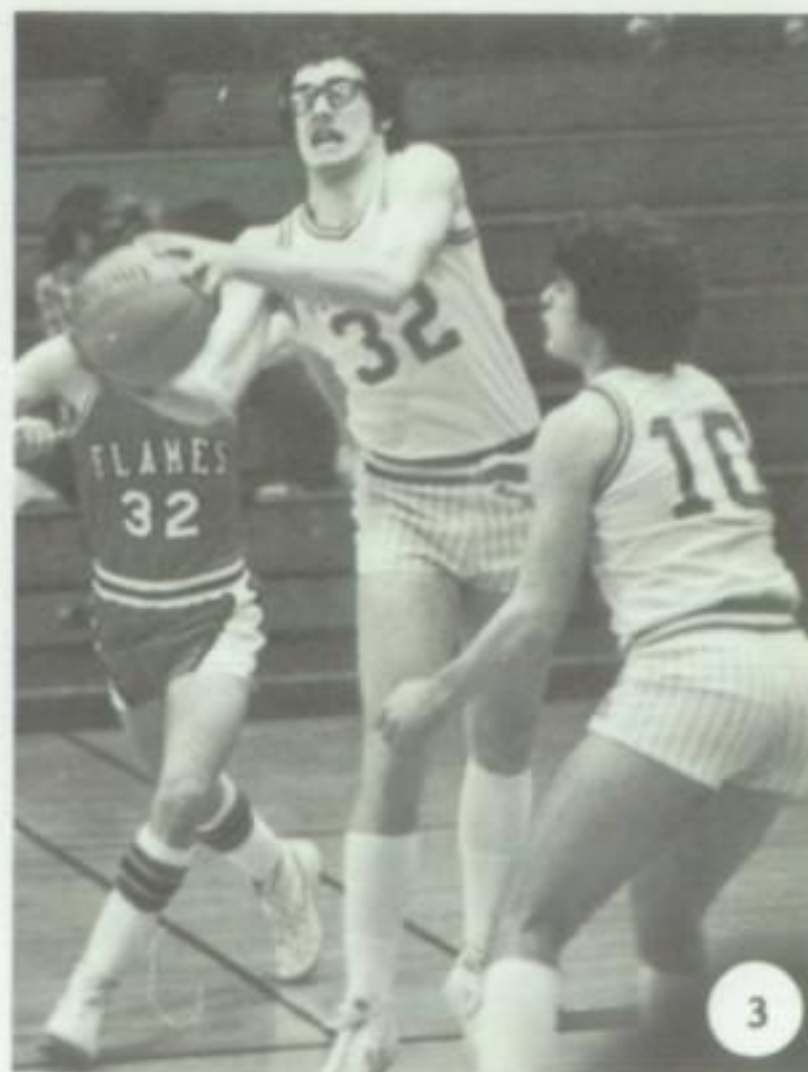


TIME OUT

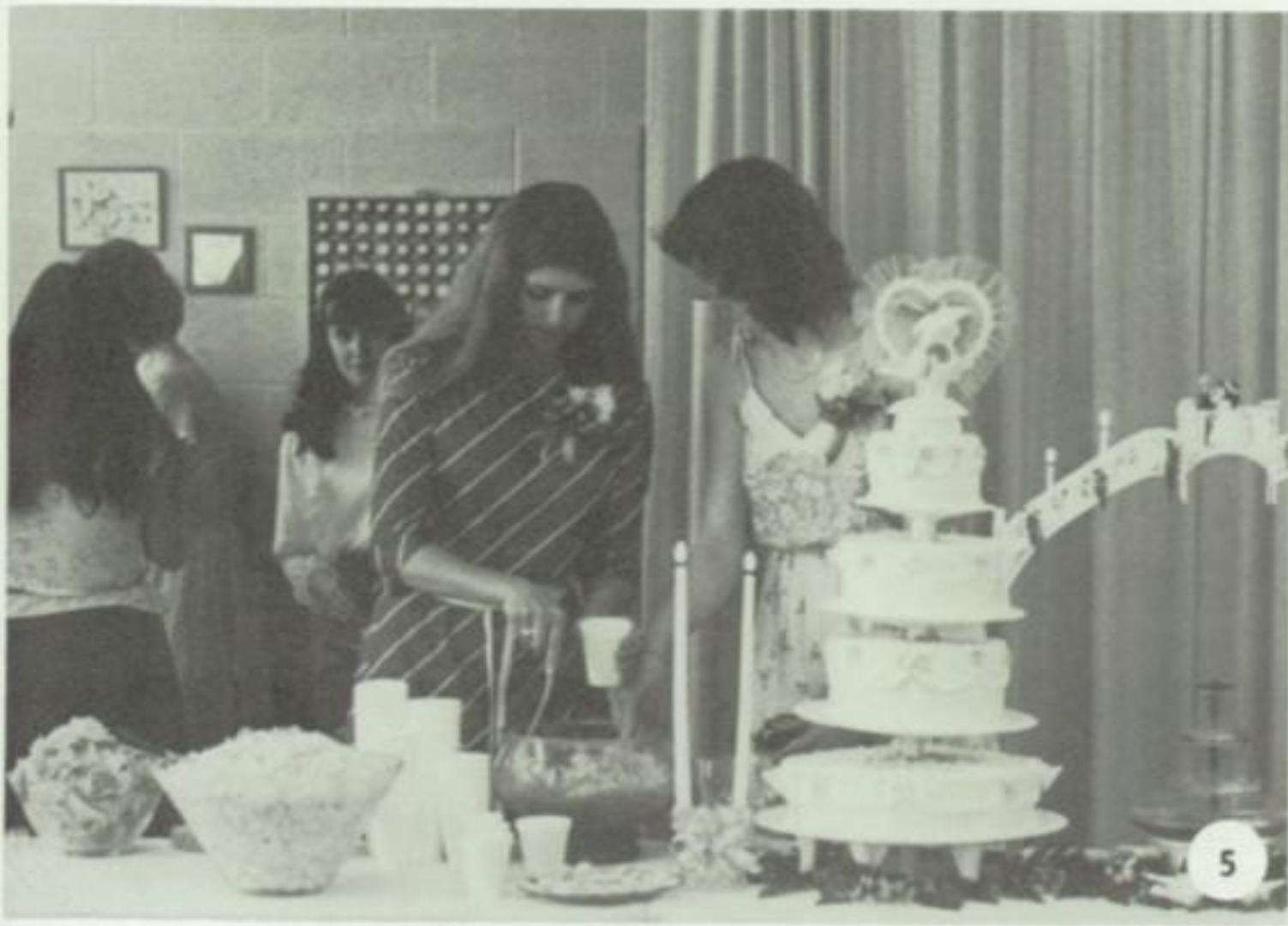
Music was provided by Miss Joni Rinaldi, pianist, and Jamie Brooks, vocalist. Guests were registered by Betty Swind.

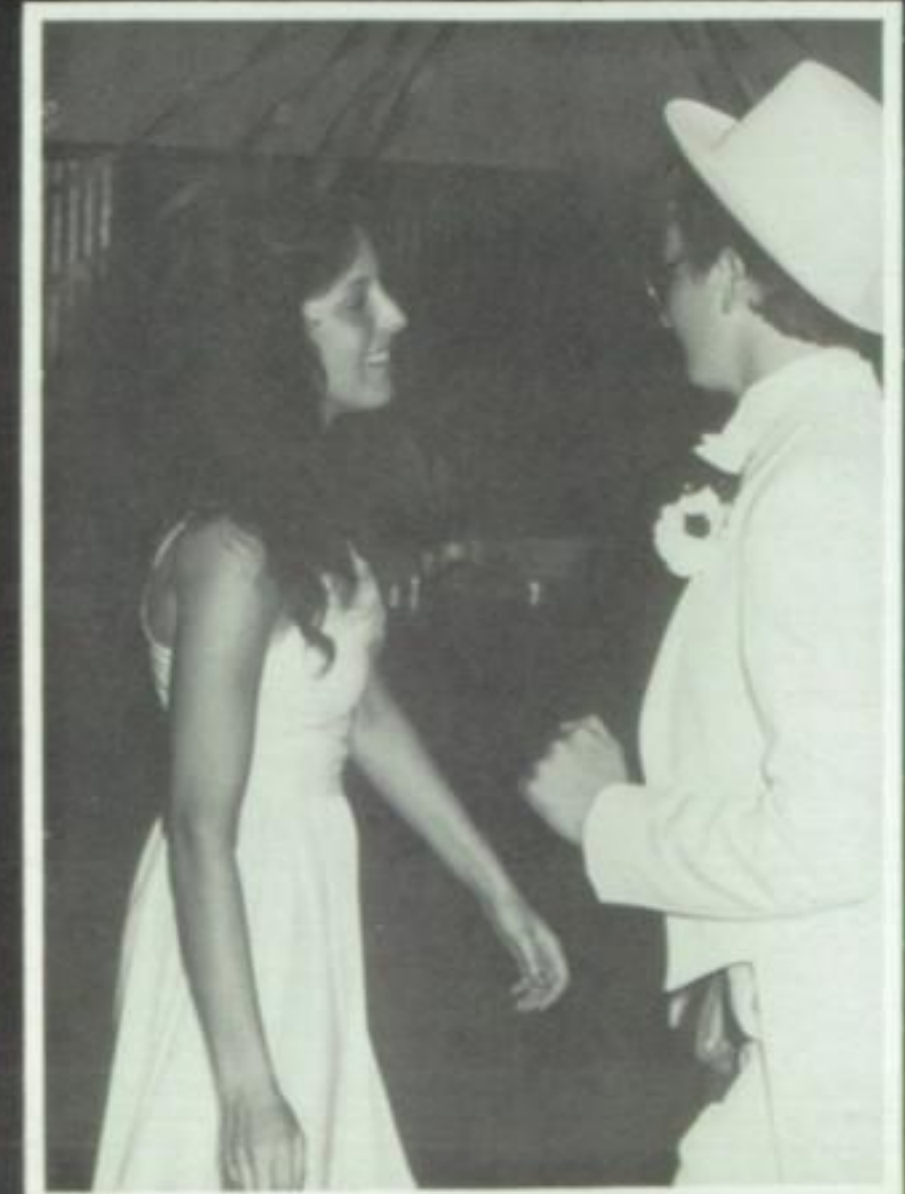
